Seattle has played 49 one-run games this season, tied for 2nd-most in MLB (trailing only Detroit with 51)...Seattle is 24-25 in 1-run games, with 7 of its last 9 losses coming by 1 run.

**5+**  
The Mariners are 50-4 (.926) when they score 5+ runs in a game, the best such record in the Majors...Seattle is 25-69 (.266) when scoring 4-or-fewer runs.

**75/75**  
Julio Rodríguez's his his 75th career home run last night, joining Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (also 2022-c) as the only players in MLB history with 75+ home runs and 75+ stolen bases through their first 3 career seasons.

The Mariners and Rangers meet for the 9th of 13 matchups this season...the Mariners swept the Rangers in their last meeting from June 14-16 at T-Mobile Park...the teams will meet for one final series in Arlington (Sept. 20-22).

**TONIGHT'S TILT...**the Mariners continue a 9-game homestand (2-2) tonight with the 3rd of 4 games against the Texas Rangers (1-1)...the Mariners split a 2-game set against the San Diego Padres (1-1) to open the homestand and will also welcome the New York Yankees (3 G, 9/17-9/19) to finish the penultimate homestand of the regular season...tonight's game against the Rangers will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call, and broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims**.

**ODDS AND ENDS...**the Mariners won last night's game against the Rangers by a 5-4 score...the Mariners own a 3-1-2 series record over their last 6 series (8/23-c)...with 14 regular season games remaining, Seattle is 4.5 games back of Houston for the AL West Division lead and 3.5 games back of Minnesota for the 3rd and final AL Wild Card spot.

- **Connected** - The Mariners are 13-1 in their City Connect uniforms this season.
- **20/20 Vision** - Outfielder **Randy Arozarena** has 19 HR and 20 SB this season, 1 HR shy of his 4th-consecutive 20-20 season (2021-c)...with his next home run, he would join José Ramírez-CLE as the only players to record 20+ HR and 20+ SB in each of the last 4 seasons.

**MESSIN' WITH TEXAS...****Logan Gilbert** has yet to allow a run in 2 starts this season against Texas, going 2-0 and allowing only 4 hits and 4 walks with 15 strikeouts in 14.2 IP...dating back to Sept. 28, 2023 in his final start of last season, Gilbert has thrown 16.2 consecutive scoreless innings against the Rangers...overall, Gilbert has made 12 starts against the Rangers in his career, his most vs. any opponent...in those 12 starts, he is 4-2 with a 2.31 ERA (19 ER, 74.0 IP) with 17 walks and 69 strikeouts, while holding the Rangers to a .190 average and a .919 WHIP.

**BIG LUKE...**outfielder/first baseman **Luke Raley** went 2-for-2 with 1 double and 2 hit-by-pitches in last night's game...since the beginning of August, Raley is batting .286 (26x91) with 17 runs, 7 doubles, 8 home runs, 23 RBI, 5 walks, 5 hit-by-pitches and 2 stolen bases, while reaching base at a .407 clip and slugging .626 with a 1.034 OPS in 31 games...among players with at least 100 plate appearances since Aug. 1, Raley's 1.034 OPS ranks 4th-best in MLB, trailing only Aaron Judge-NYY (1.163), Yordan Alvarez-HOU and Vladimir Guerrero Jr.-TOR (1.035).

**SPLENDID STARTERS...**the Mariners starting rotation **leads the Major Leagues** in ERA (3.38), opponent batting average (.224), WHIP (1.03), fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.74), fewest hits-per-9 innings (7.56), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.84) and quality starts (87)...the 4.84 SO/BB ratio would be the **best in Major League history** by starters, ranking ahead of the 2019 Dodgers (4.55 SO/BB)...the 1.74 BB/9 is tied for 9th-best in MLB history by a starting rotation.

**CAL RALEIGH: SILVER AND GOLD...**Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** is a candidate to win both the American League **Silver Slugger** and **Gold Glove** awards at catcher this season:

- **In The Box** - Cal leads MLB catchers in home runs for the 3rd consecutive season, after pacing the Majors with 27 home runs in 2022 and 30 in 2023, and is set to become the first catcher to lead the Majors in homers in 3+ consecutive seasons since Mike Piazza did it in 4 consecutive seasons (1999-2002)...Cal is also the 12th catcher in MLB history with multiple 30+ HR seasons and the 3rd to do it within his first 4 MLB seasons (also: Mike Piazza and Rudy York).
- **Behind The Plate** - Cal leads American League catchers in catcher caught stealing (26) and catcher framing runs (12) per *Baseball Savant*...after leading MLB with 24 CCS last season, Raleigh could become the 3rd catcher to lead the Majors in CCS in consecutive seasons, joining Jim Sundberg in 1975-76 (Sundberg tied for the Major League lead in '75) and Hall of Famer Gary Carter in 1982-83.

**SWEET VICTOR-Y...**outfielder **Victor Robles** went 1-for-4 with 1 run scored, 1 stolen base and 1 hit-by-pitch in last night's game, extending his on-base streak to 7 games...over his last 19 games (8/17-c), Robles is batting .429 (27x63) with 14 runs, 6 doubles, 1 home run, 11 RBI, 6 walks, 5 hit-by-pitches and is 10-for-10 stealing bases, while getting on base at a .507 clip, slugging .571 with a 1.078 OPS...Robles is 23-for-23 in stolen bases since joining the Mariners, and 27-for-28 in SB overall this season...Robles is 9-for-9 in stolen base attempts of third base (all with Seattle), most times stealing third base for the Mariners since Ichiro Suzuki (9 SB of third) in 2011.

**NOW THAT'S QUALITY...**the Mariners **lead the Majors** in quality starts (87) by a wide margin, ranking ahead of next-closest Philadelphia (74 QS)...Seattle starters will need to register a quality start in 9 of their final 14 games to surpass the franchise record of 95 QS set in 1990...the Mariners have 5 pitchers with 10+ quality starts: **Logan Gilbert** (22), **Luis Castillo** (18), **George Kirby** (17), **Bryce Miller** (16) and **Bryan Woo** (10), the only team in the Majors to boast 5 starters with 10+ quality starts.

**QUALIFIED QUARTET...**the Mariners have 4 pitchers who qualify for the ERA title (at least 162.0 IP): **Logan Gilbert** (185.2 IP), **Luis Castillo** (175.1), **George Kirby** (172.0) and **Bryce Miller** (167.1), marking the first time Seattle has had 4 pitchers toss 162.0+ innings since 2014 (Roenis Elias, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma and Chris Young)...Seattle has had 4 pitchers toss 162.0+ IP all with sub-4.00 ERA's twice in franchise history: 2014 and 1991 (Erik Hanson, Brian Holman, Randy Johnson and Bill Krueger).

**LAST 20 GAMES...**Seattle is 11-9 over its last 20 games (8/23-c), sporting a +31 run differential (102 R, 71 RA)...during that span, Seattle owns a 3-1-2 series record...7 of the Mariners 9 losses during that stretch have come by exactly 1 run.

**FIELDING THEIR POSITIONS...**the Mariners have made only 1 error over their last 17 games dating back to Aug. 26...Seattle's infield fielding percentage (.985) ranks tied for 3rd in the American League (also: Minnesota), trailing Texas (.989) and Kansas City (.986).

**HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...**the Mariners continue their 9-game homestand with **Luis Castillo POP!** **Collectible Night** and **Oktoberfest** tonight...the remaining games on the gamestand are highlighted by **Hispanic Heritage Day** (Sept. 15), **Seattle College Night** (Sept. 17), **Flannel Night** (Sept. 18) and **Frasier Day** (Sept. 19).

**AS YOU KNOW...**outfielder **Julio Rodríguez** went 4-for-5 with 2 runs scored, 1 double, 1 home run and 3 RBI in last night's game, recording his 2nd career go-ahead home run in the 8th inning-or-later, and...**AS YOU MAY KNOW...**it was Julio's 3rd game of the season with 4+ hits, and his 11th career 4-hit game since making his debut in 2022, tied for 2nd-most in MLB during that span (2022-c) with Freddie Freeman (11 G), trailing only Luis Arráez (16 G), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Julio's 11 games with 4+ hits are 3rd-most in franchise history before turning 24 years old?...he trails only Alex Rodriguez (14 G) and Ken Griffey Jr. (12 G)...Julio is also the first player in MLB to tally 11+ 4-hit games at age 23-or-younger since Mike Trout (11 G) from 2012-15.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 30th start of the season and 3rd against Texas...he will also make the 118th start of his MLB career and 13th career start against the Rangers.

LAST TIME OUT...L#11 on 9/7 at St. Louis...pitched a complete game with 8.0 innings and allowed 2 runs on 2 hits (1 home run) and 1 walk with 10 strikeouts...it was his 2nd career complete game (also: 7/4/23 at SF) and a career-low for hits allowed in a complete game...it was the first complete game loss with 2-or-less hits allowed in franchise history since Félix Hernández did so on 9/23/10 at Toronto.

TOP OF HIS LEAGUE...among qualified AL pitchers this season, Gilbert ranks 1st in WHIP (0.88), 1st in quality starts (22), 2nd in innings pitched (185.2), 2nd in Opp. AVG (.194), 4th in strikeouts (191) and 6th in ERA (3.15).

LOOKS ARE DECEIVING...this season, despite a 7-11 record, Gilbert has produced a 0.88 WHIP over 185.2 innings...he is 1 of 3 pitchers in Major League history with a losing record, 162.0+ innings pitched and a sub-0.90 WHIP...the only other pitchers to do so are Ed Walsh (1910) and Cy Young (1905).

LUCKY 7...tied for the most starts of 7.0+ scoreless IP in MLB...has totaled 5 of those outings (38.0 IP) this season (8/10 vs. NYM, 7/14 at LAA, 6/22 at MIA, 6/16 vs. TEX and 5/4 at HOU) tied with Framber Valde-HOU.

29 OUTINGS...through his 29 starts this season, opposing hitters are batting .194 (130x669) against Gilbert...Randy Johnson is the only pitcher in franchise history that has ever finished a season with a sub-.200 opponent average against (1997, .194)...so far this season he has allowed 174 baserunners, 2nd fewest in franchise history through 29 starts...trailing only Bryce Miller from this season with 157 baserunners allowed.

SPLIT SECOND DECISION...hitters this season are batting .099 (8x81) against Gilbert's splitter with 3 doubles and 1 home run...the .099 average is the 3rd-lowest in the Majors and the 2nd-lowest in the AL against a splitter (min. 60 PA).

WHIPPING IT UP...his 0.88 WHIP is the lowest qualified WHIP in franchise history, on pace to be 1 of 4 pitchers to post a sub-1.00 WHIP in a single season, joined by teammate Bryce Miller (0.99)...since making his MLB debut, Gilbert is tied with Max Scherzer-NYM-TEX for the lowest WHIP in the American League (1.07) (min. 500 IP).

FEELING SUPPORTED...is 36-0 in his career when the Mariners score 3 or more runs while he is in the game...in those games the Mariners are 44-10.

QUALITY MIDSET...22 of his 29 starts have been quality start, most in the American League and tied for the most in the Majors...he has gone 6.0+ innings in 24 of his 29 starts...the Mariners are 12-12 when he pitches in 6.0+ innings.

ALL-STAR CALIBER...on July 7, was named to the 2024 American League All-Star team, his 1st All-Star selection...in 20 starts through the All-star break led AL starters with 132.1 IP, 2nd in ERA (2.79), 3rd in strikeouts (124), and gave up the 3rd fewest hits (88).

SHUTDOWN STARTER...made back-to-back starts with 8.0 scoreless innings pitched from 6/16-6/22...since the beginning of the 2020 season, only Nathan Eovaldi-TEX (3 G, 4/29-5/11/21) has gone 8.0+ scoreless innings in consecutive starts...he became the first Seattle pitcher since Mike Montgomery (6/23-6/30/15) to do so.

30 FOR 30 FOR 30...he is making his 30th start of the season tonight, his 3rd consecutive season with 30+ starts...he is now the 9th different pitcher (10th time) in franchise history to accomplish this feat...the last to do so was Félix Hernández who put together 10 straight seasons from 2006-2015.

GET AHEAD, STAY AHEAD...he is posting a 67.2% 1st pitch strike rate, the highest of his career...among pitchers with 160.0+ IP, this is the 2nd-highest in the AL.
