Brice Turang is the only player on the team who has hit safely in all 7 games this season....he is currently batting .321 (9-for-28, 1hr, 4rbi)....his 7-game hitting streak ties the longest of his career (also 4/6-4/14, 2024).

Back on Track

Since going 0-for-5 with 5 strikeouts on Opening Day, **Jackson Chourio** has hit safely in 6 consecutive games, batting .333 (9-for-27, 1hr, 4rbi) with a .333 OBP/.593 SLG/.926 OPS.

THIS EVENING'S GAME: Is game 5 (3-1) of a 7-game homestand against Kansas City (2-1) and Cincinnati (1-0)....following this homestand and an off day on Monday, the team takes a 6-game road trip to Colorado (3g) and Arizona (3g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without **Bob Uecker** on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970)....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager....Murphy was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after guiding the team to a 93-69 record and the NL Central division championship....he became the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

COACHES: Returning from the 2024 coaching staff is associate manager **Rickie Weeks** (2nd season), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach **Jim Henderson** (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (2nd season), hitting coach **Connor Dawson** (4th season), assistant coach **Daniel de Mondesert** (2nd season), infield coach **Matt Erickson** (2nd season) and third base coach **Jason Lane** (10th season/5th in current role)....first base coach **Julio Borbón**, lead hitting coach **Al LeBoeuf** and hitting coach **Eric Theisen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

2024 IN REVIEW: The Brewers went 93-69 and finished in first place in the NL Central, 10.0 games ahead of the Cardinals and Cubs....they tied the Padres for the fourth-best record in baseball behind the Dodgers (98-64), Phillies (95-67) and Yankees (94-68)....the Brewers lost to the Mets, 2 games to 1, in the NL Wild Card Series in Milwaukee.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times over the last seven seasons (missed in 2022) and have won the NL Central in four of the last seven seasons, three of the last four, and two straight....the Brewers are one of just five teams to qualify for the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons....they are joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6).

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 669 wins since 2017, which ranks sixth in the majors and third in the National League....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight consecutive seasons, missing out by just a game in both 2017 and 2022.

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #33 - LHP TYLER ALEXANDER (2g, 0-0, 5.40)

ALEXANDER AT A GLANCE: Tyler Alexander, 30, will be making his third appearance and first start of the season....Alexander last took the hill last Sunday at New York-AL (2.1ip, 1h, 2r, 2er, 2bb, 2k, 47 pitches)....he made his Brewers debut on Opening Day at Yankee Stadium (1ip, 1h, 0r, 0bb, 1k, 16 pitches)....Alexander signed with Milwaukee as a free agent on Feb. 12....he is signed through the 2025 season.

LAST SEASON: Alexander went 6-5 with a 5.10 ERA in 23 games/9 starts with Tampa Bay as he set career highs for wins, strikeouts (90) and innings pitched (107.2)....he went 1-2 with a 4.14 ERA as a starter (45.2ip, 21er) and 5-3 with a 5.81 ERA as a reliever (62ip, 40er) in 2024....he pitched at least 3.0 innings in 13 of his 14 relief outings, including 4.0 innings or more 11 times.

CAREER: Is 17-28 with a 4.56 ERA in 145 games/52 starts (452.1ip, 229er)....is in his seventh Major League season pitching for Detroit (2019-23), Tampa Bay (2004) and Milwaukee (2025)....has gone 5-22 with a 4.60 ERA as a starter (244.2ip, 125er) and 12-6 with a 4.51 ERA as a reliever (207.2ip, 104er)....Alexander was selected by Detroit in the second round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft out of Texas Christian University.

IN CONTROL: Alexander has issued just 100 walks in 452.1 career innings pitched (1.99 BB/9 IP).

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 0-1 with a 6.43 ERA in 4 games/2 starts (7ip, 5er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 6-16 with a 4.40 ERA in 75 games/30 starts (235ip, 115er)....went 3-3 with a 4.03 ERA in 11 games/6 starts last season (51.1ip, 23er).

CAREER vs. REDS: Has gone 0-0 with a 2.00 ERA in 3 career games/1 start (9ip, 4h, 2r, 2er, 3bb, 16k, 2hr)....his only career start against Cincinnati came as a member of the Tigers on 9/3/21 at Great American Ball Park....he received no decision in the Tigers' 15-5 win (3.2ip, 2h, 1r, 1er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr).
