**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The St. Louis Cardinals continue their six-game homestand this afternoon with the second game of a three-game series with the visiting Philadelphia Phillies ... The Redbirds recorded their first shutout of the season last night, topping the Phillies, 2-0, behind 7.0 innings from **Andre Pallante** and three hits from catcher **Yohel Pozo**.

**FLIGHT PATTERN:** With a win today, St. Louis will earn their first series win against Philadelphia since 2017 ... The Cardinals are 5-2 at home and 1-5 on the road ... St. Louis enters today in 3rd place in the National League Central Division, 1.5 games behind Milwaukee.

**SECRET WEAPON?:** **Pedro Pagés** made his first career appearance at second base last night, going 1-for-3 while recording two assists in 4.0 innings ... Pagés is the 6th Cardinal in history to appear defensively at both catcher and second base in the same game, joining:

- **Tony Cruz** (July 17, 2011 at Cincinnati)
- **Scott Hemond** (June 18, 1995 vs. San Francisco)
- **José Oquendo** (Sept. 24, 1988 vs. New York Mets),
- **Roger Bresnahan** (April 24, 1911 vs. Pittsburgh)
- **Art Hoelskoetter** (Sept. 13, 1907 at Pittsburgh)

**READY RESERVE:** **Yohel Pozo** came off the bench last night to record a career-high-tying three hits, including the game-winning RBI-double ... Pozo is the first player in MLB this season to record three hits in a reserve role, and the first Cardinal since **Dylan Carlson** (July 7, 2022 at Atlanta); and first Cardinals catcher since **Jason LaRue** (July 3, 2010 vs. Cincinnati) with three hits off the bench.

**BACKSTOP BRILLIANCE:** St. Louis catchers **Iván Herrera**, **Pedro Pagés**, and **Yohel Pozo** combine to lead all MLB team catching combos in hits (20), home runs (6), doubles (6), extra-base hits (12), total bases (44), RBI (20), batting average (.357), slugging pct. (.786), and OPS (1.176).

**START ME UP:** Cardinals starters **Sonny Gray**, **Erick Fedde**, and **Andre Pallante** have allowed just one run over their last 30.1 innings (0.50 ERA), which includes an active 14.0 scoreless innings streak dating back to April 8 ... **Miles Mikolas** makes his 175th career start with the Cardinals today, and since joining St. Louis in 2018, joins **Aaron Nola** (271) and **Kyle Freeland** (203) as the only three active MLB pitchers with 175 or more starts exclusively with one team.

**FREE BASEBALL:** Entering Friday, there were 19 extra-inning games across Major League Baseball over the first 190 games, which was on pace for 243 extra-inning games and would tie the 2013 season for most in one season in MLB history. - *Elias*

**DONNY, YOU'RE OUT OF YOUR ELEMENT:** **Brendan Donovan** ranks among MLB leaders in hits (19, T-3rd) and batting average (.365, 5th) this season, while leading all of Major League Baseball in hits (14) since April 4 ... Donovan singled in the 7th inning last night to extend his hitting streak to seven games (.519/.552/.741, 14-27, HR, 7 RBI).

**NOOT NEWS:** **Lars Nootbaar** walked twice and singled last night to become the first Cardinal to reach base safely 19 times in the team's first seven home games of a season since **Fernando Tatis** (19 in 2000); **Mark McGwire** (23 in 1998) holds the Cardinals record for reaching base safely in the first eight home games ... Nootbaar has reached base safely in 12 games overall to begin the season, longest by a Cardinals leadoff hitter since 2B **Tommy Edman** (first 14 games of 2021).

**NOLAN KEEPS ROLLIN':** **Nolan Arenado** has reached base safely in 20 consecutive games since Sept. 18, 2024 (.329/.427/.434), tied with **Corbin Carroll** for MLB's 2nd-longest active streak behind **Jacob Wilson** (21 games) ... Arenado is the last Cardinal to hit for the cycle (2nd career) on July 1, 2022 at Philadelphia.

**THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (April 12, 1965):** 20-year-old southpaw **Steve Carlton** makes his Major League debut in relief for the Cardinals in a 10-10 tie at Chicago's Wrigley Field, walking **Barney Schultz** in the 11th inning for his only batter faced ... The future Hall of Famer pitched parts of seven seasons (1965-71) in St. Louis before he was traded to Philadelphia for RHP **Rick Wise** before the 1972 season (Feb. 25, 1972).

#### PHILADELPHIA CONNECTIONS

**JoJo Romero** pitched parts of three seasons in Philadelphia (2020-22)...originally selected by the Phillies in the 4th round of the 2016 MLB Draft.

**Edmundo Sosa** signed with the Cardinals as an international free agent (July 2, 2012)...played parts of five seasons in St. Louis (2018-22)... traded to Phillies for **JoJo Romero** (July 30, 2022).

**Brant Brown** enjoyed a three-homer game on June 18, 1998 vs. the Phillies at Wrigley Field.

**Michael Siani** was born in and resides in Glenside, Pa...graduated from William Penn Charter School in Philadelphia... same high school as Phillies broadcaster **Ruben Amaro**.

Cardinals Baseball Operations Advisor **Chaim Bloom** was born in Philadelphia...graduated from Jack M. Barrack Hebrew Academy.

**Nolan Arenado** is the last Cardinal to hit for the cycle (2nd career) on July 1, 2022 at Philadelphia...became the 17th in Cardinals history and first since **Mark Grudzielanek** in 2005.

Phillies Amateur Scouting Director **Brian Barber** was a 1st-round (#22) selection in the 1991 MLB draft by St. Louis from Dr. Phillips (Fla.) High School... same school as **Oliver Marmol**...pitched in 10 games for St. Louis (1995-96).

Phillies Bullpen catcher/Asst. Catching Coach **Brad Flanders** played two seasons (2003-04) at the University of Missouri...coached at Saint Louis University for three seasons (2011-13).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Bill White** played three seasons with Philadelphia (1966-68)...traded to the Phillies in 1965 and back to St. Louis in 1969.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Tom Herr** was born in nearby Lancaster, Pa. (April 4, 1956).

Hall of Famer **Scott Rolen** was originally selected by the Phillies in the 2nd round of the 1993 MLB draft ... Played parts of seven seasons with Philadelphia (1996-2002)...Traded to St. Louis with **Doug Nickle** & cash for **Placido Polanco**, **Bud Smith**, & **Mike Timlin** (July 29, 2002).

Phillies Visiting Clubhouse Manager **Kevin Steinhour** began his career as a batboy & clubhouse worker for Springfield (A) in the Cardinals organization (1981-87) before serving as Louisville Redbirds (AAA) Equipment Manager (1988-89).

Phillies Senior Advisor, International Scouting **Sal Agostinelli** was selected by St. Louis in the 20th round of the 1983 MLB draft ... played six seasons (1983-88) in the Cardinals minor league system.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Makes his 3rd start of the season (185th career) in the middle game of this weekend's series vs. the Phillies.
- Today's start will be the 175<sup>th</sup> in his Cardinals career, the 20<sup>th</sup> Cardinal all-time to reach that mark.
- Only two other MLB pitchers have made as many as 175 starts exclusively with one team since Mikolas debuted with the Cardinals; **Aaron Nola**, PHI - 271 & **Kyle Freeland**, COL - 203.
- Looking to bounce back from Sun. (4/6) Game 2 loss at BOS when he allowed 9 runs on 11 hits in just 2.2 IP (81 pitches).
- Has not yet allowed a HR in 2025 over his 8.0 IP.
- At age 36 (turns 37 on August 28), Miles is the oldest player on the team's active roster.
- Has entered his 8th season (was injured for all of 2020) with the Cardinals in 2025; Leads active pitchers in innings pitched (1,010.0), wins (60), strikeouts (736) and games started (173) as a Cardinal.
- Has registered 32-or-more starts in every season in which he was not injured or sidelined by COVID-19 protocols. One of three pitchers with at least three 200+ IP seasons since 2018 (**Gerrit Cole** - 4, **Aaron Nola** - 3).
- His 171.2 IP last season were his fewest as a Cardinal; has had three seasons (2018, 2022, 2023) of 200+ IP as a Cardinal.
- Cardinals are 95-79 in his 174 career starts with St. Louis and 46-39 in his 85 home starts.
- Needs just 1 strikeout for 800 career.
- Since joining St. Louis in 2018, Mikolas leads MLB in first strike percentage (68.0) and lowest walk percentage (0.43).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Started Game 2 of 4/6 doubleheader at BOS on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball. Lasted just 2.2 IP in the 18-7 loss, his shortest start since going 2.0 IP on 9/8/24 in 10-4 loss to Seattle.

2024/CAREER NOTES:

- Was the Cardinals' Opening Day starter in 2019, 2023 & 2024.
- Posted his fifth season with 32-or-more starts in 2024 and is one of three MLB pitchers with 32+ starts in at least five seasons since 2018 (**Jose Berrios** & **Aaron Nola** - 6).
- Posted a career-high first strike percentage that is the highest single-season mark by a Cardinals qualified pitcher since the stat was first tracked in 1988.
- Led MLB with 15 starts without a walk, his single-season career-high, the third-most by a Cardinals pitcher all-time, trailing only **Bob Tewksbury's** 19 in 1992 and 16 in 1993, and the most by a National League pitcher since **Bartolo Colón** had 15 in 2015 for the New York Mets.
- His nine road starts without issuing a walk tied **Bob Tewksbury** (1992) for the most such starts in a single season by a Cardinals pitcher.
- Tallied eight of his 10 wins in road starts, tying for the second-most road wins in the NL (1st: **Michael King**, 9).
- Led MLB with a 1.31 walks per 9 IP rate that was the lowest in a single season by a Cardinals pitcher since his 1.30 rate in 2018, while his 1.57 rate since joining St. Louis in 2018 is the lowest in MLB.
- Two-time National League All-Star (2018 and 2022).
- Finished 6th in the 2018 NL Cy Young Award voting and was a finalist for NL Comeback Player of the Year by MLBPA Player's Choice Awards, in a voting by his peers.
- 2018 Darryl Kile Award recipient, voted on by his teammates.
- Pitched three seasons in the Japanese Central League (2015-17) and was a combined 31-13 with 2.25 ERA in 62 starts for the Yomiuri Giants.

MIKOLAS vs. PHILLIES:

- Makes his 9th career start (8th appearance) against the Phillies and is looking to snap a 3-game losing skid vs. Philadelphia
- Is 2-1 with a 2.67 ERA in 4 career starts against the Phillies at Busch Stadium, registering 3 quality starts with just 2 walks allowed in 27.0 IP.
- Owns a 2-4 career with 4.29 ERA against PHI with his last win coming on 7/11/22 at STL (6-1).
- Has worked 6.0+ IP in six of his eight career starts (including 5-straight) vs. the Phillies with four quality starts.
- Is 15-16 career vs. NL East clubs in 45 games/39 starts
