RAY MATTER-The Rays won a rubber match over the Blue Javs on Wednesday and clinched a postseason berth for the seventh time in club history, including a third straight season for the first time...the Rays are 3-4 on this current 10-game homestand vs. DET/TOR/MIA, 6-8 in their last 14 games since Sep 8 and 10-11 in September, tied for 13th in the majors this month...

### MOST POSTSEASON **BERTHS, SINCE 2008**

Los Angeles Dodgers 11 New York Yankees St. Louis Cardinals 8 7 Tampa Bay Rays

despite this 10-11 mark, the Rays have lost only 2 games on their division lead in September, entering it with an 8-game lead over the Yankees and currently holding a 6-game lead over Boston...the Rays are 41-22 since the All-Star break, best in the AL since then over the Yankees (40-24).

- + With 9 games remaining, the Rays are on pace to go 99-63, which would set a franchise record for wins in a single season over 2008 (97-65)...the Rays would need to go 6-3 or better to reach 100 wins.
- The Rays have trailed in 47.9 pct. (45 of 94) of their wins and their 45 come-from-behind wins tie the club record (2008) and rank 2nd in MLB behind Boston (46)...the Rays have 17 wins after trailing by 3 runs (or more), most in the majors over the Twins (11), including a ML-most 9 wins when trailing by 3+ runs in the 6th inning or later...the Rays have a ML-most 7 wins when trailing after 8 innings.

WHERE WE STAND—The Rays lead the division by 6 games and the magic number to clinch the AL East is 4-a combination of Rays wins or Red Sox losses... the earliest possible clinch date is tomorrow, if the Rays go 2-0 and the Red Sox go 0-2 at home vs. the Yankees...the

Rays are attempting to win a fourth AL East title (2020, 2010, 2008)...the previous three division clinchers all were on the road: Sep 23, 2020 at Citi Field with 3 games remaining, Oct 3, 2010 in Kansas City on the last day of the regular season and Sep 26, 2008 in Detroit with with 2 games left.

While the Rays are one of the two youngest franchises in the majors, their run of three straight postseason berths represent a feat that nine of 30 clubs have never achieved: D-backs, Mariners, Marlins, Mets, Nationals/Expos, Padres, Reds, Rockies, White Sox

UNDER THE DOME—The Rays are 49-29 (.628) at home this season, tied for 4th in the majors and tied for 2nd in the AL behind the White Sox (49-27)...the Rays have a 2.98 ERA at home, which leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the majors behind the Dodgers (2.92)...the Rays are 42-17 (.712) at home since May 13, best in the majors ahead of the Dodgers (42-18), and have outscored opponents by 145 runs (330-185) over this span...this comes on the heels of a 7-12 start, which was 28th in the majors through May 12.

- + The Rays are attempting to reach 50 home wins for the fifth time in club history, following 2008 (57), 2009 (52), 2018 (51) and 2013 (51).
- The Rays rank 7th in the majors with 383 runs scored at home and 15th with 94 HR, but rank 2nd and 4th in these stats on the road.

IT TAKES A VILLAGE—This season the Rays have used 61 players and 38 pitchers (excluding position players), both of which shatter club records... their previous highs were 57 players used and 31 pitchers used in 2019.

- + The Rays have 10 players with 10 HR (or more), matching the club record from 2006 and tied with the Giants for most in the majors.
- Excluding the shortened 2020 season, the Rays are attempting to join the 2018 Dodgers and 2017 Astros as the only teams in major league history to win their division without a qualifying pitcher.
- The Rays have 23 pitchers with a win, most in the majors...this is one shy of matching the single-season club record from 2018 (24).
- The Rays have 13 pitchers with a save, breaking a tie with the 2020 Rays and 1973 Rangers for a major league record...the Rays had 11 pitchers with a save in 2019, 12 in 2020 and 13 in 2021, the first team to have 10+ pitchers with one in three straight seasons...since the All-Star break, 10 Rays pitchers have combined for 16 saves.

ABOUT THE OFFENSE—The Rays rank 2nd in the majors with 811 runs scored behind the Astros (827)...they have set a franchise record for runs scored in a single season, passing 2009 (803) and 2010 (802)...the Rays have increased their major league rank in runs scored in five consecutive seasons, from 25th in 2017 to 16th, tied for 15th, 12th and 2nd in 2021.

+ With Nelson Cruz and Wander Franco both in the starting lineup

- together, the Rays have totaled 224 runs in 35 games (6.40 R/G).
- + The Rays rank 6th in the majors with 210 HR and 6th with 553 BB. and rank 6th in the AL with a .320 OBP, 9th in avg. (.241), 10th in avg. with RISP (.250) and 6th in avg. with RISP/2 out (.237)...the Rays lead the AL with 1.456 SO. 3rd in MLB behind the Cubs and Marlins...their strikeout rate reached 28.2 pct. in May but has dropped to 25.1 in June, 24.4 in July, 22.5 in August and 20.7 in September.
- Since the All-Star break, the Rays rank 3rd in MLB with 100 HR.
- The Rays have scored a club-record and ML-most 300 runs in the 7th inning or later (Phillies, 261), including a ML-most 108 runs in the 8th (Phillies, 100) and ML-most 79 runs in the 9th (Padres, 65).
- This season the Rays are batting .297 (250-for-843) with RISP in the 94 wins, compared to .161 (70-for-435) with RISP in the 59 losses.

HERE'S THE PITCH—The Rays have pitched to a 3.76 ERA this season, 6th in the majors and 3rd in the AL, and their 77 games of allowing 3 runs (or fewer) are one shy of the Astros for most in the AL...the Rays are attempting to finish among the majors' top ten in ERA for a fifth straight season.

- + Since June 15-the day after Tyler Glasnow left his start with injury-Rays starters are 22-17 with a 4.83 ERA (396.2-IP, 213-ER) in 86 games, the 6th-highest among AL clubs...before that, Rays starters ranked 8th in the majors and 2nd in the AL with a 3.49 ERA.
- The Rays bullpen has pitched to a 3.24 ERA this season, best in the AL over the Yankees (3.60) and 3rd in the majors behind the Giants (3.09) and Dodgers (3.09)...the bullpen leads the majors with 55 wins and 657.2 IP and leads the AL with a .225 opp avg. and 1.15 WHIP.
- The bullpen has a 1.85 ERA (39-IP, 8-ER) in 9 games since Sep 14.

PITCHING PLANS—Tonight's game will be started by David Robertson, the first start of his major league career and second start of his professional career (June 12, 2012 vs. Louisville while rehabbing with Scranton/ Wilkes-Barre)...tonight is the 20th time this season the Rays are using an opener, and they are 13-6 in the previous 19 games...according to Stats LLC, Robertson's 670 relief apps are the most in major league history at the time of a pitcher's first start, passing the 666 relief apps for Joakim Soria before his start on June 5, 2019 at LAA (with OAK) and the 638 relief apps for Troy Percival before his start on Sep 30, 2007 at PIT (with STL).

- + Incl. postseason, since the debut of the opener on May 19, 2018, the Rays have used one 127 times and are 78-49 (.614) in those games.
- Only four pitchers currently on a 40-man roster have made more ap pearances than Robertson without starting a game: Joe Smith (830), Kenley Jansen (697), Bryan Shaw (687) and Tony Watson (686).

THE WANDER YEARS-20-year-old Wander Franco has a 39-game onbase streak, the longest active in the majors and longest by a rookie in club history, passing Rocco Baldelli (24) in 2003...among players age 20 years (or younger), it passed NYY Mickey Mantle (36) in 1951-52 for the longest in AL history and is the 2nd-longest in major league history behind CIN Frank Robinson (43) in 1956...regardless of age, it is the longest in the modern era (since 1900) for a rookie shortstop, passing CHW Chico Carrasquel (37) in 1950...his streak is tied with Johnny Damon in 2011 for 2nd-longest in franchise history behind Tommy Pham (48) in 2018-19.

- + Has more hits (49) than swings-and-misses (45) during the streak
- + Franco has struck out once in his last 60 PA and three times in his last 101 PA, compared to 32 SO over the first 170 PA of his career.
