The Mariners pitching staff has combined to post a 2.57 ERA (2 ER, 7.0 IP) in the 7th inning or later this season, compared to a 9.00 ERA (18 ER, 18.0 IP) in innings 1-6...Seattle has surrendered 14 of its 21 runs allowed this season in either the 4th or 5th inning.

Since making his Major League debut on Sept. 10, 2019, **Kyle Lewis** has homered 8 times in 21 games...during this stretch his 8 home runs are tied with Ian Happ, Eloy Jimenez, Matt Olson and Jorge Soler for 2nd-most in the Major Leagues...he trails only Nelson Cruz and George Springer, who each have 9 home runs dating back to Sept. 10, 2019.

With 199 career home runs, **Kyle Seager** is one homer away from becoming the 4th player in club history to hit 200 career home runs as a Mariner, joining **Ken Griffey Jr.** (417), **Edgar Martinez** (309) and **Jay Buhner** (307).

# 807

**Kendall Graveman** is scheduled to make his first Major League appearance in 807 days with his start in today's game...Graveman missed the 2019 season recovering from Tommy John Surgery...his last Major League action came on May 11, 2018.

### THIRD BASEMAN FWAR (SINCE 7/22/19)

Since July 22, 2019, **Kyle Seager** ranks T2nd among all Major League third basemen with 3.2 fWAR...during that stretch, Seager is batting .284 (66x232) with 38 runs scored, 15 doubles, 1 triple, 18 home runs, 47 RBI and 28 walks in 63 games.

**TODAY'S TILT**...the Mariners conclude their opening series against the Houston Astros today at Minute Maid Park...today is the fourth (1-2) of a 4-game series at the Astros...following today's game, the Mariners will travel to Anaheim for a 3-game series at the Angels: July 28-30...today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS NW** and broadcast live on **710 ESPN Seattle** and the **Mariners Radio Network**.

**ODDS AND ENDS**...the Mariners continue their opening series against the Astros...are playing their fourth (1-2) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season...are next scheduled to have an off day on Aug. 13.

- **Score!**...**Kyle Seager** is 1 run scored away from 600 in his career...he will become only the 6th player in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner...he will join Edgar Martinez (1,219), Ichiro Suzuki (1,181), Ken Griffey Jr. (1,113), Jay Buhner (790) and Alex Rodriguez (627) as the only Mariners players in club history with at least 600 runs scored.
- **Hold Me** - **Anthony Misiewicz** picked up his first career hold with a scoreless 8th inning in yesterday's win over the Astros, becoming the 12th player in club history to notch a hold within his first 2 career appearances (last: **Taylor Guilbeau** (2019)).
- **Streak Snapper** - the Mariners snapped a 15-game losing streak against the Astros with their win in yesterday's game...the streak was tied for the longest losing streak to an opponent in club history (also: 15 games vs. Oakland, April 7-Aug. 16, 2006)...also snapped a 12-game losing streak at Minute Maid Park (6/28/19- 7/26/20).
- **Young & Old** - third baseman **Kyle Seager** (32 years, 266 days) is the oldest player on the Mariners active roster...left-handed pitcher **Nick Margevicius** (24 years, 38 days) is the youngest player on the Mariners active roster.
- **International Game** - the Mariners active roster is represented by four countries: Cuba (**Nestor Cortes**), Dominican Republic (**Yohan Ramirez**), Japan (**Yusei Kikuchi**), United States (27 players).
- **2019 in Review** - Completed the 2019 season 68-94 (.420), finishing 5th in the American League West (39.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...went 35-46 (.432) at home and 33-48 (.407) on the road...were 23-26 in one-run games and 9-4 when games went to extra-innings.

**LOOKING FOR A SPLIT**...with a win in today's game, the Mariners and Astros would split the opening series, 2-2...would mark the first series split or win for the Mariners against the Astros since Sept. 17-19, 2018 when Seattle took 2 of 3 against the Astros at Minute Maid Park.

**NOT SO TINY TIM**...**Tim Lopes** got his first action of the season in yesterday's game, getting the start in left field and going 3-for-4 with a double and 2 runs scored...since making his Major League debut on July 24, 2019, Lopes is tied for the club lead (also: **Kyle Seager**) with a .284 (33x116) batting average in 43 games (min. 100 AB)...since Sept. 19, 2019, has hit safely in 7 of his last 8 games and ranks 4th in the Majors with a .435 (10x23) batting average during that span (min. 20 AB), trailing only Nelson Cruz (.512), Aledmys Diaz (.478), and Asdrubal Cabrera (.438).

**COME UP SWINGING**...**Jose Marmolejos** and **Evan White** have each made their Major League debut and recorded their first Major League hit this year, becoming the second duo in club history to debut and record their first hit within Seattle's first 3 games of a season...they join Ken Griffey Jr. and Omar Vizquel who accomplished the feat in 1989.

**MARINER MILESTONES**...with his RBI double in the first inning on Sunday, **Kyle Seager** surpassed Alvin Davis for the 4th-most RBI in club history with 668 career RBI...Hall of Famer Edgar Martinez (1,261) holds the all-time club record, followed by Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. (1,216) and Jay Buhner (951)...since his debut season of 2011, Seager ranks 7th among left-handed batters in RBI (668), 8th in doubles (271) and 8th in home runs (199).

**HE'S EXTRA**...**Kyle Seager** has tallied 4 extra-base hits this season, T2nd-most (also: 7 others) in club history through the first 3 games of the season, trailing only David Segui (6 XBH) in 1998...marks the 14th time in club history a player has tallied an XBH in each of the club's first 3 games (last: Ryon Healy, Domingo Santana and Tim Beckham, 2019)...6 players have recorded an extra-base hit in each of the club's first 4 games (last: Healy, Santana and Beckham, 2019).

**ALL HANDS ON DECK**...in the first two games of the season, the Mariners have used 25 players, including 13 pitchers...the only active players yet to appear in a game for the Mariners this season are **Justin Dunn**, **Kendall Graveman**, **Dylan Moore**, **Nick Margevicius** and **Justus Sheffield**.

**YOUTH MOVEMENT**...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.

**WHO ARE THESE GUYS?**...**Dee Gordon** and **Marco Gonzales** are the only players remaining on the Mariners active roster from the 2019 Opening Day lineup (**Mitch Haniger** is currently on the IL, and **Kyle Seager** was on the IL for Opening Day last season)...the Mariners did not return a position player from their Opening Day starting lineup in 2019 to 2020.

**SUMMER CAMP RECAP**...the Mariners played 12 intrasquad games at T-Mobile Park during Mariners Summer Camp...**Kyle Lewis** led the way on offense, batting .435 (10x23) with 4 home runs, 7 RBI and 5 walks in 9 games...**Justin Sheffield** was a standout for the pitching staff, tossing 9.0 innings and allowing just 1 run (1.00 ERA) with no walks and 13 strikeouts over 3 outings.

**IT'S A SPRINT**...as part of its COVID-19 response, Major League Baseball has restructured the 2020 schedule to span only 60 games compared to the normal 162...the Mariners will face off against the AL West in 40 games and the NL West in 20 games...with the shorter season, each game in the 2020 season carries the equivalent weight of 2.7 regular season games in a typical MLB season...the trade deadline will take place on August 31.

**AS YOU KNOW**...**Kyle Lewis** has tallied 4 RBI so far this season...**BUT DID YOU KNOW?**...Lewis has racked up 17 RBI in his first 21 career games, 2nd-most by a Mariners batter in club history, trailing only Alvin Davis (23)...since 2000, Lewis is just the 3rd American League outfielder to tally at least 17 RBI through his first 21 games, trailing only Hideki Matsui (20) and Yoenis Cespedes (18), and is 1 of 5 players in the Majors this season to pick up an RBI in each of his team's games.

**ABOUT GRAVEMAN...**

- 29-year-old right-hander is making his first start of the season, 84th career appearance (79th career start) and his 10th career appearance vs. Houston, today at Minute Maid Park.
- Signed by Seattle as a free agent on Nov. 26, 2019.
- Native of Birmingham, AL...attended Mississippi State University from 2009 to 2013... needs just eight credits to graduate with a degree in mechanical engineering.
- Originally selected by Miami in the 36th round of the 2012 MLB Draft, but did not sign...was drafted by Toronto in the 8th round of the 2013 MLB Draft out of Mississippi State.
- Made his MLB debut with the Blue Jays on Sept. 5, 2014 at Boston.
- Was traded to Oakland as part of the deal that sent Josh Donaldson to Toronto on Nov. 28, 2014.
- Spent 4 seasons in Oakland (2015-18), going 23-29 with a 4.38 ERA (226 ER, 441.1 IP), while making a pair of Opening Day starts (2017-18)...had his 2018 campaign cut short by Tommy John Surgery on July 30.
- Signed with Chicago-NL as a free agent on December 23, 2018.
- Spent most of the season on the Injured List as he recovered from Tommy John.
- Made two appearances in Chicago-NL's farm system, covering 3.0 innings and allowing 1 ER on 3 hits with 6 strikeouts on Aug. 22 and Sept. 1.

**THE LONG ROAD BACK...**

Graveman's last Major League pitch was thrown on May 11, 2018 as a member of the Oakland Athletics in Yankee Stadium...upon throwing his first pitch today, he will have completed a track of 807 days (2 years, 2 months and 16 days) between Major League appearances...in *Mariners* history, 807 days would rank as the 4th-longest span between pitching appearances for Seattle. *Research courtesy of STATS, LLC.*

**RECOVERY...** missed all of the 2019 season recovering from Tommy John surgery... performed by Dr. Keith Meister on July 30, 2018...suffered the original injury (right forearm strain) on May 27, 2018 while pitching for Oakland's Triple-A affiliate in Nashville...had been 1-5 with a 7.60 ERA (29 ER, 34.1 IP) over 7 starts with Oakland prior to being optioned on May 15.

**SPRING TRAINING 1.0...** Graveman threw 4.0 scoreless innings over two outings in Spring Training in February/March...he threw 2.0 scoreless innings, allowing only 1 hit and 1 walk on Feb. 25 at Milwaukee...threw 2.0 scoreless innings at CHC on 3/1, walking 1 and striking out 3.

**SPRING TRAINING 2.0...** Graveman only made two appearances in Summer Camp at T-Mobile Park, but he was excellent, going 2-0 with a 1.29 ERA (1 ER, 7.0 IP) with a team-best tying 13 strikeouts (also: Justus Sheffield)...in his last outing on July 21, he struck out 8 batters over just 4.0 innings pitched.

**VS. HOUSTON...** Graveman owns a career 4-3 record with a 3.71 ERA (22 ER, 53.1 IP) in 9 starts against the Astros...he hasn't pitched against them since Sept. 10, 2017 in Oakland (6.0 IP, 5 H, 1 ER, 2 BB, 3 SO) in a 10-2 A's win...this is his first appearance in Houston since taking a loss here on August 19, 2017 (6.0 IP, 6 H, 2 ER, 3 BB, 3 SO)...in 9 starts against them, Graveman has lasted at least 5.0 innings 7 times, at least 6.0 innings 5 times, at least 7.0 innings 3 times and at least 8.0 innings once...he has allowed the Astros to score more than three earned runs just twice, coming in 2015 and 2016...in fact, over his last 6 starts against Houston, dating back to July 9, 2016, Graveman owns a 2.54 ERA (11 ER, 39.0 IP), with an opponents' average of .225 (32x142) with 5 quality starts...overall at Minute Maid, Graveman is 2-2 with a 3.52 ERA (12 ER, 30.2 IP), while holding the Astros hitters to a .234 batting average.

**VS. AL WEST...** from 2015-2018, while Graveman pitched for Oakland, he was one of just 12 pitchers to record at least 200.0 IP against the American League West (236.1)...his 41 starts over that span were tied with Cole Hamels for the 4th-most, trailing only Dallas Keuchel (54 GS), Félix Hernández (50 GS) and Martín Pérez (45 GS).

**LEFT IS RIGHT, RIGHT IS LEFT...** over his 5-year career, Graveman has limited righties to a .285/.324/.460 slash line (249x873) with 79 extra-base hits and 139 strikeouts while left-handed hitters have slashed .269/.338/.406 (235x875) with 71 extra-base hits and 147 strikeouts.

**DAY 'N' NITE...** in day games, Graveman has allowed 53 extra-base hits while hitters have recorded a .285 batting average (162x568)...he is 8-9 over 28 games (26 starts) in day games with a 4.83 ERA (77 ER, 143.1 IP)...conversely, in night games, the right-hander has went 15-20 with a 4.16 ERA (140 ER, 302.2 IP) and has held batter to a .273 batting average (322x1180).

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP JUSTUS SHEFFIELD (0-0, 0.00)**

24-year-old left-hander is scheduled to make his season debut tomorrow night in Los Angeles against the Angels...it will be his first start against the Angels in his career...pitched in 8 Major League games in 2019 (7 starts), posting a .550 ERA (22 ER, 36.0 IP) with 37 strikeouts to 18 walks...**CAREER:** was originally selected by the Cleveland Indians in the 1st round (31st overall) out of Tullahoma High School (TN)...has appeared in parts of 2 Major League seasons with the New York Yankees (2018) and Mariners (2019-c) going 0-1 with a 5.82 ERA (25 ER, 38.2 IP) with 21 walks and 37 strikeouts in 11 career games (7 starts).
