ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves...Cacher Tomás Nido and RHP Jake Reed were reinstated from the Nido (sprained left thumb) has appeared in a career-high 53 games, batting .235/.278/.623 with eight extra-base hits and 13 RBI...Reed (right forearm inflammation) has appeared in two games with the Mets, tossing 4.0 scoreless innings and allowing two hits, while striking out five...He was claimed off of waivers from the Tampa Bay Rays on August 2...He will now wear #72.

METS TO HONOR OF JUAN ALICEA: The New York Mets today announced the club will name the Spanish Radio Booth at Citi Field in honor of Juan Alicea tomorrow... Alicea joined the organization in April of 1969 and has served in a variety of capacities including scouting and community relations before finding his home in the Spanish broadcasting booth in 1982, where he's been ever since...Alicea has been behind the mic for over 4,000 Mets games, including being the leading voice on the International Spanish Network during the 1986 postseason which aired throughout the United States and Latin America...The Mets radio booth was named in honor of Bob Murphy on August 17, 2002 and the television booth was named in honor of Ralph Kiner on that same day.

CHILDHOOD CANCER AWARENESS DAY: For the sixth consecutive year, MLB and its Clubs will raise awareness for childhood cancer during today's game...All on-field personnel, including players, managers, coaches, and umpires will wear gold ribbon decals and wristbands during all games...MLB's "Childhood Cancer Awareness Day," held during Childhood Cancer Awareness Month in collaboration with Stand Up To Cancer (SU2C), will combine a visual and ceremonial demonstration of support for the cause with outreach to local hospitals treating young patients in their communities.

ROBERTO CLEMENTE AWARD NOMINEE: Pete Alonso is the New York Mets nominee for the 2021 Roberto Clemente Award, baseball's most prestigious individual honor for Major Leaguers...The Roberto Clemente Award is the annual recognition of a Major League player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field...Alonso donated a portion of his Home Run Derby winnings to his Homers for Heroes charity...The organization recognizes the outstanding work of those who generally go unnoticed and inspire others to go out in their community and do the same

METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Cardinals, 7-0, last night...New York is 3.5 games back for the second Wild Card spot..The Mets are 24-33 (does not include the resumption of the April 11 suspended game on August 28) since the All-Star break... The Mets continue their penultimate homestand of the season (2-2), a nine-game, 10-day stand against the Yankees (2-1), the Cardinals (0-1) and Phillies (three games).

THE STROSHOW: Marcus Stroman is set to make his 31st start of the season tonight. He is 9-12 with a 2.87 ERA (52 earned runs/163.0 innings) with 39 walks and 143 strikeouts overall...In 14 stars at home, Stroman is 4-6 with a 2.96 ERA(22 earned runs/67.0 innings) with 18 walks and 60 punchouts...He is set to make his third career start against the Cardinals...He is 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA (three earned runs/11.0 innings) with three walks and 13 punchouts against St. Louis...Stroman took the loss in his lone start against the Cards on May 5 in St. Louis..

TAKE FIVE: Stroman has tossed at least 5.0 innings in each of his last 13 starts... That is the third-longest streak of his career...He tossed at least 5.0 innings in a career-best 18 straight starts from September 12, 2015 - June 14, 2016...Overall, he has thrown 5.0 innings or more and allowed two earned runs or fewer in 19 of his 30 starts this season...He has allowed two earned runs or fewer in 22 starts this year, one fewer than the major league leaders (Walker Buehler and Max Scherzer lead the majors with 23 such starts).

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Over his last 11 games, Lindor is batting .324 (12-37) with 12 runs, a double, six home runs, 13 RBI, 10 walks, a .458 OBP, an .838 SLG and a 1.296 OPS...He has posted a .262/.355/.615 slashline with 10 extra-base hits and 16 RBI over his last 18 games.

JAVY A NICE DAY: Javier Báez has reached base safely in each of his last 11 starts... He is batting .442 (19-43) with 14 runs, four doubles, four home runs, eight RBI, three walks, a .510 OBP and an .814 SLG in that span...Since returning from the injured list on August 22, Báez is batting .346 (27-78) with 20 runs, seven doubles, six home runs, 12 RBI, four walks, a .407 OBP, a .667 SLG and a 1.074 OPS...In 32 games with the Mets, Báez has hit .298/.360/.570 with 25 runs, seven doubles, eight home runs, 14 CBI, six parts and a .152 OBP. 16 RBI, six walks and a 153 OPS+.

WE LIKE MIKE: Michael Conforto is batting .281 (16-57) with 11 runs, a double, four home runs, 15 RBI, a .379 OBP and a .509 SLG over his last 16 games...In 41 games since the start of August, Conforto is batting .273/.381/.462 with 23 runs, seven doubles, six home runs, 21 RBI, 19 walks and an .843 OPS...This compares to a .198/.322/.324 slashline with 16 extra-base hits and 25 RBI in his first 69 games.

CARDINALS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 23-19 against the Cardinals since Citi Field opened in 2009...They have outscored the Cards 174-156 at the ballpark.

MEMORIES: Javier Báez is two home runs away from 150 for his career...Jonathan Villar is two home runs away from 100...Kevin Pillar is four home runs away from 100...J.D. Davis is one double away from 50 for his career.

PINCH OF DAVIS: J.D. Davis is 8-18 with three doubles, two RBI and a walk in 19 appearances as a pinch-hitter this year...Overall as a team, the Mets are batting .259/.328/.447 with 19 doubles, eight home runs, 43 RBI and 20 walks when pinch hitting...Their .259 average is the fourth-best in the majors and the best in the National League...Their 19 doubles and 43 RBI top the majors...The team's eight pinch-hit homers are tied for the fourth most in the majors.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz is tied for eighth in the majors and tied for sixth in the National League with 29 saves...His 82 strikeouts as a reliever are tied for fourth in the NL and tied for 11th in the majors...He has recorded 61 saves with the Mets... That places him 11th on the franchise's all-time list...Skip Lockwood is 10th with 65.

STARTING OFF: The Mets rotation has gone at least 5.0 innings in each of their last eight games...Overall this season, the starting rotation has posted a 3.69 ERA (291 earned runs/709.2 innings) with 197 walks and 726 strikeouts...Their 3.60 ERA ranks sixth in the majors and fourth in the National League.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets own a 43-29 record with a 3.37 ERA with 225 walks and 680 strikeouts at home...The Mets has secured a winning season at home...The Mets have had winning seasons at home in two of their last three years (also, 2019)... The team's 3.37 ERA at home is the fifth-best in the majors...This compares to a 29-44 record with a 4.23 ERA (287 earned runs/611.1 innings) with 192 walks and 624 strikeouts on the road this year.

A CENTURY: Pete Alonso become just the eighth player in major league history to hit 100 or more homers within their first three major league seasons...He became the second-fastest player in major league history to hit 100 home runs, hitting 101 in 347 games...Only Ryan Howard, 100 home runs in 325 games, was faster...He collected his 10th career multi-home run game last night...His 10 multi-home games are tied with Kevin McReynolds and Bobby Bonilla for the ninth-most in franchise history... Darryl Strawberry is the franchise's record holder with 22 multi-home run games.

MOVIN' ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 130 home runs, which is seventh on the team's all-time list...Carlos Beltrán is next with 149 home runs as a Met...Pete Alonso is now 15th on the team's all-time home runs list with 101 home runs...Carlos Delgado is 14th with 104 home runs...15 players, including Alonso have hit 100 or more home runs with the franchise...Alonso's 101 home runs are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019.

VILLAR THE WORLD: In 56 games following the All-Star break, Jonathan Villar is batting .288/.352/.455 with 26 runs, six doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 18 walks, 21 RBI and an .808 OPS...This compares to a .236/.318/.438 slashline with 21 extrabase hits and 19 RBI in 69 games before the break.

FIRST CLASS: In 46 games batting first this season, Jonathan Villar is hitting .291/.374/.483 with 33 runs, 10 doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 14 RBI and 22 walks...The Mets are 28-18 in games Villar leads off...His .291 average when batting first is eighth in the majors.

WHO SAYS WINS IN RELIEF DON'T MATTER?: The Mets bullpen is first in the NL and second in the majors with 43 wins this season...No team in Mets history has earned more wins from the 'pen...The previous team record was 32 wins from relievers in 2006 and 2019...The Rays (2018, 2019, 2021) are the only club to ever have 50 or more wins from the bullpen in a season...Only 15 teams, including the 2021 Mets, since 1901 have gotten as many as 40 wins from relievers...Mets relievers are 43-26 (.623) overall this year.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1996, with two on and two outs in the bottom of the seventh inning, Todd Hundley hit his 41st home run of the season, setting a new franchise record and surpassing Roy Campanella as the all-time leader in homers by a catcher...The three-run shot was part of a five-run seventh inning...The Mets tied the game up at five all in the frame...After a stalemate, Lance Johnson hit an RBI single in the bottom of the 12th allowing the Mets to secure a 6-5 walk-off victory over the Atlanta Braves...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

STROMAN NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Stroman tonight will make his 31st start of the season and 15th at Citi Field...In his last start, Stroman tossed 6.1 innings, allowing just one run, earned, on four hits with no walks and seven strikeouts on September 9 versus the Miami Marlins at loanDepot Park...Stroman did not factor into the decision in the Mets' 3-2 loss to the Marlins...Pitched 6.0 innings or more for the fourth time in his last five starts after doing so for a streak of eight straight starts (May 11-June 17).

ON THE MARC: Stroman is tied for the major league lead with 30 starts this season...Ranks tied for 12th in the NL with 163.0 IP...Is ninth in majors and seventh in the league with a 2.87 ERA...Ranks third in the NL and sixth in the majors with a 0.77 HR/9 ratio.

FEELING SIX-Y: The Mets are 11-5 when Stroman goes at least 6.0 innings this year and 4-10 when he does not complete 6.0 IP...Stroman completed at least 6.0 innings in eight straight starts (May 11-June 17) before leaving in the second inning due to injury on June 22...Those eight consecutive 6.0+ inning starts were good for the longest streak of his career...Stroman had a 2.50 ERA (14 earned runs/50.1 innings) over that stretch.

HIGH FIVE: Has thrown 5.0 innings or more and allowed two earned runs or fewer in 19 of his 30 starts this season...He has allowed two earned runs or fewer in 22 starts this year, one fewer than the major league leaders (Walker Buehler and Max Scherzer lead the majors with 23 such starts).

VS. THE CARDINALS: Making his third career start against the Cardinals and second of the season...Holds a 1-1 record with a 2.45 ERA (three earned runs/11.0 innings) against the Cardinals...In his last start against St.Louis on May 5 of this year, Stroman tossed 5.0 innings and allowed four runs, two earned, on seven hits...Struck out six batters and walked one in the Mets' 4-1 loss.

 $\ensuremath{\text{\textbf{KEEP IT ON THE GROUND:}}}$ Stroman generated a 75 percent ground ball rate in his last start, his second-highest of the season (83.3 percent in his first start)... He currently ranks seventh in the majors and fourth the NL with a 50.5 percent ground ball rate...His five-game rolling ground ball percentage was below 50 percent from the start of July until his most recent start after topping out at 59.7 percent through his first five starts of the year.

EXTRA. EXTRA: Stroman allowed 13 extra-base hits over his last eight starts after allowing only 21 extra-base hits through his first 22 starts...Still, his 35 XBH allowed this season rank tied for the fifth-fewest among the 50 pitchers in the majors who have thrown at least 140.0 innings this season.

SUCCESS VS. LEFT: Lefties are slashing just .237/.293/.343 against Stroman, a .636 OPS against that ranks 17th in the NL among pitchers who've faced at least 200 LHB.

WITH THE METS: Stroman has gone 13-14 with a 3.21 ERA (78 earned runs/228.1 innings) in his 40 starts with New York...The Mets have gone 22-18 in his 40 starts after he joined the team on July 28, 2019...ln 2019, he struck out 60 in 59.2 innings with the Mets (Stroman never averaged more than 9.0 K/9 in a season with Toronto).
