METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Marlins, 5-0, yesterday in Miami... Today, the Mets play their final game of the 2025 regular season...The Mets finish their final road trip of the season, a six-game trip (3-2) to Chicago (2-1) and Miami

ON THE ROAD: The Mets are in the midst of their final road trip of the season... They are 34-46 on the road this year...Their .425 road winning percentage is tied for 22nd in the majors.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets conclude their regular season schedule with three games in the NL East...New York is 25-26 against the division this season... They have posted a 4.43 ERA, while slashing .268/.339/457.

LOVELY LINDOR: Francisco Lindor has safely hit in 14 of his last 15 games. batting .305 (18-59) with 18 runs, two doubles, five homers, nine RBI, nine walks, three steals, a .406 OBP and a .593 SLG in that span...In 52 games since the start of August, Lindor is slashing .311/.409/.539 with 49 runs, 14 doubles, 11 homers, 27 RBI, 29 walks, 14 steals and a .948 OPS.

DIRTY 30S: The Mets feature three players with 30 + homers - Pete Alonso, Francisco Lindor and Juan Soto...This is the first time in franchise history that the Mets have featured three players with 30+ homers in season...The Mets are one of three teams with three players with 30+ homers (also, Yankees and Athletics).

30/30: Lindor and Soto join Howard Johnson (36 HR/32 SB) and Darryl Strawberry (39 HR/36 SB) in 1987 are the only pair of Mets teammates to have a 30/30 season...Along with the 1987 Mets, the 1996 Rockies are the only other team that featured two players with a 30/30 season - Dante Bichette (31 HR/31 SB) and Ellis Burks (40 HR/32 SB)...According to Sarah Langs, the Mets have had eight individual 30/30 seasons, the most of any franchise.

THE SIXTH SENSE: Lindor has recorded three straight seasons with 30+ homers...He has six seasons with 30+ homers, which is the second-most 30-HR seasons as a primary SS in MLB history (min 50% games at SS), behind only Alex Rodriguez (seven seasons)...He broke a tie with Ernie Banks...Courtesy of Sarah

POSTING UP: Pete Alonso appeared in all 161 Mets games this year...Last season. he became the second Mets player to appear in every single game, joining Félix Millán (1975) - not including 2020...John Olerud appeared in 162 of 163 games during the 1999...Last year marked the third time in his career he has appeared in 160 or more games (also, 2019 & 2022)...Alonso has appeared in 415 consecutive games, which is the second-longest streak in the majors (Matt Olson - 782 games, 5/2/21-current)...His streak of 415 consecutive games is the longest in team history.

DANCING IN SEPTEMBER: Through 24 games in September, Pete Alonso is slashing .295/.349/.589 with seven doubles, seven home runs, 16 RBI, seven walks and 13 runs...His 126 RBI are the second-most in the majors and are tied for the second-most in a single season in Mets history...Since he joined the league in 2019, Alonso has hit 264 home runs, the third-most in that span behind Aaron Judge (284) and Kyle Schwarber (268).

AND I WOULD WALK 100 MILES: Juan Soto has set a franchise record with 126 walks this season...His 126 walks lead the major leagues...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud owned the previous franchise recorded when he recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season... Soto has five seasons of 120+ walks, the fifth-most such seasons in Major League history...Only Barry Bonds (11), Babe Ruth (10), Eddie Yost (8) and Ted Williams (8) have had more such seasons.

ATTABOY ALVY: Over the last 12 games, Francisco Alvarez has batted .316 (12-38) with eight runs, two doubles, four homers, eight RBI, four walks, a .409 OBP and a .684 SLG...In 40 games following the All-Star break, Alvarez is batting .286/.370/.580 with nine doubles, one triple, eight homers, 21 RBI and 14 walks... This compares to a .236/.319/.333 slashline with three doubles, three homers, 11 RBI and 13 walks in 35 games prior to the break.

LAST TIME OUT: Allowed two runs in 1.0 inning on September 24 against the Cubs...Marked his shortest outing of the season and his shortest start since June 22, 2023 against the Padres...Has not issued a walk in seven of his 14 games this season...Since his season debut on July 13, ranks third in the majors with a 7.20 SO/BB rate (min. 50.0 IP)...Has 72 strikeouts over 59.0 innings this season...His 10.98 SO/9 rate is the fourth-best mark in the NL and the eighth-best in the majors since his debut (min 50.0 IP).

VS. MIAMI/NL EAST: Has pitched against Miami five times in his career and has a 2-2 record with 5.33 ERA (16 ER/27.0 IP) in those games...His last start against Miami came on August 16, 2024 and he tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while striking out four...Against the Division, Manaea has a 7-10 record with a 4.76 ERA (73 ER/138.0 IP).

RIGHTY DOMINATION: So far this season righties are batting .263 (45-171) against him...Last season he held right-handed hitters to a .190 batting average, compared to his career average to right-handed hitters being at .251...It was the lowest batting average he's held right-handers to in his career (in a season where he appeared in more than five games).

HERE COMES THE HEAT: So far this season, Manaea has thrown his four-seam fastball 60.6% of the time, and he has picked up 42 of his 72 strikeouts with his fastball...His fastball has generated a 23.1% whiff rate this season...He has thrown his fastball at the 16th-highest clip (60.6%) among all pitchers who have thrown their fastball at least 300 times this season.

HOW SWEEP IT IS: Manaea has thrown his sweeper 33.2% of the time and has generated a 34.4% whiff rate on the pitch...Has recorded 26 strikeouts with the sweeper and is holding opposing batters to a .210 batting average (16-73) on at-bats ending with the pitch...His 33.2% sweepers are the 18th-most in the majors among pitchers who have thrown their sweeper at least 200 times.

REHAB STINT: Was originally placed on the 15-day IL on March 27 (retro. March 24) with a right oblique strain and then was transferred to the 60-day IL on April 29...This season, he has made six rehab appearances (five starts) for Brooklyn, Binghamton, and Syracuse...Over those appearances, he allowed 13 earned runs over 18.2 IP and recorded 23 strikeouts...He made his final rehab start on July 8 with Syracuse, and he allowed three runs over 3.2 IP and struck out five...He threw 73 pitches, 48 for strikes.

2024 A CAREER YEAR: Recorded a career-high in innings (181.2), tied a career-high in wins (12) and starts (32), while his 184 strikeouts were the second-most in his career and were the ninth-most in the NL last season...The southpaw finished with the lowest full-season ERA of his career (3.47), and he was one of eight pitchers who made 32 or more starts and posted an ERA below 3.50...He held right-handed batters to a .190 average, tied for the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...From July 1 until the end of the season, Manaea was first in the majors in innings (105.1), second in quality starts (12) as well as sixth in strikeouts (108) and WHIP (0.93)...Made four Postseason starts, going 2-1 with a 4.74 ERA (10 ER/19.0 IP), eight walks and 19 strikeouts...He earned wins in Game 3 of the NLDS vs. Philadelphia and Game 2 of the NLCS at Los Angeles.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Last season, Manaea completed at least 7.0 innings in nine of his 32 starts this season and that was tied for the sixth-most such outings in the National League...Manaea recorded back-to-back starts of 7.0 scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts on 7/30/24 against Minnesota and 8/5/24 at St.Louis...Manaea joined Tyler Glasnow and Spence Schwellenbach as the only pitchers in the majors last season with consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings and double-digit strikeouts...Manaea was the only one of three to not allow a run in both of those starts...He became the first Mets pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings and record 10 or more strikeouts in consecutive starts since Max Scherzer (4/19/22 (2) - 4/25/22)...The southpaw joins Dwight Gooden (Two Separate Occasions) and Tom Seaver (Three Separate Occasions) as the only pitchers in franchise history to post back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and double-digit strikeouts...He is just the 10th left-handed pitcher in major league history with back-to-back starts of 7.0 or more scoreless innings and 10 or more strikeouts (Last: Chris Sale, 6/24/18-6/30/18).

SPECTACULAR DOWN THE STRETCH: From July on last season, Manaea was second in the majors in quality starts (12), first in innings (105.1), sixth in strikeouts (108) and sixth in WHIP (0.93)...Since June 14, Manaea had allowed three or fewer runs 17 times, which was tied for most in the majors during that span with Chris Sale (17).

CAREER: Over the course of 10 Major League Seasons with the Athletics, Padres, Giants, and Mets he has a 79-66 record, a 4.09 ERA (565 ER/1243.1 IP), and 1181 strikeouts in 242 games and 209 starts...His 1181 career strikeouts are the 13th-most among active left-handers...He resigned with the Mets this offseason on a three-year contract in December 2024.

- Fired a scoreless seventh inning on September 26 at Miami (1.0 IP, H, 2 K).
- Entered in relief in the second inning on September 23 at Chicago-NL and threw 2.2 innings while not allowing an earned run (2.2 IP, H, R, 2 K).

- Tossed 1.2 scoreless innings in relief on September 20 vs. Washington (1.2 IP, K)...Marked his 12th scoreless relief outing of at least 1.2 innings, which are tied for the ninth-most such games in the majors and the seventh most in the NL this season.
- Made his first appearance since being recalled on September 19 vs. Washington and allowed a two-run homer after entering in the fifth (0.1 IP. 2 H. 2 ER. K. HR).
- Was recalled on September 18 for his fourth stint with the team this season...This season he has gone 5-2 with two saves, 12 holds and a 3.63 ERA (25 ER/62.0 IP) through 51 appearances (three as an opener), holding batters to a .226 average (50-221)...Right-handed hitters have batted .191 (25-131) against him compared to a .278 average against left-handers (25-90)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .167 average (18-108)...His 1.11 ERA through his first 24 games of the season was the eighth best in franchise history through as many games.
- He tossed 3.1 scoreless innings in relief on September 12 vs. Texas...Marked the second-longest scoreless outing of his career (longest: 3.2 IP, 6/8/24 MIA vs. CLE) and his longest appearance of the season.
- In 10 games with Syracuse he posted a 5.93 ERA (9 ER/13.2 IP) with 15 strikeouts...Seven of his 10 appearances were scoreless.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.
- Prior to his outing on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his first 30 outings of the season...He allowed 14 earned runs over 13 appearances in the month of June (9.95 ERA) after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May (1.34 ERA).
- 15 of his appearances this season have been for four or more outs...13 of those appearances have been scoreless.
