PITTSBURGH PIRATES (10-16) vs. LOS ANGELES DODGERS (16-9) April 25, 2025 - Dodger Stadium - Los Angeles, CA - 7:10 PDT - Game #27/Road #14 RHP Paul Skenes (2-2, 2.87 ERA) vs. RHP Yoshinobu Yamamoto (3-1, 0.93 ERA)

THE PIRATES: fell to the Angels, 4-3, on Thursday in Anaheim before making the trip across town...Are in the fourth game of a six-game trip (won two of three games against the Angels from Tuesday-Thursday)...Arrived in SoCal following a 3-4 homestand from April 14-20 against Washington (3-1) and Cleveland (0-3)...Will return to Pittsburgh for an off day on Monday, followed by a six-game homestand where they'll face Chicago-NL (April 29-May 1) and San Diego (May 2-4).

A PITCHER-PERFECT DAY: Orange County native Paul Skenes will get the start for Pittsburgh tonight in the opener of this weekend series at Dodger Stadium...Skenes enters tonight's start with a 0.80 WHIP, the fourth-best mark among all qualified National League pitchers (sixth-best in Major League Baseball)...His .186 batting average against ranks sixth in the National League (Yoshinobu Yamamoto, .178, ranks fifth on that list). **MAJOR LEAGUE ERA LEADERS**

CALIFORNIA LOVE: This is Pittsburgh's first of three trips to The Golden State in 2025... The Pirates will come back here to take on San Diego from May 30-June 1 (also in Arizona from May 26-28) and San Francisco from July 28-30 (also in Colorado from August 1-3).

IT ALL STARTED WITH A BIG BANG: Oneil Cruz hit his third leadoff home run of the season (and career) last night in Anaheim off Angels starter Tyler Anderson, all of which have come in his last seven games...Cruz' three leadoff homers are tied with New York (NL)'s Francisco Lindor for most in MLB...Andrew McCutchen hit three leadoff homers for Pittsburgh in 2024...The last Pirate to hit more than three leadoff home runs in a season was Adam Frazier (five) in 2019...0f Cruz' 47 MLB home runs, Thursday's was the 10th off a left-handed pitcher (first since September 20, 2024 off Cincinnati's Brent Suter)...Cruz

has five home runs, 11 hits and seven runs in his last eight games (since April 16 vs. Washington)...He's the first Pirate to post those stats in any eight-game, single-season span since Bryan Reynolds (five HR, 13 hits, 10 runs) did it from April 2-10, 2023.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: In Thursday night's game against the Angels, Matt Gorski connected for his first big-league home run (off Tyler Anderson) in the first plate appearance of his Major League debut...He became

the first Pirate to homer in his Major League debut since Ke'Bryan Hayes on September 1, 2020 vs. Chicago (NL)...Gorski also became just the fourth Pirate to homer in his first Major League plate appearance, joining Starling Marte on July 26, 2012 at Houston (off Dallas Keuchel, first pitch), Don Leppert on June 18, 1961 (G1) vs. St. Louis (off Curt Simmons) and Walter Mueller on May 7, 1922 at Chicago-NL (off Pete Alexander, first pitch)... Gorski's first hit at every professional level he's played at has been an extra-base hit.

SEASONED VETERAN: Andrew McCutchen has reached base safely in nine consecutive games (since April 12 at Cincinnati) and has hit safely in five straight contests (since April 18 vs. Cleveland)...According to OptaStats, at 38 years old, McCutchen is the oldest Pirate with a nine-game on-base streak since Jeff Reboulet (39 years old, 11 games) in 2003.

KEEP IT UP, CRUZ: Oneil Cruz has hit a home run in back-to-back games for the second

time this season and the seventh time in his career...He also did it in three straight games from April 16-18, which marked the first time that he'd homered in three consecutive games...Cruz' seven home runs are tied for fifth-most in the National League (tied for eighth-most in all of Major League Baseball), while his 11 stolen bases are the most in all of Major League Baseball...Cruz and Elly De La Cruz (2024 Cincinnati Reds, seven homers/12 steals) are the only two Major League players since at least 1901 with sevenplus home runs and 11-plus steals through his first 23 games of a single season.

PITCHING PROWESS: Over its last 14 games (since April 9 vs. St. Louis), Pittsburgh's 2.98 staff ERA (127.0ip/42er) is the fourth-lowest in Major League Baseball, trailing only San Diego (2.37), Detroit (2.47) and New York-NL (2.59)...The Pirates' 2.30 ERA from their bullpen in the span is the third-lowest in MLB (only the Padres, 1.74, and Tigers, 1.75, bullpens have a lower ERA).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 25, 2012: Pedro Alvarez homered in both games of Pittsburgh's doubleheader split against Colorado at PNC Park, becoming the second Pittsburgh player in the last 22 seasons to hit home runs in both games of a Pirates doubleheader. The only other player to do it to that point (1991 to date) was Rob Mackowiak, who did it in both games against Chicago (NL) on May 28, 2004.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander will make his sixth of the season tonight and third away from PNC Park in 2025...Took home BBWAA National League Rookie of the Year honors last season after making his Major League debut on May 11 vs. the Cubs...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft from Louisiana State University.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes lost a 3-0 decision on April 19 vs. Cleveland, allowing two runs on six hits and one walk with four strikeouts over 7.0 innings...His seventh-inning strikeout of Angel Martínez was the 200th of his Major League career, tying with him Oliver Pérez as the fastest pitchers to reach 200 strikeouts with Pittsburgh by games (28), per the Elias Sports Bureau...He allowed a solo home run to Kyle Manzardo leading off the seventh inning, snapping his streak of 67.1 consecutive innings without allowing a home run, which dated back to August 16, 2024... According to Elias, that had been the longest-active streak in all of MLB when it was snapped.

AGAINST THE DODGERS: Skenes will make his third career start against the Dodgers...He last pitched against Los Angeles here at Dodger Stadium on August 10, 2024...He lost a 4-1 decision, allowing four runs on six hits and one walk while striking out eight Dodgers over 6.0 innings.

ROAD WARRIOR: Skenes has a 1.34 ERA (73.2ip/11er) across 13 career road starts...According to OptaStats, that is the lowest ERA by any Major League pitcher through his first 13 career road starts (since ERA became official in both leagues in 1913)...Per OptaStats, the lowest career ERA through 14 career road starts was Scott Erickson's 1.46 ERA from 1990-91 with Minnesota.

OUR ACE: Through the first 25 starts of his Major League career, Skenes had a 1.92 ERA (145.1ip/31er) with 183 strikeouts....According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the only Major League pitcher since earned runs became an official stat in both the AL and NL in 1913 to post a sub-2.00 ERA with 175-plus strikeouts in his first 25 Major League games...His 200 strikeouts since making his Major League debut on May 11, 2024 are sixth-most in MLB, behind Cole Ragans (215), Zack Wheeler (211), Logan Gilbert (207), Chris Sale (205) and Tarik Skubal (204).

OPENING DAY HONORS: Skenes allowed two runs in 5.1 innings but had a no-decision on Opening Day (March 27) in Miami against the Marlins...At 22 years and 302 days old, Skenes was the youngest Opening Day starter in club history dating back to 1893 (Frank Killen, 22 years and 148 days)...He was also the youngest Major League pitcher to make an Opening Day start since José Fernández, who did so in Miami for the Marlins on March 31, 2014, when he was 21 years and 243 days old....Skenes, who was the top pick in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft, also became the fastest No. 1 overall selection to make an Opening Day start...According to Major League Baseball, the previous quickest to do so were Mike Moore (top pick in 1981 and Opening Day starter in 1984) and Stephen Strasburg (top pick in 2009 and Opening Day starter in 2012).

ROOKIE OF THE YEAR HONORS: Last year, Skenes became the second player in Pirates history to take home BBWAA Rookie of the Year honors, along with Jason Bay in 2004...He became the first rookie pitcher to make at least 23 starts and post a sub-2.00 ERA in a single season since Scott Perry with the Philadelphia Athletics in 1918...He also became the 24th pitcher to win the N.L. Rookie of the Year Award and the first to do so since Devin Williams with Milwaukee in 2020.

IN A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN: Skenes recorded a 1.96 earned run average in 23 starts during his rookie season in 2024...His 1.96 ERA from the time of his big-league debut on May 11 through the end of the season was the lowest in all of MLB...His .198 batting average against was also the lowest by a Pirates starting pitcher in team history (minimum 16 starts)...His 1.96 ERA was the lowest by a Major League rookie pitcher (minimum 18 starts) in the Live-Ball era (since 1920).

ALL-STAR HONORS: Skenes entered the 2024 All-Star break with a 6-0 record, 1.90 ERA, 0.92 WHIP, 89 strikeouts and 13 walks in 11 starts...The strikeout total was the fifth-most in Major League history (since 1901) through 11 starts...When he started for the National League on July 16 in Arlington, he became one of five rookie pitchers to start the All-Star Game, joining Hideo Nomo (1995), Fernando Valenzuela (1981), Mark Fidrych (1976) and Dave Stenhouse (1962).
