METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets downed the Cubs, 10-1, last night...New York snapped a two-game skid...The team has won six of their last eight games...New York continues a six-game road trip (1-2) to Chicago-NL (12) and Colorado (three games)...Following this road trip, the Mets enjoy Memorial Day off before beginning a six-game homestand against Philadelphia (three games) and Toronto (three games).

ROCKY ROAD: The Mets have won six of their last eight games at Coors Field...Overall, the Mets are 41-57 at the ballpark...Starling Marte has hit . 421 (48-114) with 27 runs, four doubles, five home runs, 22 RBI, five walks with a . 468 OBP and a .588 SLG in 26 games at Coors Field...Marte has hit safely in each of his last nine games at the yard, going 16-42 (.381) with 11 runs, one doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI and a . 982 OPS... Pete Alonso has hit . 400 (14-35) with six runs, two doubles, three home urns, seven RBI in nine games in Denver.

TAP THE ROCKIES: Brandon Nimmo, who grew up around 100 miles from the ballpark, is a 364 (20-55) lifetime hitter with 12 runs, four home runs, 11 RBI, four walks with a .400 OBP and a .582 SLG in 14 games at the ballpark...After going 0-1 with a run in his career game at Coors Field on August 2, 2017, Nimmo has hit in 13 straight games at the ballpark... He is 20-54 (.370) in that span with 11 runs, four home runs, 11 RBI, and four walks with a .999 OPS.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 15-3 when scoring first this season... The team's .833 winning percentage when scoring first is tied for the second-best mark in the majors...On the other hand, the Mets are 1122 (.333) when their opponent scores first...Since the start of 2022 , the Mets are 96-19 when scoring first...Their .835 winning percentage is the best in the majors.

HOMER HAPPY: After the Mets went five straight games without a home run, the Mets have homered in season-high nine straight contests, hitting 16 home runs in that span...The Mets are 21-11 when hitting a home run this season and 9-5 when hitting multiple homers...In 2022, the Mets longest home run streak was nine games (September 9-17)... The team hit 14 home runs in that span...The last time the Mets had a longer streak was in 2021...From September 4-12 the Mets homered in 10 straight games, socking 19 dingers in that span.

HEY NINETEEN: Pete Alonso has homered in six of his last nine games... Overall, he has hit 19 home runs this year, which leads the majors leagues...His 45 RBI are third in The Show and lead the National League... Alonso ranks 12th in franchise history with 425 career RBI....Next up is Kevin McReynolds (456) and Keith Hernandez (468)...Alonso has appeared in 51 games this year...See the chart below for the fastest Met to reach 20 home runs in a season and the fastest to 50 RBI...Courtesy of Elias.

ATTABOY ALVAREZ: Francisco Alvarez is on a five-game hitting streak, batting . 444 (8-18) in that span with five runs, one double, three home runs, seven RBI, a walk with a .500 OBP, a 1.000 SLG and a 1.500 OPS... His six home runs are tied for the fifth-most by a rookie in the majors and tied for the third-most in the National League...The backstop is batting .290 (18-62) with four doubles, six home runs, five walks with a .353 OBP and a .645 SLG against right-handed pitching this year...In 18 games in May, Alvarez is batting .304 (17-56) with nine runs, five doubles, five home runs, 11 RBI, six walks with a 1.042 OPS.

ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won each of the last three series at Coors Field going back to 2019...The team is 6-3 in that span.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets rank fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a $85.4 \%$ stolen base rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 14 bags this year, tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in the National League...His 328 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 340 steals.

ROAD WARRIOR: Brandon Nimmo is batting 342 (41-120) with 15 runs, eight doubles, one triple, two home runs, 17 RBI, 11 walks with a .397 OBP and . 475 SLG in 30 games on the road this season... His .342 road average ranks sixth in the majors and fourth in the National League... Nimmo owns a career . 396 OBP on the road...That is the fourth-highest mark in the majors since the Wyoming native entered the league in 2016.

TRIPLES MAKES IT SAFE. TRIPLES IS BEST: Brandon Nimmo recorded his second triple of the season last night...It was the 25th of his career... That places him tied for 10th with Ed Kranepool on the Mets all-time list.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York has played 30 games on the road this year, the most in the majors...New York is $14-16$ with a 4.59 ERA away from Citi Field in 2023...The team's 254 strikeouts on the road are the most in the majors.

EIGHT IS GREAT: The Mets are 23-0 when leading after eight innings this season...The last time the Mets lost a game when they were ahead after eight innings was on September 6, 2021 at Washington...The Mets were up 3-2 and lost 4-3 in the bottom of the ninth...Since then the Mets have won their last 118 games when ahead after eight, the longest active streak in MLB...It's the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of 117 consecutive games...From October 1, 1990-September 2, 1992, the Mets also won 117 straight games when ahead after eight innings.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed 17 errors in 51 games this year... That gives the team a .991 fielding percentage....Their .991 fielding percentage ranks third in the majors and is the best in the NL...Their 17 errors are tied with the Padres for the fewest committed in the Senior Circuit.

I RALEY LIKE YOU: Since his return from the 15-Day IL, Brooks Raley has appeared in five games, allowing only one hits, three walks and striking out five in 5.0 innings.... He has been unscored upon in 17 of his 19 appearances this season...Overall he is $1-0$ with a 3.31 ERA ( 6 ER/16.1 IP) with four walks and 16 strikeouts.

FOGO POWER: Eduardo Escobar is 12-32 (.375) with a triple, three home runs, six RBI, five runs scored and a 1.147 OPS over his last 14 games.

FEELING A LITTLE DRAFTY: The Mets have a homegrown player on their roster from the 2019 (Brett Baty), 2018 (Tylor Megill), 2017 (Mark Vientos), 2016 (Pete Alonso), 2013 (Jeff McNeil) and 2011 (Brandon Nimmo) drafts.

COUNTDOWN TO THE HOF: Infielder Howard Johnson, LHP AI Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, June 3 in a pre-game ceremony prior to the 4:10 p.m. game vs. the Blue Jays at Citi Field...The four new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 34...Jay Horwitz will also be honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for his contributions to the organization.

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 6.0 scoreless innings in the first game of a doubleheader at Citi Field against Cleveland on May 21...Allowed three hits and one walk while striking out five Guardians batters...Scherzer had not completed 6.0 innings since his Opening Day start in Miami on March 30...His streak of five straight starts of fewer than 6.0 IP was the secondlongest of his career.... His only longer streak was in 2010 with Detroit (six straight GS under 6.0 IP).

LOOKING FOR K'S: Scherzer has not recorded more than six strikeouts in any of his last eight starts dating back to his final start of the 2022 season...He has had six strikeouts or fewer in eight straight starts only one other time in his career (September 2009-April 2010 with Arizona/Detroit).

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez... His next $10+\mathrm{K}$ game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).

LEGENDARY: Scherzer and Justin Verlander swapped places on the all-time strikeouts leaderboard all season long in 2022...Now teammates in 2023, the pair are neck and neck, with just six punchouts separating the two...With 147 more strikeouts this season, Scherzer can enter the top-10...Scherzer now ranks 12th all-time, having passed all-time greats Fergie Jenkins, Pedro Martinez, Bob Gibson, Curt Schilling, CC Sabathia and John Smoltz last season...See below for a chart of the No. 10-19 strikeout pitchers of all-time:

OPENING UP: Scherzer made his seventh career Opening Day start...Earned the victory as the Mets downed the Marlins, 5-3... Tossed 6.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits with two walks and six punchouts...All three runs scored in the sixth inning after Scherzer tossed 5.0 scoreless frames to begin his day Scherzer exited with the score tied, 3-3, then the Mets rallied for two runs in the top of the seventh to leave him in line for career victory No. 202...He improved to 2-3 in season openers and has a 2.96 ERA ( 15 ER/45.2 IP) in those games...He became the first pitcher ever to start both for and against the Mets on Opening Day...Madison Bumgarner (Arizona) is the only other active pitcher who has started for and against the same team on Opening Day in his career.

QUITE THE DEBUT: After signing a three-year deal with New York last offseason, Scherzer posted a 2.29 ERA ( 37 ER/145.1 IP) in his first season with the Mets...That is the lowest mark in a season in his career and the best all-time in a pitcher's first season with the Mets (min. 140.0 innings)...His 0.91 WHIP was not just the best mark by a Met in his first season with the club, it was the best by any Met in club history (min. 140.0 innings)...Scherzer did not allow more than four runs in any of his 23 regular-season starts last season.
2022 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Won his Mets debut on April 8 in Washington against his former team...Tossed 7.0 one-hit innings, allowing just one run while racking up 10 strikeouts in his Mets home debut vs. San Francisco on April 19...Threw 7.0 shutout frames, punched out 10 and allowed only two hits in his hometown at the Cardinals on April 25, setting the stage for New York's five-run, ninth-inning comeback rally...Threw 6.0 scoreless innings and struck out a season-high 11 batters in his return from the IL on July 5 at Cincinnati...Blanked the Yankees over 7.0 innings on his 38th birthday, July 27, in a 3-2 Subway Series victory at Citi Field... Defeated Atlanta three times over an eight-start stretch (July 11, August 6 and August 17)... Earned his 200th career victory in the Mets' playoff-clinching win at Milwaukee on September 19, throwing 6.0 perfect innings in his first start after a two-week stay on the IL.

ALWAYS IMPROVING: Scherzer set a career-best mark with a 2.29 ERA last season after posting what was then a career-best 2.46 ERA in 2021...No other pitcher since 1913 has thrown 130.0 or more innings and posted an ERA below 2.50 in both his age 36 and age 37 seasons...Only five pitchers have done that twice at any point after turning 36: Hoyt Wilhelm (three times - 1959, 1964-65), Eddie Plank (three times - 1915-17), Randy Johnson (2001-02), Dennis Martinez (1991-92) and Babe Adams (1919-20).

## TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JUSTIN VERLANDER (2-2, 3.60)

LAST TIME OUT: Pitched the longest outing by a Met this season, going 8.0 innings and allowing one run on three hits with five strikeouts on Sunday Night Baseball at Citi Field... Yielded a solo homer in the first inning, then finished his outing with seven scoreless frames as the Mets held on to defeat Cleveland, 2-1, on May 21.

COORS: Has made two career starts at Coors Field and won each game...Threw a complete game on June 19, 2011 for the Tigers, allowing one run on four hits with five striketouts... His last outing here was the final Tigers start of his career, August 30, 2017...In that game, he allowed one run on three hits over 6.0 innings...He was traded to Houston the next day.
