• Beauden is being celebrated for his inspirational recovery from a rare and aggressive staph infection, at just 3 years old, that led to septic shock, months in intensive care and more than 20 surgeries, including the amputation of both legs...his story caught the team's attention in January during his visit to MLB Network with Challenged Athletes Foundation...today, he plays baseball at Lake Havasu Little League using prosthetic legs.

• Joe, an Arizona clarinetist born blind and autistic...completely self-taught, he learns and performs music entirely by ear and has memorized hundreds of pieces, and dreams of performing alongside Andrea Bocelli.

• **Ketel Marte, Corbin Carroll** and **Geraldo Perdomo** combined for franchise-record 3 Louisville Slugger Silver Slugger awards in 2025.

• **Nolan Arenado** is among the Majors' active leaders on Opening Day in RBI (1st, 15) and home runs (T-2nd, 5).

SNAKEBITES

VETERAN SNAKES: **Ketel Marte** (since 2017) is just the second D-back to play 10 seasons with the club, joining Nick Ahmed (2014-23).

• **Zac Gallen, Merrill Kelly** and **Kevin Ginkel** are 3 of the 5 club-record-tying pitchers to play 8 seasons with the team, along with Randy Johnson (1999-2004, '07-08) and Andrew Chafin (2014-20, '23).

• **Torey Lovullo's** 10 seasons as Manager rank him as Arizona's second professional sports manager/head coach to reach double-digits (Cardinals, Coyotes, Mercury, Suns), joining the Suns' John MacLeod (14 seasons, 1974-87).

OPENING DAY STARTS: **Ketel Marte** makes his team-record seventh start at second base and franchise-record ninth straight Opening Day start (7 2B, 2 CF), ahead of Luis Gonzalez (8 from 1999-2006) and Paul Goldschmidt (7 from 2012-18).

• **Carlos Santana's** 16 consecutive Opening Day starts are second among active players, behind Andrew McCutchen/TEX (17).

• **Nolan Arenado's** 13 consecutive Opening Day starts rank tied for the most among active third basemen with Manny Machado/SD.

• **Corbin Carroll** and **Gabriel Moreno** make their fourth straight Opening Day starts while **Geraldo Perdomo** makes his third straight (fourth overall).

GALLEN PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF: **Zac Gallen**, in his final 11 starts of 2025, from Aug. 2-Sept. 26, went 6-3 with a 3.32 ERA (24 ER in 65.0 IP) with 54 strikeouts.

• Since Aug. 2, ranks among NL starters in wins (T-1st, 6), quality starts (T-1st, 8) and innings (4th, 65.0).

• Is 1 of 2 pitchers since 2022 with 12+ wins and 150+ strikeouts in each of the last 4 seasons (also: Framber Valdez/HOU).

OPENING DAY NOTES: **Ketel Marte** has hit safely in 6 of 8 starts as a D-back, hitting .364 (12-for-33)/.887 OPS with 2 doubles, 1 home run and 3 RBI...has 2+ hits in consecutive starts.

• **Geraldo Perdomo** has consecutive Opening Day starts with 1+ hits and 1+ RBI.

• **Nolan Arenado** has reached safely in 10 of his 12 career Opening Day starts, hitting .347 (17-for-49)/1.111 OPS with 3 doubles, 5 homers and 15 RBI.

• **Carlos Santana** has reached safely in 7 straight Opening Day starts (3 H, 9 BB) and in 14 of his 15 career...has walked in 13 of the 15 starts.

• **Gabriel Moreno** has multi-hit performances in consecutive Opening Day starts, going 4-for-10 with 1 double, 3 RBI and 1 walk.
