**THIS DATE IN ORIOLES HISTORY**  
On this date in 1994, RHP Ben McDonald tossed his second career one-hitter in a 4-0 win over the Brewers at Milwaukee County Stadium...Like his first one-hitter (July 20, 1993 vs. KC), his lone hit allowed came in the fourth inning...C Dave Nilsson singled for the only Brewers hit of the game.



**LET'S PLAY TWO:** The Orioles and Marlins will play a doubleheader tonight with two seven-inning contests beginning at 5:05 p.m....The second game will begin approximately 45 minutes after the first game concludes...The O's will serve as the home team for Game 1, while the Marlins will serve as the home team for Game 2...Tonight marks the first doubleheader of the season for Baltimore and first since September 3, 2019 when the O's and Rays split a twin bill at Oriole Park...Since the team moved to Baltimore in 1954, the Orioles are 170-146-294 (sweep-swept-split) in doubleheaders...At home, the O's are 103-68-171...On the road, they are 67-78-123...The records do not include May 19, 1957 and April 22, 1961, in which one of the games was a tie... Tonight's O's-Marlins twin bill is one of two doubleheaders in the majors today, joining the Yankees-Phillies...The Elias Sports Bureau provided a few notes for tonight's seven-inning games:

- ⚾ Rule 9.17 regarding credit for a win to the starting pitcher still applies...If a pitcher pitches a complete game and does not allow a run in a game that was scheduled for seven innings, he will be credited with a shutout...No-hitters by teams and individuals shall not be credited in scheduled seven-inning games, unless the game goes to extra innings and the team (or individual in a complete game) pitches at least nine innings and does not allow a hit.
- ⚾ In 1991, Major League Baseball's special committee for statistical accuracy, chaired by Commissioner **Fay Vincent**, ruled that in order for a pitcher to be credited with a no-hitter "a pitcher or pitchers had to pitch a complete game of nine innings or more without allowing a hit"...Any game of fewer than nine innings in which a pitcher or pitchers do not allow a hit should be considered as a "notable achievement"...Those are noted as such in The Elias Book of Baseball Records.
- ⚾ According to the Elias Sports Bureau, for statistical purposes, the home team is determined by whose grounds the game is played on...Therefore, even though the Marlins will bat last in two games of this series, the O's (and Oriole Park at Camden Yards) will be the home club for statistical splits.

**INTERLEAGUE INFO:** The O's will play a total of 20 games against National League opponents this season, including contests with the Miami Marlins (0-1), Washington Nationals (six games), Philadelphia Phillies (three games), New York Mets (four games), and Atlanta Braves (three games)...Since Interleague Play began in 1997, the O's are 197-227...The O's went 7-13 in Interleague Play last season...Baltimore's 14 Interleague victories in 2016 were the most in club history.

**ALL ABOUT THAT (ON) BASE:** The Orioles rank fourth in the American League with a .783 team OPS (on-base percentage plus slugging percentage)...**INF Hanser Alberto** (1.030) ranks 14<sup>th</sup> in OPS in the AL among qualifying hitters.

**RACKING UP THE K'S:** From July 29-August 2, O's pitchers struck out at least 10 batters in five consecutive games, setting a new club record...The previous record of four-straight had been done three times...The O's have recorded 10-or-more strikeouts in six of their nine games this season.

**THAT HANSER IS SO HOT RIGHT NOW:** Since the start of the 2019 season, **INF Hanser Alberto** leads the majors with 94 hits off of left-handed pitching (22 more than then the next on the list)...In that time, he also leads the majors with a .409 (94-for-230) average against lefties...This season, Alberto ranks fifth in the AL and eighth in the majors with a .385 (15-for-39) against all pitchers.

**ROUGH ROAD AHEAD:** Based on 2019 winning percentages, the Orioles own the second-toughest strength of schedule in the American League (tied for third-toughest in the majors)...The Orioles will play four of last year's 10 postseason teams in 2020...The toughest 2020 schedules based on 2019 winning percentages:

**POSTSEASON PLUS:** Major League Baseball and the Major League Baseball Players Association jointly announced that the 2020 Postseason will expand to 16 teams, beginning with eight best-of-three Wild Card Series preceding the Division Series.

⚾ The higher seeds in the Wild Card Series will host all three games, which will be scheduled for Tuesday, September 29 through Friday, October 2.

**#F16HT AGAINST COLON CANCER:** **INF/OF Trey Mancini** has teamed up with the Colorectal Cancer Alliance to raise awareness for colon cancer...Mancini participates in the organization's "Never Too Young" advisory board, which advocates for all young-onset patients and survivors...In support of Mancini's fight and his partnership with the CCA, the O's are selling **#F16HT** t-shirts to benefit the Alliance...All net proceeds from the shirts will benefit the Colorectal Cancer Alliance Patient and Family Support Services...The shirts are available for \$25, sold exclusively at [Orioles.com/Auctions](http://Orioles.com/Auctions).

**INJURED LIST:** Four players are on the Injured List...**RHP Hunter Harvey** (right forearm strain) and **RHP Dillon Tate** (right elbow contusion) are on the 10-day Injured List...**INF/OF Trey Mancini** (colorectal cancer recovery/treatment) and **INF Richie Martin** (right wrist fracture) are on the 60-day IL.

**COACHING STAFF:** The O's named **Fredi González** as Major League Coach, **Darren Holmes** as Bullpen Coach, and **Anthony Sanders** as First Base Coach...**José Hernández** shifted from Major League Coach to Assistant Hitting Coach...All other coaches remained in their same positions from the 2019 season: **Doug Brocail** as Pitching Coach, **Tim Cossins** as Major League Field Coordinator/Catching Instructor, **José Flores** as Third Base Coach, and **Don Long** as Hitting Coach.

**THE SKIPPER:** **Brandon Hyde** was named the 20<sup>th</sup> manager in O's history on December 14, 2018...He began his first Major League managerial role following 16 professional seasons in the coaching ranks and four as a player...Most recently, Hyde served as bench coach for the Chicago Cubs in 2018, his second season in that role (also 2014)...Hyde spent three seasons as the Cubs first base coach from 2015-17, and previously served as Chicago's Director of Player Development from August 2012-2013, after joining the Cubs in December of 2011 as their Minor League Field Coordinator...Prior to joining the Cubs, Hyde spent nine seasons in the Marlins organization.

## GAME 1 STARTING PITCHER

**LAST START:** Faced the Rays at home for his second start of the season on 7/31...Tossed 4.0 innings and allowed two runs on four hits and three walks with two strikeouts...All four hits were doubles, matching his career-high in doubles allowed in a single game (10x, last: 4/20/19 vs. MIN)...His three walks allowed were his most since he walked three on 9/4/18 at SEA... Now holds a 0-3 record and 4.61 ERA (14 ER/27.1 IP) in five career starts against Tampa Bay...In 64 career starts against the AL East, Cobb is 24-20 with a 3.51 ERA (146 ER/374.0 IP).

**CAREER VS. MIAMI:** Has pitched in five career games (all starts) against Miami and is 3-2 with a 2.78 ERA (10 ER/32.1 IP)...Has held the Marlins to a .186 (21-for-113) clip with two home runs, five doubles, and nine walks with 25 strikeouts... His last start against Miami came on 6/16/18 when he suffered the loss after tossing 7.0 innings, allowing five runs on seven hits, two home runs, and two walks with six strikeouts.

**AGAINST THE NL EAST:** In 11 career games (all starts) against the NL East, Cobb owns a 5-5 record and 3.10 ERA (25 ER/72.2 IP) with 58 strikeouts...Has held NL East opponents to a .190 (49-for-258) clip with 17 extra-base hits (12 doubles, two triples, and three home runs), 23 walks, and 21 RBI...His .190 opponent average against the NL East is his lowest among all divisions.

**HOME NOT-SO-SWEET HOME:** Cobb is a career 23-27 in 72 home starts with a 3.55 ERA (170 ER/431.0 IP)...In 21 games started at Oriole Park at Camden Yards, he has pitched to a 3-9 record with a 5.34 ERA (66 ER/111.1 IP) and opponents have batted .297 (132-for-445) with 21 home runs and 35 walks...His 21 home runs allowed in 21 starts at Oriole Park rank second among all ballparks he has pitched in, trailing only Tropicana Field, where he has allowed 25 home runs in 59 career starts...**Has been held winless at Oriole Park since joining the Orioles in March 2018, pitching to a 0-8 record with a 5.69 ERA (47 ER/74.1 IP) in 14 starts.**

**SEASON DEBUT:** Made his 2020 season debut on 7/25 at BOS...Earned the win after surrendering just one run on a Mitch Moreland solo home run...Allowed only four hits with no walks and six strikeouts through 5.1 innings of work...Marked his 8<sup>th</sup> career start in which he threw at least 5.0 innings, allowed one run or fewer, and issued no walks, with his last coming on August 1, 2018 against the New York-AL.

**AS AN ORIOLE:** Since signing with the Orioles in March 2018, Cobb has started 33 games and pitched to a 6-17 record with a 5.22 ERA (101 ER/174.0 IP) and 118 strikeouts...In his 33 starts, opponents have batted .287 (201-for-701) with 86 extra-base hits (47 doubles, five triples, and 34 home runs)...Through the first six seasons of his career with the Tampa Bay Rays, Cobb owned a 48-35 record and 3.50 ERA (272 ER/700.0 IP) with 570 strikeouts, and held opponents to a .246 (648-for-2639) clip.

**SECOND HALF STRENGTH:** In his only full season with the Orioles in 2018, Cobb posted a 2.56 ERA (17 ER/59.2 IP) in the second half of the season, compared to his 6.41 ERA (66 ER/92.2 IP) in the first half...Opponents batted .232 (51-for-220) against Cobb in the second half of 2018, compared to .313 (121-for-386) in the first half...In his career, Cobb has posted a 10-12 record and 3.62 ERA (60 ER/149.1 IP) through 25 starts in the month of July.

Will be making his second start of the season after taking the loss in his season debut on 7/29 vs. NYY when he allowed five runs (four earned) on four hits including three home runs, while walking two and striking out seven...Has only pitched in two career games (both relief outings) against the Marlins and has a 0.00 ERA (3.2 IP) with no walks and five strikeouts...Both of his appearances vs. Miami came in 2017 as a member of the Cincinnati Reds...His last appearance vs. the Marlins was on 7/29/17 in Miami, tossing 1.2 innings of scoreless relief (1 H, 2 K).

**QUICK HITS:** Took the loss in his season debut on 7/29 vs. NYY after allowing five runs (four earned) on four hits including three home runs, while walking two and striking out seven...Wojciechowski is the longest last name (13 letters) in Orioles history; Arnie Portocarrero (12 letters) had been the previous longest... Became the 46<sup>th</sup> player to appear for the Orioles in 2019...Acquired by the Orioles on 7/1/19 from the Cleveland Indians in exchange for cash considerations... Marked his second stint with the organization after spending part of the 2018 season with Triple-A Norfolk (19 games, 12 starts) before being released on 7/18/18...Has also spent time with the Blue Jays, Astros, Marlins, Diamondbacks, Reds, White Sox, and Indians organizations...Originally drafted by the Toronto Blue Jays in the first round of the 2010 First-Year Player Draft (No. 41 overall) out of The Citadel (S.C).

**AGAINST MIAMI:** Has only pitched in two career games (both relief outings) against the Marlins and has a 0.00 ERA (3.2 IP) with no walks and five strikeouts...Both of his appearances vs. Miami came in 2017 as a member of the Cincinnati Reds...His last appearance vs. the Marlins was on 7/29/17 in Miami, tossing 1.2 innings of scoreless relief (1 H, 2 K).

**FACING THE NL EAST:** Has made nine career appearances (two starts) against the NL East, posting a 0-2 record with a 5.87 ERA (15 ER/23.0 IP) and 25 strikeouts...made two starts against the NL East in 2019 (both against Washington), going 0-2 with a 7.71 ERA (8 ER, 9.1 IP), no walks and 10 strikeouts.

**THE TERRIBLE THREE:** In 2019, the top three batters in the lineup averaged .336 (41-for-122) with 20 extra-base-hits (10 doubles, two triples, eight home runs), 19 RBI, and 11 walks while striking out 11 batters against Wojciechowski, compared to the four through nine-hole hitters, who averaged just .194 (39-for-201) with 18 extra-base-hits (seven doubles, two triples, nine home runs), and 17 walks while striking out 54...Held the heart of the order to a .252 (30-for-119) clip last season.
