RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals opened their 135th season of play in the National League on Thursday with a memorable come-from-behind 9-7 victory over the visiting Tampa Bay Rays at Busch Stadium ... The two teams continue their season-opening three-game series with 1:15 p.m. CT matinees today and Sunday in St. Louis.

OPENING DAY WEEEEEEEEEEEE: Prior to Thursday's six-run comeback win, the largest Cardinals comeback win on any Opening Day was a five-run deficit on **April 26, 1995** vs. Phillies at Busch II as the Cardinals trailed 5-0 in the top of the 3rd inning before winning 7-6 on **Scott Cooper's** walk-off two-run single in the 9th inning off **Norm Charlton**. - *Elias*

- The largest Cards comeback win in St. Louis all-time is nine runs on **May 9, 1992** vs. Braves after falling behind 9-0 after the top of the 4th inn ... St. Louis won 12-11 after scoring seven unanswered. - *Elias*
- Prior to Thursday, the last time the Cardinals won a home game after trailing by 6+ runs was **Sept. 30, 2017** vs. Brewers in a 7-6 win at Busch III (trailed 6-0 after top 3). - *Elias*
- Thursday's victory was the Cardinals largest comeback win overall since St. Louis erased a seven-run deficit on **July, 19, 2019** at Cincinnati in its 12-11 win, which was also the last time the Cardinals won while allowing 17+ hits (Reds had 18 hits).

MEMORABLE LID-LIFTERS: According to *Elias & Sarah Langs*, Thursday's Cards-Rays lid-lifter was only the 2nd Opening Day game in MLB history where **both teams scored 6+ runs in the same inning**, joining the Boston Beaneaters (Braves) & Brooklyn Bridegrooms (Dodgers) on **April 19, 1890** (3rd inning).

- The only other Opening Day game in MLB history with **both teams scoring 6+ runs in any inning** was **April 21, 1937** at **Sportsman's Park** between the Chicago White Sox (6 runs - 8th inn.) and St. Louis Browns (7 runs - 5th inn.).
- The only other time the Cardinals scored 8+ runs in an inning on Opening Day was **April 3, 2006** at Philadelphia's Citizens Bank Park, an eight-run 4th frame en route to a 13-5 win.
- Thursday marked the first time the Cardinals and their opponent scored 14+ combined runs in an inning since **July 18, 2001** when Houston and St. Louis combined for 14 runs during the 5th inning (17-11 Astros win at Enron Field).

HIT PARADE: Thursday's combined 15 hits in the 6th inning by the Cards (8) and Rays (7) marked only the 6th time in the Expansion Era (1961-present) that both teams had 7+ hits in the same inning and first since July 31, 2025 between Atlanta (8) at Cincinnati (8) in the 8th inning ... The seven consecutive Cardinals hits to begin the bottom of the 6th was their longest since nine straight hits to begin the bottom of the 7th inning on Sept. 6, 2013 vs. Pittsburgh. - *Elias*

- Three Cardinals had 3+ hits in an Opening Day game for the 3rd time in franchise history after the **1965** and **1984** openers.

AND NOW DEEP THOUGHTS: After homers from **JJ Wetherholt** and **Alec Burleson** on Thursday, St. Louis has now gone yard in 10 consecutive Opening Days dating back to 2017, MLB's longest active Opening Day homer streak ... Burly's go-ahead blast traveled a projected 432 feet, MLB's 3rd-longest homer on Thursday, while Wetherholt's solo homer was 425 feet, MLB's 5th-longest.

- Wetherholt, White Sox **Munetaka Murakami**, and Mets **Carson Benge** all homered on Thursday in their MLB debuts, representing the most players to homer in their MLB debuts on a single day in MLB history (since 1900) - *OptaStats/Sarah Langs*

YOUNGRIER: According to *Baseball America*, the Cardinals entered the 2026 season with the youngest Opening Day roster across Major League Baseball with an average age of 27.3, while the Braves sport MLB's oldest average age at 30.9 ... At age 23.5, **JJ Wetherholt** is the 16th-youngest in the National League and the circuit's youngest middle infielder.

TAMPA & ST. PETERSBURG CONNECTIONS

Matthew Liberatore was originally selected by Tampa Bay in the 1st round (16th overall) in the 2018 MLB Draft, making him the highest drafted high school player in Rays franchise history... pitched two seasons (2018-19) in the Rays minor league organization...traded to St. Louis with **Edgardo Rodriguez** and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP **Tink Hence**) for **José Martínez**, **Randy Arozarena** and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF **Alika Williams**), Jan. 9, 2020.

MLB's Fastest Friends **Victor Scott II** and **Chandler Simpson** are both Atlanta natives...were teammates on the 2021 Fond du Lac Dock Spiders... Co-led Minor League Baseball in 2023 with 94 stolen bases...Scott II aka "Argo" recently released a rap music album that featured Simpson.

Ryne Stanek pitched parts of his first three seasons with the Rays (2017-19)...was selected by Tampa Bay in the 1st round (29th overall) in the 2013 MLB Draft.

Cardinals President of Baseball Operations **Chaim Bloom** worked 15 years in the Rays baseball operations department, including the final three as Senior Vice President, Baseball Operations.

Oliver Marmol attended Dr. Phillips High School in nearby Orlando.

Steven Matz pitched parts of four seasons in St. Louis (2022-25)...traded to Boston for INF **Blaze Jordan** (July 31, 2025).

Richie Palacios played in 32 games for St. Louis in 2023...Traded to Tampa Bay for RHP **Andrew Kittredge** (Jan. 5, 2024).

Brandon Allen played in seven games for Tampa Bay in 2021.

Ryan Vilade played in seven games for St. Louis in 2025.

Rays Comm. Director. **Elvis Martínez** spent 2017 in the Cards organization as a Baseball Operations Fellow & GCL Cardinals Coordinator in Jupiter, Fla.

Hall of Fame Manager **Tony La Russa** is a Tampa native...raised in Ybor City and graduated from Jefferson High School in Tampa...earned undergraduate degree from the Univ. of South Florida.

The Rays selected C **Mike DiFelice** in the first round (#10 overall) and OF **Kerry Robinson** in the second round (#22 overall) from the Cardinals in the 1997 MLB Expansion Draft.

Rays broadcaster **Dewayne Staats** is a graduate of SIU-Edwardsville, where he began his sports career with WSIE Radio...won an Emmy Award as the sports director at KPLR TV in St. Louis.

Cardinals Baseball Information & Media Services Manager **Chris Tunno** graduated from Stetson University...worked in Sports Information at Stetson and the University of Central Florida.

The Cardinals called Waterfront Park and Al Lang Stadium in St. Petersburg their Spring Training homes for 57 seasons (1938-42, 1947-97).

TODAY'S STARTER:

- The 25-year-old righty is making his 2026 debut today in his 20th career start and 22nd career game pitched.
- This season marks his 1st time making the Cardinals Opening Day roster.**
- Making his 1st career MLB appearance in the month of March/April - 17 of his 21 career appearances (16 of 19 starts) have come post All-Star break.
- Is making his 1st career appearance/start against Tampa Bay and just his 4th career Interleague appearance (1-0, 1.50 ERA, 18.0 IP)
- Today is his 12th career appearance (10th start) at Busch Stadium where he is 5-3 with a 4.50 ERA
- Went 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA in 5 Spring Training starts, striking out 16 to just 2 walks but did allow a team-high 6 HR's
- Led MLB with his 4 Spring Training wins and ranked in top 10 in ERA (2.45), Opp. BA (.229) and WHIP (0.98)**

NL Rookie Rankings: Wins (8, T-2nd), Innings Pitched (95.2, 6th), Games Started (16, 6th), Quality Starts (7, T-1st)

CARRYING THE LOAD: Combined to make 31 starts over 32 appearances between St. Louis and Memphis (AAA). Hurlled a career-high 170.2 innings and won 16 games.

TOTAL RECALLS: Was recalled five times to St. Louis during the season including once as the 27th player in a doubleheader (6/19 at CWS).

SECOND WINS: Ranked T-2nd among Cardinals pitchers with **Miles Mikolas** (31 GS) and **Matthew Liberatore** (29 GS) with eight wins, despite making only 16 starts.

POST-ER CHILD: His 7 wins post All-Star Break ranked T-5th among Major League pitchers. Most by a Cardinals pitcher since **Adam Wainwright** went 10-2 post All-Star Break in 2021.

ONE-HIT WONDER: Made his 2025 season debut with 5.2 scoreless innings of one-hit relief vs. NYM (5/4) in the second game of a doubleheader sweep earning the win.

QUALITY STUFF: Made 10 starts of 6.0 innings or more, six of those quality starts. Pitched 6.0 innings or more in six August starts, longest streak by a Cardinals pitcher in 2025.

AUGUST RUSH: Was 4-0 in the month of August, most wins by a Cardinals pitcher in August since **Adam Wainwright** was 5-1 in 2021.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR SUPPORT: Benefitted from a 6.21 run support average, ranked 7th among MLB pitchers with 16 or more starts.

SEEING RED: Threw a season-high 7.0 scoreless innings of three-hit ball vs. CIN (9/16) in a 3-0 win.

TURN ON THE FANS: Struck out a career-high seven batters over 6.0 innings vs. PIT (8/25).

WALKING PNEUMONIA: Led all Cardinals starting pitchers with a 1.9 walks/9 IP ratio.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE: Ranked 3rd among Cardinals with 10 opponent ground into double plays induced, trailing Andre Pallante and Erick Fedde with 12.

TRIPLE-A ON DISPLAY: Was 8-3 with a 3.72 ERA in 15 starts at Memphis (AAA). At the time of recall, was 3rd among International League leaders in winning pct. (.727, 8-3), 5th in wins (8), 8th in ERA (3.72) and WHIP (1.24).

CAREER:

- Cardinals 1st round pick in 2021 made his Major League debut vs. Texas on July 31, 2024, throwing 7.0 innings and allowing one run in a 10-1 victory.
- Has 11 wins in his first 21 Major League games, 6th Cardinals pitcher to achieve that mark and first since Luis Arroyo in 1955. **Jack Harper** set the franchise record with 14 wins in 1901. **Bobby Miller** of the Dodgers was the last in MLB with 11 (2023).
- His .769 win percentage Post All-Star Break over the past two seasons (2024-25) is the best among starting pitchers.
- Posted a 1.96 ERA (5 ER/23.0 IP) through his first four career games, best by a Cardinal through his first four career games since RHP René Arocha's 1.52 ERA (4 ER/23.2 IP) in 1993 (min. 20 IP).
- Became the first Cardinals rookie to pitch at least 8.0 IP in one of his first four career starts since RHP **Alan Benes** on Sept. 30, 1995 at Pittsburgh (3rd career start).
- First Cardinals pitcher to earn a win in his MLB debut at Busch Stadium since **Nick Greenwood** (6/16/2014 vs. NYM). First Cardinals pitcher to throw 7.0 or more innings in his MLB debut at home since **Jason Simontacchi** vs. ATL (5/4/2002). First Cardinals pitcher to throw 7.0 innings with 1 ER or less in his MLB debut since **Michael Wacha** vs. KC (5/30/2013), and first to do so and earn the win since **Tyler Lyons** (5/22/13 at SD). Started the game with 5.0 scoreless innings, most since **Austin Gomber** with 6.1 scoreless innings at CIN (7/23/2018).
- Earned a win in relief in his second MLB appearance with 3.0 scoreless innings in relief vs. PIT (9/18/24) in a 10-5 win at Busch Stadium. Is the only Cardinal in franchise history to earn a win as a starting pitcher and then a relief pitcher in his first two appearances (7/31 vs. TEX & 9/18 vs. PIT).
- Threw a career-high 8.0 innings at San Francisco (9/29/24) on the final day of the regular season, allowing one run in a win. Marked the longest outing by a Cardinals starting pitcher in 2024
- His outing on 9/29/24 at SF made him one of 11 rookie pitchers in 2024 (12 instances) to throw 8.0 or more innings.
- Was the first Cardinals pitcher with nine or fewer walks and 80.0+ IP in their first 14 career games and only the 2nd in MLB history with **Elmer Steele** (1907-08) of the Boston Red Sox.
- Over the past four seasons, led Minor League Baseball in wins (39), innings pitched (552.1), games started (82) and complete games (4).

McGREEVY vs. TAMPA BAY:

- Is making his 1st career appearance/start against Tampa Bay and just his 4th career Interleague appearance (1-0, 1.50 ERA, 18.0 IP).
- Posted a 7-2 win at the Rays Triple-A Durham Bulls club on 5/28/25 while pitching for Memphis, striking out 9 in 6.0 IP and allowing 1 run.
- This is his 1st career appearance against an American League East opponent.

GIVE ME A FIFTH: Former non-drafted free agent looking to appear in games with 5th Major League club, previously appearing in 94 total games with LAD (65), TOR (15), COL (7) and PIT (7) ... Signed as a free agent with the Reds in 2024, but did not pitch in an MLB game.
