## LOS ANGELES DODGERS (43-25) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (35-33) June 11, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #69/Home #36 LHP Justin Wroblewski (7-2, 2.62 ERA) vs. RHP Mitch Keller (5-3, 4.81 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** snapped their four-game losing streak (since June 5 at Atlanta) with Wednesday's 9-8, come-from-behind win over Los Angeles (NL) at PNC Park...Will host the Dodgers for one more game (tonight) before welcoming Miami to town for a three-game series this weekend (Friday-Sunday)...Have the fifth-most runs scored (345) throughout all of Major League Baseball, behind only Washington (372), Los Angeles-NL (365), Milwaukee (352) & Atlanta (350).

**DODGER DOMINANCE:** Pittsburgh would pick up its fifth straight home series win vs. Los Angeles (NL) with a win tonight (won two of three games from May 9-11, 2022, two of three games from April 25-27, 2023, two of three games from June 4-6, 2024 and swept a three-game series last year from Sept. 2-4)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the Pirates have won five straight home series vs. the Dodgers just four times in series history... Those came from Sept. 26, 1901-Sept. 10, 1903 (eight straight series), July 21, 1910-July 27, 1911 (five straight series), June 17, 1925-July 24, 1926 (five straight series) and July 24, 1943-August 22, 1944 (five straight series).

**TY IS THE GUY:** Tyler Callihan hit his first two Major League home runs with a solo shot off Shohei Ohtani (fourth inning) and a go-ahead, three-run shot off Kyle Hurt (eighth inning) in Wednesday's 9-8 win vs. Los Angeles (NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was the 12th Pirate ever (since 1887) to hit each of his first two Major League homers in the same game, the first since Ryan Doumit on July 19 (G1), 2005 vs. Houston...He was the 10th Pirate (since RBI became an official stat in 1920) with at least two home runs, four RBI, two walks and three runs scored in a game (he was the only Pirate to achieve that in a game with exactly four plate appearances)...He became the 15th player to reach base safely vs. Shohei Ohtani three times in a game (since 2018), the first since teammate Henry Davis did it on July 21, 2023 at Los Angeles (AL).

**BATTLING BUCS:** The Pirates erased a five-run deficit (6-1) in Wednesday's 9-8 win vs. Los Angeles (NL)...It was Pittsburgh's biggest come-from-behind win since erasing a six-run deficit (6-0) in a 9-6 win on May 27, 2025 at Arizona/its largest at home since erasing a five-run deficit (5-0) in a 6-5 win on August 23, 2024 vs. Cincinnati...It was the first time the Pirates overcame a deficit of more than two runs in a win since overcoming a three-run deficit (4-1) in a 5-4 win last year on August 4 vs. San Francisco...It was the first time they won a game when trailing by at least five runs after six innings since erasing a five-run deficit (5-0) with four runs in the seventh inning and six runs in the eighth inning of a 10-7 victory on April 14, 2013 vs. Cincinnati.

**INDISPENCEABLE:** Spencer Horwitz went 2-for-5 with a two-run home run in Wednesday's 9-8 win vs. Los Angeles (NL), extending his on-base streak to a career-best 16 straight games (since May 23 at Toronto)...He has gone 20-for-62 (.323) with five homers, a .992 OPS and 10 runs during the streak.

**WELL-ATTENDED:** The Pirates have drawn at least 30,000 fans in each of the last two games (30,646 fans on Tuesday and 30,626 fans on Wednesday)...Pittsburgh last drew at least 30,000 fans in at least three straight Monday-Thursday home games from July 20-August 9, 2016 (five consecutive games)...The Pirates' last three-game, Monday-Thursday series with at least 30,000 fans at all three games came from September 16-18, 2014 vs. Boston.

Josh Harrison, who stole the first base of his Major League career in the victory, was 2-for-3 with a walk and a run scored. James McDonald improved to 4-4 after allowing two runs over 6.0 innings. Joel Hanrahan converted his 16th consecutive save to begin the season with a perfect ninth inning.

**AS OF LATE:** Keller lost a 6-3 decision after allowing six runs in 4.2 innings on June 5 at Atlanta...He has an 8.31 ERA (26.0ip/24er) over five starts since May 13 vs. Colorado.

**AGAINST THE DODGERS:** Keller has a 6.59 ERA (28.2ip/21er) in six career starts against Los Angeles (NL)...He had a no-decision after allowing three runs (two earned) over 6.0 innings in his last start against the Dodgers, which came on April 26, 2025 at Dodger Stadium (Pittsburgh lost, 8-4)...His last start vs. Los Angeles at PNC Park came on April 27, 2023, when he won a 6-2 decision (had 10 strikeouts over his 6.0 innings).

**K IS FOR KELLER:** Keller enters tonight's start vs. Los Angeles (NL) five strikeouts shy of passing Steve Blass (896) for seventh place on the team's all-time list...He surpassed Rick Rhoden (852) on April 19 vs. Tampa Bay and Deacon Phillippe (861) on April 25 at Milwaukee...Keller also surpassed Dock Ellis (869) for eighth place on May 7 at Arizona.

**AT PNC:** Keller's 90 career starts at PNC Park rank second in stadium history (since 2001), behind only Paul Maholm (100 starts)...His 492.0 innings pitched here rank third in ballpark history, trailing Maholm (649.2 innings) & Zach Duke (517.1 innings).

**HOMER HIATUS:** Keller is one of only five Major League pitchers with at least 73.0 innings pitched and five or fewer home runs allowed...The only other pitchers on the list are Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez (93.1 innings, four homers), New York (AL)'s Cam Schlichtler (82.0 innings, four homers), Chicago (AL)'s Davis Martin (78.1 innings, three home runs) and Milwaukee's Jacob Misiorowski (78.0 innings, four home runs).

**SIX PACK:** Keller pitched 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts this season (March 28 at New York-NL, April 3 vs. Baltimore, April 8 vs. San Diego)...He was the first Pirate to toss at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts of a season since Joe Musgrove (April 5-16, 2019).

**CONSISTENT KELLER:** Keller pitched 6.0 scoreless innings during his start on April 8 vs. San Diego, marking his second scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings through his first three starts of the 2026 campaign (also March 28 at New York-NL)...He joined Salomon Torres (2002), Zach Duke (2005), Jeff Karstens (2008), Wandy Rodriguez (2013) and Jameson Taillon (2018) as the only Pirates during the 21st century with two scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings through their first three games of a season...Keller's 17 starts of at least 6.0 scoreless innings during his career (since 2019) are the 10th-most by any Pirate in the Live Ball Era (since 1920)...Paul Skenes, who has done that on three occasions this season, ranks tied for 12th on the list (15).

**DAZZLING DEBUT:** Keller scattered three hits without issuing a walk (had three strikeouts) over 6.0 scoreless innings, but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 4-2, 11-inning loss on March 28 at New York (NL)...Keller left with the game scoreless after six frames...The Pirates took a short-lived, 1-0 lead into the bottom of the 10th before the Mets tied it...Pittsburgh also added a run in the top of the 11th before New York's Luis Robert Jr. hit a walkoff, three-run home run off Hunter Barco in the bottom half...Keller joined Vance Worley (June 15, 2014 at Miami), Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) and Joe Musgrove (May 25, 2018 vs. St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the 21st century to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings without allowing a walk in a season debut.
