METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets split a doubleheader with the Braves yesterday...The Mets won game one and fell in the nightcap...The loss snapped a three-game win streak and a four-game streak against Atlanta...They were shut out for 10th time this season, that is tied for the second-most such games in the majors this season...This year, the Mets have held their opponents to one or zero runs 17 times this season and they are 15-2 in those contests...The Mets are in the midst of a 10-game homestand (3-3) against the Dodgers (1-2), Braves (2-1) and Marlins (four games).

HERE COME THE JOHNNIES: The New York Mets welcome the 2026-27 St. John's men's basketball team on Thursday night. Led by Hall of Fame Coach Rick Pitino, the Red Storm is coming off back-to-back BIG EAST Regular Season and Tournament Championships and a trip to the Sweet 16 this past March...The Johnnies have won 30 games and matched a league record with 18 BIG EAST wins in each of the last two seasons...Rising junior and New York City native Ian Jackson will throw out the ceremonial first pitch to fellow returner Ruben Prey.

HERE'S THE PITCH: Mets pitchers have combined to pitch to a 2.91 ERA (34 ER/105.0 IP) since the All-Star Break, the second-lowest such mark in the majors...The starting rotation has posted seven quality starts in the second half of the season...Mets relief pitchers have not allowed a run over their last 17.2 innings...The bullpen's 2.06 ERA (9 ER/39.1 IP) after the All-Star Break is the lowest in the NL and the third-lowest in the majors.

ROLLIN' NOLAN: Nolan McLean has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last seven starts...He is the first Met with as many consecutive starts since Sean Manaea made eight straight starts of at least 6.0 innings from August 16-September 21, 2024... Over his last 10 starts, dating back to May 31, he has pitched to a 2.17 ERA (14 ER/58.0 IP) with 67 strikeouts and has allowed two or fewer earned runs in nine of those 10 starts...Over that span, he has the fourth-best ERA and the fifth-most strikeouts among qualified NL pitchers.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 29 career starts, McLean is 12-8 with a 2.96 ERA (55 ER/167.1 IP) and 199 strikeouts...His 199 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 29 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 251, Matt Harvey's 217, Noah Syndergaard's 210 and Kodai Senga's 202...Per Elias...He is one of six pitchers in Major League history to strike out 199+ batters and allow 55 or fewer earned runs through their first 29 appearances (also: Matt Harvey, Jacob Misorowski, Paul Skenes, Stephen Strasburg and Kodai Senga).

ATTABOY ALVY: Francisco Alvarez is batting .274/.353/.492 with 12 runs, three doubles, eight homers, 14 walks and an .844 in 36 games since the start of June 1...His .749 OPS this season is seventh among NL catchers (min. 200 PA).

100!: Carson Benge recorded his 100th career hit on a single up the middle in the fourth inning of game one yesterday...He is the 17th Mets rookie to record 100 hits in a season and the first since Pete Alonso, who set a franchise rookie record with 155 hits in 2019...Has 26 multi-hit games this season, tied with Sal Stewart for the third-most in the majors among rookies.

TWICE IS NIGHT: In game one yesterday, A.J. Ewing recorded two stolen bases in a game for the second time this season (also: 6/5 at San Diego)...Joins Cleon Jones (1966), Mookie Wilson (3x, 1981) and Darryl Strawberry (3x, 1983) as the only rookies in franchise history to record two stolen bases in a game on multiple occasions.

MARLINS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won three straight against the Fish at Citi Field...Overall, the Mets are 90-61 against the Marlins since the yard opened in 2009.

GREAT SCOTT: Christian Scott has allowed four or fewer runs in each of his 24 Major League starts...He is the only Met to ever accomplish the feat and is one of only six pitchers in Major League history to do so.

DREAM WEAVER: Luke Weaver (1.0 IP, H, K): Fired a scoreless eighth inning in game one of the twinbill yesterday...He is unscored upon over his last 11 outings at Citi Field (12.1 IP)...Is unscored upon in 27 of his last 29 outings dating back to May 1 (31.0 IP) and has allowed only one earned run during that span...Is the only relief pitcher in the majors to allow one run and pitch at least 25.0 innings since May

IN THE CITI: The Mets have three of their last four home games...They have gone 6-13 over their last 19 games at Citi Field after starting the season 18-18 at home...They are now 24-31 at home this year...The team has posted a 4.14 ERA, while batting .235/.313/.388 at Citi Field.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in the midst of seven straight games against the NL East...They are 2-1 in that span...The Mets are 16-16 against the division this year...They have posted a 4.35 ERA, while batting .250/.324/.416.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Mets No. 5 prospect, shortstop Mitch Voit led-off the contest in his Double-A debut for Binghamton and laced a double off the center field wall...Then, with two outs in the first inning, second baseman Nick Lorusso delivered an RBI single to make it 1-0 Binghamton...In 77 games between two levels this year, Voit is batting .248/.354/.412 with 26 extra-base hits, 41 RBI and 36 steals.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets fell to Chicago 4-3...Sid Fernandez suffered his fourth loss of the season, allowing all four runs on five hits with three walks and 11 strikeouts over 5.0 innings...Gary Carter collected three hits in the loss including a double...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions.. The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

NEW SKIPPER: Andy Green has been named Interim Manager for the remainder of the 2026 season...Green, who joined the Mets organization in 2023 and previously served as Senior Vice President, Baseball Development, managed the San Diego Padres from 2016-19, guiding the club to a 274-366 (.428) record...The 48-year-old played parts of four Major League seasons with the Diamondbacks (2004-06) and appeared in four games with the Mets in 2009...He will wear #70... The Mets are 11-16 since Green took the helm.

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his seventh loss of the season after allowing two earned runs over 6.0 innings on July 25 vs. Los Angeles-NL (6.0 IP, 7 H, 4 R, 2 ER, HR, 2 BB, 7 K)...Has recorded seven or more strikeouts in six of his last seven starts and in 12 games this season...His 12 such games this season are tied for the eighth-most in the majors and tied for the fifth-most in the NL.

ROLLIN' NOLAN: Has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last seven starts...He is the first Met with as many consecutive starts since Sean Manaea made eight straight starts of at least 6.0 innings from August 16-September 21, 2024.... Over his last 10 starts, dating back to May 31, he has pitched to a 2.17 ERA (14 ER/58.0 IP) with 67 strikeouts and has allowed two or fewer earned runs in nine of those 10 starts...Over that span, he has the fourth-best ERA and the fifth-most strikeouts among qualified NL pitchers.

AHEAD OF THE PACK: This season, he is 7-7 with a 3.32 ERA (44 ER/119.1 IP) with 142 strikeouts and is holding opposing batters to a .206 batting average (90-436)...Among qualified NL pitchers, he ranks third in opposing batting average, sixth in strikeouts and eighth in WHIP (1.11)...Among all qualified rookies in the majors, he ranks first in strikeouts, third in batting average against and in innings pitched, sixth in WHIP, and seventh in ERA.

SPIN THAT THING: This season, he has thrown his curveball 14.1% of the time and he is generating an average of 3,352 RPM on the pitch...That is the highest average RPM on any qualified pitch in the majors this season...He is posting a 41.9% whiff rate on his curveball, which is the third-highest mark on a qualified curveball this season...Batters are hitting just .108 (8-74) in at-bats ending with his curveball, which is the lowest opponents' batting average in at-bats ending with a curveball in the majors among qualifiers...Over his first 29 career starts, opposing batters are hitting .099(10-101) in at-bats ending with McLean's curveball, and he has recorded a career 45.95% whiff rate on the pitch.

SINK SINK BABY: McLean has thrown his sinker 33.2% of the time this season, up from 27.9% last season...His sinker has produced a 20-run value, which is the third-highest run value on any pitch in the majors this season and is the highest mark on any sinker this season...Batters are hitting just .173 (31-179) in at-bats ending with his sinker.

RECORD BOOKS: Through 29 career starts, McLean is 12-8 with a 2.96 ERA (55 ER/167.1 IP) and 199 strikeouts...His 199 strikeouts are the fifth-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first 29 career starts, only trailing Dwight Gooden's 251, Matt Harvey's 217, Noah Syndergaard's 210 and Kodai Senga's 202...Per *Elias*....He is one of six pitchers in Major League history to strike out 199+ batters and allow 55 or fewer earned runs through their first 29 appearances (also: Matt Harvey, Jacob Misorowski, Paul Skenes, Stephen Strasburg and Kodai Senga).

VS. MIAMI: Is set to make his second start of the season against Miami and his second of the season...Earned a win back on May 31 vs. Miami (5.0 IP, 2 H, ER, 5 BB, HB, 2 K) after allowing one run over 5.0 innings...Walked a career-high five batters and struck out a career-low two in the start.

IN THE CITI: Over 15 career starts at Citi Field, he has posted a 3.19 ERA (30 ER/84.2 IP)...He has struck out at least six batters in 14 of his 15 home starts...He became only the second player in Major League history to strike out at least six each of their first 10 career home starts (also: Kerry Wood, 6 K's in each of his first 11 career home starts in 1998 with CHC)...His first three career home starts were scoreless and he became the first Met pitcher to not allow a run in their first three career starts at home and the seventh pitcher in Major League history not to allow a run in each of their first three home starts (min. 15.0 IP)...His 19.1 inning scoreless streak at home is the longest to start a career since Robert Suarez didn't allow a run through all 24.0 innings he threw at home during the 2022 season...Per *Elias*.

PERFECT FIVE: He has retired each of his first 15 batters faced twice this season (4/21 vs. MIN and 4/3 at SF) ...He is the third pitcher in franchise history to be perfect through 5.0 innings multiple times in a season (also: Steve Trachsel, 2002 and Rick Reed, 1998)...His is the first pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to retire each of his first 15 batters multiple times in his first 13 career starts...*Per Elias*...When he was

perfect through 5.0 innings on April 3 he became the first Mets pitcher to retire each of their first 15 batters faced since Sean Manaea retired each of the first 17 batters he faced on August 21, 2024, vs. Baltimore.

ROOKIE SENSATION: McLean was called up to the Majors on August 16, 2025, and he finished the season with the big-league club...Last season he made eight starts for the Mets, and he finished 5-1 with a 2.06 ERA (11 ER/48.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts...The Mets went 6-2 as a team in games started by McLean...His ERA is the third-best in franchise history through a player's first eight career starts, only trailing Terry Leach's 1.68 ERA and Rick Aguilera's 1.92 ERA...His 57 strikeouts are the third-most in franchise history through a pitcher's first eight career games, only trailing Nolan Ryan's 64 and Dwight Gooden's 59...He became the first pitcher in Major League history to throw at least 5.0 innings, strikeout five or more, and allow two or fewer earned runs in each of his first seven career starts...He is one of four players in Major League history to record 57 or more strikeouts and allow 11 or fewer earned runs through their first eight career games...He joins Nolan Ryan, Stephen Strasburg, and Paul Skenes as the only other pitchers to do so...Because McLean threw less than 50.0 innings last season, he is still considered a rookie under MLB's eligibility criteria...He entered the season as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, the No. 1 pitching prospect in baseball, and the No. 1 prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

MC-USA: He represented the USA in the WBC...He made two starts and he finished with a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with eight strikeouts...He held opposing batters to a .222 (6-27) batting average during the event....He got the ball in the championship game vs. Venezuela on March 17 and he tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two earned runs while striking out four.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League debut on August 16, 2025 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joined Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Became the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh).

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: Last season, he appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguers at the time of his callup...He only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances prior to being called up...Overall from 2023-2025, he made 48 minor league appearances (44 starts) and finished 12-15 with a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and 245 strikeouts.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 home runs...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.
