TRANSACTION

The Reds today claimed off waivers from the Braves **RHP Kevin Gausman** (#46), placed on the 10-day injured list **IF/OF Derek Dietrich** (left shoulder inflammation), selected from Louisville the contract of **OF Brian O'Grady** (#34) and designated for assignment **IF Blake Trahan** (TRUH-haw)...will make **Gausman's** corresponding roster move when he reports.

FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (88), **HR** (32), **RBI** (85) and **slugging percentage** (.579) while ranking second in **batting average** (.303) and **on-base percentage** (.365)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **88-56**, and are **27-7** (.794) when leading after the first inning...**5 times** this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first...**3B Eugenio Suárez** is hitting **.326** in the first frame, is tied with Min's **Nelson Cruz** for the Major League lead with **10 HR** and ranks T3rd in the majors with **20 RBI**...**1B Joey Votto** is among NL first-inning leaders in **extra-base hits** (14, T1st), **doubles** (8, T2nd), **hits** (31, 3rd) and **batting average** (.337, 11th).

Major League Baseball on Thu suspended **8** individuals for their roles in Tue's bench-clearing incident between the **Reds** and **Pirates** at Great American Ball Park, including Reds manager **David Bell** (6 games) and pitchers **Amir Garrett** (8 games) and **Jared Hughes** (3 games)...Bell today will serve the **fifth game** of his suspension...**Garrett** and **Hughes** are appealing...Reds bench coach **Freddie Benavides** is serving as Cincinnati's acting manager in **Bell's** absence...below is a list of those who were disciplined:

TODAY'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 2-game series vs **Adam Chodsko's Angels** and **Game 1** of a 6-game homestand that includes Wed's day off followed by a 4-game weekend series vs the **Cubs**...the Reds are coming off a **2-2 series split** at Atl's **SunTrust Park**...in their **last 4 series** the Reds are **3-0-1** (2-1 at Mil, 2-1 vs Col, 2-1 vs Pit, 2-2 at Atl).

SERIES NOTES: This series is the Redlegs' sixth overall series vs LAA, the second of the season and their first meeting at **Great American Ball Park** since the **2013 season-opening series**...the **Reds** are **4-10 all-time** vs the **Angels**, including **1-2 in 2002, 0-3 in 2016 & 0-2 in 2019 in Anaheim** and **1-2 in 2007 & 2-1 in 2013 at Great American Ball Park**...in **2013** the **Reds** and **Angels** played the **first interleague Opening Day game in Major League history**, a 3-1 Angels win in **13 innings** in which the teams established the modern Major League record for strikeouts by both teams in a season-opening game (Cin pitchers 17, LAA pitchers 13).

DEADLINE DEALS: On Wed the Reds made the following transactions:

- Acquired from the Indians **RHP Trevor Bauer** as part of a 3-team trade in which the Indians received from the Reds **OF Yasiel Puig** and **LHP Scott Moss** and from the Padres **OF Franmil Reyes**, **LHP Logan Allen** and **IF Victor Nova**...the Padres received from the Reds **OF Taylor Trammell**.
- Acquired from the Athletics minor league **OF Jameson Hannah** for **RHP Tanner Roark**.
- Acquired from the Giants a player to be named for **2B Scooter Gennett** and cash.

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used **5 catchers** this season, including **Tucker Barnhart**, **Curt Casali**, **Kyle Farmer**, **Juan Graterol** and **Ryan Lavarway**...the **3 catchers** on the club's **Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) & Farmer** (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for **8 days** (7/18-7/25) until **Barnhart** came off the injured list prior to the game on 7/26...**Barnhart** and **Farmer** have returned to the active roster...on 7/26, **Barnhart** filled the roster spot vacated by **Graterol**, who went on the **7-day concussion list**...**Farmer** was reinstated from the 7-day concussion list on 7/28...he relaced **Lavarway**, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used **6 catchers** in a season just **7 times** in their history, most recently in **1992** (**Troy Afenir**, **Scott Bradley**, **Joe Oliver**, **Jeff Reed**, **Dan Wilson**, **Rick Wrona**)...also used **6 catchers** in **1963, 1961, 1937, 1925 and 1895**...the **1909 Reds** used a club-record **8 catchers** (**Tommy Clarke**, **Tom Downey**, **Emil Haberer**, **Mike Konnick**, **Larry McLean**, **Si Pauxtis**, **Duck Pearce**, **Frank Roth**).

2-WAY PLAYER: **RHP Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 68 of the Reds' 110 games so far this season, including 45 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once as a **pitcher/LF/RF** (7/22 at Mil), once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), twice as a **P/RF**, 3 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 7 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi) and once as a **CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 380 career innings pitched (382.1) to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** (474.1ip) in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

BLACK & BLUE: **Derek Dietrich** has been hit by a pitch **23 times**, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (**Shin-Soo Choo**, 26, 2013 & **Jason LaRue**, 24, 2004)...was hit by a pitch **6 times** in the 4-game series at Mil from **6/20-6/23** and was hit by a pitch **4 times** in the 3-game series at Chi from **7/15-7/17**...he is the only player in **modern Major League history** to get hit by a pitch **6 times** in a series of any length...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

AND THIS ONE BELONGS....: Hall of Fame broadcaster **Marty Brennaman** is in his 46th and final season calling Reds games for **700 WLW Radio**...joined the Reds radio team in **1974** and for **31 seasons** (1974-2004) shared the 700 WLW Radio booth with Reds Hall of Fame pitcher **Joe Nuxhall**, tying LA's **Vin Scully** and **Jerry Doggett** for the longest running broadcast duo in baseball history...is only the eighth Major League Baseball broadcaster to work for the same team for at least 46 seasons, joining **Scully** (67 seasons, 1950-2016), **Ralph Kiner** of the Mets (52, 1962-2013), KC's **Denny Matthews** (51, 1969-2019), Mil's **Bob Uecker** (49, 1971-2019), **Jack Buck** (48, 1954-2001) & **Mike Shannon** (48, 1972-2019) of the Cardinals and LAD's **Jaime Jarrín** (47, 1973-2019)...in the top of the first inning in his first regular-season game as a Major League broadcaster on **4/4/74** at Riverfront Stadium, Brennaman provided the call when **Hank Aaron** belted his record-tying **714th** home run...over **45 years** later, both Aaron and Brennaman were in attendance for **Friday's game** between the Reds and Braves at SunTrust Park.

150th CELEBRATION: During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the **150th anniversary** of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the **1869 Red Stockings**...this season, the team will wear **15 uniforms** from various periods throughout the team's history...on **Sun vs Cubs** will wear replica uniforms from **1969**...the Reds are 3-7 wearing **throwback uniforms**...already wore uniforms from **1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956, 1961 and 1967**...as part of the season-long celebration, the **Reds Hall of Fame and Museum** underwent a comprehensive modification, while the **1869 Pavilion** at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on **May 4**, the **150th anniversary** of the **Red Stockings'** 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game..

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: **RHP Luis Castillo** was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month** for **March/April**...in 7 starts he went **3-1, 1.45** while ranking second in the National League and third in the Major Leagues in **ERA**, second in the NL and sixth in the majors in **strikeouts** (50) and third in the NL and T6th in the majors in **innings pitched** (43.1).

Tonight's Pitcher - #58 Luis Castillo, RHP

RED HOTS

Luis Castillo tonight is making his first career appearance vs the **Angels**...in his third **Major League** season at just **26 years old**, is a **2019 National League All-Star**...per *Baseball America*, his **changeup** was voted by managers, scouts and executives the **best in the National League**...in his career has allowed **13 HR** in the **first inning**, his highest total in any inning and including **3 HR** in the **first frame** this year...in the third inning on **7/15 at Wrigley Field** allowed a 2-out, solo HR to **Kyle Schwarber** than snapped his **career-high 14.2-inning scoreless streak**...produced 8 starts in which he threw at least 5.0 innings while allowing 2 hits or fewer and 2 runs or fewer, a single-season franchise record...selected by his peers, he joined **RHP Sonny Gray** as the first pair of **Reds starting pitchers** named to the **All-Star team** since **Johnny Cueto** and **Alfredo Simon** in **2014**...threw a perfect fourth inning in the National League's 4-3 loss at Cle's **Progressive Field** (struck out **Carlos Santana**, struck out **J.D. Martinez**, **Alex Bregman** 4-3)...**Gray** did not pitch...was the National League's **Pitcher of the Month for March/April** (7gs, 3-1, 1.45)...through his first 7 starts of this season led the Major Leagues in ERA (1.45)...made his first career **Opening Day start**, but in the 5-3 win vs Pit was the victim of a blown save...became the fifth straight different **Opening Day** starter for the Reds (**Johnny Cueto** 2012-2015, **Raisel Iglesias** 2016, **Scott Feldman** in 2017, **Homer Bailey** in 2018)...is the longest stretch of different **Opening Day starting pitchers** since a **6-year stretch** from **2001-2006** (**Pete Harnisch** 2000-2001, **Joey Hamilton** 2002, **Jimmy Haynes** 2003, **Cory Lidle** 2004, **Paul Wilson** 2005, **Aaron Harang** 2006)...since his **Major League debut** in 2017, leads the Reds' pitching staff in almost every statistical category, including **wins, starts, innings pitched** and **strikeouts**.

6 PHILLIP ERVIN, of 2nd Half: 21g, 8gs, 17-44 (.386), 2 2b, 3 3b, 1hr, 7rbi

- Has 1 hit in 11 AB since his season-high 6-game hitting streak was snapped on 7/28.
- Has made 18 starts (14gs in LF, 3gs in CF, 1gs in RF), most recently Sat at Atl (LF).
- On 6/15 was recalled to replace injured LHP Wandy Peralta...is his fourth stint with the Reds this season (37g, 27-77, .351, 3 2b, 4 3b, 2hr, 11rbi, .969ops).
- Made his first apps for the Reds on 4/13 & 4/14, as the 26th player appeared in both games vs the Cardinals in Monterrey...from 4/23-4/30 made 5 apps and 2 starts...in his third stint, from 5/18-5/23 made 3 apps and 1 start.
- In the 17-9 win on 7/13 at Coors Field tied the club record with 6 hits, accomplished for the fourth time (Tony Cuccinello 1931, Ernie Lombardi 1937, Walker Cooper last on 7/6/1949 vs Cubs)...fell a home run shy of the cycle.
- Is 1 of 4 first-round or supplemental first-round draft picks to play CF for the Reds this season (Michael Lorenzen, Jesse Winker, Nick Senzel).
- In 40 apps for Louisville hit .290 (8 2b, 1 3b, 6hr, 26rbi, 6sb, 10g in LF, 25g in CF).
- Was the International League's Batter of the Week for 5/27-6/2 (.423, 2 2b, 5hr, 10rbi, .516obp, 1.593ops).

52 KYLE FARMER, inf/c 2nd Half: 8g, 4gs, 6-20 (.300), 1 2b, 2rbi

- Is hitting .273 (3-11) in 2 starts, both at catcher, and 4 apps since he came off the concussion list on 7/28...missed 9 games will on the concussion list (7/18-7/27).
- This season has made 8 apps and 6 starts at C...are the first starts of his career at that position...entered this season with 4 career apps at C (3g in 2017, 1g in 2018)...this spring training caught 36.0 innings.

4 JOSÉ IGLESIAS, ss 2nd Half: 22g, 21-70 (.300), 3 2b, 2hr, 7rbi, 2sb

- Leads the Reds in hitting with RISP (.325, 27-83), T15th in the National League.
- Has a 3-game hitting streak (6-11, .545, 1 2b, 3r), including 3 hits yesterday at Atl.
- With 99 hits is just 5 behind team leader Eugenio Suárez...is trying to become the second straight shortstop to lead the team in hits...SS José Peraza last year led the team with 182 hits.
- With 7 HR has established a new single-season high (6hr, 2017)...has 2 grand slams in his career, both this season vs Pit (5/27/night off Mitch Keller, 7/29 off Montana DuRapau)...his career high for RBI in a season is 54 (2017).
- After Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training became the team's starting SS, with José Peraza moving to 2B.
- On 2/23/19 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract with an invitation to 2019 Major League spring training camp.
- Was 1 of 2 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (IF/OF Derek Dietrich).
- Is the Reds' recipient of the 2019 Heart and Hustle Award, given to each team's player who best embodies the passion, values, spirit and traditions of the game.

34 BRIAN O'GRADY, OF Louisville: 100g, .277, 27 2b, 1 3b, 27hr, 70rbi, 16sb

- Today was recalled from Louisville to fill the roster spot vacated by injured IF/OF Derek Dietrich.
- Is 1 of just 3 players in professional baseball with at least 27 doubles and 27 HR (Pit's Josh Bell, 34 2b, 27hr & Min's Max Kepler, 27 2b, 30hr).
- Was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month for May.
- When he plays will become the fourth Reds player this season to make his Major League debut (CF Nick Senzel, IF/OF Josh VanMeter, RHP Jimmy Herget).

9 JOSÉ PERAZA, inf 2nd Half: 20g, 9gs, 14-47 (.298), 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 10rbi

- In 48 apps beginning 5/31 is hitting .284 (33-116, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 18rbi, 1sb).
- Made 39 starts at 2B (last, Sat at Atl), second-most on the team (Derek Dietrich, 41gs)...made 15 starts at SS (last, Fri at Atl), also second-most on the team (José Iglesias, 95gs).
- Made 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- Tue vs Pit made the first pitching appearance of his career after Amir Garrett, along with 5 other players, was ejected with 2 outs in the top of the ninth inning...threw 4 pitches and induced Jacob Stallings to F8.
- After Eugenio Suárez was ejected by HP umpire Carlos Torres between the first and second innings on 7/19 vs StL, made his first Major League appearance at 3B...made his second appearance at that position on 7/23 at Mil.

15 NICK SENZEL, cf 2nd Half: 19g, 22-67 (.328), 6 2b, 2 3b, 4rbi, 1sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- In 10 apps beginning 7/22 is hitting .317 (13-41), raising his BA from .272...his season BA through Fri's game (.285) was a season high, but he is 1-for-10 in 2g since then.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf 2nd Half: 23g, 24-79 (.304), 9hr, 17rbi, 1.084ops

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Since the All-Star break leads the National League in slugging percentage (.684) while ranking among the NL's second-half leaders in BA (.304, 14th), HR (9, T1st), RBI (17, T10th), on-base percentage (.400, 11th) and extra-base hits (11, T18th).
- Received votes for National League Player of the Month for July after leading the NL in HR (12), slugging percentage (.733) and total bases (66, T1st)...also finished among the July leaders in RBI (23, 3rd), OPS (1.086, 3rd) and extra-base hits (15, 5th).
- In the first inning, is tied with Min's Nelson Cruz for the Major League lead with 10 HR while ranking T3rd in the majors with 20 RBI...also in the first frame ranks 15th in the National League in hitting .326 (28-86).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 11 of his last 30 apps (13hr, 26rbi).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
- Suárez and Tony Pérez are the only third basemen in franchise history to hit 25 or more HR in 3 or more seasons...with 1 more homer will join Pérez as the only third basemen in club history with 30 HR in 2 seasons...Suárez' 12 HR in July were the most by a Reds batter in that month since Adam Dunn hit 12 HR in July 2008...no Reds batter has hit more than Dunn's 12 HR in July since Frank Robinson hit 13 HR in July 1961.

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of 2nd Half: 16g, 15-42 (.357), 4hr, 7rbi, 1.150ops

- In his last 15 apps beginning 7/19 is hitting .366 (15-41, 2 2b, 4hr, 7rbi, .707slg, .458obp)...from 7/27-7/31 became the third Reds player to homer in 3 straight games this season (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez twice).
- On 7/18 was promoted from Louisville as 1 of 7 roster moves...since then has made 16 apps (15-42, .357, 2 2b, 4hr, 7rbi, 1.150ops).
- Is his fourth stint on the Reds' roster...from 5/5-5/16, in his first Major League apps, went 2-for-14 (1rbi) in 8 apps and 2 starts...from 5/21-6/18 made 20 apps, including 5 starts (7-27, .259, 2 2b, 2rbi, .375obp)...in his third stint, from 7/4-7/7 went 1-for-4 with a 2-run double in 2 apps (PH, PH-LF-2B-1B-LF).
- Has made 17 starts for the Reds (12gs in LF, 2gs at 2B, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at DH)...also made 2 apps at 1B and 1 appearance in RF (7/22 at Mil).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacin on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit .358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b 2nd Half: 23g, 22-92 (.239), 5 2b, 3hr, 14rbi

- For the fifth straight season, per *Baseball America* was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
- Fr at Atl homered off Kevin Gausman, his first HR at SunTrust Park and the 27th Major League ballpark in which he's homered.
- In his last 58 apps beginning 5/24 is hitting .300, raising his season BA from .208 (67-223, 15 2b, 7hr, 28rbi, .373obp).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season...his current on-base streak is at 4 games (.389obp).
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 68 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 63 HR on the first pitch.

33 JESSE WINKER, of 2nd Half: 23g, 22-65 (.338), 3 2b, 1 3b, 2hr, 11rbi

- Among National League leaders since the All-Star break ranks fourth in on-base percentage (.434) and seventh in batting average (.338).
- In his last 17 apps beginning 7/18 is hitting .365 (19-52, 3 2b, 2hr, 8rbi, .988ops).
- Has 3 career leadoff HR, including 2 this season (6/18 vs Hou off Justin Verlander, 7/31 vs Pit off Dario Agrazal).
- Has 15 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 81 starts, including a team-high 54 starts in LF (15gs in CF, 11gs in RF, 1gs at DH).
