PITTSBURGH PIRATES (75-85) vs. NEW YORK YANKEES (93-67)

SEPTEMBER 28, 2024 AT YANKEE STADIUM, BRONX, NY - 1:05 EDT - GAME #161/ROAD #80

RHP PAUL SKENES (11-3, 1.99 ERA) vs. RHP LUIS GIL (15-6, 3.27 ERA)

THE PIRATES: opened their final series of the season with a 4-2 comeback win last night against the Yankees...Have hit at least one home run in each of their last seven road games (their three bombs on Friday were the most away from PNC Park since going deep five times at Milwaukee on July 9)...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have won eight games when trailing after seven innings (their most since winning nine times in 2019 when trailing after seven frames)...Have played in 51 one-run games, which are tied for the second-most in the National League behind the Brewers (53); it's also the most one-run games for the team since also playing in 51 one-run contests in 2018...Have recorded 12 shutouts this year, which are tied for the sixth-most in the National League...Have allowed the fourth-fewest home runs (54) in MLB among relief pitchers...The only three teams whose bullpens have surrendered fewer home runs this season are the Royals (48), Athletics (51) and Guardians (52)...Have not made an error in seven of their last eight games...Have won 10 of their last 13 games when not making an error.

PAUL GETS THE CALL: Paul Skenes will make his final start of the 2024 campaign this afternoon...According to StatsPerform, the 22-year-old Skenes has a chance to become the fourth different pitcher in MLB history to finish a season with a sub-2.00 ERA while averaging 11.00-plus strikeouts per nine innings (minimum 20 starts), along with Pedro Martinez in 1997 and 2000, Jacob deGrom in 2018 and Blake Snell in 2018...All of those pitchers won the Cy Young that year.

ROOKIE SENSATION: Paul Skenes boasts a 1.99 ERA this season...He is just the second player since 1913 to post an ERA of less than 2.00 through 22 career appearances (all starts), joining Steve Rogers from 1973-74, who posted a 1.95 ERA through his first 22 starts.

FROM THE BUREAU: Paul Skenes has allowed six hits or fewer in each of his 22 career starts...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, among pitchers who have debuted since 1893, and excluding openers, the 22-start streak matches the fourth-longest stretch in Major League history to start a career...The only other pitchers to accomplish that are Shohei Ohtani (31 games from April 1, 2018 to August 25, 2021), Bill Burbach (24 games from April 11, 1969 to August 16, 1969), Tony Cingrani (24 games from April 18, 2013 to April 30, 2014) and Alek Manoah (22 games from May 27, 2021 to April 17, 2022).

DYNAMIC DUO: This year the Pirates are just the ninth National League team since 1900 to have two rookie pitchers (Paul Skenes with 167 and Jared Jones with 132) each record at least 125 strikeouts in the same season...According to StatsPerform, the Pirates are on pace to be the first team in MLB history to have two rookies average at least a strikeout per inning in the same season (minimum 20 starts each).

LET'S GO REYNOLDS: Bryan Reynolds is the first Pirate since Brian Giles to hit at least 24 home runs in four straight seasons (1999-2002)...Reynolds also comes into today one RBI shy of tying Bill Robinson (412) for 37th place all-time in RBI by a Pirate (since 1920 when RBI became an official stat)...Neil Walker ranks 36th in team history with 418 RBI.

DENNIS DEALING: Dennis Santana has not allowed an earned run in each of his last 21 outings dating back to August 8 while holding opponents to an .068 batting average against (5-for-74)...Santana's 21 straight games without an earned run is tied for the sixth-longest such streak in a single season in club history and the longest since Mark Melancon's 23-game streak from May 16 to July 10, 2016.

KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES: Andrew McCutchen comes into today one run shy of tying Arky Vaughan (936) for 10th all time in Pirates history...McCutchen is also two extra base hits shy of 800 in his career.

SAVING THE DAY: Aroldis Chapman comes into today first in the National League with eight saves this month...That's his most in a month since he had nine in August of 2019...Chapman's 14.31 strikeouts per 9.0 innings ranks second in MLB among relief pitchers behind Oakland's Michel Otanez (14.56).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

September 28, 2000: The Pirates scored twice in the ninth inning for a 3-2 victory over the Astros in what would be the last walkoff win in Three Rivers Stadium history. Jason Kendall started Pittsburgh's comeback in the ninth with a run-scoring single before Warren Morris ended it with a walkoff single that brought home John Vander Wal for the win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...He began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis where he posted an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er) and recorded 45 strikeouts while allowing just eight walks in seven starts before being selected to the Major League roster on May 11...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player draft out of Louisiana State University.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes struck out nine batters in 5.0 innings and earned the win in a 2-0 shutout at Cincinnati on September 22.

VS. NEW YORK (AL): Skenes will be making his first start against the Yankees.

THIS MONTH: Skenes comes into today leading all Major League rookies this month in ERA (0.82)...His 0.82 ERA is also the second-lowest in all of MLB among pitchers with at least 22.0 innings of work...The only pitcher to post a lower ERA this month is Houston's Ronel Blanco with an 0.75 ERA (24.0ip/2er).

BODY OF WORK: Is making his 23rd career start and appearance today...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 21 of his 22 career outings, including two or fewer 19 times and one or fewer 13 times (six scoreless outings).

- Of his 22 career starts, 15 have been quality starts...That's tied for the most on the team along with Mitch Keller.

AS A PIRATES ROOKIE: Skenes comes into today with 167 strikeouts, which are the most by a Pirates rookie...The previous record since 1900 was 142, which was held by Cy Blanton in 1935... Skenes ranks second among all National League rookies this season in strikeouts...Since making his MLB debut on May 11, Skenes' 167 punchouts are the fourth-most in all of MLB behind Tarik Skubal (175), Chris Sale (173) and Cole Ragans (169).

TRY TO HIT THIS: Skenes has allowed 94 hits through his first 22 Major League starts...That's the fewest by any Pirate in that span since 1901...He is aiming to become the fifth Major League rookie since 1900 with at least 150 strikeouts and fewer than 40 walks in a single season, along with Chicago's Shota Imanaga (2024), San Diego's Chris Paddack (2019), Los Angeles' Walker Buehler (2018), and Noah Syndergaard of the New York Mets (2015).

SHUTOUTS: The Pirates shut out the Reds 2-0 in Skenes' last start Sunday at Cincinnati...It was the fourth time this season Skenes did not allow a run in a game in which the Pirates went on to toss a shutout.

NO JOSHING AROUND: Skenes is tied for second among all National League rookies with 11 wins...That's also the most wins by a Pirates rookie since Josh Fogg won 12 games in 2002.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Since making his Major League debut on May 11, Skenes ranks among the NL leaders in ERA (first, 1.99), WHIP (first, 0.96), strikeout-to-walk ratio (third, 5.22), strikeouts (second, 167), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (second, 11.47) and batting average against (second, .200).

100 K CLUB: Skenes reached 100 career strikeouts in his 13th career game in his outing on July 29 at Houston...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the sixth player all-time since the current mound distance was established in 1893 to reach 100 strikeouts in 13 or fewer games and the first since Masahiro Tanaka did so in 2014...The others to do so were Kerry Wood in 1998 (12 games), Hideo Nomo in 1995 (12 games), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (13 games) and Herb Score in 1955 (12 games).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Skenes made the start for the National League at the 2024 All-Star Game in Arlington on July 16, tossing a scoreless first inning with three groundouts and a walk...He was the first Pirate to earn the starting honors in the All-Star Game since Jerry Reuss in 1975...Dock Ellis (1971), Bob Friend (1960 All-Star Game on July 11), Vernon Law (1960 All-Star Game on July 13) and Bob Friend (1956) are the only other Pirate pitchers to start in the Midsummer Classic.

- He was the fifth rookie to ever start the All-Star game, joining LAD Hideo Nomo in 1995, LAD Fernando Valenzuela in 1981, DET Mark Fidrych in 1976 and WSH Dave Stenhouse in 1962.

JUST KEEP WINNING: Skenes took his first loss as a professional (Major or Minor Leagues) on July 23 vs. St. Louis despite pitching a career-high 8.1 innings, allowing just two runs on four hits with eight strikeouts and no walks in what was his 12th career start...He was the first pitcher in Pirates history to not take a loss in each of his first 11 Major League games, all of which were starts...The previous best had been 10 by Zach Duke in 2005 (source: Elias Sports Bureau).

ON DECK: The 27-year-old Falter will make his 28th start of the season tomorrow in the finale of the 2024 season...Lost a 7-2 decision (5.0ip/4r) in his last start on Tuesday against Milwaukee...Has lost back-to-back starts since winning each of his previous four decisions...Is 2-2 with a 3.52 ERA (23.0ip/9er) in four starts this month...Has allowed five home runs in 71.0 innings in his last 15 starts, averaging 0.63 per 9.0 innings...Has never faced the Yankees.

RACKING UP PUNCHIES: Skenes recorded seven or more strikeouts in nine consecutive games dating back to the second game of the doubleheader in Detroit on May 29 through his start on July 23 vs. St. Louis, surpassing the previous franchise record of seven set by Mitch Keller from April 27-May 31, 2023.

- The nine-game streak matched the Major League record by a rookie, done by Dwight Gooden from August 11-September 23, 1984 and Brandon Beachy from August 9-September 24, 2011 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- In total, Skenes has recorded seven or more strikeouts in 16 of his 22 career outings.
