OF Robbie Grossman went 1-for-3 with a homer last night, his first as a member of the organization. Grossman hit ninth for Atlanta last night, and is in that same spot in the order tonight.

Atlanta's ninth-place hitters are batting .284/.324/.499 this season, and lead the majors in OPS (.823), hits (116), homers (20), runs (78) and RBI (73) from that spot in the batting order.

The Braves' .823 OPS from the ninth spot this season is higher than all but six teams have gotten from their cleanup hitters.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Braves and Mets continue a four-game series tonight with the 15th of 19 meetings between the clubs this season...Following these four games, the teams will not meet again until the penultimate series of the year, September 30-October 2, here in Atlanta.

A The Braves won 5-0 last night and have won each of the first two games of this series, outscoring New York, 18-1...They hit two home runs and struck out just three times...In losing four of five games to the Mets, August 4-7, at Citi Field, the Braves scored 22 total runs and struck out 57 times.

A Entering this series, the Mets had won six of the last eight games between the clubs, and took two-of-three in the only series between the teams in Atlanta so far this season, July 11-13.

A The Braves went 10-9 against the Mets last season, taking the season set from their NL East rivals for the fourth consecutive season...They went 7-3 in 2020, 11-8 in 2019 and 13-6 in 2018...The Braves need to go 4-1 over the final five games between the teams to avoid losing the season series.

A Atlanta is 6-8 against New York this season, but has outscored the Mets by 10 runs in their 14 games...The Braves have tallied 66 runs and are averaging 4.7 runs/game, while New York has scored 56 times and is averaging 4.0 runs/game in their matchups.

A RH Jake Odorizzi made his Braves debut against the Mets, August 6 at Citi Field, and took the loss after allowing six hits and three runs, two earned, over just 4.2 innings...He walked three and fanned four as the Mets beat the Braves, 8-5...The 6-foot-2, 190-pound right-hander has made three career starts against New York, and has yet to beat the Mets...He is 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA in these turns, allowing seven runs, six earned, in 16.0 innings.

A RH Max Scherzer is set to face Atlanta for the 30th time in his career tonight, and for the 28th time as a starter...The Missouri native is 12-9 with a 3.62 ERA (69 ER/171.2 IP) over his first 29 games...In two starts this season, he has allowed just one earned run in 14.0 innings (0.64 ERA) and fanned 20 in a pair of wins.

WIN: The Braves extended their winning streak to eight games yesterday after they took the second straight game from New York, 5-0...The Braves' winning streak is the longest active run in the majors and moved them a season-best 26 games over .500 at 72-46.

A Atlanta never trailed yesterday, the 50th game this season in which the Braves did not face a deficit...That total is the third most in baseball and one off the Mets' NL lead...This weekend's opponent, Houston, has the most with 52.

A Last night marked just the Braves' seventh shutout of the season, and their first since blanking the Diamondbacks on July 31...Since the start of last season, Atlanta's 25 shutouts are tied for fourth most in the majors, trailing just the Yankees (27), Dodgers (27) and Cardinals (26).

STREAKING: The Braves have won eight consecutive games after losing five of six to Philadelphia and New York last week.

A The eight-game winning streak is the second longest run for the Braves this season...It trails only a 14-game streak, June 1-15...The last time the Braves had multiple eight-game win streaks in a season was 2019, when they had two nine-game runs and an eight-game streak.

A This current streak began on August 9 in Boston, and Atlanta has outscored the opposition 53-20 (+33) during the run.

A Since Atlanta's initial 14-game winning streak began on June 1, the Braves' 49-19 record is best in baseball.

ACUÑA JR. ON BASE: Ronald Acuña Jr. drew a career-most four walks last night, and has reached base in seven of his nine plate appearances this series.

A Acuña Jr. has reached base 25 times in his last 13 games dating to August 4, and is batting .404/.472/.638 in that stretch...He has 19 hits, including seven extra-base hits, six walks and 11 runs, while Atlanta is 9-4 as a club.

A In 26 career at-bats against tonight's starter for New York, Max Scherzer, Acuña Jr. has two homers and is slugging .615.

OLSON RBI: Matt Olson went 2-for-4 with three RBI last night versus New York, and connected on his 25th home run of the season...Olson has 79 RBI on the season, and his 58 runs driven in since June 1 stand as most in the National League.

A Only the Yankees' Aaron Judge, with 62, has more since that date in baseball...Olson's RBI are eight more than anyone else in the N.L. in that span (NYM's Pete Alonso, 50).

A Olson has 190 RBI since the start of last season, easily most among first basemen in baseball...The Cardinals' Paul Goldschmidt, with 171, ranks second...Olson's RBI total over the last two years is fifth most in the majors, regardless of position.

A Four of Olson's last eight hits have been homers, dating to August 12, and he is batting .308/.333/.769 with nine RBI in those six games.

CONTRACT: The Atlanta Braves last night signed OF Michael Harris II to an eight-year contract worth \$72 million that runs through the 2030 season...The deal includes a \$15 million club option for 2031 with a \$5 million buyout and a \$20 million club option for 2032 with a \$5 million buyout.

A Harris II, 21, is hitting .287 with 12 home runs, 13 stolen bases and 39 RBI in 71 games this season, and leads all qualified rookies with an .825 OPS this season.

A Harris II played his first major league game at 21 years, 82 days old, becoming the youngest Georgia-born player to debut for the Braves since they moved to Atlanta in 1966.

Tonight's Game

- A Makes his 15th start of the season, the 230th turn of his career and his 234th career appearance.
- A Has made two starts with Atlanta since the Braves acquired him on August 1, and is 0-1 with a 4.15 ERA (4 ER/8.2 IP) in these turns...Has allowed 14 hits and four walks in his two starts.
 - A Atlanta is 1-1 in his two starts and won his last turn, August 12 at Miami.
- A Made his Braves debut, August 6 at New York, and took the loss after allowing six hits and three runs, two earned, over just 4.2 innings...Walked three and fanned four as the Mets beat the Braves, 8-5.
 - A Has made three career starts against New York, and has yet to beat the Mets... Is 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA in these turns, allowing seven runs, six earned, in 16.0 innings.
 - A His two starts with Atlanta have come against the NL East...In 15 career starts against the division, is 3-5 with a 4.18 ERA (35 ER/75.1 IP) and a 3.54 FIP.
- A In his four wins this season, has combined to allow just 10 hits and one earned run in 24.2 innings...Has pitched to a 0.36 ERA.
 - A In all other starts, including four losses and five no-decisions, has compiled a 5.73 ERA and allowed 28 earned runs in 44.0 total innings.
 - A Opponents are batting just .177 against him in wins, and he is allowing just 0.608 walks and hits per inning.
- A Was acquired by Atlanta from the Houston Astros on August 1 in exchange for LHP Will Smith.
 - A Went 4-3 with a 3.75 ERA (25 ER/60.0 IP) in 12 games, all starts, for the Astros this season.
 - A He missed 42 games with a lower left leg injury from May 17-July 4, but since returning to the Houston rotation went 1-1 with a 4.45 ERA (14 ER/28.1 IP) in five starts.

2022 Recap

- A Went seven straight starts without a loss, April 26 to July 17, compiling a 4-0 record with a 2.31 ERA (10 ER/39.0 IP) in that span.
 - A The run marked his first winning streak of at least four games since May 26 to June 15, 2019.
- A Opened the season going 0-2 with a 9.00 ERA in his first three starts, allowing 12 total runs, nine earned, over 9.0 innings...Opponents batted .400 against him in that span.
 - A In nine starts since, dating to April 26, has pitched to a 4-1 record and a 2.82 ERA (16 ER/51.0 IP), while opponents have batted just .195 against him.
 - A Has allowed one earned run or less in six of these nine turns.
- A Started on May 16 at Boston and allowed two runs, one earned, over 5.0 innings before being carted off with a lower left leg injury after just 62 pitches.
 - A He suffered the injury while running to cover first base.
 - A He was placed on the injured list the following day, May 17, and missed 42 games before returning on July 4...Made a pair of rehabilitation starts with Triple-A Sugar Land and Double-A Corpus Christi.
- A Made his season debut, April 8 at the Angels, and allowed six hits and two runs over just 4.0 innings...Fanned two and did not issue a walk...Took a no-decision in Houston's win, 13-6.
 - A Followed that start by going just 4.1 innings in his next turn, April 15 at Seattle...Allowed eight hits and four runs to take his first loss.

Career Recap

- A Originally drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers 32nd overall in 2008 out of Highland High School in Highland, Ill., made his major league debut in 2012 with Kansas City...He moved to Tampa Bay the following season before joining Minnesota in 2018.
 - A Over 231 career games, 227 starts, Odorizzi is 72-66 with a 3.94 ERA (528 ER/1,207.0).
- A Was a 2019 All-Star with Minnesota, and won a career-best 15 games that season.
- A He joined Houston in 2021 and appeared in Game 1 of the World Series against Atlanta last season, striking out five over 2.1 innings out of the bullpen.

Raisel Iglesias • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 32 yrs • #26**Saves/Opp:** 1/2 **Holds:** 2 **1st Batter/Retired:** 7/3 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 2/0

- Pitched to a 4.04 ERA with Los Angeles (AL)...Pitching to a 1.35 ERA in seven appearances with Atlanta.
- Made his Braves debut on August 5 at New York (NL), pitching a scoreless inning in relief.
- Logged 16 saves and 2-6 record while pitching to a 4.04 ERA in 39 appearances with the Angels this season.
- Acquired from the LA Angels on August 1 in exchange for LHP Tucker Davidson and RHP Jesse Chavez.
- Ranks eighth among active pitchers with 156 career saves.
- Iglesias and Kenley Jansen are the only two pitchers to record at least 30 saves in the previous four seasons.
- Named to All-MLB Second Team in 2021...His 34 saves were the second most in the American League last season.
- Leads the majors with 37 saves of 4-plus outs since the beginning of the 2017 season.
- Since 2017, his 134 saves are the third most in baseball...Trails teammate Kenley Jansen and Mets' Edwin Díaz.
- Made his Major League debut with Cincinnati on April 12, 2015 against St. Louis.

Kenley Jansen • RHP • 6-5 • 265 • 34 yrs • #74**Saves/Opp:** 26/30 **Holds:** 0 **1st Batter/Retired:** 44/36 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 4/3

- Tied Joe Nathan and now ranks tied for ninth among all-time saves leaders with his 27th save of the season at Miami on August 14, Jansen
- He is 13 saves away from tying Hall-of-Famer Dennis Eckersley for the eighth most career saves in baseball history.
- Recorded his 20th save of the season against LAD on 6/25...With that save against his former team, he became just the 14th player in history to record at least 20 saves in 10 different seasons, tied for seventh most.
- Passed Jonathan Papelbon with his last save on June 23 and now ranks 10th among all-time saves leaders...He is one save away from tying Joe Nathan for the ninth most career saves in baseball history.
- Ranks tied for third in the National League with 27 saves.
- His career 2.43 ERA is the fourth lowest in history among players with as many appearances...Trails Hall-of-Famers Walter Johnson and Mariano Rivera, while Billy Wagner trails third.
- His 377 career saves are the second most among active pitchers, trailing only Craig Kimbrel...Ranks T-9th on the all-time save list and his 19 career postseason saves are second only to Mariano Rivera.
- Is a three-time N.L. All-Star and a two-time recipient of the Trevor Hoffman N.L. Reliever of the Year award.

Dylan Lee • LHP • 6-3 • 215 • 27 yrs • #52**Saves/Opp:** 0/3 **Holds:** 8 **1st Batter/Retired:** 29/24 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 23/8

- Pitching to a 2.38 ERA in 29 relief appearances and is averaging 1.1 innings pitched per outing...Has not surrendered an earned run in 22 of his 29 outings this year.
- Throwing strikes on 69.5% of his pitches, fourth highest rate in the NL (min. 15 appearances).
- His 7.80 K/BB rate is the sixth highest in the National League (min. 15 appearances).
- Pitched to a 7.20 ERA in five combined appearances (three in the postseason) last year...This year owns a 2.41 ERA.
- Had a 2.30 ERA in 14 outings with Triple-A Gwinnett this year...Made his debut on October 1, 2021 with Atlanta.
- Became just the second pitcher in major league history to make his first career start in the postseason (first in the world series)...The first was teammate A.J. Minter in the 2020 NLCS.

Tyler Matzek • LHP • 6-3 • 210 • 31 yrs • #68**Saves/Opp:** 1/1 **Holds:** 6 **1st Batter/Retired:** 27/17 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 12/2

- His next strikeout will be the 250th of his career.
- Pitching to a 2.81 ERA since being reinstated from the IL...Had a 5.06 ERA prior to his IL stint.
- Made his first appearance since missing 46 games on the IL on 7/5 vs. STL...Pitched a scoreless frame.
- Was placed on the 15-day IL on May 14 with left shoulder inflammation, and was reinstated on 7/4.
- Struck out five of the six hitters he faced in two rehabilitation appearances with Triple-A Gwinnett.
- In 2021, owned a 3.31 ERA in the first half of the season...Pitched to a 1.78 ERA in the second half.
- Set a new franchise record for appearances in a single postseason with 13...The previous mark of 11 was set by Mark Wohlers in 1995...Appeared in each of the Braves' first eight games, setting a new franchise-record mark and tying the MLB record held by Jesse Orosco, Wade Davis and Greg Holland for consecutive outings to open a postseason.

Collin McHugh • RHP • 6-2 • 190 • 34 yrs • #32**Saves/Opp:** 0/4 **Holds:** 8 **1st Batter/Retired:** 41/31 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 29/9

- Owned a 6.10 ERA in his first 10 appearances with Atlanta...In 31 outings (41.0 IP) since May 6 he has pitched to a 2.20 ERA.
- Is three strikeouts away from reaching 900 career punchouts in the majors.
- His 16 appearances of at least 1.2 innings pitched are the most by a reliever in the National League this season.
- Stranded 19 of 29 inherited runners for a 69.0% strand rate...The 29 inherited runners are the third most in the NL and his strand rate is the 10th highest among NL pitchers (min. 20 IR).
- Pitched a season-high 3.0 innings against Los Angeles (NL) on June 24.
- Among pitchers with as many innings last season, his 1.55 ERA with Tampa Bay ranked fourth in the majors behind N.Y.'s Jacob deGrom (1.08), CLE's Emmanuel Clase (1.29) and PHI's Ranger Suárez (1.36).
- Pitched for the Mets (2012-'13), Rockies ('13), Astros (2014-'19) and Rays ('21) over a nine-year career.
- Is the only product of Berry College (Ga.) to reach the majors.

A.J. Minter • LHP • 6-0 • 215 • 28yrs • #33**Saves/Opp:** 5/8 **Holds:** 20 **1st Batter/Retired:** 53/41 **Inherited Runners/Scored:** 19/6

- Earned his fifth win on August 5 at New York (NL) and became the only pitcher in baseball with at least five wins, five saves, and 15 holds this season.
- Pitched to a 0.98 ERA in 29 games through June 15...Has a 4.29 ERA in 24 appearances since.
- Pitching to a 1.71 FIP this season, fourth lowest in baseball (min. 25 appearances).
- Owns a career 2.49 ERA away from Truist Park...Has a 4.22 ERA at home.
