MOVING ON: The Detroit Tigers and Tampa Bay Rays today conclude their three-game series with an afternoon affair at Steinbrenner Field ... by dropping the first two games, the Tigers have secured just their seventh setback in 25 series this season and have extended their losing streak to three games, only their third three-game losing streak of the season and their first in nearly a month ... the Tigers previously lost three games in a row May 22-24 as well as the first three games of the season back in March at Dodger Stadium.

- Despite losses in their last three games, at 48-30, the Tigers still have the best record in the majors, 1.0 game ahead of the Cubs and Dodgers and 3.0 games ahead of the Yankees for tops in the A.L. ... the Tigers are still off to their best start through 78 games in 19 years when they began 53-25 in 2006 ... the Tigers are 30-18 in their last 48 games starting April 30.
- The Tigers have posted a 48-27 record, a .640 winning percentage, in their last 75 games starting March 31 since enduring the three-game sweep to start the season at Dodger Stadium ... their 48-27 record, which is a 104-win pace over 162 games, starting March 31 is the best in all of baseball in that span and 5.5-games up on the Astros, the next closest A.L. team.
- After today's finale in Tampa, the Tigers are off tomorrow before returning to Comerica Park on Tuesday for a six-game homestand vs. the ATH and the Minnesota Twins, as the Tigers will ultimately play 15 of 21 games at home to end the month of June.

OF MIZE AND MEN: Tigers starter Casey Mize is one of only six pitchers in the A.L. to have seven or more wins and a sub-3.00 ERA ... Mize is joined by Tarik Skubal (8-2, 2.06 ERA) in achieving this feat as they are the lone pair of A.L. teammates and one of two teammates in the majors to each be in this category, joining San Francisco's Robbie Ray and Logan Webb.

STREAK'S ALIVE: Riley Greene yesterday reached base safely for the 12th-straight game, joining Zach McKinstry as the two Tigers with a pair of 12-game (or more) on-base streaks this season ... Greene had a season-high 16-game streak of reaching base safely from April 28-May 16.

JUNE BOON: Riley Greene is now up to 19 RBI in June, trailing only Seattle's Cal Raleigh (20 RBI) for most in the A.L. this month ... Greene set a single-month best with 24 RBI last month in May and, with 43 RBI starting May 1, is second to only Raleigh (46 RBI) for most RBI in the A.L. starting May 1.

- Greene is looking to become the first Tiger to record 20 RBI in back-to-back calendar months in 12 years when Miguel Cabrera did so in May (33 RBI) and June (21 RBI) of 2013.

GREENE WITH ENVY: Riley Greene has 15 RBI in his last eight games and 29 RBI in his past 30 games starting May 20, trailing only Seattle's Cal Raleigh (32 RBI) for most RBI in the majors in this span.

- Greene has 17 homers, 59 RBI and 35 extra-base hits this season, joining Aaron Judge and Cal Raleigh as the only three players in the A.L. to reach those totals.
- Greene has 18 doubles to go along with his 17 homers and 59 RBI through 78 team games, which puts him on pace for 37 doubles, 35 homers and 123 RBI in a 162-game season ... last year in his first All-Star campaign, Greene finished up with 27 doubles, 24 homers and 74 RBI.

PRODUCE SECTION: Riley Greene (17 homers, 59 RBI) and Spencer Torkelson (16 homers, 48 RBI) are the most dynamic duo on offense in the A.L., as they are the only set of teammates in the A.L. (and one of two in the majors) to have each reached 16 homers and 48 RBI.

GLEYBER PARTY: Gleyber Torres, who leads all A.L. second basemen in All-Star voting, has posted an .806 OPS this year, the best OPS by any second baseman in the A.L. ... Torres also leads all major league second basemen with a .386 on-base percentage, leads A.L. second basemen with a .279 batting average and is second in the A.L. with 38 RBI ... www.tigers.com/vote.

HERE'S THE CATCH: Dillon Dingler begins the day with a 1.9 WAR this season, according to Fangraphs ... it is the fourth-highest mark among A.L. catchers and third-best among Tigers position players behind Riley Greene (2.3) and Zach McKinstry (2.0) ... Dingler ranks fourth among A.L. catchers with a .268 batting average (55-for-203/min. of 200 plate apps.) ... www.tigers.com/vote.

WHAT A RELIEF!: Will Vest (12 saves, 2.50 ERA) and Tommy Kahnle (eight saves, 1.41 ERA) are one of only three sets of teammates to each have eight saves this year, joining San Francisco's Camilo Doval and Ryan Walker as well as New York's Luke Weaver and Devin Williams.

- Kahnle also has nine holds, making him the only pitcher in the A.L. with at least eight saves and eight holds this year ... additionally, Kahnle's 1.41 ERA is tied for the lowest of any A.L. pitcher with at least 30.0 relief innings this season and tied for third lowest in the majors.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?: The Tigers begin the day with the best record in the majors on the strength of a +76 overall run differential this year, trailing only the Yankees (+108) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +102 edge on the second-place Guardians (-26), are +96 on the second-place Royals (-20) and are +85 on the fourth-place Twins (-9).

AND FINALLY: Tarik Skubal has a 3.9 WAR this year, per Fangraphs, which is 0.8 higher than his next-closest A.L. competitor in Garrett Crochet ... no other A.L. pitcher is within a point of Skubal.

- Placed on the 15-day IL on May 10 (retro May 9) with a left hamstring strain...was activated and made his first start back against Cleveland on May 24.
- Became the first Tigers pitcher to win four games in April since Jordan Zimmerman won five games in 2016...went 4-1 with a 2.12 ERA (6 ER/24.1 IP) in five starts in April.
- Began the 2025 season with a perfect 2-0 record and a 0.77 ERA (1 ER/11.2 IP) through his first two starts.
- Held a 1.89 ERA in six games (four starts) over Spring Training this year...led the team with 25 strikeouts, including seven over 3.0 innings in his final outing on March 25.
- In his first MLB action since 2022, Mize appeared in 22 games (20 starts) and posted a 2-6 record with a 4.49 ERA (51ER/102.1IP) and 78 strikeouts last season.

- Earned a spot on his first career Opening Day roster after a standout spring camp, during which he didn't allow a single earned run over 10.2 innings (nine games) of relief...went 1-0, surrendering seven hits and three walks while striking out nine.
- Appeared in 21 games (three starts) for the Tigers in 2024, posting a 1-1 record with a 1.84 ERA (6ER/29.1IP), six walks and 23 strikeouts...also made 34 appearances with Triple-A Toledo last year, going 1-2 with one save, a 5.17 ERA (27ER/47.0IP) and 53 strikeouts.
