RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their final home-stand of the season with the second game of a three-game series with the division-rival Cincinnati Reds tonight at Busch Stadium ... The Milwaukee Brewers visit St. Louis for three games on Fan Appreciation Weekend ... St. Louis held leads in eight of its last 10 defeats since August 27, yet their 29 lead-relinquishing losses this season are tied for the 6th-fewest in MLB (the DBacks and White Sox co-lead with 44).

GOTTA BEAT THE BEST TO BE THE BEST: St. Louis enters tonight 4.5 games back of the final National League Wild Card position behind New York (77-73), Arizona (76-75), Cincinnati (75-75), and San Francisco (75-75) ... With a postseason elimination number of eight vs. the Mets, their final 11 games are against four teams fighting for Postseason positioning (Reds-2, Brewers-3, Giants-3, & Cubs-3), including eight against divisional opponents ahead of them in the standings.

JUST WIN, BABY: Michael McGreevy leads Major League starting pitchers in winning percentage Post All-Star Break over the past two seasons (8-2, .800), just ahead of reigning AL Cy Young winner **Tarik Skubal** (.786, 11-3) ... St. Louis has also won all five of McGreevy's career appearances (4 starts) vs. NL Central opponents (3-0, 3.51 ERA, 25.2 IP).

FIGHT TO THE FINISH: St. Louis needs a 9-2 finish to end with a winning season at 82-80 ... The Cards have had winning marks in 25 of their past 31 seasons since joining the NL Central Division in 1994 and in 23 of their 25 seasons played since 2000 ... The last time St. Louis posted two losing seasons over a three-year span was 1997 (73-89) and 1999 (75-86).

OUCH!: The Cardinals have been hit by an MLB-leading 11 pitches over the last five games (Sept. 10-present) and have been plunked 84 times overall this season, 3rd-most in MLB to the Twins (86) and Angels (85).

• **1B Willson Contreras** (23) ranks 2nd in MLB to **Randy Arozarena** (26), while DH/C **Iván Herrera** (14) ranks T-9th ... The last time multiple Cardinals finished in MLB's Top 10 in HBP was 2014: **Jon Jay** (20, 1st) and **Matt Holliday** (17, T-3rd).

• Jay (20 in 2014) was last Cardinal to lead the NL in HBP ... Contreras led MLB once in his career (14 in 2020), while his single-season career-high is 24 from 2022 with Chicago.

• The last time St. Louis led MLB in hit by pitches was 2014 with 86 ... The 1901 Cardinals hold the franchise single-season HBP record with 90, while the 2014 and 2021 Redbirds tie for the modern single-season team record with 86.

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS: Iván Herrera sports MLB's 3rd-best OPS (1.062) against left-handed pitching behind **Aaron Judge** (1.264) & **Byron Buxton** (1.067) - *min. 100+ PA* vs. LHP **DID YOU KNOW:** Kyle Schwarber hit his 22nd homer off of a left-handed pitcher last night to tie **Stan Musial** (1949) and **Matt Olson** (2021) and for the most left-on-left crime in single-season MLB history. - *Elias*

S-CARDS BEGIN POSTSEASON: The Springfield Cardinals (AA) kick off the Postseason tonight in Game 1 of the Texas League Semifinals against the Tulsa Drillers (Dodgers) at ONEOK Field ... LHP **Ixan Henderson** (9-7, 2.59) starts for Springfield tonight ... The best-of-three series continues Thursday at Springfield's Hammons Field for Game 2 and Game 3 (if necessary) ... Springfield is seeking its 2nd overall Texas League championship (also 2012) and the organization's second full-season affiliate league championship in consecutive seasons following Palm Beach (A) winning the 2024 Florida State League Championship ... Springfield set a franchise record in victories (88-50, .638), while winning both halves in the same season for the 2nd time in franchise history (2007).

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (September 16, 2022): In the Cardinals come-from-behind 6-5 win over the Reds at Busch Stadium, **Albert Pujols** hits his 698th career home run and closer **Ryan Helsey** tosses the third Immaculate Inning in franchise history, joining **Jason Isringhausen** (9th inning on April 13, 2002 vs. Astros) and **Bob Gibson** (7th inning on May 12, 1969 vs. Dodgers) ... Helsey fanned **Kyle Farmer**, **Jake Fraley**, and **Donovan Solano** (all swinging) in the 9th inning.

CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

Reds Executive Advisor, the late **Walt Jocketty**, served as the Cardinals GM for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, St. Louis compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06).

Terry Francona played in 86 games in 1990 with the Louisville Redbirds (AAA), including five at pitcher...his father, **Tito Francona**, played parts of two seasons (1965-66) with St. Louis...became a Cardinal via trade by Cleveland in exchange for a player to be named (Dec. 15, 1964)...originally signed by the St. Louis Browns before the 1952 season (MLB debut for Baltimore in 1956).

Reds pitching coach **Derek Johnson** played baseball & coached at Eastern Illinois Univ. (1991-94)...coached at Southern Illinois Univ.(1995-97)...was **Sonny Gray's** pitching coach at Vanderbilt Univ.

Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** played his final four seasons with the Reds (2009-12)...won the 2010 Gold Glove and was a two-time All-Star (2010-11).

Sonny Gray pitched three seasons with Cincinnati (2019-21)...named a 2019 NL All-Star.

Riley O'Brien made his MLB debut with Cincinnati (Sept. 28, 2021 at Guaranteed Rate Field).

Reds Bullpen Coach **Matt Tracy** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Christian Brothers College HS.

Julio Rangel served as Bullpen Coach for the Reds in 2019.

Cardinals FanDuel TV broadcaster **Mark Sweeney** played outfield for both the Cardinals (1995-97) and Reds (1999).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in 33 games for Cincinnati in 1996.

Reds Senior Advisor to the GM **Cam Bonifay** played two minor league seasons with the Cardinals...worked for St Louis as a professional scout and special assistant.

Reds President of Baseball Ops **Nick Krall** previously interned for the New Jersey Cardinals of the NY Penn League (SS).

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds in his final season (2010).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julián Javier** played in 44 games for the Reds during his final 1972 season.

Reds Senior Advisor to the GM **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **John Morris** played five seasons for St. Louis (1986-90).

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Office **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds and shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals...his father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds CEO **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were Cardinals investors from 1995-2006...interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

TONIGHT'S STARTER:

- Making his 14th start (15th appearance) of the season (17th career start./19th app) in tonight's game.
- Leads Major League starting pitchers in winning percentage Post All-Star Break over the past two seasons (8-2, .800). Tarik Skubal (DET) ranks 2nd at 11-3 (.786).**
- Ranks 3rd among National League rookies with six wins trailing **Cade Horton** (CHI, 10) and **Ben Casparius** (LA, 7).
- Is 5-0 career in 8 Road starts with a 2.57 ERA; the Cardinals have gone 7-1 in those games and have provided Michael with 6+ runs of support in his first five (four total in last two).**
- Tonight's start extends his career-high of 11 consecutive starts uninterrupted by option/injury/doubleheader/etc. (July 21-present).
- Has walked 14 batters over his first 102.0 career innings pitched (2024-present); 1-of-6 pitchers in MLB history with 14 or less walks, 100.0+ innings in his first 18 appearances; most recent since Josh Towers (BAL, 2001).
- Since McGreevy's MLB debut (July 31, 2024), sports the lowest BB/9 IP (1.24) of pitchers with 100.0 or more innings edging out **Tarik Skubal** (1.43).
- The Cardinals are 9-5 in his 14 appearances this season and 13-5 in his career.
- Sports a 2.50 ERA (36.0 IP) in six road starts, but 6.07 ERA (43.0 IP) in eight home games (7 starts) at Busch Stadium.
- Was 8-3 with a 3.72 ERA in 15 starts at Memphis this season. Ranked 3rd among International League in winning percentage (.727, 8-3), 5th in wins (8) wins and 8th in ERA (3.72) and WHIP (1.24) at time of last recall.

LAST TIME OUT (Tuesday, Sept. 10 at Seattle): ND, L, 4-2 (13): 6.0 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 4 K, 0 HR - 81 pitches.

- Cardinals lost the first road game in which he pitched in his career, 4-2 in 13 innings. Exited after six innings in a 1-1 game.
- Held his opposition to one run or less for the 5th start this season.

2025:

- Made six straight appearances of 6.0 innings or more (8/2-30); longest streak by a Cardinals pitcher this season.
- Struck out a career-high seven batters in a 7-6 win over Pittsburgh (8/25).
- Held the Cubs scoreless over 6.0 innings scattering six hits in a 5-0 win at Busch Stadium (8/8).
- Was the first Cardinals pitcher with 9 or fewer walks and 80.0+ IP in their first 14 career games and only the 2nd in MLB history with Elmer Steele (1907-08) of the Boston Red Sox.
- Had three consecutive Quality Starts (8/8-19), the longest streak of his career..
- Pitched a season-high 7.0 innings at COL (7/21), the first team he started against a team for the second time in his career.
- Was recalled twice from Memphis (AAA) and optioned back the following day on May 4-5 and June 8-9. Appointed as the 27th player for the June 19 doubleheader. Recalled on June 24 and most recently on July 21.
- Sustained most of his damage from the 5-9 batters in the Dodgers lineup on June 8; as they were 7-for-14 while the Top 5 batters were a combined 1-for-12 which included Shohei Ohtani (1-3, 2B), Mookie Betts (0-3, K), Freddie Freeman (0-3, K) &Teoscar Hernandez (0-3).
- Made his 2025 debut against the New York Mets in Game 2 of a doubleheader on May 4. Earned the win and held the Mets scoreless to one hit over 5.2 innings with a walk and five strikeouts. Held Francisco Lindor (0-2, K), Juan Soto (0-2), Pete Alonso (0-2, K) and Mark Vientos (1-3, K) to 1-for-9 with 3 strikeouts.

CAREER:

- From the start of 2022 until July 2025, led all of Minor League Baseball in wins (39), starts (97), innings pitched (522.1), and complete games (4), and ranked T-1st for first in double plays induced (55), 11th in ERA (4.00), and 3rd in SO/BB ratio (3.59) among qualifiers.
- Made his Major League debut against the Texas Rangers on July 31, 2024, firing 7.0 innings allowing one run on five hits with three strikeouts.
- Scouted the Rangers while watching the game on TV from the hotel bar/restaurant across the street the night before he started.
- Posted a 1.96 ERA in 2024, the best four game start by a Cardinal since **René Arocha** in 1993 (1.52 ERA, 23.2 IP, 4 ER).
- Is the only pitcher in Cards history to earn a win as a starting pitcher (July 31 2024 vs. Texas) and then as a relief pitcher in his second appearance (Sept. 18, 2024 vs. Pittsburgh) in his first two career MLB appearances.
- Originally selected by St. Louis in the 1st round (18th overall) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of the University of California-Santa Barbara.
- Entered the 2025 season as the No. 10 prospect in the Cardinals organization by *Baseball America*.

McGREEVY vs. CINCINNATI:

- Making his second career start against Cincinnati, previously facing the Reds on Aug. 30 at Great American Ballpark.
- Did not strike out a batter over 6.0 innings in his previous start vs. CIN, holding the Reds to one run on five hits. It was a 1st inning run followed by five scoreless innings.
- Cardinals have won all five of his career appearances (4 starts) vs. N.L. Central opponents (3-0, 3.51 ERA, 25.2 IP).
- The Brewers are the only team McGreevy has yet to face in the N.L. Central.
