#### SNAKEBITES

**THE NL CHAMPS:** The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs lost 6-2, vs. Braves.

- ◆ Zac Gallen allowed 5 runs (4 earned) over 5.1 innings (7 H, 1 BB, 4 K).
- ♦ Thyago Vieira (2.0 IP), Joe Mantiply (0.2 IP) and Humberto Castellanos (1.0) allowed 1 run over 3.2 frames (4 H, 2 BB, 4 K).
- ◆ Gabriel Moreno reached base 3 times with 1 single and 2 walks.
- ◆ Jake McCarthy had a RBI triple then scored on Eugenio Suarez's ground out in the sixth inning.

**ROSTER AGE:** The D-backs active roster's average age of 28.0 is the third youngest in the NL and sixth youngest in the Majors behind the Guardians (26.8), Athletics (27.3), Phillies (27.6), Nationals (27.8) and Rays (27.8) and ahead of the Tigers (28.2), Giants (28.2), Pirates (28.3), Mariners (28.4) and Rockies (28.4).

♦ The 3 oldest active rosters are the Cardinals (31.1), Rangers (30.6) and Braves (30.5).

**LG2:** Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has reached base safely in 17 of his last 18 games, hitting safely in 16 games, with a .351 average (26-for-74)/.944 OPS, 3 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers, 13 RBI, 2 walks and 1 hit by pitch.

- ♦ Has hit safely in 7 straight games (.290 AVG/.843 OPS).
- ♦ Has hit safely in 6 of his last 7 home games at a .360 clip (9-for-25)/1.000 OPS with 1 double, 1 triple, 1 homer, 6 RBI, 2 walks and 1 hit by pitch.

**JOC VS. NL EAST: Joc Pederson**, in 8 starts vs. NL East this season, is hitting .321 (9-for-28)/.960 OPS with 2 home runs, 5 RBI, 4 walks and 1 hit by pitch.

♦ In 21 starts vs. NL East since 2023, is hitting .319 (22-for-69)/1.057 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 12 RBI, 13 walks and 1 hit by pitch.

**GABI THRIVING IN JULY: Gabriel Moreno**, since being reinstated from the injured list on July 2, has hit safely in 6 of his last 8 games at a .393 clip (11-for-28)/1.076 OPS with 3 doubles, 1 home runs, 5 RBI and 4 walks.

**WHAMO WHACKO WALKER: Christian Walker** has reached base safely in 7 of his last 9 home games, batting .314 (11-for-35)/.543 SLG/.894 OPS with 5 doubles, 1 homer, 7 RBI and 2 walks.

• Among all relievers (min. 15 G) since May 18, his 2 walks are tied for third fewest (1 of 12 relievers; 2 pitchers with 1 walk).

**ALL-STAR STARTER: Ketel Marte** is now a 2-time All-Star as the fan-elected NL starting second baseman (besting Luis Arraez/Padres 55% to 45%)...second career All-Star selection/start (also: 2019)...second D-back with multiple fan elections (also: Paul Goldschmidt)...D-backs' eighth fan-elected start for a position player.

RISPY BUSINESS: Among NL players with runners in scoring position over the last month since June 10 (min. 20 PA), Gabriel Moreno's 1.278 OPS is eighth and Ketel Marte's 1.136 OPS is 14th.

♦ With runners in scoring position, the D-backs boast 3 of the NL's Top 11 players in OPS (min. 100 PA) with Christian Walker seventh at .915, Lourdes Gurriel Jr. ninth at .883 and Ketel Marte 11th at .847.

**GINKS LOCKED IN: Kevin Ginkel** has an 8-game, 8.1-innings home scoreless streak, since June 4, with opponents batting .300 (6-for-30) with 0 walks and 9 strikeouts.

- ♦ Has not issued a walk in his last 7 games since June 25 (30 BF).
- ♦ Has not issued a walk in 19 of his last 20 games since May 18 (82 BF; 2 BB on June 21 @ Phillies).

**WIN THE SERIES:** The D-backs have won or split 9 of their last 11 series overall since May 30, going 6-2-2, including 3-1-2 on the road (splits @ Mets and Padres, win @ Nationals, loss @ Phillies, win @ Dodgers, win @ Padres).

.500: The D-backs' 45-45 record entering Monday's game had them at .500 for the first time since June 21 (38-38) following a 5-4 win @ Phillies, which was their first time at .500 since April 16 (9-9) following a 12-11 win (10 innings.)

VS. BRAVES: The D-backs are 4-5 in their last 9 games vs. Braves, since Sept. 23, 2021.

- ◆The D-backs were swept @ Braves from April 5-7.
- ♦ In 2023, split the season series 3-games-to-3.

**0 IS ROLLING:** The D-backs offense from June 25-July 7, the 12 games prior to this homestand, was the best among NL teams, ranking first in runs (76), OBP (.352), SLG (.489), OPS (.842), times on base (166), tied for first in AVG (.283) and home runs (18), second in extra-base hits (48) and third in doubles (27).

• The D-backs offense on the roadtrip, July 2-7 scored 50 runs (8.3 runs per game) while batting .311 (71-for-228)/.959 OPS with 15 doubles, 1 triple. 15 home runs and 24 walks.

**DEFENSE RULES:** The D-backs defense is among the best in the Majors, ranking tied for first with a .988 fielding pct., with the Rangers, Astros, Braves, while their 40 errors are fourth fewest, behind the Braves (38), Rangers (39) and Rangers (39).

**MILESTONES:** D-backs approaching career milestones:

- Joc Pederson: 199 home runs are 1 shy of 200 career homers.
- **Christian Walker**: 693 hits are 7 shy of 700 career hits...794 games are 6 shy of 800 career games.
- **Lourdes Gurriel Jr.**: 698 games are 2 games shy of 700 career games...391 RBI are 9 shy of 400 career RBI.

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs...debuted in 2023 (Aug. 2, | FIRST BATTER: Limiting first batters faced to a .154 average (2-for-13). 2023 @ Giants...4.2 IP, 2 R, 4 H, 1 BB, 2 K).

- D-backs' second pick, No. 33 overall pick, in Competitive Balance A round, in the 2020 draft...shortened-draft class included current teammates Bryce Jarvis (first round, No. 18 overall) and Brandon Pfaadt (fifth round, No. 149 overall)...all 3 debuted in 2023.
- Played 2 seasons at the University of Miami in 2019-20.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: 13th start (14th game) of the season and fifth start at home.

- In his last 4 starts, is 1-1 with a 4.58 ERA (9 ER in 17.2 IP), 3 walks and 17 strikeouts.
- In his last 8 starts, has walked just 5 batters (158 BF).

LAST OUTING: Took a no-decision in the 10-8 loss @ Padres on July 5 after going 4.2 innings with 5 runs allowed on 8 hits and 1 walk with 2 strikeouts.

· Retired 7 of his first 8 batters (1 2B).

**VS. BRAVES**: First career start against the Braves.

VS. NL EAST: In 3 career starts vs. NL East (all in 2024), is 1-1 with a 1.32 ERA (2 ER in 13.2 IP), .250 opponent AVG (13-for-52)/.635 OPS, 0 walks and 12 strikeouts.

- Has not walked a batter and allowed 1 or fewer runs in 2 of his 3 starts.
- · All 3 starts have been on the road (June 1@ Mets, June 18@ Nationals, June 23 @ Phillies).

VS. LEFT AND RIGHT: In his last 3 starts, is holding lefties to a .200 AVG (5for-25) with 1 walk and 6 strikeouts.

• In his first 4 starts of the season from April 21-May 9, held righties to a .114 average (4-for-35)/.205 OBP and lefties to a .220 average (9-for-41)/.289 OBP.

INNINGS INFO: Holding hitters in innings 1-2, to a .145 average (12-for-83) with 1 walk and 22 strikeouts.

LIMITING THE FREEBIES: His 4.5 walk pct. is third lowest among NL starters (min. 10 GS) behind Shota Imanaga/CHI (4.0) and Miles Mikolas/ STL (4.1) and ahead of Jameson Taillon/CHC (5.0).

FIRST TIME THROUGH: In his first time thru the lineup as a starter, is limiting batters to a .135 average (14-for-104) with 4 walks and 31 strikeouts.

RENO IN 2024: In 5 starts at Triple-A Reno, is 3-2 with a 3.38 ERA (10 ER in 26.2 IP), .242 opponent average, 9 walks and 32 strikeouts.

• Tossed 7.0 scoreless innings and struck out 9 batters in his last start on May 26 @ Oklahoma City.

FIRST WIN: Earned his first Major League win on April 21 @ Giants with his first quality start (2 ER in 6.0 IP).

STEE-RIKE!: Set a career high with 8 strikeouts on April 27 @ Mariners.

PICKOFF POWER: Recorded his first career pickoff on June 6 @ Padres (Fernando Tatis Jr. in the third inning).

DEBUT IN 2023: Made his Major League debut on Aug. 2, 2023 @ Giants and allowed 2 runs in 4.2 IP (4 H, 1 BB, 2 K).

- Struck out his first batter faced, walked his second batter faced then retired 9 straight batters.
- Second member of the 2020 draft class to debut... Brandon Pfaadt on May 3 @ Rangers...Bryce Jarvis on Aug. 15 @ Rockies.

2023 RECAP: Pitched in 7 games (4 starts) in 2 stints in his first Major League season (0-1, 4.33 ERA, 13 ER in 27.0 IP, 27 H, 4 BB, 20 K)...issued just 4 walks to 111 batters faced.

- In 4 starts, went 0-1 with a 5.60 ERA (11 ER in 17.2 IP)...20 H, 4 BB, 15 K.
- In 3 relief outings, went 0-0 with a 1.93 ERA (2 ER in 9.1 IP)...7 H, 0 BB, 5 K.
- Debuted as the starter on Aug. 2, 2023 @ Giants and did not figure in the decision (4.2 IP, 4 H, 2 ER, 1 BB, 2 K).
- Was with the big league team for a month, from Aug. 2-Sept. 4, making 6 appearances (4 starts)...optioned to Triple-A Reno on Sept. 4...recalled on Sept. 22 and made 1 relief appearance @ Yankees (1 ER in 2.2 IP, 2 K)...optioned to Reno on Sept. 25.
- In 23 starts with Triple-A Reno, went 5-9 with a 6.11 ERA (79 ER in 116.1 IP), .268 opponent average, 36 walks and 118 strikeouts.
- Entered the season as the D-backs' No. 9 prospect by MLB Pipeline.

2 SEASONS AT TRIPLE-A: Has played parts of 2 seasons at Triple-A Reno in 2023-24, making 28 starts and going 8-11 with a 5.60 ERA.
