The Braves have won each of LHP Max Fried's last eight starts dating to July 15, during which Fried is 6-0 to set a new career-long winning streak.

Fried has a 3.50 ERA (17 ER/43.2 IP) during the run, with wins over Milwaukee, Philadelphia, Cincinnati, Minnesota, the Mets and the White Sox...The stretch spans eight total starts.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Nationals open a four-game set tonight, the 13th of 19 meetings between the clubs this season...The teams are scheduled to finish their season series next week in Washington, September 13-15.

A The teams have split the first 12 games of their season series, with Washington winning four of six here, and Atlanta winning four of six at Nationals Park.

A After dropping the first three games against Washington this season, the Braves have won six of the last nine, despite outscoring the Nationals by only two runs over this stretch (54-52).

A LHP Max Fried is set to face the Nationals for the fourth time in his career, for the third time as a starter, and for the second time this season...The lefty went 5.2 innings and dropped a 5-4 decision to Washington on May 28 here at SunTrust Park, allowing four runs, earned, and nine hits...The Braves are 0-3 in his three career appearances against the Nationals.

A RHP Stephen Strasburg has won all three of his starts against the Braves this season, compiling a 3.93 ERA (8 ER/18.1 IP) with 23 strikeouts in these games...For his career, the righty is 14-11 with a 4.06 ERA (81 ER/179.2 IP) in 33 games, all starts, against Atlanta.

32 OVER: With Tuesday's 7-2 win, the Braves are 86-54 and a season-best 32 games over .500...This ties Atlanta's high-water mark for the past 16 years; the club was also 32 over at 85-53 after play on September 3, 2013...Atlanta has the fifth-best record in baseball, and the second-best mark in the National League, 4.5 games behind Los Angeles.

A The last time the club was more than 32 over was at the end of the 2003 season, when the Braves finished 40 over at 101-61.

SURGING: The Braves have won 17 of their last 21 games and 14 of 16 after Tuesday's win over Toronto...The club moved its magic number to clinch the National League East to 17 after second-place Washington dropped an 8-4 decision to New York (NL) yesterday.

A The last time the club had a better 16-game stretch was from July 26-August 11, 2013; they went 15-1.

A Over their last 16 games, the Braves have compiled a 2.57 ERA (42 ER/147.1 IP) and allowed just 12 home runs.

A The Braves have not lost a multi-game series since July 23-24, when Kansas City swept both games here at SunTrust Park...They have gone 9-0-3 in multi-game series play over this stretch.

A The Braves are on pace to win 100 games this season...Eight different teams in franchise history have won triple digits in a season (last, 2003; 101)... They need to finish 14-8 or better to get there.

WINNING AT HOME: The Braves have won 10 straight in Atlanta after Tuesday's 7-2 victory over Toronto, the club's longest home winning streak of the season...The last time the Braves won 10 consecutive home games in a single season was 2000, when the club won a franchise modern-era record 12 straight from April 8-May 5.

A The Braves have held the opposition to 29 total runs in these 10 games (26 earned runs/2.60 ERA), while striking out 96, converting five saves and collecting 13 holds.

A The longest home single-season winning streak by any Braves team in franchise history is 18, set in 1897 by the Boston Beaneaters...Led by 31-game winner Kid Nichols and four other future Hall of Famers (manager Frank Selee, 3B Jimmy Collins, OF Billy Hamilton, OF Hugh Duffy), the Beaneaters won 18 straight at South End Grounds from May 31-June 25.

ROSTER MOVE: The Braves today recalled OF Adam Duvall and C Alex Jackson from Triple-A Gwinnett and placed Jackson on the 60-day injured list with a left knee sprain...The club also returned RHP Darren O'Day from his major league rehabilitation assignment and reinstated him from the 60-day injured list...The club now has 32 active players.

A Duvall returns to a .241 batting average and six home runs in 26 games with the Braves this season.

A O'Day has spent the entire season recovering from a right forearm strain, and will be making his Braves debut after the club acquired him from Baltimore at last season's trade deadline...The righty pitched in four rehabilitation games, striking out six and not walking any over 4.0 scoreless innings.

VS. THE NL EAST: The Braves enter a stretch tonight of 14 consecutive games against the NL East, specifically Washington (seven games) and Philadelphia (seven games)...The Braves are 38-21 (.644) against the division this season, the fourth-best mark by an Atlanta team since divisional play began in 1969.

A The Braves went 35-16 (.686) against the East in 1999, the club's best ever intradivision record...They won a franchise-record 51 games in 2004 (51-25, .671) against their division, before going 49-27 (.645) last season.

A No other NL team has been better against their own division the last two seasons than Atlanta (87-48, .644)...The Astros have the best intradivision record in the majors for the last two seasons at 88-45 (.662).

RUNS: OF Ronald Acuña Jr. scored twice on Tuesday, giving him a NL-most 111 runs...No Braves player has led the league in runs scored since Dale Murphy in 1985 (118).

A The franchise modern-era record for runs scored in a single season is 131 by Murphy in 1983...Acuña is on pace for 128.

Tonight's Game

- A* Set for his 27th start and 29th appearance of the season...Makes his 36th career start and his 52nd career appearance.
- A* Atlanta has won each of his last eight starts dating to July 15, during which Fried is 6-0, a new career-long winning streak...Had won three straight twice before.
 - A* Is 6-0 with a 3.50 ERA (17 ER/43.2 IP) during the run, with wins over Milwaukee, Philadelphia, Cincinnati, Minnesota, the Mets and the White Sox... The stretch spans eight total starts.
 - A* It is the third such run by Atlanta in a pitcher's starts this season, after winning eight straight games started by Mike Soroka from June 1 to July 14, and each of Mike Foltynewicz's last nine games dating to June 11.
 - A* Atlanta is the only team in the majors to win at least eight straight starts by a single pitcher on three occasions this season, and one of just two teams with at least two such streaks...The Yankees won eight straight starts by both Chad Green (9 straight) and Domingo German (8 games).
- A* His 15 wins are most in the National League by a left-hander, and second most in the majors among lefties...BOS's Eduardo Rodriguez has won 17 games.
 - A* Fried's 15 wins are most by an Atlanta left-hander since 2002, when Hall-of-Famer Tom Glavine won 18 games.
 - A* Atlanta is 20-6 in his starts as a team, including 13-2 in his last 15 turns.
- A* Makes his third career start against Washington, including his second this season, and his fourth career appearance...Is 0-1 with a 5.19 ERA (5 ER/8.2 IP) in his first three games.
 - A* Started against them on May 28 here at SunTrust Park, and allowed nine hits and four runs over 5.2 innings to take the loss...Walked three and fanned five.
 - A* In 11 intradivision games this season, including nine starts, is just 3-2 with a 5.72 ERA (32 ER/50.1 IP)...It is easily his highest ERA against any one division...Has a 2.18 mark against the Central (6 games), a 4.14 ERA against the West (8 games) and a 2.55 mark versus the American League (3 games).

2019 Recap

- A* Struck out a career high-tying 11 batters, 8/30 vs. CWS, to earn his 15th win of the season...Allowed four hits and four runs in 6.0 innings.
 - A* Also won both of his starts against the Cubs this season, becoming just the second Atlanta pitcher to beat both the Cubs and White Sox in a single season...Tim Hudson earned victories over both Chicago clubs in 2013...Dallas Keuchel also did so this season, beating the White Sox the day after Fried.
- A* Started against the Dodgers, 8/18 at SunTrust Park, and allowed eight hits and three runs in 5.0 innings...Did not factor in the decision.
 - A* Surrendered all three runs in the first inning and allowed the first two hitters to reach in the second, before retiring 11 of the next 13 hitters, including the final eight he faced.
 - A* Picked A.J. Pollock off first base in the opening inning, his fifth pickoff of the season...His five pickoffs are tied for second most in the majors.
- A* Won five consecutive starts from July 15-August 13, becoming the first Atlanta pitcher to win five consecutive starts since Mike Minor won five in a row between the 2012 and 2013 seasons.
- A* Missed nine games with a blister on his left index finger, July 16-July 27.
 - A* Was his second career stint on the Braves' injured list due to a blister...Missed from July 6 to July 29 of last season with a blister on his left third finger.
- A* Appeared in 20 games before the All-Star break, and set full-season career highs in wins (9), games (20), starts (18), innings (98.2) and strikeouts (97).
 - A* Went 9-4 with a 4.29 ERA (47 ER/98.2 IP) before the break...His nine wins were the most by a Braves lefty before the All-Star break since 2013, when both Paul Maholm and Mike Minor had nine...No Braves left-hander has won more since Tom Glavine had 11 wins at the break in 2002.
 - A* His nine wins were second most by a left-hander in the National League...Only the Dodgers' Hyun-Jin Ryu won more (10 wins).
- A* Made his third career start against the Cubs, 6/25, and allowed two hits and two runs over 6.0 innings to earn the win...Walked a career high five and fanned eight.
 - A* Is 3-0 in his career against Chicago, winning all three of his starts...Is the first Braves starter to earn the win over Chicago in consecutive starts since LH Mike Minor, who won six straight over the Cubs from 8/22/10 to 7/12/14.
- A* Allowed seven hits and two runs over 6.0 innings, 4/16 vs. ARI...Walked one and struck out three.
 - A* Opened the season with 16.2 innings without allowing an earned run, before Arizona scored twice in the fourth...It was the longest streak without an earned run to open the season by a Braves pitcher since 2013 (Paul Maholm, 25.1 IP).

- Is 1-0 with 3.90 ERA (12 ER/27.2 IP) in 37 games with Atlanta...Thirty of his 37 appearances have been scoreless, including 17 of his last 21.
- Converted his first save chance of the season, 8/14 vs. NYM...Was the seventh save of his career.
- Celebrated 10 years of major league service time on July 27.
- Has a 27.00 ERA (6 ER/2.0 IP) against LAD this season...Has a 2.10 ERA (6 ER/25.2 IP) against all other teams.
- Twenty of his 37 appearances have been less than 1.0 inning.
- Holding left-handed batters to a .160 (8-for-50) average with 17 strikeouts...Righties are 13-for-53 (.245).
- Atlanta acquired him from the Oakland A's on 4/28 in exchange for cash considerations...Was designated for assignment by Atlanta on 5/14 and re-signed to a major league contract on 5/18.

- Is 0-1 with a 4.11 ERA (7 ER/15.1 IP) in 17 games with the Braves, and 0-3 with a 2.03 ERA (12 ER/53.1 IP) in 55 games on the season...He has converted 22 of 27 save opportunities.
- Has 11 consecutive scoreless appearances spanning 11.0 innings, allowing just four hits and striking out 11.
- Allowed runs in four of his first six appearances with the Braves, and allowed all four inherited runners to score.
- Made his Braves debut on 8/3 vs. CIN, allowing a run in the ninth inning to blow a save.
- Acquired from Detroit on 7/31 in exchange for LHP Joey Wentz and OF Travis Demeritte...Prior to joining the Braves ranked fourth in the American League with his 22 saves, while his 1.18 ERA was the second lowest in baseball to San Diego's Kirby Yates among qualifying relievers.
- Was 0-2 with 22 saves and a 1.18 ERA (5 ER/38.0 IP) with 43 strikeouts and 12 walks in 38 games out of the bullpen for the Tigers this season.

- Is 8-2 with a 3.58 ERA (26 ER/65.1 IP) in 62 games this season...Has converted 18 of his 25 save chances after logging just one career save prior to 2019...His seven blown saves are tied for third most in the majors.
- Has eight wins in relief this season, the most by a Braves reliever since Oscar Villarreal also had eight in 2006.
- Per Statcast, has an expected batting average of just .204 and an average exit velocity of 87.5 mph...Opponents are officially batting .263 (67-for-255).
- Left-handers have just 16 hits in 96 at-bats (.167) against him...Righties are hitting .321 (51-for-159).
- Has fanned 90 batters in 65.1 innings for a career-best 12.40 SO/9.0 IP ratio.
- Earned his 18th save, 8/11 at Miami...Has four saves of at least 1.1 innings.
- Recorded his second consecutive two-inning save, 5/15 vs. STL, to become the first Braves closer with back-to-back two-inning saves since Hall of Famer John Smoltz in 2002
