IN THE STANDINGS [167 days]: The Brewers have spent the following number of days alone or tied at each position in the NL Central standings: <u>FIRST</u>: 92, <u>SECOND</u>: 63, <u>THIRD</u>: 5, <u>FOURTH</u>: 6, <u>FIFTH</u>: 1.....the team is in second place, trailing the Cardinals by 8.5 games.....the team trails the Phillies by 2.5 games for the last Wild Card spot.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Brewers are 22-19-8 in series play, including this series.

AT HOME: The Brewers are 41-30 at home, going 14-7-3 in series play, including this series.....the team went 45-36 at home last season, going 14-10-2 in series play.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 37-40 on the road, going 8-12-5 in series play.....the team went 50-31 on the road last season, going 18-7-1 in series play.....their 50 road wins in 2021 broke the franchise record set by the 1982 team (47-33).

MANAGER: Craig Counsell - the longest-tenured active manager in the National League and third in the majors - is in his eighth season as Brewers manager (607-549) and seventh full season.....Counsell has the most wins of any manager in franchise history, passing Phil Garner, who had 563, on 6/15 at New York-NL....his 1,156 games ranks second to Garner (1,180).....under Counsell, the Brewers made the postseason in four consecutive years (2018-21) for the first time in franchise history.....he was named the 19th manager in franchise history on 5/4/15, replacing Ron Roenicke.....he is signed through 2023.....only the Guardians' Terry Francona (10/8/12) and Rays' Kevin Cash (12/5/14) have longer active tenures.

COACHES: First base coach Quintin Berry (2nd season), pitching coach Chris Hook (4th season), third base coach Jason Lane (7th season, 2nd as 3B coach), associate pitching, catching and strategy coach **Walker McKinven** (3rd season) and bench coach Pat Murphy (7th season) all returned from the 2021 staff.....new to the staff is hitting coach Connor Dawson, infield/assistant hitting coach Matt Erickson, bullpen coach Jim Henderson and hitting coach Ozzie Timmons.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 31 replay challenges this season, going 19-12....their last challenge (lost) came on 9/16 vs. New York-AL as a safe call at second base (Oswaldo Cabrera) stood.

#### TODAY'S STARTER: #37 - RHP ADRIAN HOUSER (20g, 19gs, 6-9, 4.85)

HOUSER AT A GLANCE: Adrian Houser, 29, will make his 21st appearance and 20th start of the season.....Houser last pitched last Friday vs. New York-AL and had no decision in the Brewers' 7-6 win (3ip, 7h, 5r, 4er, 4bb-1ibb, 1k, 85 pitches).....the team is 8-11 in his starts.....he has 6 quality starts.....opponents are batting .263 (98-for-373, 8hr)....he was on the 15-day injured list from 7/1-8/23 with a right flexor strain.....Houser was acquired from Houston with LHP Josh Hader, OF Brett Phillips and OF Domingo Santana for OF Carlos Gómez, RHP Mike Fiers and International Signing Bonus Slot #76 on 7/30/15.

LAST SEASON: Houser went 10-6 with a 3.22 ERA in 28 games/26 starts last season.....the team went 18-8 in his starts.....he made 7 quality starts.....opponents batted .228... he went 7-1 with a 2.65 ERA over his last 19 games/17 starts (98.2ip, 29er), including 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA over his last 5 games, all stats (30ip, 5er).....he was on the injured list (COVID-19) from 8/7-8/21.

2021 HIGHLIGHTS: On 5/8/21 at Miami, Houser became the 15th pitcher (17x) in the Modern Era (since 1900) to hit a home run, walk nobody and have 10+ strikeouts in a game.....on 9/4/21 vs. St. Louis, he threw the first 9-inning complete game by a Brewer since Jimmy Nelson on 6/18/17 vs. San Diego, a span of 612 games.....it was the first complete game shutout by a Brewer since Kyle Lohse on 9/24/14 at Cincinnati, a span of 1,011 games (MLB record).

CAREER: Is 23-28 with a 3.99 ERA in 104 games/74 starts (420ip, 186er).....is in his sixth Major League season, all with the Brewers (2015, 2018-22).....is 18-28 with a 4.33 ERA as a starter (363.2ip, 175er) and 5-0 with a 1.76 ERA in relief (56.1ip, 11er)....underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his right elbow on 7/21/16.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 8-13 with a 3.47 ERA in 52 games/35 starts (204.2ip, 79er).....is 3-4 with a 3.73 ERA in 10 games/9 starts this season (50.2ip, 21er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 15-15 with a 4.47 ERA in 52 games/39 starts (215.1ip, 107er).....is 3-5 with a 6.14 ERA in 10 starts this season (44ip, 30er).

CAREER vs. METS: Is 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA in 3 games/1 start (Bip, 4er)....his only start came this season on 6/14 at Citi Field in a 4-0 loss (4.2ip, 8h, 4r, 4er, 1bb, 3k, 1wp).

# TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP BRANDON WOODRUFF (24gs. 11-4, 3.26)

RHP Brandon Woodruff makes his 25th start of the season and fourth against the Reds.....Woodruff last started last Saturday vs. New York-AL and earned a 4-1 win (8ip, 5h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 10k, 1hr, 1hbp, 101 pitches).....the team is 16-8 in his starts.....he has made 12 quality starts.....opponents are batting .220 [111-for-505, 16hr].....he was on the 15-day injured list from 5/30-6/27, retroactive to 5/28, with a right ankle sprain and Raynaud's syndrome affecting his pitching fingers.....since coming off the IL, he is 6-1 with a 2.55 ERA in 15 starts [91.2ip, 26er].....Woodruff has gone 6-4 with a 3.65 ERA in 14 career games/12 starts vs. Cincinnati (89ip, 28er), including 2-1 with a 5.63 ERA in 3 starts this season (16ip, 10er).
