GRAND CENTRAL STAY-TION: Fresh off a series win vs. the Cleveland Guardians (2-1), the Detroit Tigers tonight continue their critical A.L. Central homestand with the first of three games against the division-leading Chicago White Sox ... the Tigers have won nine of their last 12 games and are 16-9 in their 25 games since the All-Star Break.

- This weekend marks the third series between the Tigers and the White Sox this season with each team having already completed a three-game sweep in its home ballpark.
- This homestand marked the start of nine games vs. the A.L. Central in a 12-game stretch through Sunday, August 23 ... after a brief intradivision respite to start the club's next road trip in Pittsburgh, the Tigers conclude that trek with three games at Kansas City.
- Of Detroit's 41 remaining games this season, nearly half (20) are against A.L. Central foes ... the Tigers are 13-19 in their first 32 games against their division this year ... among the top four teams in the division, the Tigers are the lone club with a sub-.500 intradivision record vs. the A.L. Central behind the White Sox (20-13), Guardians (19-17) and Twins (19-18).

WHERE THINGS STAND: The Tigers are 38-23 since the beginning of June, the second-best record in the A.L. behind only the Boston Red Sox (40-23) in this span and the third-best record in baseball.

- The Tigers woke up on June 1 in fourth place in the A.L. Central, 11.0 games behind the first-place Guardians, and 7.0 games behind for the third Wild Card spot with every team in the A.L. to leap frog ... since posting the second-best record in the A.L. starting on June 1, the Tigers woke up today, August 14, in second place in the A.L. Central, 2.5 games behind the first-place White Sox, and in sole possession of the third Wild Card spot in the American League.

THE FINAL QUARTER: With 41 games to go, the Tigers tonight embark upon the final quarter of their 2026 campaign ... the Tigers went 18-22 through their first 40 games and then 16-25 in their next 41 games to reach the 81-game halfway mark at 34-47 ... the Tigers have gone 26-14 in their last 40 games to creep back within one game of the .500 mark.

OH BLANK!: The Tigers yesterday recorded their 14th shutout of the season, tops in the A.L. and second most in the majors behind only the Phillies (15) ... the Tigers have six shutouts in their last 14 games, their first such 14-game stretch in franchise history ... the Tigers are one of only eight teams since 2000 to throw six shutouts in a 14-game stretch ... thanks to OptaSTATS.

EVERYONE IS PITCHING IN: The Tigers pitching staff has turned in a 2.93 ERA and a .641 OPS against starting June 1, the lowest marks in all of baseball in this span.

- Tigers starting pitchers lead the majors with a 2.81 ERA in this span, well ahead of the next-closest Marlins (3.19) and Red Sox (3.40), and Tigers starters lead with a .631 OPS against.
- Tigers relievers rank fourth best in all of baseball with a 3.12 ERA starting June 1.

BY JOBE I THINK HE'S BACK: Jackson Jobe last Saturday in San Francisco got the win (5.0 IP/0 R) in his return after missing 14.5 months due to Tommy John surgery ... Jobe's 2025 campaign was off to an excellent start before injury struck as he set a franchise record with the club going 8-0 in his first eight career starts, surpassing Howie Koplitz and Detroit's 7-0 record through his first seven career starts from September 30, 1961-August 25, 1962, before the team lost Jobe's ninth start.

- The Tigers are now 10-1 in Jobe's first 11-career major league starts ... Jobe is the first pitcher in Tigers franchise history to have the club win 10 of his first 11 major league starts ... four pitchers saw the club go 9-2 through 11 starts, most recently Michael Fulmer in 2016.
- Jobe is the first pitcher in baseball to see his team win 10 of his first 11 starts since Parker Bridwell with the Angels in 2017 (also 10-1) ... thanks to OptaSTATS.

MAN O WAR: Kevin McGonigle leads the A.L. with a 5.6 bWAR, ahead of Triple Crown candidate Yordan Alvarez (5.5) for tops in the A.L. ... McGonigle trails only PCA (7.4 bWAR) for best in baseball.

THE BEST CATCHER IN BASEBALL: Dillon Dingler boasts a 5.4 fWAR this season, the third-best fWAR by a position player in baseball and fourth-best overall, as Dingler trails only Pete Crow-Armstrong (7.9), Shohei Ohtani (6.6 fWAR: 3.6 as position player, 3.0 as pitcher) and Yordan Alvarez (5.6).

IT HAS BEEN A GRIND: Through their first 26 games of 2026, the Tigers went 14-12 and woke up on April 24 with a share of first place in the A.L. Central ... in 95 games since, the Tigers have gone 46-49 to drop to 60-61 and second place in the division ... Detroit's 46-49 (.484) record starting April 24 is the 12th-lowest winning percentage in baseball in this span.

- Despite going 38-23 starting June 1, the Tigers have lost 34 of their last 76 games, 37 of their last 80 games and 44 of their last 86 games starting May 4.

AND FINALLY: The Tigers yesterday shutout the Guardians, 3-0, without striking out any Cleveland batters ... the last time this happened anywhere in baseball?: 12 years ago when Detroit's Rick Porcello tossed a complete-game, 3-0 shutout vs. the Athletics on July 1, 2014 ... the Tigers have turned this trick three times in the last 20+ years: yesterday, July 1, 2014 and May 17, 2006 vs. Minnesota when Justin Verlander (8.0 IP) and Todd Jones (1.0 IP) combined on a seven-hit, 2-0 shutout ... in the 20+ years since May 17, 2006, the other 29 teams have combined to do this once.

- The Tigers are now 10-1 in his first 11-career major league starts...first pitcher in Tigers franchise history to have the club win 10 of his first 11 major league starts
- Made his first start of the season after missing 14.5 months due to Tommy John surgery on Aug. 8 against San Francisco, allowed just one hit and one walk while striking out four over 5.0 innings.
- Started a rehab assignment with Lakeland on July 7, FCL Tigers on July 13, Erie on July 19 and West Michigan on Aug. 2...activated by Detroit on Aug. 7 and made his first major league start since May 28, 2025, the next day.
- Placed on the 15-day injured list on May 30, 2025, (retro May 29) with a right grade one flexor strain...transferred to the 60-day injured list on June 12 and had Tommy John surgery on June 16, 2025, ending his season.
- Went 4-0 over his first eight starts, with Detroit winning all eight games...set the club record for consecutive team wins in starts to begin a career. The Tigers won each of Howie Koplitz' first seven career starts from Sept. 30, 1961 - Aug. 25, 1962.
- Earned his first Major League win against the Twins on April 12, 2025, allowing two hits and one walk while striking out two over 6.0 scoreless innings.
- Entered the 2025 season ranked as MLB's No. 5 overall prospect and the top prospect in the Tigers' system according to MLB Pipeline.
- Earned a spot on the 2025 Opening Day roster for the first time in his career after going 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA in five Spring Training starts.
- Was promoted to the Majors near the end of the 2024 season and pitched in two regular season games with the Tigers, working 4.0 scoreless innings with one hit allowed, one walk and two strikeouts.
- Made his Major League debut on Sept. 25, 2024 vs. Tampa Bay, closing out Detroit's win with a scoreless ninth inning.
- At 22 years and 64 days old, was Detroit's fourth-youngest pitcher to appear in a postseason game (Oct. 2), trailing only Joel Zumaya (2006), Fred Hutchinson (1940) and Ralph Works (1909).

- Allowed a solo home run in his second inning on Aug. 5 against Seattle, snapping his scoreless inning streak at 17.0.
- Threw two perfect frames in his first game back with Detroit, striking out a batter along the way.
- Pitched in seven games (10.1 innings) from July 1-25 with Toledo, allowing five earned runs on 17 hits and two walks while striking out 10...recalled on July 31.
- Allowed just three hits and two walks while striking out 13 batters over 13.0 innings (eight games) from May 21 to June 26 before getting optioned to Toledo on June 28.
- In his first game since May 22, tossed 4.0 perfect innings on June 2 against Tampa Bay to earn his first Major League save...struck out four of the 11 batters he faced.
- Earned the win on Sunday Night Baseball on May 10 against Kansas City, delivering a perfect 2.1 innings with a strikeout.
- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on April 22...recalled on April 29 after making one relief appearance with the Mud Hens...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two over 2.0 innings in the outing.
- Earned the first Major League win of his career with a scoreless inning (one hit, two strikeouts) in his first appearance of the year on March 27 against San Diego.
- Posted a 2-0 record in the World Baseball Classic, helping Team Venezuela to a gold medal...struck out 11 batters with a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) in the tournament.
- Had his contract selected by the Tigers on March 10, 2026, in the midst of the World Baseball Classic.
- Appeared and started in 30 games for the Kiwoom Heroes last season in the KBO with a 13-11 record and 3.68 ERA (72ER/171.1 IP), recording 171 strikeouts.

- Earned his second save of the season, needing just two pitches to induce a game-ending double play on July 23 against Kansas City.
- Struck out all four batters he faced in a perfect 1.1 innings on June 23 against the Yankees.
- Blew a save in the eighth inning against Kansas City on May 8 and ninth inning on May 29 against Chicago.
- Earned his first save of the season on April 30 against Atlanta, allowing one hit while striking out one in a scoreless ninth inning...marked his first save with the Tigers since Aug. 16, 2025, at Minnesota.
- Did not allow a run over his first 11 games (11.0 innings) this year, allowing five hits and eight walks while striking out five over that span...his first earned run came on April 24 against Cincinnati in a game in which he struck out four batters over 1.2 frames.
- Re-signed with Detroit on a two-year deal as a free agent on Dec. 20, 2025...appeared in 16 games with the Tigers last season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (3ER/18IP) with 23 strikeouts.
- Made his first postseason appearance with the Tigers in 2025, playing six games and striking out three in 7.1 innings of work.
- Landed on the injured list on Sept. 5 with a right adductor strain...activated Sept. 19 and allowed one run in three of the first four games since returning from the IL.
- Became the first MLB reliever to change teams at the deadline and immediately throw 14+ scoreless innings since Erik Goeddel in 2018...the first Tigers reliever to do so since Doug Blair in 1983.
- Recorded a four-out save on Aug. 2 at Philadelphia in his Tigers debut...started his Tigers career going 3-0 with a hold and four saves, allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out 19 over his first 14.1 innings (12 games).
- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals in 2025 prior to being traded to Detroit on July 31, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.
