**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets and Rockies were postponed due to rain yesterday...On Friday, the Mets fell to Colorado, 4-3...The loss snapped a two game winning streak...The Mets have lost 13 of their 15 games dating back to April 8 and have been outscored 81-38 during that span...They have dropped each of their last five series openers and are 3-6 in series openers this season...The Mets are in the midst of a 10-day, nine-game homestand (2-2) against the Twins (2-1), Rockies (0-1) and Nationals (three games).

**HERE COMES YOUR 27TH MAN:** RHP Austin Warren will serve as the 27th man for both games of the doubleheader.

**TWINBILLS:** The Mets are set to play their first doubleheader of the season...The Mets and Rockies last played two on May 21, 2022 at Colorado...The team played three doubleheaders in 2025...The Mets were swept in a doubleheader on May 4 in St. Louis, split a two games on July 2 vs. Milwaukee and were swept on July 10 at Baltimore...The Mets have played 36 double dips since 2021, more than any other team in the majors...The Mets have earned at least a split in 31 of those 36 twinbills over the last four years...New York has swept nine of their last 23 doubleheaders...Of the 36 doubleheaders, the Mets have swept 12, split 19 and have been swept five times.

**RECORD BOOKS:** Through 13 career starts, Nolan McLean is 6-2 with a 2.30 ERA (20 ER/78.1 IP) and 95 strikeouts...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first 13 career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 2.04 ERA from 1981-1987 and Matt Harvey's 2.21 ERA from 2012-2013...His 95 strikeouts tied for second in franchise history through a pitcher's first 13 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 96, and is tied with Matt Harvey's 95...Per Elias...He is one of four pitchers in Major League history to strikeout 95+ batters and allow 20 or fewer earned runs through their first 13 starts (also: Hideo Nomo, 119 K and 20 ER, Matt Harvey 95 K and 20 ER, and Paul Skenes 103 K and 17 ER).

**IN THE CITY:** Over seven starts at Citi Field he has posted a 1.70 ERA (8 ER/42.1 IP)...It is the fifth-best mark by a Met through their first seven home starts with the franchise...He is trailing Noah Syndergaard (1.46), Taijuan Walker (1.52), Carl Willey (1.57) and Charlie Puleo (1.70)...He has struck out at least six batters in all of those starts...His first three home starts were scoreless and he became the first Met pitcher to not allow a run in their first three career starts at home and the seventh pitcher in Major League history not to allow a run in each of their first three home starts (min. 15.0 IP)...His 19.1 inning scoreless streak at home is the longest to start a career since Robert Suarez didn't allow a run through all 24.0 innings he threw at home during the 2022 season...Per Elias.

**MIGHTY GOOD MANAEA:** On Friday, Sean Manaea recorded seven strikeouts in relief of Freddy Peralta...It marked his third career game with seven or more strikeouts as a relief pitcher (also: 8 K, 5/22/23 at Minnesota w/San Francisco and 7/13/25 at Kansas City)...Joins Tug McGraw (5), Nolan Ryan and Skip Lockwood as the only relief pitchers in franchise history with multiple seven+ strikeout games...His 19 strikeouts this season are tied for the seventh-most for NL relief pitchers.

**HOME, SWEET HOME:** The Mets are in the midst of their third homestand of the season...The team is 5-8 in New York this year...The team has posted a 4.54 ERA (61 ER/121.0 IP) at Citi Field in 2026...They are hitting .231/.295/.339 at Citi Field.

**SWEET 15:** On Friday Freddy Peralta and Sean Manaea combined for 15 strikeouts, tied for the most by the club in a game this season (also: 4/21 vs. Minnesota)...The Mets join Toronto (5), Chicago-NL and Cincinnati as the only teams with multiple 15+ strikeout games this season.

**ROX-METS NOTES:** The Mets have won eight of their last night games against the Rockies...New York has won five of their last seven games against the Rockies at home...The Mets are 32-24 all-time at Citi Field.

**SAY IT IS SOTO:** Juan Soto has safely reached base in all 11 of his games this season...It is the second time in his career that he has reached base in each of the first 11 games of a season (also: 11 G, 2025)...He is batting .317 (13-41) with three runs, two doubles, one homer, five RBI, six walks, a .404 OBP, a .439 SLG and an .843 OPS.

**JUAN OF A KIND:** According to Sarah Langs, Juan Soto is the only player in history to record 900 walks, 200 doubles and 200 homers before turning 28...Mel Ott and Mickey Mantle were the second-youngest players to accomplish that feat but doing so after they turned 28.

**BATTING FIRST:** Bo Bichette has hit leadoff in three straight games, he is batting 5-13 with four runs, two doubles, three RBI and a .923 OPS in that span...In his career, he is batting .281/.324/.454 with 94 runs, 46 doubles, one triple, 25 home runs, 85 RBI and 42 walks when batting leadoff...He has safely hit in eighth of his last nine games.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

**THIS DAY IN 1986:** The Mets defeated the Cardinals, 4-3, in St. Louis...The Mets earned their eighth straight victory...Sid Fernandez hurled 8.0 innings in the victory, allowing two runs on two hits with two walks and struck out 10...Keith Hernandez and Danny Heep recorded two hits, while Gary Carter doubled and Lenny Dykstra homered in the win...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Fired 6.2 innings and struck out 10 batters on April 21 vs. Minnesota (6.2 IP, 5 H, 3 ER, 10 K, HR)...His 10 strikeouts were a season-high, and he was the first Met to record at least 10 strikeouts since himself on September 25, 2025, at Chicago-NL...He retired each of the first 15 batters he faced...Was this first time this season and the third time in his career he has issued zero walks (also: 8/22/25 at ATL and 8/27/25 vs. PHI)...Marked the first time this season he has allowed more than two earned runs in a start...Was only the second time he has allowed more than two earned through his first 13 Major League starts (also: 9/25/25 at CHC).

**AHEAD OF THE PACK:** This season, McLean is 1-1 with a 2.67 ERA (9 ER/30.1 IP), 38 strikeouts and is holding opponents' batters to a .143 (15-105) over four starts...Among qualified NL pitchers, he is tied for second in opposing batting average, tied for third in strikeouts, fourth in WHIP (0.76) and 13th in ERA.

**RECORD BOOKS:** Through 13 career starts, McLean is 6-2 with a 2.30 ERA (20 ER/78.1 IP) and 95 strikeouts...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first 13 career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 2.04 ERA from 1981-1987 and Matt Harvey's 2.21 ERA from 2012-2013...His 95 strikeouts tied for second in franchise history through a pitcher's first 13 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 96, and is tied with Matt Harvey's 95...Per *Elias*...He is one of four pitchers in Major League history to strikeout 95+ batters and allow 20 or fewer earned runs through their first 13 starts (also: Hideo Nomo, 119 K and 20 ER, Matt Harvey 95 K and 20 ER, and Paul Skenes 103 K and 17 ER).

**PERFECT FIVE:** He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...Per *Elias*...When he was perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

**SPIN THAT THING:** This season, he has thrown his curveball 10.0% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,304 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any pitch in the majors this season (min. 40 pitches)...He is posting a 45.8% whiff rate on his curveball...Batters are hitting just .056 (1-18) in at-bats ending with his curveball...Over his first 13 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .066 (3-45) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 47.9% whiff rate on the pitch.

**SINK SINK BABY:** McLean has thrown his sinker 34.8% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 6-run value, which is tied fifth-highest run value on any pitch in the Majors this season and tied for the second-highest mark on any sinker this season, is just trailing Jose Soriano's 7 run value on his sinker...Batters are hitting just .125 (5-40) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

**ROOKIE SENSATION:** McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

**MC-USA:** He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event...He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

**DAZZLING DEBUT:** Made his Major League debut on August 16 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and

Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

**MINOR LEAGUE RECAP:** Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

**TWO-WAY COWBOY:** The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Matched a career-high seven runs (six earned over 3.1 innings...Gave up a career-high-tying two home runs for the seventh time (last: 4/11/26 vs. Athletics).

**SPRING TRAINING:** In three Spring outings (three starts), Senga recorded a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) with 11 strikeouts...Held Spring batters to a .176 (6-34) average...Last pitched on March 19 at Houston, tossing a spring-high 4.0 innings (2R, 6H, 1BB, 4K).

**VS. COLORADO:** Today, Senga will make his fourth career start against the Rockies...On June 6, 2025, Senga allowed one earned run and struck out six across 6.0 innings in Colorado...Senga worked 6.1 innings on May 31, 2025, allowing two earned runs with seven strikeouts...He threw 6.0 scoreless innings and earned the win in his first meeting with Colorado on May 5, 2023.

**2025 SEASON RECAP:** Senga finished last season going 7-6 with a 3.02 ERA (38 ER/60.2 IP), 55 walks and 109 strikeouts in 22 starts...Started the season going 7-3 through June 12, with a 1.47 ERA (12 ER/73.2 IP)...He had thrown at least 5.0 innings in all 13 starts and allowed three earned runs or fewer in all of those starts...Following his return from the IL, posted a 5.90 ERA (26 ER/39.0 IP) in nine starts...Allowed three or more earned runs in three consecutive games before being sent to Triple-A.

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** Senga picked up 71 of his 109 strikeouts on the ghost fork last season...Held batters to a .130 average with his ghost fork this season, which was the second-lowest opponents' batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing a split-finger pitch and the seventh-lowest opponent batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing any pitch...His 41.8% whiff rate was the fourth highest...In his rookie year (2023), Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

**GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES:** Has allowed three or fewer runs in 46 of his first 54 career starts...His 46 such starts are tied with Dwight Gooden for the second-most in franchise history through a starter's first 54 career games...He had allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts from June 23, 2023 to July 11, 2025, which tied with deGrom (from 4/16/18-4/3/19) for the second-longest such streak in franchise history...At the time, it was the longest active such streak in the majors...He trailed only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22).

**SENGA GENESIS:** Through Senga's first 54 career starts he has posted 336 strikeouts...His 320 strikeouts through his first 52 Major League games are the fifth-most in Mets history behind Dwight Gooden (449), Noah Syndergaard (374) Matt Harvey (373) and Jacob deGrom (358)...His 320 strikeouts are also the fifth-most among Japanese-born pitchers through their first 54 starts, trailing only Yu Darvish (446), Hideo Nomo (425) and Shohei Ohtani (379)...His career 3.00 ERA (99 ER/296.2 IP) is the eighth-best in franchise history through a player's first 54 starts with the club.

**CRUISING AT CITI:** In 29 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 12-5 with a 2.80 ERA (49 ER/157.1 IP), which is the 11th best in the history of the ballpark (min. 90.0 IP)...He has allowed just 15 home runs to 653 batters faced, recording a 0.86 HR/9.0IP ratio at home...His 11.27 K/9.0IP is the third-highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin Díaz's 15.10 K/9.0IP and Jacob deGrom's 11.52 K/9.0IP (min. 400 BF).

**2024 REWIND:** He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

**REMARKABLE ROOKIE:** During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967)...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

**HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.
