METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Reds, 9-6, yesterday in the Queen City...New York is looking for their first series victory of the 2024 season...The Mets continue on their first road trip in 2024, a seven-game trip (1-1) visiting Cincinnati (1-1) and Atlanta (four games)...The Mets are currently in a streak of 15 games in 14-days... New York has gone 2-2 in that span.

REDS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 40-25 at Great American Ball Park since the facility opened in 2003.

WHAT A MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA: Sean Manaea is set to make his second start of the season...In his first career start with the Mets, April 1 vs. Detroit, Manaea did not allow a hit through his first 5.2 innings...It was the longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their team debut and the second-longest no-hit bid by a Mets pitcher in their first career start with team...Tracy Stallard threw 6.0 no-hit in his first career start with the Mets on June 2, 1963 vs. Pittsburgh after making 13 relief appearances to begin his career with New York... He joined Kenny Rogers (7/2/28/99) as the only Mets pitcher to allow one hit and throw 6.0 or more innings in their team debut... He recorded eight strikeouts, which tied Johan Santana (3/31/08) for the most punch outs by a Mets left-handed pitcher in their team debut and were tied for the seventh-most by any Mets pitcher in their team debut...Credit Elias.

SEEING RED AGAIN: In three games at Great American Ball Park, Francisco Alvarez is a .267 (4-15) hitter with two runs, one double, two home runs, two RBI and a walk...Francisco Lindor has hit .289 (28-97) with 17 runs, three doubles, seven home runs, 13 RBI, eight walks with a .536 SLG...Brandon Nimmo has hit .300/.410/.471 with five extra-base hits and 12 RBI...Pete Alonso has hit five home runs in 14 games at the ballpark.

MENDOZA LINES: Carlos Mendoza was named the 25th manager in franchise history...The 44-year-old spent the previous 15 seasons with the Yankees organization, including the last four as the club's bench coach...From 2018-2019, Mendoza served as the Yankees' quality control coach...Prior to joining the big league coaching staff, Mendoza served as a manager and coach in the Yankees farm system...A native of Barquisimeto, Venezuela, Mendoza is the second full-time Venezuelan-born manager in big league history, joining Ozzie Guillén.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is batting .333 (8-24) with three runs, one home run, four RBI, one walks with a .360 OBP, a .583 SLG and a .943 OPS through seven games this season.

HERE'S THE PITCH: The Mets pitching staff has posted a 2.92 ERA (24 ER/74.0 IP) with 33 walks and 79 strikeouts...The team's 2.92 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit...That places sixth in the major leagues.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil has recorded 206 multi-hit games in his career...That places him 18th on the Mets All-Time list...Next up is Lee Mazzilli who record 207 multi-ht games, followed by Kevin McReynolds with 208 and Félix Millán who managed 211 such games with the Mets.

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has posted a 2.18 ERA (10 ER/41.1 IP) with 19 walks and 42 strikeouts...Their 2.18 ERA is the best in the National League and third-best in the majors.

THIS BUD'S FOR YOU: In January, Mets Hall of Famer Buddy Harrelson passed away at age 79 at after a lengthy battle with Alzheimer's...Harrelson played for the Mets from 1965-1977 and was a member of the 1969 Miracle Mets, a two-time All-Star (1970 and 1971) and earned the 1971 Gold Glove at shortstop...He later would serve as a coach with the Mets in 1982 and again from 1985-1990. Harrelson took over the managerial duties early in the 1990 season and led the Mets through the 1991 campaign...In honor of his life and legacy, the Mets will wear a patch commemorating him all season long.

BRETT THE MET: Brett Baty has reached base safely in all but one game this season...He is batting 8-27 (.296) with three runs, one home run, five RBI, three walks with a .367 OBP.

THE GOOD DOC: On Sunday, April 14 the New York Mets will retire Doc Gooden's number 16... Gooden spent 11 years with the Mets, winning the 1984 NL Rookie of the Year Award while setting a major league rookie record with 276 strikeouts and was the youngest player ever named to an All-Star team at age 19...The following year, Doc became the youngest pitcher ever to win Cy Young honors when he captured the "Triple Crown" of pitching, leading the majors in wins (24), strikeouts (268) and ERA (1.53)... Gooden was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2010...He ranks second in franchise history in wins (157) and strikeouts (1,875) and third in innings (2,169.2), complete games (67), starts (303) and quality starts (209).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is in the midst of their first road trip of the year...The team is 1-1 away from Citi Field in 2024...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023...The team posted a 4.73 ERA while batting .241/.316/.401...The Mets went 47-34 on the road in 2022.

2023 HIGHLIGHTS: Appeared in 37 games (10 starts) with the San Francisco Giants...Made his first start of the season vs. Kansas City on April 8 and allowed one run over 6.0 innings while tallying eight strikeouts...Was a starter in six of his first eight games of the season before becoming a full-time reliever on May 16...Tied a season-high eight strikeouts in just 3.2 innings of relief on May 22 at Minnesota... Became the first MLB left-hander to throw at least 80 pitches and strike out 8+ batters in a scoreless relief outing since Randy Johnson struck out 16 in 7.0 innings on July 19, 2001...Courtesy of OptaSTATS... Did not allow a home run in a 53.2 inning stretch from May 22 through his first inning of work on August 21 at Philadelphia...Rejoined the rotation on September 12 and started his final four games of the season, going 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA (6 ER/24.0 IP)...Pitched to a 2.61 ERA (15 ER/51.2 IP), the third-best mark in the NL and ninth-best in the majors (Min. 50.0 IP).

SWEEPIN SAMOAN: At the end of May 2023, Manaea introduced a sweeper to his arsenal... Last season, the pitch generated a 35.1 percent whiff rate and kept batters to a .140 average and .163 slugging percentage...The southpaw allowed just six hits (five singles and a double) in 49 plate appearances ending with the offering.

SUPERB SOUTHPAW: Since his debut season, 2016, Manaea ranks in the top-10 among left-handed pitchers in several categories including innings (1008.2, seventh), wins (65, ninth) and strikeouts (933, 10th)...In 2021, Manaea was tied for the AL lead with 32 games started and ranked eight in the AL with a career-high 194 strikeouts...In 2018, Manaea ranked sixth in the AL in WHIP with a 1.08 clip (Min. 150.0 IP).

NO HITS FOR YOU: On April 20, 2018, Manaea threw a no-hitter against the Red Sox in Oakland...The southpaw walked two and struck out 10...It was the 12th no-hitter in Athletics history and the first since Dallas Braden's perfect game on May 9, 2010 vs. Oakland...According to Elias, the Red Sox .895 winning percentage entering the game was the highest in major league history by a team that was no-hit at least five games into the season.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JULIO TEHERAN (0-0, -.-)

WELCOME TO NEW YORK: On April 5, the Mets and Julio Teheran agreed to a one-year contract...Last season, the Cartagena, Colombia native appeared in 14 games (11 starts) with the Brewers and went 3-5 with a 4.40 ERA (35 ER/71.2 IP)... The 33-year-old has spent 12 seasons in the majors with the Braves (2011-2019), Angels (2020), Tigers (2021) and Brewers (2023).

I USED TO WORK HERE: Teheran will make his Mets debut against the Atlanta Braves, the team that originally signed him in 2007...Teheran spent his first nine major league season with the Braves from 2011-2019 and went 77-73 with a 3.67 ERA (554 ER/1360.0 IP) over 229 games (226 starts)...Teheran was named a National League All-Star twice with Atlanta (2014, 2016) and made six consecutive Opening Day starts with the Braves from 2014-2019.

- In 2023, ranked second in the majors in RBI (118) and third in homers (46)...His 46 homers were the second the second most in a single season in Mets history, behind only his record-setting, 53-homer 2019 campaign...His 118 RBI were the sixth-most by a Met in a single season...Became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry recorded three seasons each.
- Reached the 40-home run mark for the third time in five big league seasons...Only one player (Ralph Kiner) has had more 40-HR seasons through his first five career seasons...His three seasons with 40+ homers are tied with Nolan Arenado and Mike Trout for the most such seasons by an active player, while his two seasons with 45+ homers are tied with Aaron Judge and Kyle Schwarber for the most such seasons among active players.

- Tied for 14th in the NL with 66 XBH...Ranked 14th in the NL with 98 RBI...Tied for eighth in the majors and tied for seventh in the NL with 108 runs scored.
- Tied for sixth in the NL with 6.0 fWAR in 2023...His 15.6 fWAR is the seventh-best in the NL since 2021.
- Had a season-high 13-game hitting streak (.367, 18-49) from August 14-28, tied for the second-longest streak of his career...His longest was a 15-game streak from April 29-May 14, 2018 with Cleveland.
- Has four seasons of at least 30 home runs, tied with Miguel Tejada and Ernie Banks for the second-most such seasons by a shortstop in major league history... Only Alex Rodriguez (seven) has had more 30+ home run seasons as a shortstop.
- Is one of seven active players with at least 200+ career home runs and 150+ career stolen bases.
