METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Twins, 2-0, yesterday in Minnesota... New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (1-2)...Tonight, the Mets start their penultimate homestand, a seven-game stand against Arizona (four games) and Cincinnati (three games).

NEVER FORGET: Tonight, the Mets will hold a special pregame ceremony to honor the memory and victims of those who perished on September 11, 2001 and from injuries sustained in responding to the crisis...First responders from across the area will be involved to help commemorate the day...Mike Piazza, whose game-winning home run against the Braves lifted the spirits of our city when baseball resumed after the 9/11 attack, will hold a pregame press conference in the Press Conference room following Buck Showalter...The New York Mets will wear first responder caps during the game...Caps from the FDNY, NYPD, Port Authority Police Department, Department of Sanitation and Department of Correction will all be represented to commemorate their bravery and sacrifice.

CONGRATS: For the second straight week, RHP Joander Suarez was named the Minor League Pitcher of the Week for the Eastern League...In game one of a twinbill on September 7, Suarez threw a seven inning no-hitter...He allowed only one walk and struck out four in the outing...In two starts at Double-A, Suarez is 2-0 and has yet to allow a hit, surrendering two walks and striking out 10 in 13.0 innings.

HIP, HIP, JOSÉ: Tonight, José Quintana is set to make his 10th start of the season... He is 2-5 with a 3.00 ERA (18 ER/54.0 IP) with 21 walks and 39 strikeouts...In three starts at Citi Field this year, Quintana is 0-2 with a 1.59 ERA (3 ER/17.0 IP) with six walks and 12 strikeouts...He has made seven quality starts this season and his tossed at least 5.0 innings in all nine of his outings.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets return home for their penultimate homestand of the season tonight...The Mets are 35-33 at Citi Field in 2023...This compares to a 30-44 record on the road.

IDON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ: Over his last 18 games, DJ Stewart is batting .323 (21-65) with 11 runs, four doubles, 10 home runs, 21 RBI and a 1.218 OPS...In 41 games this year, Stewart is batting .264 (28-106) with 14 runs, six doubles, 11 home runs, 24 RBI, 10 walks, a .342 OBP and a .632 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

30-FOR-30: Lindor has recorded 32 doubles and 26 home runs this season...He is looking to become the 12th player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season...The last player to accomplish that feat was Pete Alonso in 2019...He has stolen 26 bases this year...He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 doubles, 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-season.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor has safely hit in five straight and eight of his last nine games...Over his last 71 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .292 (78-267) with 54 runs, 15 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 41 RBI, 30 walks, 20 steals with a .374 OBP, a .521 SLG and an .894 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high 26 bases this season.

I DECLARE fWAR: Francisco Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.5 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.3 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (19.0), Mookie Betts (18.2) and Trea Turner (16.7) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.3 fWAR since 2021 is sixth in the majors.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets now feature for players who have hit 20 or more home runs this season: Pete Alonso, Francisco Alvarez, Francisco Lindor and Brandon Nimmo...The 2023 Mets are one of five teams in franchise history to accomplish this feat...This includes the 2019 Mets who had a franchise-high five players who recorded at least 20 home runs.

100: Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 483 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...He is tied for second in the majors and second in the NL with 103 RBI.

D-BACKS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 16-3 over their last 19 games against the Diamondbacks...That span includes an eight-game winning streak from September 9, 2019-May 31, 2021...New York has won the season series against Arizona each season since 2018.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs... He is tied for third in the majors and second in the National League with 43 home runs...Alonso's 189 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

DINGERS!: The Mets have socked 188 home runs this season...That tied for the fourth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The team's 188 home runs the seventh-most in a single season in franchise history...Next up is the 1987 team, which hit 192 in the season...Four teams in franchise history have cracked 200+ home runs in a single year 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day on 1997, John Olerud became the seventh player in franchise history to hit for the cycle...He doubled in his first at-bat, singled in the third inning, homered in the seventh and recorded a triple in his final at-bat in the eighth...He finished the game going 4-5 with two runs and five RBI...The Mets defeated the Expos, 9-5 at Shea Stadium...In total, 11 players have recorded cycles for the Mets.

DOWN ON THE FARM: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies officially clinched a playoff berth in the 2023 Eastern League Playoffs yesterday...It marks the 11th playoff appearance in franchise history and first since 2017. Binghamton has won three Eastern League championships in its history (1992, 1994, 2014)... The Rumble Ponies (33-25, 70-59) will begin the postseason next Tuesday, September 19 at Mirabito Stadium against the Somerset Patriots, the New York Yankees Double-A Affiliate.

QUINTANA NEWS & NOTES

RECENTLY: Quintana made his first start with the Mets on July 20 against his former team, the Chicago White Sox...Quintana signed a two-year contract with New York on December 9, 2022...The southpaw began the season on the IL due to a stress fracture in his rib cage...Underwent surgery on March 17.

LAST TIME OUT: Quintana made his ninth start of the season on September 5 against the Nationals at Nationals Park...He threw a season-high 7.0 innings and allowed one run and one walk while striking out four batters...The lefty has recorded seven quality starts through his first nine starts as a member of the Mets.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT RECAP: Made five appearances across St. Lucie (A), Binghamton (AA) and Syracuse (AAA) as part of his rehab assignment after being placed on the 60-day IL with a left rib fracture...Threw 15.2 innings in five games, four of which were starts, pitching to a 4.60 ERA (8 ER/15.2 IP) while tallying 16 strikeouts compared to eight walks.

WATCH YOUR BACK(S): Tonight, Quintana will make his sixth career start against the Diamondbacks...Quintana last faced Arizona on August 21, 2022 at Chase Field with the Cardinals...Threw a season-low 2.2 innings and allowed four runs (two earned) while walking three batters.

HOT STREAK: Quintana's homerless inning streak came to an end at 97.1 innings in his start on August 12 at St. Louis after allowing a solo homer to Tyler O'Neill to lead off the bottom of the seventh inning...The last pitcher before Quintana to reach 90.0+ homerless innings was Tyson Ross (100.0 IP) in 2015...Courtesy of Elias...Last season Quintana owned the lowest ERA (0.89) in Major League Baseball during the month of September last year and is the lowest ERA in any month in his career.

LEFT 'EM SPEECHLESS: Reached 1,500 career strikeouts in his start vs. Colorado on August 16, 2022...Quintana currently ranks fourth among active MLB lefties in strikeouts (1,571) behind Clayton Kershaw (2,930), Chris Sale (2,170) and Patrick Corbin (1,577).

2022 SEASON: Quintana allowed two earned runs or fewer in 26 starts in the regular season...Posted a season-high 19.1-inning scoreless streak from September 11-28, the longest scoreless streak in by a Cardinals pitcher in 2022...NL Ranks 2022: ERA (2.93, 8th), Games Started (31, T10th), HR/9 IP (0.43, 1st), GIDP/9 IP (1.25, 1st), GIDP (25, T1st).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP JOSÉ BUTTO (0-2, 3.86)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw a career-high 6.1 innings and recorded a career-high six strikeouts on September 6 against the Nationals at Nationals Park...Allowed two runs in a 3-2 Mets walk-off loss...Was his first major league start since April 25 vs. Washington.

PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Butto made two starts during the first week of the season for Triple-A Syracuse, going 1-1 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) to go along with eight strikeouts and five walks...For his efforts, he was named International League Pitcher of the Week...He also earned the honor during the final week of the 2022 season after throwing 7.0 shutout innings, allowing two hits and fanning 11 in a September 21 start at Worcester.
