**METSCELLANEOUS:** For the second straight night, the Mets defeated the Nationals in 10-innings...The Mets have won back-to-back games...New York has won 14 of their last 18 and 18 of their last 24...New York is in stretch of 17-straight games before the All-Star break...They are 3-2 in that span...The Mets are in the midst of an eight-game road trip (2-0)...They travel to Washington D.C. for a four-game series (2-0) and to Pittsburgh, PA for a four-game series.

**EXTRA, EXTRA:** The Mets earned their second straight extra-innings win last night...According to Elias, the Mets are one of four teams to score five or more runs in extra-innings in back-to-back games, joining the Padres (May 28-29, 2021), Diamondbacks (April 21-22, 2021), the White Sox (August 6-7, 1993) and the Reds (September 4-5, 1973).

**WELCOME BACK:** RHP Christian Scott is set to take the bump today...He is 0-2 with a 3.90 ERA (12 ER/27.2 IP) with six walks and 25 strikeouts in five major league starts...Scott has gone 3-0 with a 2.76 ERA (13 ER/42.1 IP) with 12 walks and 55 strikeouts in nine starts at Triple-A Syracuse this year...The 25-year-old was selected by the Mets in the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida.

**FEELING A LITTLE DRAFTY:** The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2021 (Christian Scott), 2017 (David Peterson, Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts.

**O.M.G.:** Over his last six games, Jose Iglesias is 5-13 with three runs, three doubles, one home run, four RBI with a 1.231 OPS...He is 14-30 with five doubles against right-handed pitching this year...In addition, he is 8-13 with RISP as a Met.

**LET'S GO STREAKING:** The Mets have homered in 15 straight games, bashing 33 home runs in that span...It is their longest streak of the season and tied for the second-longest in franchise history...The last time the Mets recorded a longer streak was also a 15-game streak from May 16-June 1, 2023...The Mets record is a 21-game streak from July 16-August 5, 1996...The Mets have hit 106 home runs this year...That is the fourth-most in the major leagues.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has safely hit in six straight games...He is batting .333 (8-24) in that span with one double, two home runs, five RBI, four walks, one steal with a .448 OBP and a .625 SLG...Alonso has safely reached base in 15 straight games, batting .322 (19-59) with 10 runs, four doubles, four home runs, 16 RBI, 10 walks, one steal with a .423 OBP and a .593 SLG...The 15-game on-base streak is tied for the second-longest of his career (also, July 9-29, 2022)...His longest streak is a 34-game stretch from August 2-September 9, 2019.

**DOUBLE VISION:** The Mets have recorded a double in 29 consecutive games...That is the third-longest streak in franchise history...New York has recorded 66 doubles in that span...The last time the team had a longer streak was a franchise-record 36 games from May 7-June 14, 2012...The Mets had a 30-game streak from April 20-May 22, 2001...The Mets are fourth in the majors with 154 doubles.

**HIGH-FIVE:** The Mets have scored five or more runs in eight straight games...The last time the team had a longer streak was a nine-game stretch from August 3-10, 2022...That nine-game stretch was tied for the second-longest streak in franchise history...The longest streak scoring five or more runs in consecutive games was from August 11-24, 2007...The Mets have scored 60 runs over their last eight games.

**AM I SEEING DOUBLE?:** Francisco Lindor has recorded 25 doubles this season...That places him tied for second in the majors...Lindor has recorded 25 or more doubles in three straight years...Since he entered the league in 2015, Lindor has collected 290 doubles...His 290 doubles are tied with Vic Power for the 17th-most by a Puerto Rican born player...Next up is Jose Valentin (302).

**MAKERS MARK:** In 40 games this season, Mark Vientos is batting .305 (43-141) with 25 runs, eight doubles, 10 home runs, 27 RBI with 13 walks, a .361 OBP, a .574 SLG with a .936 OPS...Entering 2024, Vientos had played a total of 81 games and hit .205 (52-254) with six doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 15 walks with a .255 OBP, a .354 SLG and a .610 OPS.

**NATIONALS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 74-71 all-time at National Park since the yard opened in 2008.

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are 13-10 against the National League East this season...They have posted a 4.51 ERA, while batting .262/.327/.422...The Mets have won nine of their last 11 games against the division.

**RECORD SCRATCH:** The Mets are in the midst of 18 straight games against teams who currently have records below .500...The team is 2-0 in this stretch...The Mets are 24-16 this season when facing a team with a record below .500.

**WASHINGTON D.C., IT'S PARADISE TO ME:** Pete Alonso has hit .316/.404/.644 with 30 runs, 10 doubles, one triple, 15 home runs, 34 RBI and 24 walks in 46 games at Nationals Park...Brandon Nimmo is a career .324/.425/.459 hitter with 31 runs, 11 doubles, one triple, four home runs, 14 RBI and 31 walks in 53 games at the yard...Jeff McNeil has slashed .293/.343/.433 with 12 extra-base hits and 22 RBI in 41 games in D.C...Francisco Lindor has socked 12 home runs with 29 RBI and a .589 SLG in 36 games at Nationals Park.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets hit the road for the final time before the All-Star break...New York is 21-16 on the road...Their .568 road winning percentage is the sixth-best in the majors and the third-best in the National League...The Amazins' have hit .276/.338/.457 on the road in 2024...They lead the majors in average and OPS and are second in OBP and SLG...They have scored 216 runs on the road, averaging a major league-best 5.84 runs/game...The Mets went 32-49 on the road in 2023.

**INVADER NIMS:** Entering June, Brandon Nimmo was batting .214/.350/.378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS...In 24 games since then, he is batting .326/.413/.611 with 25 runs, seven doubles, one triple, six home runs, 23 RBI, 11 walks with a 1.023 OPS...He has safely reached base in 16 straight games, posting a .479 OBP in that span that started on June 13...He owns a 2.7 fWAR this season, which is 11th in the National League.

**MEET THE METS:** Following a loss on May 29, the Mets have played 28 games, going 20-8 in that span...Their 20 wins are the best in the majors, as is their .714 winning percentage...The Mets have hit .287/.357/.515 in that period with 69 doubles, six triples, 48 home runs, 97 walks, 24 steals and an .872 OPS...They have outscored their opponents 182-130 during those 28 games...The Mets lead the majors in average, OBP, SLG and OPS in that span...Their 182 runs are the most in the majors in that span, as are their 6.50 runs/game.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** In 40 games batting in the leadoff spot the this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .302/.362/.527 with 31 runs, 17 doubles, seven home runs, 21 RBI, 11 walks, nine steals with an .888 OPS...He ranks 11th in the majors and sixth in the NL with a 3.4 fWAR...Francisco Lindor has posted a 2.8 fWAR since May 1...That is third in the National League in that span, behind only Bryce Harper (3.3 fWAR) and Shohei Ohtani (3.0 fWAR)...It is seventh in the majors in that period...In 54 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .277/.331/.491 with nine home runs and 30 RBI.

**THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT:** RHP Brandon Sproat will represent the New York Mets at the 2024 All-Star Futures Game...Sproat, who was promoted to #98 on MLB Pipeline's Top 100 Prospects, has appeared in 13 games (12 starts) with the Cyclones and Rumble Ponies this season...He is a combined 5-1 with a 1.61 ERA (12 ER/67.0 IP) with 26 walks and 76 strikeouts...In seven starts at Double-A this year, Sproat is 3-0 with a 1.94 ERA (9 ER/41.2 IP) with 10 walks and 43 strikeouts...The right-handed pitcher was selected in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida...The Futures Game will be played on Sunday, July 14 in Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas.

### BUTTO NEWS & NOTES

**LAST MAJOR LEAGUE START:** Made his fifth career start on May 30 vs. Arizona...Allowed two earned runs on four hits with one walk and struck out four as the Mets held on for a 3-2 win.

**LAST MINOR LEAGUE START:** Took the bump on June 25 at Buffalo... Allowed one run on four hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 4.0 innings of work.

**DOWN AT THE FARM:** Since he returned to Triple-A, Scott made four starts, posting a 2.12 ERA (4 ER/17.0 IP) with six walks and 19 strikeouts...All together in nine starts at Triple-A, Scott is 3-0 with a 2.76 ERA (13 ER/42.1 IP) with 12 walks and 55 strikeouts.

**WHAT A DEBUT:** Christian Scott made his major league debut on May 4 in Tampa Bay...He recorded a no decision in the Mets 3-1 loss, throwing 6.2 innings and allowing just one run on five hits with one walk and six strikeouts... He became the third Mets player to make his major league debut this year... Scott is the first Mets pitcher to toss at least 6.0 innings in their debut since Steven Matz did so on June 28, 2015 vs. Cincinnati.

**SIZZLING IN SYRACUSE:** At the time of his first call up, was 3-0 with a 3.20 ERA (9 ER/25.1 IP) at Syracuse...Has made five starts, allowing six walks and striking out 36...Led the International League in WHIP (0.71) and batting average against (.136), while placing fourth in strikeouts (36) and ninth in ERA (3.20).

**23 AND ME:** Named the New York Mets 2023 Pitcher of the Year after making 19 starts this across three levels season and posting a 5-4 record with a 2.57 ERA (25 ER/87.2 IP) with 12 walks and 107 strikeouts.

**HE'S GOT PROSPECTS:** Entered the 2024 season as the 99th best prospect in the minors by ESPN.

**SLIDE TO THE RIGHT:** While seeking a third pitch, looked at Pitching Ninja video and discovered the slider grip used by Max Scherzer...It's still the grip he uses today...Was predominately a reliever throughout his career at the University of Florida and transitioned to a starting role after he was selected by the Mets.

**MINOR LEAGUE BACKGROUND:** In 2023, held opposing hitters to a .199 batting average and posted 10.98 strikeouts per nine innings...Started for the Rumble Ponies in Game One of the Northeast Division Series...In 2022, he split his time between A St. Lucie and A+ Brooklyn with a combined 4.45 ERA in 18 appearances...In 2021, he had three relief outings for FCL Mets and threw 12 strikes out of 16 total pitches.

### TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP JOSE QUINTANA (2-2, 3.22)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Allowed two runs on six hits with three walks and seven strikeouts over 4.0 innings of work on June 28 vs. Houston...The Mets held on to win, 7-2, but Quintana did not receive a decision.

**THREE'S COMPANY:** Over the last three starts, Quintana has posted a 1.65 ERA(3 ER/16.1 IP) with six walks and 21 strikeouts...He has earned two wins and the team is 3-0 in that span.

**JUNE BLOOM:** Quintana made five starts in June and went 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (9 ER/24.0 IP) with 11 walks and 26 strikeouts...The Mets went 4-1 in those starts.

- Has 27 career home runs in 88 games against the Nationals...Are the second-most by a Met against the Expos/Nationals behind only Darryl Strawberry (31) and are tied with Aaron Judge's 27 home runs against Baltimore for the most against any single opponent since 2019...His 1.039 OPS against the Nationals is the best mark by an opposing player since the team relocated to Washington in 2005 (Min. 300 Plate Appearances).
- Launched a two-run homer in the 10th on July 2 at Washington...Has five career home runs in extra-innings tied with Kevin McReynolds for second-most in Mets history...Only Howard Johnson (nine) has more.
- Is batting .333/.439/.611 with 16 RBI over his last 14 games dating back to June 16.
- Laced a game-winning double in the ninth on June 18 at Texas...Has 79 game-winning RBI, fifth-most in franchise history.
- Has 546 RBI, seventh-most in franchise history...Carlos Beltrán (559) is next.
- Picked up his second three-hit game of the season on June 17 vs. Texas (Also: 4/13 vs. Kansas City...Has 26 multi-hit games, tied for eighth-most in the NL and tied for 17th-most in the majors).
- Went 2-5 with a two-run homer and a two-run single on June 16 vs. San Diego...Was his ninth career five-RBI game, the second-most such games in franchise history behind David Wright (10)...Are the second-most such games since 2019 behind only Nelson Cruz (10).
- Has 10 home runs and 16 doubles over his last 48 games dating to May 7...His 16 doubles during that span are tied for the third-most in the majors, while his 26 extra-base hits during that span are tied for the eighth-most in the majors.
- Is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for 11th in the majors with 18 home runs...Also ranks tied for seventh in extra-base hits (38), tied for eighth in the NL in doubles (20) and 13th in total bases (153).

- Hit safely in a career-best 10 straight games from June 15-28...Batted .515/.595/.939 with three home runs, five doubles, 10 RBI and seven runs during the stretch...Was the longest hitting streak by a Mets catcher since Wilson Ramos' 26-game hitting streak from August 3 - September 3, 2023.
- Went 2-5 with a go-ahead double in the sixth and an RBI triple in the 10th...Was his first career triple.
- Posted a 1.123 OPS in June...Is the highest OPS by a catcher younger than 23 in a month (Min. 50 Plate Appearances) since Johnny Bench in June 1970 (1.208)...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.
- Went 3-3 with a home run, a double, a walk, three RBI and three runs on June 26 vs. Yankees...Was the third time in his career reaching base four times in a game.
- Has 30 home runs, the fourth-most by a catcher before turning 23...The only catchers with more homers prior to turning 23 are Johnny Bench (87), Iván Rodríguez (37) and Darrell Porter (31).
- Is batting .362/.433/.655 with 16 RBI and 10 extra-base hits in 18 games since returning from the IL on June 11...His 1.088 OPS during that span is the seventh-best mark in the NL and the 10th-best mark in the majors (Min. 50 Plate Appearances).

- Owns a .348 (32-92) average in 26 career games against Washington, the fourth-best mark among active players (Min. 75 at-bats).
- Has a .388 (19-49) batting average in his first 20 games with the club...Is the eighth-best mark by a Met through their first 20 games with the team...In 12 starts, is batting .409 (18-44), the fourth-best such mark in franchise history by a player in their first 12 starts with the behind only Lenny Randle (.460, 23-50), Keith Hernandez (.435, 20-36) and Del Unser (.426, 20-47) (Min. 30 at-bats).
