The Mariners and Twins meet today for the second of 6 games during the regular season...prior to Thursday, these two teams had not faced each other since June 13, 2019...the Mariners will host the Twins at T-Mobile Park for a 3-game series, June 14-16...the Mariners are 11-10 against the Twins since the start of 2017, including 5-6 over that span at Target Field.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue their first road trip of the season with a 5,600-mile, 8-day, 7-game odyssey that includes trips to Minnesota (0-1) and Baltimore (4 games) before returning home to Seattle...opened the season at T-Mobile Park going 3-3 vs. the Giants (2-1) and White Sox (1-2)... today's game will be televised on *ROOT Sports NW*, as well as broadcast on *710 ESPN Seattle*.

<u>ODDS AND ENDS</u>...lost on Thursday afternoon...went 3-3 on the first homestand 3-3 vs. the Giants (2-1) and White Sox (1-2)...are 1-1 in day games and 2-3 at night...are 2-2 at T-Mobile Park and 0-1 on the road... are 3-1 when scoring at least 4 runs.

- Taxi Squad RHP Robert Dugger, C José Godoy, OF Luis Liberato, RHP Eric Swanson and INF Donovan Walton are on the Mariners taxi squad and traveling on the current road trip.
- No Runs For You RH Chris Flexen (5.0), RH Kendall Graveman (3.0) and LH Anthony Misiewicz (3.2) and combined to toss 11.2 scoreless innings this season.
- Take it to the Grave Dating back to Sept. 19, 2020, Kendall Graveman has tossed 8.1 scoreless innings over 6 games...during this stretch he has limited opponents to a .120 (3x25) while walking 4 and striking out 7.
- Bullpen Bully After allowing a home run to the first batter faced in 2021 (A. Dickerson-SF), Rafael Montero has retired each of the last 10 batters faced, including striking out 6.
- Getting a Win The Mariners have not been swept in their last 10 series of three-or-more games...that is the 2nd-longest active streak in the American League (Yankees, 11: Twins are third with 8).
- 2nd-longest active streak in the American League (Yankees, 11; Twins are third with 8).

 Road Warriors The Mariners are in game #2 of a stretch of 15 of 20 games on the road (0-1).
- **DH** The Mariners designated hitters have combined to hit .348 (8x23) with 3 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 home runs, 4 RBI and 5 walks in 7 games...the team's .348 batting average by the DH is the 6th-highest in the American League, trailing only Boston (.467/14x30), Chicago-AL (.457/16x35), Minnesota (.421/8x19), Texas (.385/10x26), and Los Angeles-NL (.375/6x16).

EMMY NOMINATION...the Seattle Mariners production of *Kyle Lewis: Writing My Own Story* has been nominated for an Emmy Award in the Sports – One-Time Special category...the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences (NATAS), Northwest Chapter, released its list of Northwest Regional Emmy® Nominations on Friday afternoon...a My Oh My Production, Writing My Own Story featured original interviews and documentary footage of Kyle Lewis' path to being unanimously voted the 2020 Jackie Robinson Rookie of the Year in the American League...Gregg Greene (Vice President of Marketing) and Ben Mertens (Sr. Director – Mariners Productions), served as Executive Producers on the special, while Tim Walsh (Director of Digital Marketing & Social Media) was the Producer, Sam Findlay (Motions Graphic Designer) and Eric Vaughn were Associated Producers and Dan Oleskowicz (Manager & Producer - Video Productions) was the editor on the piece...conceived and produced entirely in-house by the Mariners, Kyle Lewis: Writing My Own Story was originally streamed by the Mariners, but then ran on ROOT SPORTS and, eventually, the MLB Network...it is available on the Mariners YouTube channel: YouTube.com/Mariners.

LEADER AMONG US...Ty France has reach base safely in all 7 games he has appeared this season, including recording at least 1 hit in 6 games...overall this season he is batting .346 (9x26) with 5 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 4 RBI, 1 HBP and 4 walks...France ranks among American League leaders in hits (T10th, 9), times on base (T11th, 14), on-base percentage (12th, .452) and average (18th, .346).

IN RELIEF...the Mariners relievers have combined for 35 batters in 30.2 innings in relief this season... their 35 strikeouts are currently 5th-most in the American League, trailing only New York-AL (39), Toronto (39), Boston (38), and Los Angeles-AL (38), while ranking ahead of Detroit (34)...Rafael Montero (6), Drew Steckenrider (6) and Kendall Graveman (5) lead the Mariners relievers in strikeouts.

BRING ON THE OFF DAY...after a day off yesterday, the Mariners begin a stretch of 25 games over the next 26 days, April 10-May 5...their only day off during this stretch will be on Wednesday, April 21...the Mariners will play 14 consecutive games April 22-May 5, their 2nd-longest stretch without a day off this season...they will play in a season-high 17 consecutive games, May 21-June 6 and will also play in 13 consecutive games, Sept. 17-29.

BRING ON THE CENTRAL...the Mariners face an AL Central opponent in 6 of their first 9 game of the season (1-3)...Seattle went 18-15 vs. the Central in 2019...since 2001 the Mariners have had 9 winning seasons vs. the AL Central (31-10 in 2001, 23-18 in 2002, 32-13 in 2003, 23-20 in 2007, 25-16 in 2012, 19-14 in 2014, 18-16 in 2017, 23-9 in 2018 and 18-15 in 2019), including a winning record vs. the Central in each of their last 3 seasons (2017-2019)...dating back to 2017, the Mariners are 59-42 vs. the AL Central, their highest winning percentage during this stretch vs. any division.

GETTING ON BASE....Since joining the Mariners on Sept. 4, 2020, **Ty France** has reached base safely (via hit, walk or hit by pitch) in 28 of 30 games, including 24 games with at least 1 hit...during this stretch he is batting .313 (35x112) with 15 runs scored, 7 doubles, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 17 RBI, 3 HBP and 10 walks...during this stretch his .313 batting average is currently the 7th-highest in the American League, trailing Jared Walsh-LAA (.340/36x106), DJ LeMahieu-NYY (.336/41x122), Whit Merrifield-KC (.325/39x120), Willi Castro-DET (.325/37x114), Cedric Mullins-BAL (.324/34x105), and Lourdes Gurriel Jr.-TOR (.318/35x110)...also during this stretch he ranks among the AL leaders in on-base percentage (3rd, .384), times on base (T3rd, 48), OPS (6th, .857), doubles (T6th, 7), OPS (5th, .852), walks (T6th, 10), total bases (111th, 53) and slugging percentage (11th, .473).

<u>IN THE PIPELINE</u>...with the addition of infielder **Noelvi Marte**, the Mariners currently have 7 prospects in MLB Pipeline's updated top-100 Prospects List, tied with Tampa Bay for most of any club...outfielder **Jarred Kelenic** is #4, outfielder **Julio Rodríguez** is #5, right-handed pitcher **Emerson Hancock** is #28, right-handed pitcher **Logan Gilbert** is #30, right-handed pitcher **George Kirby** is #85, outfielder **Taylor Trammell** is #93 and **Marte** is #100...the Mariners are the only team with 2 players in the top 5 and 4 players in the top 30.

AS YOU KNOW...Kyle Seager made his Major League debut with Seattle on July 7, 2011 and has appeared in 1,328 games with the Mariners since his debut...BUT, DID YOU KNOW?...Seager's 1,328 games with Seattle are 6th-most among active players with games played for by only one team?...Seager trails only Yadier Molina-STL (2,032), Joey Zotto-CIN (1,778), Ryan Zimmerman-WAS (1,693), Brett Gardner-NYY (1,553) and Freddie Freeman-ATL (1,413)...Seager trails only Edgar Martinez (2,055) for most games played in a career only with the Mariners.

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 2nd start of the season, his 43rd Major League start and his 3rd career start against the Twins.
- Signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021
- with options through 2025. Native of Morioka, Japan...pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School.
- Was the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft by the Saitama Seibu Lions of Japan's Pacific League.
- In 7 seasons with Seibu, was 69-45 with a 2.69 ERA (286 ER, 956.1 IP) with 879 strikeouts and 363 walks in 148 games (144 starts)...had 13 complete games, including 7 shutouts.
- Resides in Tokyo, Japan with wife, Rumi (married in 2016), and son, Leo...Rumi previously worked as a broadcaster for NHK TV.
- LAST START...ND in 2021 debut on 4/2 vs. SF...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed 3 ER on 6 hits 1 walk with a career-high tying 10 strikeouts...left the game with the score tied 3-3 after the 6th inning in 3-6 Mariners loss.
- TAKKKKE A SEAT...tied career high with 10 strikeouts on April 2 vs. San Francisco, while tossing 6.0 innings and allowing 3 earned runs on 6 hits with 1 walk...also notched 10 Ks on May 3, 2019 at Cleveland...is the only Mariners pitcher to record 10+ strikeouts in a game since James Paxton fanned 10 on Sept. 1, 2018 at OAK.
- **SPRING TRAINING RECAP...**went 0-2 with a 3.24 ERA (3 ER, 8.1 IP) in 3 official Spring Training starts: March 2 vs. CLE (L-2.0,1,1,1,1,3), March 8 at CLE (L-3.0,2,1,1,2,0,HR) and March 14 vs. MIL (ND-3.12,1,1,0,1,6).
- BRINGING THE HEAT...Kikuchi's 4-seam fastball averaged 95.0 MPH in his first start of 2021...among left-handed starters to have thrown at least 25 4-seam fastballs this season, his 95.0 mph average velocity ranks 5th in MLB, trailing only Adrian Morejon (96.8), Carlos Rodon (95.4), Trevor Rogers (95.3) and Jesús Luzardo (95.1).
- SMALL BALL...Kikuchi was 1 of 10 players in MLB to make 9-or-more starts and allow 3 or less home runs in 2020...the others include Justus Sheffield-SEA (10 GS, 2 HR), Max Fried-ATL (11 GS, 2 HR), Randy Dobnak-MIN (10 GS, 3 HR), Dallas Keuchel-CWS (11 GS, 2 HR), Brad Keller-KC (9 GS, 2 HR), Corbin Burnes-MIL (9 GS, 2 HR), Spencer Turnbull-DET (11 GS, 2 HR), Zack Wheeler-PHI (11 GS, 3 HR) and Steven Brault-PIT (10 GS, 2 HR).
- START ME UP...Yusei has made 42 career starts with Seattle in his 3-year Major Leauge career...he is currently T13th in starts as a Japanese-born pitcher in the Major Leagues (als: Kenshin Kawakami)...he trails Mac Suzuki (1996-2005), whose 67 starts are currently 12th-most...Hideo Nomo hold the record for a Japanese-born pitcher with 318 career MLB starts...Kikuchi's 42 starts trail Hisashi Iwakuma's 136 starts (2012-17) for most in Mariners club history.
- 2020 RECAP...went 2-4 with a 5.17 ERA (27 ER, 47.0 IP) with 20 walks and 47 strikeouts in 9 starts during his second Major League season...tossed at least 6.0 innings in 4 starts, including 3 of his last 4 starts to end the season.
- HISTORIC DEBUT...with his start March 21, 2019 at Oakland in the Tokyo Dome, became the first Japanese-born player to make his Major League debut in Japan...was just his second career start (3rd appearance) as a professional in the Tokyo Dome.
- COMPLETELY KIKUCHI... recorded his first career complete game shutout on August 18, 2019 at Toronto, pitching 9.0 scoreless innings and allowing only 2 hits and 1 walk with 8 strikeouts...he became just the 14th pitcher (done 17x) in club history to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (last: Mike Montgomery, 6/30/15 at SD)...was the 4th Mariners pitcher since 2000 to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (also: Mike Montgomery, Roenis Elías, and Gil

<u>WELCOME TO SEATTLE...</u>signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025... is the 10th Japanese-born player to appear with the Mariners, including the 6th pitcher...is the 3rd Japanese-born pitcher to start a game for the Mariners (also: Hisashi Iwakuma, 136 GS; and Mac Suzuki, 9 GS).

EARLY YEARS...the native of Morioka, Japan, pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School...helped lead his high school to a runner-up finish at the national high school invitational in April and to the semifinals in the national championship in August before being the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft...made his professional debut for Seibu's minor league team in 2011 and also pitched with Melbourne in the Australian Winter League that year.

JAPAN CAREER...was a 3-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2018)...in 2017, led the Pacific League in ERA (1.97) and wins (16)...posted a 69-45 mark with a 2.69 ERA (286 ER, 956.1 IP) over 7 seasons with the Saitama Seibu Lions in Japan's Pacific League.

26-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his second start of the season tomorrow vs. the Twins...tossed 5.0 scoreless innings on 4/3 vs. SF with 2 walks and 6 strikeouts to pick up his first win as a Mariner...**WELCOME TO SEATTLE**: Signed a a 2-year Major League contract with Seattle, that also includes an option for 2023 on December 18, 2020...**KBO TOTALS**: Spent the 2020 season with the Doosan Bears in the Korean Baseball Organization and went 8-4 with a 3.01 ERA (39 ER, 116.2 IP) with 30 walks and 132 strikeouts over 21 starts...during the Bears' playoff run, in which they fell to the NC Dinos 4-2 in the Korean Series, he posted a 1.91 ERA (6 ER, 28.1 IP), pitching in both starting and relieving roles...**CAREER**: Flexen has appeared in 3 Major League seasons with New York-NL (2017-19)...was originally selected by the Mets in the 14th round of the 2012 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Newark Memorial (CA) High School...made his Major League debut with New York-NL on July 27, 2017 at San Diego...vs. MIN: Is scheduled to make his first career start vs. Minnesota.
