The Mariners have won 11 of their last 16 games vs. the White Sox, dating back to July 14, 2017...during this stretch their 11-5 record is their 2nd-best record vs. any opponent (min. 5 games), trailing only the Tigers (10-4), and ahead of the Royals (12-5), the Diamondback (4-2) and the Rays (10-6).

James Paxton has recorded 617 strikeouts in his Mariners career...he is 41 strikeouts away from tying Joel Pineiro (658) for 9th-most in Mariners club history.

James Paxton is the 47th player in club history to have spent at least two different stints with the Mariners.

Since making his Major League debut on July 7, 2011, **Kyle Seager** has appeared in 1,325 career games...his 1,325 games are currently the 3rd-most during this stretch, trailing only Carlos Santana-KC (1,372) and Eric Hosmer-SD (1,353), while also ranking ahead of Paul Goldschmidt-STL (1,315) and Freddie Freeman-ATL (1,305).

Kyle Seager is 26 at-bats (4,974) away from 5,000 in his career...on pace to become the 6th player to record at least 5,000 at-bat since July 7, 2011.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-game, 7-day homestand with the second game against the Chicago White Sox (0-1) at T-Mobile Park...the Mariners opened the homestand with a series win vs. the San Francisco Giants (2-1)...following tomorrow's afternoon game, the Mariners will embark on their first road trip of the season with a 7-game, 8-day trip to Minnesota and Baltimore...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT Sports NW**, as well as broadcast on **710 ESPN Seattle**.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost yesterday and have alternated wins and losses in each of their first 4 games...are 0-0 in day games and 2-2 at night...are 2-2 at T-Mobile Park and 0-0 on the road.

• **Let's Go Streaking - Mitch Haniger** has hit safely in each of his first 4 games of the season, batting .353 (6x17) with 3 runs scored, 3 doubles, 1 home run and 1 RBI...he is 1 of 19 American League players with an active hitting streak of at least 4 games.

• **Winner, Winner - James Paxton** is currently T14th in club history with John Halama and Bill Swift with 41 wins as a Mariner...he trails Glenn Abbott's 43 wins for 13th-most in club history.

• **Rule 5 - RHP Will Vest** (10th pick) is one of 12 players selected in the Major League phase of the 2020 Rule 5 Draft to make an Opening Day Roster with the big league team (2 additional players on the 60-day IL)...Vest has worked 3.0 innings, allowing only 1 unearned run, across 2 relief appearances this season; he has struck out 2 and walked 2 while allowing only 1 hit.

• **Walk This Way - Jake Fraley** is tied for the Major League lead with 8 walks this season (also: Robbie Grossman-DET and Mike Trout-LAA).

• **Bring on the Central** - Dating back to June 19, 2019, the Mariners are 9-3 vs. the AL Central.

• **DH** - The Mariners designated hitters have combined to hit .308 (4x13) with 3 runs scored, 2 doubles, 1 home runs, 2 RBI and 3 walks in 4 games...the team's .308 batting average by the DH is the 5th-highest in the American League, trailing only Chicago-AL (.545/12x22), Boston (.533/8x15), Minnesota (.500/3x6) and Texas (.438/7x16).

• **Closing in on a Milestone - Kyle Seager** has hit 81 career home runs at T-Mobile Park...his 81 home runs at T-Mobile Park are 3rd-most, trailing only Nelson Cruz (83) and Raul Ibanez (83)...Seager's 81 home runs at T-Mobile Park are the most as a Mariner, ranking ahead of Ibanez (78).

DOUBLE DOUBLE...the Mariners have recorded 12 doubles this season, ranking 3rd in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (14) and Houston (13), while ranking ahead of Minnesota (10) and Baltimore (9)...**Mitch Haniger** ranks T2nd (along with 7 other players) in the Major Leagues with a team-high 3 doubles...the Mariners have had 8 different players record at least 1 double this season (**Haniger-3, Dylan Moore-2, Evan White-2, Jake Fraley, Ty France, Kyle Seager, Luis Torrens and Taylor Trammell**), which is tied with Houston, Los Angeles-NL and Minnesota for the most in the Majors.

IN RELIEF...dating back to the 8th inning on April 2 vs. the Giants, the Mariners bullpen has tossed 10.0 scoreless innings in relief...during this stretch the Mariners relievers have combined to hold opponents to a .118 (4x34) while walking 3 and striking out 9...overall this season the relief staff is 1-1 with 1 save and a 2.40 ERA (4 ER, 15.0 IP) in 4 games...they have combined to hold opponents to a .148 (8x54) average, while walking 6 and striking out 17...their .148 opponent batting average is the 3rd-lowest in the Majors this season, trailing only New York-AL (.115/7x61) and Pittsburgh (.145/9x62).

CENTRAL PERK...**James Paxton** is 12-5 with a 2.97 ERA (56 ER, 169.2 IP) in 29 career starts vs. the American League Central...he has limited AL Central opponents to a .238 (154x646) average, while walking 42 and striking out 188...dating back to 2013, among all active Major League pitchers, Paxton's 2.97 ERA is the 6th-lowest vs. the AL Central (min. 150.0 IP), trailing only Mike Clevinger (2.27), David Price (2.74), Brad Keller (2.75), Yu Darvish (2.80) and Max Scherzer (2.85)...since April 5, 2018, Pax is 5-0 with a 2.42 ERA (18 ER, 67.0 IP) vs. the AL Central.

HOME SWEET HOME...dating back to Aug. 9, 2020, the Mariners have won 14 of their last 19 home games at T-Mobile Park...their .773 (14-5) winning percentage during this stretch is the 4th-highest in the Major Leagues, trailing Houston (.773/17-5), Los Angeles-NL (.750/18-6) and Minnesota (.739/17-6), while ranking ahead of Chicago (.696/16-7) and Tampa Bay (.684/13-6).

ALL HANDS ON DECK...in the first four games of the season, the Mariners have used 24 players, including 12 pitchers...the only active players yet to appear in a game for the Mariners this season are **James Paxton** (scheduled to start tonight) and **Justin Dunn** (schedule to start on Wednesday afternoon)...in 2020 the Mariners used 49 players this season, tied for 2nd-most in the Major Leagues...equaled Pittsburgh, Texas and Toronto for players used while trailing only Miami (61).

PROSPECTING...the Mariners are ranked by *Baseball America* as having the 2nd-best farm system in the Major Leagues, trailing only Tampa Bay...Seattle's No. 2 ranking is its best in club history...5 Mariners are ranked in *Baseball America's* Top-100 Prospects: OF **Julio Rodriguez** (#3), OF **Jarrod Kelenic** (#4), RHP **Logan Gilbert** (#35), RHP **Emerson Hancock** (#57) and INF **Noelvi Marte** (#73)...the Mariners are the only club with two of the top-5 prospects in 2021...since 2018, the Mariners farm system has risen in *Baseball America's* from #30 (2018) to #14 (2019) to #5 (2020) and finally #2 (2021).

AS YOU KNOW...dating back to June 29, 2019, **Kyle Seager** has appeared in 140 consecutive games with the Mariners...**BUT, DID YOU KNOW?**...his 140 consecutive Ironman streak is currently the 3rd-longest active streak in the Majors?...he trails only Whit Merrifield-KC (311 games, 6/25/18-current) and Francisco Lindor-NYM (204 games, 4/20/19-current), while ranking ahead of Paul Goldschmidt-STL (88 games, 9/2/19-current) and José Abreu-CWS (86 games, 9/6/19-current)...it is the longest streak by a Mariner since Robinson Canó played in 167 consecutive games (8/1/15-8/7/16)...it also marks the 2nd-longest such streak in Seager's career, trailing only his career-high 192 game streak (5/11/14-6/17/15).

ABOUT PAXTON...

- James Paxton is set to make his 2021 debut for the Mariners, his 137th career Major League start and his 5th career start against the White Sox.
- Paxton was drafted by the Mariners in the 4th round of the 2010 First-Year player draft.
- He made his MLB debut on September 7, 2013 against the Tampa Bay Rays.
- He threw the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history on May 8, 2018 at Toronto.
- The left-hander returns to Seattle after spending the 2 previous seasons (2019-20) with the New York Yankees.
- Paxton last started on Aug. 20, 2020 at Yankee Stadium against the eventual American League Champion Tampa Bay Rays, pitching 5.0 innings and allowing 3 earned runs on 1 hit with 4 walks and 8 strikeouts.
- Paxton last started for Seattle 920 days ago on Sept. 29, 2018.
- Tonight, he will attempt to snap the Chicago White Sox streak of 16 straight victories against left-handed starting pitchers, dating back to last season.

WELCOME BACK PAX!...the "Big Maple" returns to Seattle to make his 2021 debut...the left-hander signed as a free agent on Feb. 18, 2021...in 102 career starts with the Mariners in 6 seasons (2013-18), Paxton compiled a 41-26 record with a 3.42 ERA (221 ER, 582.1 IP) with 168 walks and 617 strikeouts.

VS. THE WHITE SOX...Paxton has dominated in his 4 career starts against the Chicago White Sox...3 of the 4 outings have come in a Mariners uniform, while the most recent start (June 16, 2019) came with New York-AL...in 4 career starts against the White Sox, Paxton is 2-0 with a 3.09 ERA (8 ER, 23.1 IP) with 2 walks and 25 strikeouts...he has notched a quality start in 3 of those 4 outings...he last faced the White Sox while pitching for Seattle on July 14, 2017 at US Cellular Field...Paxton's teams are 2-2 when facing the White Sox, with both of his no-decisions ending in 1-run losses for the Mariners.

MAPLE GROVE...Paxton is 1 of 256 all-time MLB players born in Canada...his 136 starts are 11th-most among Canadian-born pitchers, 24 away from Rich Harden's 160 starts to move into the top-10 all-time...his 57 wins rank 14th-most among Canadian-born pitchers.

THE TRADE...on Nov. 19, 2018, Paxton was traded by Seattle to the New York Yankees in exchange for yesterday's Mariners starter, LHP **Justus Sheffield**, RHP **Erik Swanson** and OF Dom-Thompson Williams.

THE NO-HITTER...on May 8, 2018 in his native Canada, Paxton threw the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history (5th by an individual pitcher) in Seattle's 5-0 win (9.0 IP, 3 BB, 7 K) at Toronto...in his previous start on May 2, he set a career-high 16 strikeouts vs. Oakland...was second Canadian-born pitcher in MLB history to throw a no-hitter (Dick Fowler, 1945 Philadelphia Athletics)...he is the only Canadian-born pitcher to throw a no-hitter on Canadian soil.

AS A YANKEE...Paxton went 16-7 with a 4.16 ERA (79 ER, 171.0 IP) over 2 seasons (2019-20) with New York-AL...he made 34 regular season starts, going 15-6 with a 3.82 ERA (64 ER, 150.2 IP) in 29 starts in 2019...he made just 5 starts in an injury-riddled 2020 campaign.

IL STINTS...the 32-year-old has been on the Injured List 7 times in his Major League career...from April 9-August 2, 2014 (left lat strain), transferred to 60-day IL on June 9...from May 29-Sept. 13, 2015 (strained tendon in left middle finger)...Aug. 16-25, 2016 (left elbow contusion)...May 5-31, 2017 (left forearm strain)...Aug. 11-Sept. 14, 2017 (strained left pectoral muscle)...May 4-29, 2019 (left knee inflammation)...and Aug. 24 through the end of the season in 2020 (left flexor strain) with the Yankees, forcing him to make only 5 starts.

PLAYOFF EXPERIENCE...Paxton started 3 games for the New York Yankees in the postseason...he made his playoff debut on Oct. 4, 2019 in ALDS Game 1 vs. Minnesota...he also started ALCS Games 2 and 5 against the Astros...he recorded his 1st career postseason victory on Oct. 18 in Game 5, pitching 6.0 innings and allowing 1 earned run on 4 hits, walking 4 and striking out 9...for his postseason career (3 starts), Paxton is 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (5 ER, 13.0 IP) with 13 hits and 2 home runs allowed, walking 7 and striking out 20.

ALL STARTS...all 136 of his regular season Major League pitching appearances have been starts...the 136 starts with no relief appearances rank 11th-most among active players.

SOUTHPAWS...Paxton is the 4th Mariners left-handed starter in the team's 5th game to begin the season...the Mariners are the 1st team to use 4 different LHP's (**Marco Gonzales**, **Yusei Kikuchi**, **Justus Sheffield**, Paxton) in the first 5 games of a season since the 2019 Padres...Seattle is the 5th club to open the season with 4 of 5 different left-handed starters over the last 17 seasons (since 2005).

CAREER...selected by the Mariners in the 4th round of the 2010 First-Year player draft out of the University of Kentucky in Lexington, KY...signed by scouts Brian Williams and Jesse Kapellusch...made Major League debut with the Mariners on Sept. 7, 2013 vs. Tampa Bay, recording the win...began his career 6-0 with a 1.88 ERA in his first 9 career starts (2013-14), the longest winning streak to open a career in Mariners history...named Mariners Pitcher of the Year by the Seattle chapter of the BBWAA...named American League Pitcher of the Month in July 2017 and AL Pitcher of the Week 3 times: April 16, 2017, July 30, 2017 and May 13, 2018.

2020: Went 4-1 with a 4.34 ERA(22 ER, 45.2 IP) in 10 starts with Seattle...limited opponents to a .189 (31x164) with 31 walks and 38 strikeouts...Earned first Major League win on Aug. 10 at Texas, allowing 2 runs on 7 hits while walking 3 and striking out 2 in 6.0 innings. Tossed at least 5.0 innings in 6 of his 10 starts, including 5 of his final 6 starts of the season (8/23-9/26). **PERSONAL:** Justin Warren Dunn...resides in Lauderhill, FL...graduated from The Gunnery (CT)...selected by Los Angeles-NL in the 37th round of the 2013 Draft but did not sign...played 3 seasons at Boston College, where he was third-team All-America (Baseball America) in 2016...while at BC, the late Pete Frates was the program's Director of Baseball Operations...selected by the Mets with the 19th overall pick in the 2016 Draft. **CAREER:** Made his Major League debut with Seattle on September 12, 2019 vs. Cincinnati...spent first 3 pro seasons with the Mets after being selected 19th overall out of Boston College in 2016...joined Seattle in 7-player trade one week before 2018 Winter Meetings.
