METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets enjoyed a day off on Thursday...On Wednesday, the team fell to the Tigers, 6-2, in the final game of a three-game set...The Mets had their first day off after playing 16 straight games...They went 9-7 in that span...Today the team begins a stretch of 10 straight games and in 16 games in 17 days...The Mets are in the midst of their penultimate road trip of the season, a 10-game trip (2-1) against Detroit (2-1), Cincinnati (three games) and Philadelphia (four games).

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to today's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves: RHP Kodai Senga has been optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...RHP Wander Suero (#54), who was claimed off waivers from the Braves yesterday, reported to the Major League team...C Francisco Alvarez has been returned from rehab assignment and reinstated from the 10-Day Injured List...C Hayden Senger has been optioned to Triple-A Syracuse.

SEASONS GREETINGS: Over a career-high 26 starts this season, David Peterson has gone 8-5 with a 3.61 ERA (61 ER/152.0 IP), 58 walks and a career-high 136 strikeouts...He has allowed three earned runs or less in 21 of his 26 starts this season and one or zero earned runs in 10 starts...Has allowed four or more earned runs in five of his last 12 starts after not allowing more than three ER through his first 14 starts of the season...Has a 4.96 ERA (36 ER/65.1 IP) over his last 12 starts after having a 2.60 ERA (25 ER/86.2 IP) in his first 14 starts...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, is third in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.53, third in NL), tied for third in opponent GIDP (18, tied for first in NL), and sixth in groundball percentage (55.3, fourth in NL).

MAKE IT A BAKER'S DOZEN: Soto has safely reached base in 13 straight games...He is batting .378 (17-45) in that span with one triple, six homers, 17 walks, seven steals, a .556 OBP and an .822 SLG...He has safely reached base in 30 of his last 31 games, batting .295/.452/.634 in that span with one triple, 12 homers, 29 RBI, 31 walks, 12 steals and a 1.086 OPS.

25/25 GOING ON 30/30: Juan Soto (37 HR/27 SB) and Francisco Lindor (26 HR/28 SB) join Howard Johnson (36 HR/32 SB) and Darryl Strawberry (39 HR/36 SB) in 1987 as the only pair of Mets teammates to have a 25/25 season...Along with the 1987 Mets, the 1996 Rockies are the only other team that featured two players with a 30/30 season - Dante Bichette (31 HR/31 SB) and Ellis Burks (40 HR/32 SB).

AND I WOULD WALK 100 MILES: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 115 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

10 FOR NO. 9: Brandon Nimmo is on a 10-game hitting streak...He is batting .405 (17-42) in that span with 10 runs, four doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, three walks, a .435 OBP and a .643 SLG...He has safely hit in 17 of his last 19 games, batting .370 (27-73) with 16 runs, six doubles, three home runs, 15 RBI, six walks, a .407 OBP and a .575 SLG...He has hit 22 home runs this season...He hit 23 last season and a career-high 24 in 2023...He is one of 16 Mets to record at least three seasons of 20 home runs.

LAST TIME OUT: His last start came on August 30 vs. Miami and it was the 110th career start of his career, passing Johan Santana and Bobby Ojeda for the eighth-most starts by a southpaw in franchise history...Al Jackson (138 GS) is next...In his last start, he allowed a career-high eight earned runs over 2.0+ innings...Was his shortest start of the season and his shortest since he failed to get out of the first inning on September 14, 2022 vs. Chicago-NL...He only recorded one strikeout in a start for the first time since June 12, 2024 vs. Miami...Allowed five earned runs in the first inning...Marked the first earned run he’s allowed in the first inning since May 18 at New York-AL...Since the beginning of 2024 (46 starts) he had allowed three earned runs in the first inning prior to his last start.

GOING THE DISTANCE: Has thrown 7.0+ innings in six of his 26 starts this season...Mets starters have completed 7.0 innings 10 times this season, six of those starts coming from Peterson...Joins Nolan McLean as the only Mets pitchers to complete 8.0 innings his season...His two 8.0+ IP starts are the most by a Mets southpaw in a single season since Jon Niese (2014)...He has pitched 5.0 or more in 21 of his 26 starts this season, and 6.0+ innings in 16 of those starts...His 21 such starts are the second-most on the team (most: Clay Holmes - 22) and his 16 such starts of 6.0 or more innings is the most on the team (next: Homes - 8)...He is one of 12 left-handed starters this season to record at least 16 starts with 6.0+ IP, joining Framber Valdez, Garrett Crochet, Cristopher Sánchez, Robbie Ray, Tarik Skubal, Matthew Boyd, MacKenzie Gore, Jeffrey Springs, Carlos Rodón , Ranger Suárez and Max Fried...He joins Sean Manaea (16 in 2024) as the only Mets lefties to record as many 6.0+ IP starts since Steven Matz (16 in 2016 and 2019)...Peterson's 21 starts of 5.0+ IP, his 16 starts of 6.0+ IP, six starts of 7.0+ IP and two 8.0+ IP are all his most in a single season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Has made 12 road outings this season, nine being quality starts...Despite his nine total QS, the Mets have gone 3-9 in his road starts compared to a 10-4 record when he starts at home...Has combined to go 3-4 with a 3.44 ERA (28 ER/73.1 IP), 30 walks and 70 strikeouts on the road this year...He is one of 13 pitchers this season to have as many quality starts on the road (one of five left-handers)...In 24 road starts since his start to the 2024 season, Peterson has gone 9-5 with a 3.02 ERA (49 ER/146.0 IP), 56 walks and 120 strikeouts...He has recorded quality starts in 17 of those games, including 14 of his last 19 (since August 3, 2024)...Has allowed two runs or less in 18 of those 24 road outings and one or zero earned runs in eight...Had six straight quality starts to open the season on the road, which were the most by a Mets starter since Noah Syndergaard's six such starts from April 5 - June 8, 2016.

VS. REDS: Will be making his fifth career start against the Reds tonight...Has faced the Reds once this season on July 20 at Citi Field, allowing just one unearned run over 6.0 innings (4 H, BB, 4 K, HP).

YEAR IN REVIEW: Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 37 of his 47 starts, going 18-8 with a 3.30 ERA (100 ER/273.0 IP), 104 walks and 237 strikeouts...27 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 28-19 over games in which Peterson has started in that span...Since 2024, has allowed just 10 runs in the first inning, which is the tied for the fourth lowest in the majors during that span (min. 40 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 40 GS), he is first in HR/9.0 IP (0.56), fifth in winning percentage (.692, first in NL), seventh in groundball percentage (53.1, fourth in NL) and eighth in opponents' SLG (.348, third in NL).

LEFTY LEADERBOARD: His 600 K are the eighth-most by a left-hander in franchise history...Johan Santana is next on the list with 607 K...His 111 career starts are the eighth-most in franchise history by a southpaw...Vs. left-handers this season, has posted a .215/.261/.269

slash line (28-130) and has allowed just one home run to 139 lefty batters faced...Among qualified left-handed pitchers facing left-handed batters this season, he is third in groundball percentage (67.8), fifth in strikeouts (43), fourth in opponents' SLG, eighth in OPS (.530) and 10th in opponents' OBP...He reached 500.0 career innings pitched on May 18, becoming one of 18 left-handed pitchers to reach the milestone with the franchise...He also became the 13th Mets southpaw to reach 500 strikeouts on May 6 and was the first to do so since Steven Matz (recorded his 500th strikeout on 9/11/19).

QUALITY CONTROL: Has recorded 15 quality starts in 26 total outings this season, including 12 of his last 19 starts...Recorded five straight quality starts from 7/3-8/1, which was tied for the longest such streak in his career (also: 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson has recorded 27 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 25 of them coming in his last 42 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to now, he is one of 10 pitchers (one of five in NL) to record at least 25 quality starts and one of four left-handers to do so (also: Tarik Skubal, Framber Valdez and Cristopher Sánchez).

APPLE PICKING: This season, Peterson has recorded a net bases prevented of eight (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which is tied for the best in the majors with Mitchell Parker and Will Warren...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 32 net bases prevented is the most among qualified Major League pitchers...Chris Flexen and José Berríos are next on the list at 22...Peterson has recorded 18 career pickoffs (three this season), which is tied with Sid Fernandez for the seventh-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20)...According to *OPTA*.

CAREER NOTES: Has set new career highs in strikeouts, innings pitched and starts this season...Was selected to the All-Star team for the first time in his career in 2025...He was the first Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Kodai Senga in 2023 and the first left-handed Mets pitcher to be named an All-Star since Johan Santana (2009)...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from 6/5-17...He threw at least 5.0 innings in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 36-29 with a 3.97 ERA (267 ER/606.0 IP), 255 walks and 600 strikeouts in 127 games (111 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.
