RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a nine-game, 11-day, season-opening road trip through St. Louis (1-2), Milwaukee (three to play), and Minnesota (three to play) tonight at American Family Field, their first night game of the year...marks the longest road trip to begin a season in club history...are opening with back-to-back Interleague series for the second time, joining 2025 (COL, PIT)...are opening with a road trip for the eighth time, first since 2021, and second time in the last 17 seasons (2010-26)...are scheduled for five games in March, most in franchise history, more than their four in 2025, 2024, and 2019...will return to Tropicana Field on April 6 vs. CHC, their first game at the ballpark in 561 days (Sept. 22, 2024 vs. TOR).

- ★ The Rays erupted for 11 runs yesterday in St. Louis to salvage the three-game set and avoid their second 0-3 start, which would have joined the 2011 team (0-6)...they recorded a season-high-tying 17 hits (also: Opening Day at STL) becoming the third club since 1901 to reach that mark twice within their first three games, joining the Blue Jays in 1984, the Brooklyn Dodgers in 1952, and Cleveland in 1936 (all 2G).
- ★ The Rays tallied five doubles in 15 AB from the 2nd through 4th innings after having none in their first 84 AB to open the season...it included three consecutive doubles from **Yandy Diaz**, **Jonathan Aranda**, and **Cedric Mullins** in the 4th, the Rays first time collecting three straight extra-base hits since July 23, 2025 vs. CWS (1st inn. - Diaz HR, Aranda 2B, Caminero HR).
- ★ Tampa Bay's 41 hits are the most in MLB and the club's second most through three games behind the inaugural 1998 season (42)...only the 2008 (25) and 1998 (24) teams have scored more runs in such a span than this year's Rays (23)...the franchise records for hits and runs through four games are 53 (1998) and 31 (2008), respectively.
- ★ The Rays have scored five runs or more in each of their first three games for the seventh time, first since 2008 (4G)...the club record is five games, established at the onset of the 2000 season.
- ★ With a victory tonight, the Rays would start .500 or better through four games for the eighth straight season since 2019...they last held a losing record after four games in 2018 (1-3).
- ★ Rays skipper **Kevin Cash** enters this series with 897 wins in his managerial career.

DEATH BY A THOUSAND HITS—The Rays 35 singles lead the majors, 11 more than second-ranked Brewers (24), and are the most by any club through three games since the 1952 Brooklyn Dodgers had 38...it also ties the fourth-most singles by any team through three games since 1901 (see table to the right)...the record through four games is 48 singles, set by the 1935 Phillies...**Yandy Diaz** paces MLB with eight singles, while **Chandler Simpson** and **Ben Williamson** are tied for second with five each...Diaz's eight singles are the most by any player through his team's first three games since **CHC Emilio Bonifacio** (9) in 2014 and the most by an AL hitter since **CLE Ronnie Belliard** (8) in 2004...with two singles tonight, Diaz would tie the most singles (10) by any player through his team's first four games since 1901 (6x, last: **BAL Brady Anderson**, 1997).

- ★ The Rays have scored 23 runs despite tallying only 6 XBH (5 2B, 1HR)...they are the fourth team since 1901 to plate 23 runs or more through three games while recording 6 XBH or fewer, joining the 2024 Padres (23R, 6XBH), 1950 Red Sox (23R, 6XBH), and 1920 Brooklyn Robins (25R, 6XBH).
- ★ They have struck out only 19 times, becoming the first AL club with 40 hits or more (41) and fewer than 20 strikeouts through three games since the 1998 Devil Rays (42H, 14SO)...the Rays have more runs (23) than strikeouts (19) through three games for the first time since 2013 (25R, 21SO).

BULLPEN BLUES—The Rays bullpen has yielded 15 runs, third most in the majors to the White Sox (19) and Cardinals (16) and their most through three games in franchise history (prev. 12R, 3x: 2021, 2006, 2000)...the club record through four games is 18 runs (2021)...the Rays (2) are one of four teams with multiple blown saves along with the Athletics, Blue Jays, and Padres (all 2)...Tampa Bay relievers have allowed all three of their inherited runners to score and have yielded a .435 (10-for-23) opp. average with runners on base, highest in the majors.

- ★ Overall, the Rays pitching staff has turned in a 6.84 ERA (26.1IP, 20ER), third highest in MLB behind the White Sox (10.13) and Cardinals (7.07)...the staff has permitted six runs or more in each of the Rays first three games for the second time, joining a three-game streak in 2013.
- ★ In franchise history, only the 2006 (25) and 2001 (23) Devil Rays have allowed more runs through three games than this year's Rays (22).
- ★ Conversely, Rays hitters are batting an MLB-best .407 (24-for-59) against relievers, scoring 16 of their 23 runs off opposing bullpens, second in the majors to the Brewers (19).

DEUCES WILD—The Rays are batting an MLB-best .395 (17-for-43) with two outs, reaching base safely in nearly half (24) of their 50 two-out plate appearances (.480 OBP)...11 of their 21 RBI and four of their 6 XBH have come with two outs...Rays pitchers have limited opponents to a .161 (5-for-31) clip in two-out situations, second in the AL to the Blue Jays (.156/5-for-32)...the staff's .212 opp. on-base pct. with two outs is second in the majors behind the Marlins (.200).

- ★ **Jonathan Aranda** is 4-for-4 with 1 2B, 1 HR, 2 RBI, and 2 BB with two outs, tied with three others for the most two-out hits in the majors.

TRAFFIC JAM—**Yandy Diaz** (10) and **Jonathan Aranda** (9) are the second pair of teammates over the last 14 seasons (2013-26) to both reach base safely nine times or more through their club's first three games, joining **LAD Mookie Betts** (11) and **LAD Freddie Freeman** (9) in 2024...they are the first AL teammates to turn the trick since **TOR José Bautista** (9) and **TOR Kelly Johnson** (11) in 2012...the Rays opening series was the first three-game set in team history in which multiple players reached safely nine times or more.

PLAYING THE HITS—**Yandy Diaz's** nine hits are the most in the majors and most by any player through the Rays first three games in team history, surpassing **Quinton McCracken** (8) in 1998...no Rays batter has ever recorded 10 hits or more through the team's first four games...he is the second major leaguer over the last 11 seasons (2016-26) with nine hits in his club's first three games, joining current teammate **BAL Cedric Mullins** (9) in 2021...yesterday at Busch Stadium, he matched a career high and franchise record with five hits...the mark has now been met 12 times in Rays history, most recently by Diaz on Sept. 3, 2025 vs. SEA...it was the Rays eighth five-hit game on the road, first since **Tommy Pham** on Sept. 18, 2019 at LAD...Diaz, who is responsible for two of the last three five-hit games in the majors (also: **SEA Dominic Canzone** on Sept. 16, 2025 at KC), also drove in a career-high-tying (6x) four runs, joining **Matt Joyce** on June 29, 2014 at BAL (5H, 4RBI) and **B.J. Upton** on Oct. 2, 2009 as the only Rays with five-hit, 4-RBI games.

- ★ Diaz went 9-for-16 (.563) with 5 RBI against the Cardinals, tying the most hits in a three-game series in Rays history (5x, last: **Randy Arozarena** from May 20-22, 2022 at BAL)...he joined **Carl Crawford** (Aug. 2-4, 2005 at TEX - 9H, 5RBI) as the only Rays with nine hits or more and 5 RBI or more in a three-game set.
- ★ He has struck out only once, joining Mullins in 2021 (9H, 1SO) and **DET Chris Shelton** in 2006 (9H, 0SO) as the only AL hitters since 2001 to tally nine hits with one or zero strikeouts through their team's first three games.

HERE'S JONNY!—**Jonathan Aranda** carries a career-long 17-game on-base streak (July 19, 2025-pres.) into this series, the third-longest active run in the majors (see table to the right)...he has also hit safely in 10 straight games dating back to July 28, 2025, going 16-for-40 (.400) with 2 2B, 4 HR, 12 RBI, 9 R, and a 1.197 OPS in that span...only **PIT Ryan O'Hearn** (12G) has a longer active hitting streak.

BRATS AND BASEBALL—The Rays play their 10th series against the Brewers this week (fourth on the road), winning five of the first nine sets...they took two of three games from May 9-11 last year at Steinbrenner Field, tallying both wins by one run in come-from-behind fashion, and have claimed two of the last three series between the clubs (2025, 2023)...however, the home team has won the last four series in this matchup...they are seeking their second series win at American Family Field, which would join June 20-22, 2011...the Rays have played only eight road games against the Brewers, their fewest against any opponent...the Dodgers (10) are the next closest team.

- ★ Fifteen of the 25 all-time meetings between the Rays and Brewers have been decided by two runs or fewer, including 10 of 13 since 2022.
- ★ **Cedric Mullins** is a .326 (14-for-43) hitter in 12 career games against the Brewers, adding 3 2B, 4 HR, and 13 RBI...it marks his third-highest average vs. any opponent behind the Mets (.392) and White Sox (.357).

TONIGHT'S START—Nick Martinez will make his first career start with the Rays today against the Milwaukee Brewers...marks his 130th career start and seventh opposite Milwaukee...enters his ninth major league season and first with the Rays...last year, tied his career high from 2024 with 116 SO...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

LAST TIME OUT—In his final spring training tune-up on Sunday, March 22, Martinez allowed 11 ER on 12 H (3HR) and 2 BB, over 3.2 innings pitched at TOR...he finished the spring 0-4 with a 14.49 ERA (13.2IP, 22ER) across his four Grapefruit League outings...is coming off a 2025 regular season with the Reds in which he produced career highs in starts (26), innings pitched (165.2), and wins (11) while tying his career high from 2024 with 116 strikeouts.

BEER BEER BEER BEER BEER!—The former Red is 0-1 with a 4.65 ERA (40.2IP, 21ER) and 31 SO in 11 career appearances (6 starts) opposite the Brewers...this includes a 4.99 ERA (30.2IP, 17ER) and 20 SO in the six starts against them and a 2.91 mark (21.2IP, 7ER) with 20 SO in seven career outings (2 starts) at American Family Field.

★ Martinez is 4-5 with a 3.80 ERA (94.2IP, 40ER) in 18 career appearances (18 starts) vs. NL Central opponents...his 3.70 ERA (428.1IP, 176ER) against NL opponents ranks 9th among active major league pitchers (min. 150 G, 50 starts).

SOFT CONTACT KING—Among qualified pitchers last season, Martinez ranked tied for fifth with MIL Freddy Peralta for the lowest hard hit pct. (34.5%), behind only HOU Hunter Brown (32.2%), DET Tarik Skubal (33.0%), CIN Andrew Abbott (33.7%), and LAA Kyle Hendricks (34.3%).

★ He also ranked fourth among qualified AL pitchers in barrel pct. (6.9%), behind only Brown (5.9%), ATH Luis Severino (6.0%), HOU Framber Valdez (6.7%).

NO FREE PASSES—His 6.1% walk rate last season was 10th lowest among NL pitchers (min. 650BF)...he limited opponents to two walks or fewer in 24 of his 26 starts, tied for 11th most among NL starters.

★ Issued only two free passes across five starts (32.0IP) in May...min. 30.0 IP, marked the fifth instance of a Reds starter walking two batters or fewer in a month since 1977, joining Bronson Arroyo (August 2013), John Smiley (July 1997), Tom Browning (April 1991), and John Denny (August 1986).

CHANGING THE PACE—Last season, Martinez held opponents to a .192 (24-for-125) clip on his changeup, the fourth-lowest mark on an NL pitcher's changeup (min. 120AB), behind PHI Christopher Sánchez (.170), MIL Freddy Peralta (.173), and AZ Merrill Kelly (.174)...he fanned 31 batters using the pitch, the most of any in his repertoire...min. 500 changeups, his 29.6% whiff rate ranked eighth highest among NL pitchers...he allowed just one hit on the pitch over his final 18 outings of the season.

SWINGMAN—Last season, Martinez went 10-10 with a 4.72 ERA (145.0IP, 76ER) in 26 starts and 1-4 with a 2.61 ERA (20.2IP, 6ER) and five holds across 14 relief appearances...he became the first pitcher to appear in at least 40 games and make at least 25 starts in a season since TB-MIA Ryne Stanek did so in 2019 (63G, 27 starts).

★ Since returning to the majors in 2022, has made 61 starts and 131 appearances out of the bullpen...over that span (2022-25), joined STL Andre Pallante (61GS/108G in relief) as the only MLB pitchers to start 50 games or more and make 100 relief appearances or more.

THINGS ARE LOOKING UP—In his last 20 outings (8 starts) of the 2025 season, Martinez posted a 3.75 ERA (60.0IP, 25ER) with 43 SO...he went 4-1 with a 4.04 ERA (42.1IP, 19ER) in his eight starts and pitched 5.0 innings or more in seven of those eight starts without allowing more than two walks in any appearance.

CAREER RUNDOWN—In 2024, set career marks in ERA (3.10), bWAR (4.0), WHIP (1.03), strikeouts (116), strikeout rate (23.0%), walk rate (3.2%), opp. average (.237), FIP (3.21), barrel rate (5.1%), and chase rate (33.9%) in his first season with the Reds...received the Johnny Vander Meer Award, from the Cincinnati chapter of the BBWAA as the Reds most outstanding pitcher.

★ In 2023, paced the Padres staff with a career-high 63 appearances and recorded the highest strikeout (23.0%) and whiff (28.6%) rates of his career...also held opponents to a career-best .354 slugging pct.

★ Returned to the majors in 2022 after signing a one-year deal with the Padres March 16...made 47 appearances, including 10 starts, and became the first pitcher since holds became an official statistic in 1986 to record a season with four holds or more, eight saves or more, and 10 starts or more.

★ Played his final season overseas in 2021...signed with the Fukoka Softbank Hawks in January and went 9-4 with a 1.60 ERA (140.2IP, 25ER) and 138 SO over 23 starts...led the club and ranked fourth in the Japan Pacific League in strikeouts...min. 100.0 IP, the only JPL pitcher with a lower ERA was Yoshinobu Yamamoto (1.39).

★ Missed the 2019 season due to a right forearm strain...returned to action midway through the 2020 campaign, making 17 appearances for the Nippon-Ham Fighters (NPB).

★ In 2018, started 25 games for the Nippon-Ham Fighters, tied for most on the club...also ranked second on the team in strikeouts (93) and innings pitched (161.2) and threw three complete games.

★ Spent the 2011-17 seasons in the Rangers organization, pitching to a 35-23 record with a 3.28 ERA (510.2IP, 186ER) across 107 minor league appearances (87 starts).
