TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 7-game homestand with the 3rd of 4 games against the Chicago White Sox (2-0)...Seattle is coming off a 6-game road trip (3-3) at the Oakland A's (2-1) and Kansas City Royals (1-2)...the Mariners will also host the Texas Rangers (3 G, 6/14-6/16) on the 'stand... tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Dave Sims** and **Mike Blowers** on the call... the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Aaron Goldsmith**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won last night's game by a 4-3 score, winning their 3rd consecutive game...the Mariners are 12-4 over their last 16 games (5/26-c), tied for the best record in MLB during that span...Seattle is 23-11 at home and 16-19 on the road...the Mariners are 32-13 (.711) when their starting pitchers go 6.0+ innings...Seattle is 31-11 (.738) when scoring first in a game.

- **It's Great To Be Home** - The Mariners are 19-5 (.792) over their last 24 home games (4/15-c), 2nd-best home record in MLB during that span behind Philadelphia (23-4, .852)...Seattle has also won 10 consecutive home series openers.
- **High Tide** - Seattle is a season-high 9 games above .500 for the first time this season.
- **The Bryce Is Right** - The Mariners have scored 9 runs in each of **Bryce Miller**'s last 2 starts.

FIRST-PLACE MARINERS...the Mariners (39-30) hold 1st place in the American League West Division by 6.5 games over 2nd place Texas (31-35) and 7.5 games over 3rd place Houston (31-37)...the Mariners have held 1st place for 31 consecutive days (5/12-c)...the 6.5-game lead over the rest of the division is Seattle's largest lead of the season, surpassing a previous-high 5.5-game lead on 2 occasions (6/5 and 6/11).

SERIES-LY SENSATIONAL...the Mariners came into the series against the White Sox having won 7 consecutive series at T-Mobile Park since April 15...with a win today, Seattle would secure its 8th-consecutive series win at home...overall, Seattle has an 11-4-1 series record over their last 16 series since April 15.

CAL REMAINS CLUTCH...**Cal Raleigh** hit a go-ahead, 2-RBI double in the 7th inning of last night's game...he leads MLB with 18 RBI in "Late & Close" situations while ranking 4th in MLB with a 1.046 OPS in Late & Close spots (min. 30 PA)...Cal has recorded 6 go-ahead or game-tying RBI in the 7th inning-or-later this season, tied with **Willy Adames** (6) for the most in MLB...**Julio Rodriguez** ranks narrowly behind Cal with 5 such RBI, tied for 3rd-most in MLB.

ONE-RUN FUN...the Mariners recorded their 15th 1-run win of the season in last night's game, improving to 15-6 (.714) in 1-run games...Seattle's 15 wins in 1-run games lead the Majors, ranking ahead of the New York Mets (13), Chicago Cubs (12), Pittsburgh Pirates (12) and Tampa Bay Rays (12)...Seattle pitchers have limited opponents to a .639 OPS when the score is tied or within 1 run, 3rd-lowest in MLB...Seattle hitters rank 6th in MLB with 40 home runs in such situations.

GARV SAUCE...**Mitch Garver** went 1-for-2 with 1 double and 2 walks in last night's game and has reached base multiple times in 4 of his last 5 games...over his last 8 games (6/2-c), Garver is batting .304 (7x23) with 4 runs, 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 9 RBI and 7 walks, while reaching base a .467 clip and slugging .696 with a 1.162 OPS...during that span, his 1.162 OPS leads Mariners batters and ranks 9th in MLB (min. 30 PA)...Garver has recorded at least 1 RBI in 4 of his last 5 games, with each of last 4 hits going for extra bases.

HOME COOKIN'...the Mariners are 23-11(.676) at home this season, pitching to a 2.66 ERA (91 ER, 308.0 IP) with 67 walks and 328 strikeouts...Seattle pitchers lead the Majors at home in ERA, WHIP (0.94), BB/9 (1.96), SO/BB (4.90) and Opp. OPS (.568), ranking 2nd in Opp. AVG (.200), 3rd in SO/9 (9.58)...coming into this season, the lowest home batting average allowed by a Major League team over a full season was Cleveland in 1968, limiting opponents to a .201 batting average (h/t Mariners Executive Producer and Radio Engineer **Gary Hill Jr.**).

JULIO HEATING UP...**Julio Rodríguez** went 1-for-4 with 2 runs scored and 2 stolen bases in last night's game...over his last 17 games (5/25-c), Julio is batting .328 (22x67) with 14 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs, 11 RBI and 7 stolen bases, getting on base at a .375 clip and slugging .478 (.853 OPS)...during that span, Julio has reached base in 16-of-17 games, hitting safely in 14-of-17 including 6 multi-hit games.

ROSTER MOVES...the Mariners today recalled RHP **Brett de Geus** from Triple-A Tacoma and optioned LHP **Jhonathan Díaz** to Triple-A Tacoma (post-game 6/11)...Díaz was recalled prior to yesterday's game for a spot start, tossing 5.1 innings and allowing 3 runs with 1 walk and 4 strikeouts.

FOUR SCORE...Seattle owns a 31-5 record (.861) this season when scoring 4+ runs in a game, 2nd-best record in the Majors when scoring 4+ runs...they trail only the Yankees (.913/42-4), while ranking ahead of Cleveland (.860/37-6) and Baltimore (.848/39-7)...the Mariners are 8-25 (.242) when scoring 3-or-fewer runs in a game.

NOW THAT IS SOME HIGH-QUALITY STUFF...the Mariners lead the Majors with 41 quality starts this season...Seattle is one of 3 starting rotations in the Major Leagues to produce 4 pitchers who have tallied 6+ quality starts this season (also: Philadelphia and Toronto)...**Logan Gilbert** (11 QS), **Luis Castillo** (9), **Bryce Miller** (7) and **George Kirby** (7) have all gone 6.0+ innings while allowing 3-or-fewer earned runs 6+ times this year...the Mariners are also the only team to produce 6 pitchers with at least 3+ QS this season: **Gilbert** (10), **Castillo** (8), **Miller** (7), **Kirby** (7), **Bryan Woo** (4) and **Emerson Hancock** (3).

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...Seattle continues a 7-game homestand vs. the White Sox (4 G, June 10-13) and Texas Rangers (June 14-16)...upcoming promotions during the homestand include **Star Wars Night** (6/12 vs. CWS), **Buhner Buzz Night** (6/13 vs. CWS), **Pride Month T-Shirt Night** (6/13 vs. CWS), **'70s Fireworks Night** (6/14 vs. TEX), **African American Heritage Day: A Juneteenth Celebration** (6/15 vs. TEX), **Father's Day - Big Dumper Stadium Seat Cushion** (6/16 vs. TEX), **Youth Softball & Fastpitch Day - Julio Rodriguez Poster** (6/16 vs. TEX) and **Mariners Value Games** with tickets as low as \$10 for each game during the White Sox Series (June 10-13)...the Mariners are 23-11 (.676) at T-Mobile Park this season and 6-2 (.750) before crowds of 35,000+ in Seattle.

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners have recorded comeback wins in each of the first 2 games of the current series vs. the White Sox, entering the 7th inning trailing in both games, and...**AS YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...the Mariners have tallied 13 comeback wins this season, but prior to the current series vs. Chicago-AL, the Mariners had not trailed in any of their last 6 wins dating back to their last comeback on May 29 vs. Houston, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...the Mariners have picked up 10 of their 13 comeback wins this season when trailing in the 7th inning-or-later?...**Cal Raleigh** has recorded the game-winning RBI in 4 of those games, joined by **Julio Rodriguez** (2), **Ty France** (2), **Mitch Garver** (1) and **Josh Rojas** (1).

ABOUT BRYCE MILLER...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 14th start of 2024 and his 1st against Chicago-AL...marks his 39th career start and 2nd against the White Sox.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on 6/7 at Kansas City...pitched 5.0 innings and allowed 7 runs on 6 hits (1 home run) and 3 walks with 1 strikeouts.

SEA YOU LATER...in his last 6 starts at T-Mobile Park (4/12-c), Miller has gone 6.0+ innings and allowed 2-or-less earned runs in each outing...during that span at home he is 4-1 with a 1.45 ERA (6 ER, 37.1 IP) and a .148 (19x128) average against...since April 12, his 1.45 ERA at home is the 5th-lowest in MLB.

KEEPIN' IT LOW...his .200 opponent average (55x275) against ranks 11th in the Majors and 6th in the AL...he is 9th in the AL in WHIP (1.02).

YOU GOTTA EARN IT...has given up 2 ER or fewer in 8 of 13 games this season and 1 ER or fewer in 5 games...Luis Castillo leads Mariner starters with 10 games of 2 or less ER allowed.

EVERYTHING IS ALL LEFT...left-handed batters are slashing .186/.261/.407 (27x145) with 15 walks, 33 strikeouts, 5 doubles and 9 home runs, in 2024...his .261 OBP against is the 10th-lowest in the AL (min. 100 AB).

HIT LIMITER...his start on 6/1 vs. Los Angeles-AL was his 11th career game with 6.0+ innings pitched and 3-or-fewer hits allowed...since his debut on May 2, 2023, he is tied for the 6th-most in the Majors and 2nd-most in the AL, only trailing Logan Gilbert (13)...he has done so on 5 occasions this season, tied for the 3rd most in MLB while trailing Tyler Glasnow-LAD (6) and Luis Gil-NYY (6).

IT WORKS 80% OF THE TIME, EVERYTIME...hitters this season are batting .188 (45x239) against his 4-seam fastball, splitter and sinker combined...81.3% of his pitches thrown this year have been one of those three...65 of his 72 strikeouts this season have come via a 4-seam fastball (28), splitter (24) or sinker (13) and he has allowed just 7 doubles and 8 home runs on those pitches.

SOME QUALITY TIME...has tossed 16 quality starts (6.0+ IP, 3 ER or less) in 38 career outings...in games where he tosses a quality start the Mariners are 14-2.

EATIN' INNINGS...in 13 starts this season, the right-hander has pitched into the 6th inning on 11 occasions...Logan Gilbert is the only Mariners pitcher that has pitched into the 6th inning more this season (12).

MID-SEASON FORM...in his 5 starts in April, he held a 1.19 ERA (4 ER, 30.1 IP) with 3 wins, 4 quality starts and an opponent batting average of .127 (13x102)...this marks the lowest ERA and the lowest batting average against in a single calendar month during his career...it is also tied for the most wins in a month (May 2023, 3) and 2nd-most quality starts during a single month in his career (May 2023, 5).

YOU SHALL NOT SCORE...tossed 14.0 consecutive scoreless innings starting in the 5th inning of his start vs. Boston (3/31) and ending in his start vs. Chicago-NL (4/12) in the 7th...this is tied for the longest scoreless inning streak by a Mariner this season (also: George Kirby).

AMONG THE BEST OF THEM...finished in the top 10 among rookies with a minimum of 100.0 innings pitched in various pitching categories in 2023, including BB/9 (1st, 1.78), SO/BB (1st, 4.58), WHIP (3rd, 1.14), GS (4th, 25), wins (T-6th, 8), IP (7th, 131.1) and ERA (9th, 4.32).

THE CENTURY MARK...recorded his 100th career strikeout in his outing against Oakland on 8/30/23 after striking out Ryan Noda in the 5th inning...his 100 strikeouts in his first 20 career games is tied for the 5th fastest to 100 strikeouts in franchise history (also: Roenis Elías).

MAKING MORE HISTORY...became the 1st pitcher since at least 1901 to go 6.0+ innings pitched and allow 2-or-fewer hits in at least 4 of his first 10 career appearances.

MAKING IT LOOK EASY...he became the only pitcher in MLB history to have 6.0+ innings pitched and allow 3-or-fewer baserunners in his first 3 career starts...his 3-game streak of 6.0+ innings pitched and 3-or-fewer baserunners allowed is tied for the longest since 1901...Blake Snell-SDP and Corbin Burnes-MIL were the most recent pitchers to achieve this feat, both doing so in 2021.

AN ALMOST PERFECT BEGINNING...took a perfect game into the 6th inning in his first career Major League start at Oakland on 5/2/23 before a Tony Kemp 1-out single broke up the no-hit bid...the 16-consecutive batters retired in a pitcher's MLB debut are the most since 1961 (h/t Elias Sports).

WHAT A DEBUT...became just the 3rd pitcher in MLB history to strike out 10 batters without issuing a walk in their Major League debut, joining RHP Johnny Cueto-CIN (4/3/08) and Stephen Strasburg-WSH (6/8/10)...became the 30th pitcher in MLB history to strikeout 10+ in their MLB debut...also set a franchise record for most strikeouts in a debut moving ahead of Enrique Romo, who struck out 9 on 4/7/77.

NO RUNNERS ALLOWED...became the only pitcher in MLB history to have 3-or-fewer baserunners allowed in each of their first 3 career starts...
