William Contreras last night threw out his 11th runner attempting to steal in 25 attempts this season (44.0%)....his caught stealing percentage ranks the highest among qualified qualified MLB catchers....only the Cardinals' **Pedro Pages** has thrown out more would-be base stealers this season, going 12-for-38 (31.6%).

THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME: Is the fourth game (2-1) of a brief 4-game homestand against San Francisco....following this series, the team will take a 6-game road trip to Colorado (3g) and Las Vegas to face the Athletics (3g)....the next homestand covers 6 games in 7 days from 6/12-6/18 against Philadelphia (3g) and Cleveland (3g).

IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM: RHP Logan Henderson (back), LHP Jared Koenig (left elbow), **OF Brandon Lockridge** (right knee), RHP Quinn Priester (right thoracic outlet), RHP Brandon Woodruff (right shoulder), LHP Rob Zastryzny (left trapezius) and LHP Angel Zerpa (left forearm) are on the injured list....Zerpa is on the 60-day IL.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy (383g, 227-156, .593) is in his third season as Brewers manager....he was voted NL Manager of the Year in 2024 and 2025....he is one of four managers ever to win Manager of the Year in consecutive seasons, joining the Braves' Bobby Cox (2004-05), Rays' Kevin Cash (2020-21) and Guardians' Stephen Vogt (2024-25)....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he signed a multi-year contract extension on 2/20/26.

COACHES: Returning from the 2025 staff is offense & strategy coordinator **Jason Lane** (11th season/1st in current role), pitching coordinator **Jim Henderson** (5th season/1st in current role), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (4th season/3rd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (8th season), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (3rd season), lead hitting coach **Eric Theisen** (2nd season/1st in current role) and third base coach **Matt Erickson** (3rd season/1st in current role)....assistant pitching coach **Juan Sandoval**, hitting coach **Guillermo Martinez**, hitting coach **Daniel Vogelbach** and first base coach **Spencer Allen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

IN THE STANDINGS (70 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: **FIRST:** 32, **SECOND:** 10, **THIRD:** 8, **FOURTH:** 13, **FIFTH:** 7....the Brewers are currently in first place, leading the Cardinals and Pirates by 5.5 games, Cubs by 6.5 games and Reds by 7.0 games.

AT HOME: The Brewers are 21-12 at home, going 7-3-0 in series play....the team is 13-5 in its last 18 home games, including a pair of season-high 5-game winning streaks coming from 4/30-5/12 and 5/25-6/2.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 16-10 on the road, going 6-2-1 in series play....the team is 8-2 in its last 10 road games.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 21 replay challenges this season, going 16-5....their last challenge (lost) came on 5/30 at Houston as a safe call at home plate involving Cam Smith stood.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and three seasons in a row....the team was just two games away from making the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing out in both 2017 and 2022 by a single game....Milwaukee has won the NL Central in four of the last five seasons and three seasons in a row.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 800 wins since 2017, which ranks fourth in the majors behind the Dodgers (893), Astros (834) and Yankees (824).

CROW AT A GLANCE: Coleman Crow, 25, will be making his fourth start for the Brewers.....Crow last started last Friday at Houston and had no decision in the Brewers' 5-4, 10-inning win (4ip, 4h, 4r, 2er, 2bb, 1k, 1hr, 61 pitches).....the team is 3-0 in his starts.....opponents are batting .212 (11-for-52, 1hr).....he made his Major League debut on 4/17 at Miami and received no decision in the Brewers' 7-5, 10-inning win (5.1ip, 4h, 2r, 2er, 1bb, 4k, 77 pitches).....Crow has also gone 4-1 with a 4.89 ERA in 7 games/6 starts this season at Triple-A Nashville (35ip, 32h, 19r, 19er, 14bb, 39k, 5hr).....he was acquired from New York-NL on 12/20/23 in exchange for RHP Adrian Houser and OF Tyrone Taylor.

LAST SEASON: Crow went 4-1 with a 3.24 ERA in 12 starts between Double-A Biloxi (10gs) and Triple-A Nashville (2gs).....he was Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Month for June (3gs, 3-0, 1.06era, 17ip, 1bb, 24k).....he did not pitch after July 9 due to a right flexor strain.....Crow was added to the 40-man roster last November 3.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Is 23-8 with a 4.21 ERA in 60 games/55 starts (299.1ip, 282h, 153r, 140er, 96bb, 324k, 38hr) in the Angels (2021-24) and Brewers (2025-26) farm systems.....he missed most of the 2023 season and the entire 2024 season as he recovered from "Tommy John" surgery, performed on 7/11/23 by Dr. David Altschek.....Crow was selected by the Angels in the 28th round of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft and traded to the Mets on 6/23/23 as part of the deal for INF Eduardo Escobar.

AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Crow has not pitched in Milwaukee.

ON THE ROAD: Is 0-0 with a 3.14 ERA in 3 starts (14.1ip, 5er).

vs. GIANTS: Crow has not faced San Francisco.

ODDS & ENDS: Crow graduated from Pike County (GA) High School and committed to Kennesaw State University prior to being drafted....he had 34 supporters on hand for his Major League debut in Miami, mostly coming from Georgia, including his wife, Avery, parents, two sisters, brother, in-laws, two sets of grandparents and his high school coach.
