RBI D-BACKS TEAM SECURES A SPOT IN THE RBI WORLD SERIES: The RBI D-backs team won 3 of their 5 games over the weekend to secure the West Regional Championship in Seattle...they will head to Florida for the RBI World Series from Aug. 4-10...the RBI (Reviving Baseball in Inner-Cities) program provides opportunities for young athletes to develop their skills and compete at high levels...this year, the D-backs also sponsored their first women's softball team, who went 1-3...the program also offers these young athletes an incredible experience beyond the sport...it was the first time on an airplane for 26 of them as well as their first time to Seattle.

## SNAKEBITIES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs fell 2-1 yesterday in 10 innings @ Cubs.

- Brandon Pfaadt matched a career best with 7.0 innings with no runs and 1 hit allowed, 1 walk and 7 strikeouts...it was his second career outing of $7.0+$ shutout innings.
- Eugenio Suárez collected his 11th homer of the season to break the scoreless game in the seventh.

VS. ROYALS: The D-backs are 19-15 all-time vs. Royals, including 13-7 on the road.

- This is the third trip to Kansas City since 2017.
$\bullet$ In their last 7 meetings, the D-backs are 5-2 vs. Royals.
FACING THE AL CENTRAL: Since 2022, the D-backs' 23 wins vs AL Central opponents are tied for the second most by an NL team with the Brewers, behind the Dodgers (28).

SERIES OPENERS: The D-backs have won 9 of their last 13 series openers.

- In series-opening games since June 3, the D-backs are slashing .285/.356/.479 and are averaging 5.38 runs per game.

SERIES STRONG: The D-backs have won or split their last 6 series (5-0-1) and 12 of their last 14 series overall since May 30, going 9-2-3.
