METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets took the final game of their three-game series against the Dodgers, 8-3, yesterday...The win snapped a three-game losing streak and a five-game home losing streak...Their eight runs scored marked their most in a game since their 16-12 loss vs. Kansas City on July 7... Their 13 games straight games scoring seven or fewer runs was their third-longest such streak of the season behind two 15-game streaks (4/5-22, 6/18-7/4)...The Mets are in the midst of a 10-game homestand (1-2) against the Dodgers (1-2), Braves (three games) and Marlins (four games).

LAST TIME OUT: Zac Thornton earned his first Major League win after firing 6.0 scoreless innings in his fourth career start at Milwaukee on July 21 (6.0 IP, 3 H, BB, 2 K)...Each of his last two starts has been scoreless, and dating back to the second inning on June 26, each of his last 18.0 innings has been scoreless...Has thrown at least 6.0 innings and allowed one or zero runs in three of his first four starts, which are tied for the second-most such by a Met this season (also: Clay Holmes) and is only trailing Nolan McLean's six such starts...He joins Clay Holmes and Nolan McLean (2x) as the only other starters who have completed at least 6.0 innings in at least three consecutive starts this season...Through four career starts, he is 1-1 with a 1.93 ERA (5 ER/23.1 IP) with 17 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .175 (14-80) batting average.

GOOSE EGGS: Each of Thornton's last 18.0 innings have been scoreless...It is the longest such streak in franchise history by a rookie starting pitcher since Steven Matz fired 19.0 scoreless innings from May 20-31, 2016...The longest scoreless streak by a Mets rookie starting pitcher in franchise history is 25.0 innings from Jon Maine from July 21-August 12, 2006...He is the first Mets starter with as long a scoreless streak since Kodai Senga tossed 19.2 scoreless innings from April 1-25, 2025...Per Elias.

ZAC ATTACK: Has pitched to a 1.93 ERA through his first four career starts... It is the sixth-best ERA in franchise history by a starter through their first four career starts (min. 20.0 IP)...He is only trailing Nolan McLean (1.37 ERA, 2025), Jim McAndrew (1.82 ERA, 1968), Noah Syndergaard (1.82 ERA, 2015), Steven Matz (1.88 ERA, 2015) and Tom Seaver (1.88 ERA, 1967)...He has fired two shutouts of at least 6.0 innings in his first four career starts, and he is the first pitcher in franchise history to have at least two such starts in their first four career games...He is the first pitcher in the majors with at least two such starts in their first four career starts since Robert Gasser had two shutouts of at least 6.0 innings for Milwaukee in 2024.

WHAT A RELIEF: Yesterday, Cionel Pérez, Brooks Raley, Luke Weaver and Devin Williams combined for 5.0 scoreless innings in relief...Marked the sixth time this season the bullpen has thrown 5.0 or more scoreless innings in a game (last: 5/25/26 vs. Cincinnati)...Mets relievers have not allowed a run in their last 9.0 innings.

TAYLOR MADE: Yesterday, Tyrone Taylor hit a go-ahead three-run homer in the sixth...It marked his second three-run homer of the season that either tied the game or gave the Mets the lead...Hit a game-tying three-run homer when the Mets were down to their final out in the ninth on May 17 vs. Yankees...Since he was activated off of the Injured List, has slashed .382/.462/.941 with five home runs, four doubles and a 1.403 OPS...Has the highest OPS in the majors since June 28 (min. 30 plate appearances)...All five of his home runs since being activated off the Injured List have come in his last 14 games (since 7/4)...Are tied for the most homers he has hit in any 14-game span of his career (also: 4 overlapping spans in 2022)...Has hit four of his eight home runs at Citi Field this season...Only hit three homers in Queens in his first two seasons with the Mets.

IN THE CITI: The Mets snapped a five-game home losing streak yesterday... They have gone 4-12 over their last 16 games at Citi Field after starting the season 18-18 at home...They are now 22-30 at home this year...The team has posted a 4.26 ERA, while batting .233/.311/.384 at Citi Field.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are 66-84 against the Braves since Citi Field opened in 2009...The Mets have won five of their last eight contests against the Braves in New York.

FRANC-LY SPEAKING: Yesterday, Francisco Lindor put the Mets on the board with an RBI single in the first...Over his last 10 games, is batting .282/.364/.513 (11-39) with two home runs, three doubles, seven RBI and an .876 OPS.

BO KNOWS: Bo Bichette has hit safely in six of his last seven games including four multi-hit games...Overall, he has 29 multi-hit games this season...Over his last 44 games since June 3, Bo Bichette has a .320/.353/.471 slashline with 24 runs, nine doubles, one triple, five homers, 10 walks, 24 RBI with an .824 OPS.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The St. Lucie Mets climbed out of an early 5-0 hole and rallied for an 11-8 win over the Fort Myers Mighty Mussels in the series finale on Sunday afternoon at Clover Park... LHP Conner Ware took over on the mound for the Mets in the third inning and seized control of the game. He fired 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out a career-high eight batters. Ware walked one and gave up just one hit. He struck out the side swinging in the fourth inning then struck out the side looking in the sixth...He was credited with the win...He has struck out 76 in 61.2 innings this year.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets defeated the Braves, 5-1, at Atlanta-Fulton County Stadium...Rick Auilera earned his fourth win after tossing a complete game...He allowed one run on eight hits with two strikeouts...Gary Carter, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin Mitchell all homered in the victory...The Mets recorded three hits in the loss...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions..The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70...The Mets are 10-15 since Green took the helm.

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WELCOME TO THE SHOW: His Major League debut came on May 20 at Washington (4.1 IP, 4 H, 4 ER, 2 BB, 3 K, HR) and he tossed 4.1 innings while allowing four runs on four hits, two walks and recorded three strikeouts...The 24-year-old, Winona, Minnesota native, is in his third professional season after being drafted by the Mets out of Grand Canyon University in the fifth round of the 2023 First-Year Player draft...The left-hander is currently ranked as the No. 12 prospect in the Mets system by *MLB Pipeline*...Over three seasons between Low-A St. Lucie, High-A Brooklyn, Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse, he is 12-11 with a 3.32 ERA (75 ER/203.1 IP) and 197 strikeouts...Overall, he has held minor league batters to a .240 (183-761) batting average.

2026: Has made 14 appearances (13 starts) this season between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse...Between the two clubs, he is 1-5 with a 4.02 ERA (28 ER/62.2 IP) and 65 strikeouts...His first five starts came with Binghamton and he pitched to a 3.60 ERA (10 ER/25.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts...His last nine appearances (eight starts) came with Syracuse, and he went 1-3 with a 4.30 ERA (18 ER/37.2 IP) and 38 strikeouts...His last start in the minors came on July 8 at Norfolk and he completed 2.0 scoreless innings and recorded five strikeouts...He threw 30 pitches...His season-high in terms of pitches was 90 on June 2 vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre.

CUT IT UP: Over his seven appearances with Triple-A Syracuse, his most-used pitch is his cutter...He has thrown it 35.6% of the time in the minors...In his four Major League starts, his cutter has been his most-used pitch, and he has thrown it 41.4% of the time....Of his 17 Major League strikeouts, eight of them have come via the cutter...In the minors, 47.1% of his swing-and-misses came on his cutter...The most by any of his pitches.

LOVE OF THE LOPES: Pitched his first two collegiate seasons at Barton Community College in Great Bend, Kansas, before transferring to Grand Canyon University for his junior season in 2023...That season, he finished 9-2 with a 3.87 ERA (38 ER/88.1 IP) and 91 strikeouts over 15 starts...He earned All-WAC second-team honors as a starting pitcher...Was named WAC Pitcher of the Week two times (Feb. 20 and Mar. 13) and was named a semifinalist for the Dick Howser Trophy, given to the nation's top player...Completed at least 5.0 innings in 14 of his 15 starts that season...Notably, he was a college teammate of Jacob Wilson of the Athletics.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: Thornton became the first pitcher to make their Major League debut for the Amazins' this season, but the fourth player overall (also: Carson Benge, AJ, Ewing and Nick Morabito)...Matt Seelinger also made his debut but after Thornton...Five Mets have debuted this season.

PERSONAL: His parents are Paul and Julie Thornton...His mom participated in track and field, cross country and soccer at Lewis & Clark College and St. Olaf College from 1988 to 1992...She was an All-American in heptathlon in 1991 and 1992 and was inducted into the St. Olaf's athletics hall of fame in 2004...His dad also ran track at St. Olaf from 1989-1993 and he was a conference champion in the 1,000-meter run in 1993...His favorite team growing up was the St. Louis Cardinals and his favorite athletes were Yadier Molina, Adrian Peterson and Max Fried.

- Fired a scoreless ninth inning on July 25 vs. Los Angeles-NL (1.0 IP)...33 of his 43 appearances this season have been scoreless.
- Recorded four outs and allowed one earned run on July 22 at Milwaukee (1.1 IP, H, ER)...Has recorded at least four outs in 15 appearances this season.
- He throws his changeup 40.9% of the time and opponents are hitting .176 (13-74) in at-bats ending in his changeup....He has recorded 22 of his 46 strikeouts via the changeup...His changeup produces a 18.9% hard-hit rate, which is tied for the second-best mark in the majors among qualified changeups.
- Dating back to September 20, 2025, he hasn't allowed an earned run in 38 of his last 47 appearances...He is 4-2 with a 2.40 ERA (15 ER/56.1 IP) and is holding opposing batters to a .168 batting average (33-196) over that span.
- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 54 appearances (four starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-2 with 11 holds, a 2.59 ERA (19 ER/66.0 IP) and 63 strikeouts...Over 21 appearances (two starts) at home this season he has pitched to a 1.32 ERA (4 ER/27.1 IP).
- Threw 2.0 innings in relief and didn't allow a run (2.0 IP, 3 H, 2 K, 2 BB) on July 7 vs. Kansas City (2.0 IP, 3 H, 2 K, 2 BB)...Has completed at least 2.0 innings six times this season and allowed an earned run in only one of those appearances.
- Recorded one out and allowed a career-high-tying five runs on July 5 at Atlanta (0.1 IP, 4 H, 5 ER, K, BB)...The only other time he has allowed at least five runs in an outing was June 26, 2024 at Kansas City while with Miami.
- Entered with no outs and two men on in the fourth inning on June 24 (G2) vs. Chicago-NL (2.0 IP, 4 K) and struck out the side...He also threw a scoreless fifth inning while recording one more strikeout...Is the ninth time in his career he has recorded at least four strikeouts in an outing and has done so twice this season (also: 6/12 vs. ATL).
- Made his sixth start of the season on June 7 at San Diego and he threw a scoreless first inning (1.0 IP, 2 BB)...Over 7.0 innings as a starter this season he has allowed four earned runs and four of his six starts have been scoreless...For his career as an opener, he has pitched to a 3.27 ERA (4 ER/11.0 IP) over nine starts.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.
