THE LATEST:

- ★ The Blue Jays dropped Game 2 of the World Series, 5-1, to the Dodgers at Rogers Centre on Saturday night, evening up the 121st Fall Classic at a game apiece...The offence was held to four hits, their second-fewest in a game this postseason (2H in Game 1 of the ALCS vs. SEA).
- ★ The team holds an all-time record of 8-5 in postseason game 3's, including winning each of their World Series game 3's in the early 90's (3-2W in 1992 vs. ATL & 10-3W in 1993 at PHI).

GAUS AND EFFECT:

- ★ Kevin Gausman tossed 6.2 frames of three-run ball on Saturday night, giving up just four hits with no walks and six strikeouts on 82 pitches (59 strikes)...Retired 17 consecutive batters between a Will Smith RBI single in the 1st inning and a Smith solo homer in the 7th...Is the only pitcher in MLB history to retire at least 16 consecutive batters in a game twice in a single postseason (courtesy: @EliasSports)...Matched Dave Stewart (4x in 1993) for the most starts of at least 5.2 innings in a single postseason in franchise history...Over his five postseason appearances (four starts) this year, Gausman has posted a 2.55 ERA (7 ER/24.2 IP) and a 0.93 WHIP with 14 hits, nine walks, and 18 strikeouts, while holding hitters to a .163 batting average...His 24.2 innings pitched are the third most in a single postseason in franchise history, behind only Dave Stewart (25.1 in 1993) and Juan Guzman (25.0 in 1993).

DOUBLING UP:

- ★ George Springer led off Game 2 on Saturday with a double to left, his sixth two-bagger of the postseason...Was also hit by a pitch in 3rd inning, finishing the game 1-for-3...His 21 career postseason doubles are tied for sixth most in MLB history, one behind David Ortiz for fifth...Has eight career doubles in the World Series, tied for seventh most in MLB history...Has reached base safely in each of his last 10 games and in 12 of 13 postseason contests this year...In 80 career postseason games, is slashing .267/.345/.539 with 21 doubles, 23 homers, and 47 RBI (.884 OPS).

FEEL THE ERN:

- ★ Ernie Clement extended his postseason hitting streak to eight games on Saturday night with a 2nd-inning single, part of a 1-for-3 effort...Matched Nico Hoerner for the longest hitting streak of the 2025 postseason...In his 13 postseason games, is batting .429 (21-for-49) with three doubles, a triple, a home run, eight RBI, and a 1.034 OPS...His 21 hits are tied with Paul Molitor (21 in 1993) for the second most in a single postseason in franchise history, trailing only Vladimir Guerrero Jr. (22 in 2025).

VLAD TO BE HERE:

- ★ Vladimir Guerrero Jr. recorded his 22nd hit of the 2025 postseason on Saturday night with a 113.9 MPH single off the wall in left in the bottom of the 3rd inning...His 22 knocks surpassed Paul Molitor (21 in 1993) for the most in a single postseason in Blue Jays history...Over his 13 postseason games this year, has slashed .431/.500/.843 with three doubles, six homers, 12 RBI, and seven walks (1.343 OPS)...Has recorded an average exit velocity of 94.1 MPH this postseason, up from his regular season average of 92.0 MPH.
- ★ Guerrero Jr. (22H) and Clement (21H) are the ninth set of teammates in MLB history to each record at least 21 hits in a single postseason, and the only Blue Jays pair to accomplish the feat...The last set of teammates to do so were the Dodgers' Corey Seager (22H) and Mookie Betts (21H) in 2020, while the last group of AL teammates were the 2017 Astros (Gurriel/Altuve/Springer/Correa).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN:

- ★ The Blue Jays finished the regular season with a 40-41 road record (T-6th in the AL)...**Blue Jays hitters led all AL clubs this year in road AVG (.260) and in road strikeout rate (18.3%)**, while ranking 3rd in road OBP (.327), 3rd in road OPS (.733), T-4th in runs per road game (4.53), and 6th in road SLG (.407)...On the pitching side, Toronto hurlers rank 5th in the AL in road strikeout rate (22.8%), 6th in road walk rate (8.6%), 7th in road K/BB (2.66), and 11th in road WHIP (1.34).

STARTING SOMETHING:

- ★ Over the last seven postseason games, Toronto's rotation has combined to post a 3.38 ERA (14 ER/37.1 IP) and a 1.23 WHIP while holding hitters to a .230 batting average with a 34.0% whiff rate and a 32.3% chase rate...Over 13 postseason games, Blue Jays starters have allowed two earned runs or fewer on 11 occasions, combining for a 3.48 ERA (24 ER/62.0 IP) and a 1.15 WHIP...The rotation's 3.48 ERA is the second-best single-season mark in franchise postseason history (1st: 3.42 in 2016).

GIVE 'EM A HAND:

- ★ The Blue Jays have scored 83 runs through 13 postseason games, 28 more than the next closest team (LAD - 55R)...Plated at least five runs in a game 75 times during the 2025 regular season, T-2nd most in the AL (T-5th in MLB)...**When scoring at least five runs, the team posted a 71-4 record, an MLB-best .947 win%** (2nd: MIL - .910%), the best single-season mark in franchise history (2nd: .864% in 1985).

DOWN, BUT NEVER OUT:

- ★ **The Blue Jays racked up an MLB-best 49 comeback wins this season**, their second-most in a single season in franchise history (50 in 1987)...**When allowing the first run of the game, the Blue Jays fashioned an MLB-leading .467 win%**.

- ★ The Blue Jays went 1-2 against the Dodgers this season in Chavez Ravine, dropping the first two contests before winning the finale on Aug. 10 by a 5-4 score...Have gone 4-5 over their last nine regular season meetings with the Dodgers, dating back to the start of 2023...Are facing Los Angeles in the postseason for the first time ever...Have met the Dodgers more than three times in a season only once, going 3-3 vs. LAD in 2007.
- ★ Vladimir Guerrero Jr. went 3-for-11 (.273) over the three-game series in LA this season, notching two doubles, a homer, and two RBI for a 1.061 OPS...Over 14 career contests vs. LAD (reg+post), has hit .346 (18-for-52) with five extra-base hits, five RBI, and seven walks (.519 SLG, .943 OPS).
- ★ George Springer met the Dodgers in the 2017 World Series as a member of the Astros, coming out on top in the seven-game affair...Was named World Series MVP, batting .379 (11-for-29) with three doubles, five homers, seven RBI, and five walks for a 1.000 SLG and a 1.471 OPS...Is one of three players all-time to record five home runs in a single World Series (Chase Utley in 2009 vs. NYY & Reggie Jackson in 1977 vs. LAD).
- ★ Mason Fluharty entered the game on Aug. 10 at LAD with one out and the bases loaded in the bottom of the 9th inning, striking out Shohei Ohtani and inducing a game-ending groundball from Mookie Betts to earn his first career MLB save...Became the first player since Trevor Hoffman on Sept. 15, 2002 to pick up a save by retiring two former MVP's with the bases loaded (Barry Bonds & Jeff Kent).

Max Scherzer, RHP #31

Born: St. Louis, MO AGE: 41

TODAY'S GAME:

- ★ Making his 32nd career postseason appearance (27th start) and his 2nd in a Blue Jays uniform...In his last time out, on 10/16 at SEA in Game 4 of the ALCS, made his 500th career MLB start (reg+post), giving up 2 runs on 3 hits and 4 walks over 5.2 innings with 5 strikeouts... Touched 96.5 MPH on a fourseamer to Cal Raleigh in the 1st inning, his fastest pitch since 6/24/23 (96.6 MPH)...Earned his 1st postseason win since Game 1 of the 2019 World Series on 10/22 at HOU...Became the 4th starting pitcher in postseason history to earn a win at the age of 41 or older, joiningRoger Clemens (5x), Kenny Rogers (3x), and Dennis Martinez... With his 5 punchouts, reached 176 career postseason strikeouts, surpassing Roger Clemens (173K) for 5th-most in MLB history...Picked off Leo Rivas at first base in the 3rd inning, his first successful pickoff attempt in his postseason
- ★ Will become the 1st player in MLB history to pitch in the World Series with 4 different teams (DET - 2012, WSH - 2019, TEX - 2023, TOR - 2025).
- ★ Owns an 8-8 postseason record over 26 starts (31 appearances) while posting a 3.75 ERA (62 ER/148.2 IP) with 176 strikeouts and a 1.16 WHIP...Among all active pitchers ranks 3rd in playoff innings (148.2), games started, and strikeouts, trailing only Justin Verlander and Clayton Kershaw in each category...Among MLB's all-time postseason leaders (min. 100 IP), ranks 2nd in strikeout rate (28.6%), 5th in strikeouts, 7th in opponent average (.207), 8th in games started, and 9th in innings pitched.
- ★ Ranks 2nd among active pitchers in strikeouts (3,489), innings pitched (2,963.0), starts (474), while also ranking 3rd in wins (221).

2025 HIGHLIGHTS:

- ★ Tossed 6.0 innings of one-run ball on 4 hits and 3 walks with 4 strikeouts on 8/19 at PIT...Threw a season-high 104 pitches, his most in a start since 8/3/24 vs. CWS (105)...Marked his 6th quality start of the season.
- ★ Threw a season-high 7.0+ innings on 8.14 vs. CHC, surrendering 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk with 3 strikeouts...Marked his 5th quality start of the season and 4th in a row...Threw 57 strikes on 78 pitches (73%), his fewest pitches thrown in a start of at least 7.0 innings pitched in his career, surpassing an 82-pitch outing across 7.0 innings on 4/23/15 vs. STL...Became the 3rd pitcher in franchise history to win multiple games at age-41 or older, joining R.A. Dickey (10) and Darren Oliver (6).
- ★ Threw 7.0 frames of 3-run ball on 7/27 at DET, giving up 3 hits with no walks and a season-high 11 strikeouts...Marked his most punchouts in a start since striking out 11 on 8/14/23 vs. LAA
- ★ Pitched 5.0 innings on 7/22 vs. NYY, surrendering 4 runs on 5 hits and 1 walk with 4 strikeouts, while limiting hitters to an 87.9 MPH AVG exit velocity (5 hard-hit balls on 16 balls in play).
- ★ Earned his first win as Blue Jay on 7/11 at ATH, throwing a season-high 6.0 innings while allowing 3 runs on 5 hits and 1 walk with a season-high 8 strikeouts...Became the 3rd starting pitcher in franchise history to win a game at age 40 or older, joining R.A. Dickey (21 wins from 5/4/15-9/16/16) and Dave Stieb (8/29/98 vs. MIN).
- ★ On injured list from 3/30-6/24 with right thumb inflammation...Made a pair of rehab starts with Triple-A Buffalo.
- ★ Made his Blue Jays debut on 3/29 vs. BAL, pitching 3.0 innings allowing a pair of runs on 3 hits and 0 walks with 1 strikeout... Was removed from the game in the 4th inning with right lat soreness.

OTHER HIGHLIGHTS:

- ★ In his MLB career, has been named an All-Star 8 times (2013-2019, 2021), 3-time Cy Young Award winner (2013, 2016-2017), and 2-time World Series Champion (2019 & 2023).
- ★ Selected by the Arizona Diamondbacks in the 1st round (11th overall) of the 2006 First-Year Player Draft.

VS. THE DODGERS:

- ★ Making his 21st career start and 4th in the postseason against the Dodgers...In his 19 career appearances (18 starts) at Dodger Stadium, has gone 7-5 with a 2.45 ERA (30 ER/110.1 IP), a 2.73 FIP, a 1.02 WHIP, a .209 opponent AVG, and a 29.1% strikeout rate.

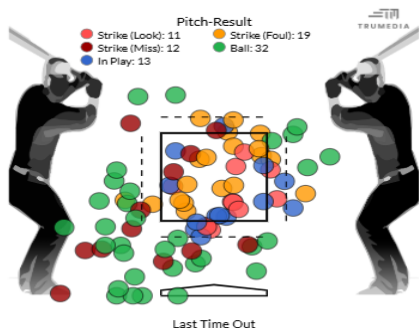
