THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY
SEPT. 15
1998 - At 1 a.m. CT on Sept. 15, the Astros clinch the NL Central after the Cubs lose to the Padres...the Astros could have clinched earlier that night on Sept. 14, but lost 7-4 in 13 innings to the Mets...this is the earliest the Astros have clinched a postseason berth in club history.

TONIGHT'S GAME: The first-place Astros will open their final homestand of the regular season tonight as they welcome in the Royals for an important three-game series in Houston, TX...Astros ace **RHP Hunter Brown** (5-3) will try to pitch the Astros back into the win column tonight as he starts opposite **RHP Michael Wacha** (9-8) and the Royals.

BROTHER BROWN: **RHP Hunter Brown** has posted a 3.12 ERA (18ER/52IP) in his last eight starts (since July 25), pitching through the 5th inning in all eight outings...Brown, who finished third in the AL Cy Young Award voting last season, has been limited this season, missing over two months due to a lengthy stint on the Injured List (April 1-June 15) with a right shoulder strain.

ASTROS-ROYALS: The Astros and Royals have a memorable history, with the two clubs meeting each other in the 2015 ALDS, won by the Royals in five games...11 years later, **2B Jose Altuve** and **C Salvador Perez** remain on their respective team's active rosters, while **SS Carlos Correa**, currently on the IL, also played in the series...more recently, the Astros are 9-4 in their last 13 games against the Royals, including a 2-1 record this season.

CLEMENTE DAY: Today is **Roberto Clemente Day** presented by Capital One...as part of the league-wide celebration, the Roberto Clemente Day logo will appear on the bases, on the official dugout lineup cards and on a special uniform patch...in honor of Clemente, seven different Astros players and Manager **Joe Espada** will wear Clemente's #21 for tonight's game.

HADER NAMED CLEMENTE NOMINEE: For the second straight season, **LHP Josh Hader** has been named the Astros nominee for the **Roberto Clemente Award**, baseball's most prestigious individual honor for MLB players...the Roberto Clemente Award, presented by Capital One, is the annual recognition of an MLB player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field.

FIRST RESPONDERS NIGHT: Tonight is First Responders Night at the ballpark as the Astros will proudly honor the courageous men and women who serve the city of Houston...there will be a pregame ceremony and ceremonial first pitch for First Responders Night presented by Budweiser.

MEDIA PARKING UPDATE: Media parking will be exclusively available in Lot C for the entirety of the Royals series...Lot B will reopen to media for the weekend series vs. the Braves.

THE SUNDAY SCARIES: The Astros finished their six-game road trip on Sunday in Tampa with a 14-4 loss to the Rays...the Astros hit three homers in the loss, one each by **3B Isaac Paredes** (1x3), **SS Nick Allen** (1x2) and **DH Nelson Velázquez** (1x2).

CHALLENGING STRETCH: On Sunday, the Astros completed a stretch of playing 13 consecutive games against opponents with winning records (CWS, ARI, PHI, TB), going 6-7 in those contests...on the season, the Astros are 29-23 against teams with .500 or better records.

TODAY'S ROSTER MOVE: The Astros have placed **OF Taylor Trammell** on the Paternity List and have recalled **OF Joey Loperfido** from Triple A Sugar Land.

TRIPLE THREAT: **DH Yordan Alvarez**, who is a solid candidate for the AL MVP Award, currently ranks first or second in the AL in all three **Triple Crown** categories...he enters today leading the AL in batting avg. (.310), while ranking second in RBI (96) and tied for second in HR (38)...Alvarez also leads the Majors in OPS (1.016), SLG (.589) and OBP (.427)...since **Carl Yastrzemski** won the AL Triple Crown in 1967, there has been just one Triple Crown winner in the Majors, **Miguel Cabrera** in 2012 (AL).

ISAAC'S FABLES: **3B Isaac Paredes** has posted a 20-game on-base streak, which is the second-longest on-base streak of his career (22g in 2025) and the second-longest active on-base streak in the Majors (**Elly De La Cruz**, 21g)...during the streak, which dates back to Aug. 23, Paredes has 14 walks, a .395 OBP and a .917 OPS.

NOTHING FINER THAN YAINER: **C Yainer Diaz** is hitting .378 (14x37) in the month of September with a .924 OPS...prior to going 0x3 on Sunday, Diaz had tallied multiple hits in six straight starts, going 13x23 (.565) in that span.

STALKING 200: **1B Christian Walker** is currently sitting on 199 career home runs and needs just one homer to become the 35th active Major League player to reach 200 career long balls...Walker has hit 25 homers this year for his fifth consecutive 25-plus homer season (2022-26).

FIREMEN: **LHP Josh Hader** ranks tied for 40th in Major League history with 252 career saves, along with **LHP Dave Righetti**...among lefties, Hader and Righetti rank tied for fifth in saves in MLB history.

ONE WIN AWAY!: The Class A Fayetteville Woodpeckers won Game 1 of the Carolina League Championship Series over Charleston on Sunday by a score of 14-4...the three-game series shifts to Fayetteville tonight with the Woodpeckers needing just one more win to take home their first championship in franchise history.

ASTROS MILB PLAYERS OF THE YEAR: The Astros player development department has named **C Jason Schiavone** the Astros 2026 Minor League Player of the Year, **RHP Bryce Mayer** the Astros 2026 Minor League Pitcher of the Year, **OF Anthony Huelo** the Astros 2026 Minor League Baserunner of the Year, **IF Max Holy** the Astros 2026 Minor League Defender of the Year and **IF Yamal Encarnacion** the Astros 2026 Standard Award recipient...all five players will be recognized in a pregame ceremony at Daikin Park on Sunday.

POSTSEASON CREDENTIALS: Media may apply for credentials for potential Astros postseason home games in the Wild Card Series and ALDS on MLB's credentialing system...the deadline to apply for Wild Card Series credentials is Sunday, Sept. 27.

LAST START, SEPT. 9 at PHI: Allowed 5 runs (4 ER) on 7 hits and no walks with 7 strikeouts in 5.0 innings...marked his 2nd start of the season without allowing a walk (also, July 25, 2026 at CWS).

THE DIESEL: The Astros 2026 Opening Day starter, Brown has been limited to 17 Major League starts on the season due to a 2-plus month-long IL stint (April 5-June 16) due to a right shoulder strain...the Astros have gone 8-9 in his 17 starts...owns a .221 opponent average and has fanned 100 in his 92.0 innings pitched on the season.

THE TURNAROUND: Has returned to form as the Astros ace over his last 9 starts, posting a 4-2 record with a 3.12 ERA (18ER/52IP), 57 strikeouts, a .230 opponent batting average and a 1.19 WHIP dating back to his start on July 25 at CWS...prior to this run, he struggled in his first 6 starts back from the IL, posting a 5.22 ERA (17ER/29.1IP) from June 16-July 19.

SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Had his best start of the season on July 25 at CWS, tossing 7.0 scoreless innings with 7 strikeouts while allowing just 2 hits and no walks...was the 1st start of his career in which he tossed 7.0+ scoreless innings while allowing 2-or-fewer hits without issuing a walk...was outstanding in his start on Aug. 28 at NYM, allowed 1 run on 5 hits and 1 walk with 10 strikeouts in 6.2 innings...his 10 strikeouts are a season-high and the most he's recorded since he struck out a career-high 12 on June 14, 2025 vs. MIN.

SAVANT SAYS: Among all Major League pitchers, he ranks in the 95th percentile in average exit velocity (86.2) and 96th percentile in groundball percentage (55.9)...also ranks in the 90th percentile in xBA (.200) and the 79th percentile in extension (6.8).

FOUR SEAMS: Has held opponents to a .155 batting average (13x84) with his 4-seam fastball and has tossed the pitch at a 31.8-percent rate, the highest of all his pitches.

VS. KC: In 4 career games vs. the Royals, he's recorded a 8.82 ERA (16ER/16.1IP) with 17 strikeouts...in his last start vs. the Royals on April 27, 2025 at Kauffman Stadium, he allowed 1 run on 7 hits and 1 walk with 9 strikeouts in 6.0 innings.

MINOR LEAGUE WORK: Made 4 rehab appearances this season on his way back from injury between Double A and Triple A...combined for a 1.88 ERA (3ER/14.1IP) with 21 strikeouts, 3 walks, a 0.77 WHIP and a .157 opponent average.

ALL-STAR SEASON: A 2025 All-Star, Brown finished third in the AL in Cy Young voting last season after turning in the best year of his career with a 12-9 record, a 2.43 ERA (50ER/185.1IP) and posting a 1.03 WHIP...in 2025, Brown held opponents to a career-low .201 average and posted 206 strikeouts in 185.1 innings pitched...his 2.43 ERA ranked 10th all-time among Astros starters and was the second-lowest by an Astros starter in the last 20 seasons (since 2005)...among AL starters, he ranked first in opponent SLG (.318) and second in ERA (2.43)...lastly, by reaching 206 strikeouts, he became the 18th pitcher in club history to reach 200 strikeouts in a season.

WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU: By finishing third in the AL Cy Young voting in 2025, the Astros were granted a compensation pick immediately after the first round of the 2026 draft (No. 28 overall)...the Astros earned the pick through the Prospect Promotion Incentive (PPI), which was ratified into the latest CBA...the PPI rewards teams for promoting their best prospects to the big leagues at the start of the season, having them accrue one full year of service time and then having them factor into a major award that season or prior to qualifying for arbitration...the Astros used that selection on **RHP Jack Radel** out of Notre Dame.

LAST APPEARANCE (9/11 at TB): Suffered his 4th loss of the season on Fri. night at TB after allowing a walk-off 2-run home run to **TB IF Junior Caminero** in the 9th inning...prior to Friday night, he recorded 8 consecutive scoreless outings from Aug. 28-Sept. 10.

TURNING THE PAGE: Since May 3, he has gone 6-2-7 with a 2.20 ERA (12ER/49IP)...also has recorded 60 strikeouts, a 1.10 WHIP and a .175 opponent average during the stretch...prior to May 3, Abreu had a 12.54 ERA in his first 11 apps. of the season...among AL relievers since May 3 (min. 45 IP), he ranks 6th in opponent batting average and 7th in SO/9 (11.02).

ASTROS RANKINGS: Enters tonight with 524 career strikeouts and is 5 strikeouts from matching **RHP Dave Smith** (529) for the 3rd-most by a reliever in Astros history.

VS. KC: In 13 career appearances vs. the Royals, he's recorded a 3.27 ERA (4ER/11IP) with 10 strikeouts.

SAVANT SAYS: Ranks in the 97th percentile in whiff perc. (34.9%), 93rd percentile in K rate (30.3%) and 92nd percentile in xBA (.199) per Baseball Savant.

A CUT ABOVE: Began throwing a cutter this season in his outing on June 2 vs. PIT and has tossed the pitch at a 10.7 percent rate on the season...has held opponents to a .158 batting average (3x19) vs. his cutter this year.
