TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 6 game homestand today with the last of 3 games against the Atlanta Braves (1-1)...Seattle also hosted the Kansas City Royals (0-3) on the homestand...following an off-day on Thursday, Seattle will open a 7-game road trip with the Chicago White Sox (3 G, May 8-10) and Houston Astros (4 G, May 11-14)...today's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call with **Angie Mentink** serving as field analyst...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's game against the Braves by a 3-2 final...Seattle is 7-5 over its last 12 games and 9-7 over its last 16 games.

- **Small Margins** - The Mariners have played an MLB-leading 15 one-run games this season, going 6-9 (.400) in those contests...Seattle leads MLB in one-run games (282) since 2021 and their 156-126 (.553) record in one-run games during that span ranks 2nd in MLB behind the Brewers (.564/136-105).
- **Let Me Lead** - Seattle ranks 3rd in the Majors with 17 go-ahead home runs this season, trailing only the Braves (20 HR) and Yankees (26 HR)...in 2025, the Mariners ranked 2nd with 81 go-ahead homers behind only the Yankees (92 HR).
- **D** - The Mariners rank T-8th in MLB with 13 defensive runs saved.

J.P. CRAWFORD: GOOD BASEBALL PLAYER...J.P. Crawford went 1-for-4 with 1 HR and 2 RBI in yesterday's game...he has hit safely in 7-consecutive games (4/28-c), batting .296 (8x20) with 6 runs, 3 home runs, 5 RBI, 6 walks to just 4 strikeouts and 1 stolen base with a .424 OBP, slugging .630 for a 1.054 OPS...Crawford has walked (22) more than he has struck out (20) this season, 1 of 18 players with more walks than strikeouts in 2026 (min. 100 PA)...additionally, he is getting on base at a .363 clip this season, posting an 17.7% walk rate that ranks 8th in MLB...since 2022, his 310 walks rank 7th in MLB and 2nd in the AL behind only Aaron Judge-NYY (484 BB).

HAMMER AND NAYLZ...over his last 15 games (4/17-c), first baseman **Josh Naylor** is batting .386 (22x57) with 3 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI, 6 walks and 6 stolen bases, reaching base at a .438 clip and slugging .544 for a .982 OPS...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, he is 25-for-27 in stolen base attempts, ranking T-5th in the Majors and T-4th in AL in stolen bases over that span.

REHAB UPDATE...INF/OF **Brendan Donovan** went 1-for-3 with 1 double and 2 walks yesterday in the first game of his rehab assignment with Double-A Arkansas...OF **Victor Robles** and INF **Patrick Wisdom** appeared in yesterday's game with Triple-A Tacoma on rehab...RHP **Bryce Miller** is scheduled to make his 4th rehab start of the season...in Miller's last start on April 30, he tossed 4.0 innings and 53 pitches.

J-ROD SHOWING OFF...over his last 24 games since April 11, **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .326 (30x92) with 12 runs, 7 doubles, 4 home runs, 14 RBI, 7 walks and is 3-for-3 in stolen base attempts, getting on base at a .380 clip, slugging .533 with a .913 OPS in 100 plate appearances.

RANDY JOHNSON'S NUMBER 51 RETIRED...Randy Johnson's #51 was retired on Saturday, joining fellow Hall of Famers **Ken Griffey Jr. (#24)**, **Edgar Martinez (#11)**, **Ichiro Suzuki (#51)** and **Jackie Robinson (#42)** as the only numbers retired by the Mariners...Johnson became be the 14th player in MLB history to have his number retired by multiple teams, as his and Ichiro's #51 became the 8th number to be retired by the same team for multiple players (in addition to #42 which is retired across Major League Baseball)...Randy was inducted into the Mariners Hall of Fame in 2012 and the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2015...the Arizona Diamondbacks retired his #51 in 2015.

- **Johnson Statue Coming In 2027** - Mariners Chairman & Managing Partner **John Stanton** announced Saturday that **Randy Johnson** will be honored with a statue at T-Mobile Park in 2027...Johnson will join **Dave Niehaus** (2011), **Ken Griffey Jr.** (2017), **Edgar Martinez** (2021), and **Ichiro Suzuki** (2026), as well as **Mike Cameron** and **Mark McLemore** raising the American flag in 2001 statue, set for later this year, as Mariners legends to be immortalized with a statue at T-Mobile Park.

K KINGS...the Mariners have had 4 of the last 5 pitchers to record 13+ strikeouts in a game: **Emerson Hancock** (14, 5/2/26 vs. KC), **George Kirby** (14, 9/14/25 vs. LAA), **Bryan Woo** (13, 9/13/25 vs. LAA) and **Logan Gilbert** (13, 8/24/25 vs. ATH)...Max Fried-NYY (13, 9/18/25 at BAL) is the last non Mariner with 13+ SO in a game.

COLE YOUNG'S RUN...over his last 17 games (4/16-c), **Cole Young** is batting .308 (20x65) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 10 RBI, 4 walks and 2 stolen bases...the 22-year-old leads second basemen and ranks T-2nd in MLB with 7 defensive runs saved (*Sports Info Solutions*).

FURIOUS GEORGE...George Kirby was stellar again in last night's game, allowing 2 runs over 7.0 innings...overall this season, he is 4-2 with a 2.94 (17 ER, 52.0 IP), 12 walks and 39 strikeouts...he has induced 9 double plays, which is tied for the MLB lead (also: **Tarik Skubal-DET**) and ranks 2nd in MLB with 52.0 IP, trailing only **Max Fried-NYY** (52.2).

ALL IS FERRER IN LOVE AND WAR...Mariners reliever **José A. Ferrer** holds a 2.00 ERA (4 ER, 18.0 IP), 3 walks, 15 strikeouts and 1 save in 19 appearances this season...Ferrer has held opponents to a 28.3% hard-hit rate (95+ MPH) and is 1 of 15 qualified MLB pitchers that has yet to allow a "barrel" this season.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Bryan Woo** is looking to bounce back after allowing 6+ runs in each of his last 2 appearances, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Woo's 3.34 career ERA is the best mark in Mariners history (min. 50 GS)?...he ranks ahead of a quartet of franchise legends who each hold a 3.42 ERA: **Randy Johnson**, **Félix Hernández**, **Hisashi Iwakuma** and **James Paxton**...current rotation-mates **George Kirby** (6th, 3.54), **Luis Castillo** (7th, 3.61) and **Logan Gilbert** (8th, 3.61) round out the top 8.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 6

- **1981** - Rene Lachemann is named the third manager of the Mariners replacing Maury Wills.
- **1982** - Mariner pitcher Gaylor Perry won his 300th career game, a complete game, 7-3 victory over the New York Yankees before a Kingdome crowd of 27,369. Perry became just the 15th pitcher in Major League history to win 300 games.
- **2000** - Kazuhiro Sasaki picked up his first Major League win in a 1-0 victory vs. Anaheim.
- **2001** - Bret Boone hits two homers in game against the Blue Jays, the 12th multi-homer game of his career and 1st as a Mariner.
- **2003** - Dan Wilson goes 2x5 to extend his hitting streak to 11-games, tying his career high.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 8th start of the season and his 78th career start...is also making his first career start against the Braves.
Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of California Polytechnic State University...signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances (6 starts) for the Mustangs. Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.
Was selected to the 2025 American League All-Star team for the first time in his career.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on May 1 vs. Kansas City...allowed 6 runs (6 ER) on 7 hits (2 HR) with no walks and 2 strikeouts in his 7th start of the season...he threw 84 pitches (60 strikes).

NEW FACES...is facing the Braves for the first time in his career...Atlanta is one of six teams that Woo has yet to face, also: Chicago Cubs, Colorado Rockies, Miami Marlins, Milwaukee Brewers, and the Seattle Mariners.

AGAINST THE NL EAST...despite not facing the Braves so far in his career, he is 1-1 with a 1.88 ERA (5 ER, 24.0 IP) and 22 strikeouts across 4 career starts against teams in the National League East.

THE LAST 15...across his last 15 home starts (5/13/25-c), he is 9-2 with a 3.04 ERA (32 ER, 94.2 IP) and 105 strikeouts to just 15 walks allowed, tossing a quality start in 11 of those 15 starts and throwing 6.0+ IP in 14 of those starts and 7.0+ IP in 4 of the last 15 home starts.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME...among Mariners starting pitchers through their first 34 home starts with the club, his 19 wins, 137 hits allowed are each franchise-best marks while his 3.13 ERA (61 ER, 175.1 IP) rank 5th...his 217 strikeouts are also second-most, trailing Luis Castillo (241 SO) and his 33 walks allowed are 2nd-fewest, trailing only George Kirby (23 BB).

MAY FLOWERS...May is historically a high performing month as he holds a 2.63 ERA (21 ER, 72.0 IP) with a 13.25 strikeout-to-walk ratio (53 SO, 4 BB) and a 0.819 WHIP across 12 career starts in the month of May...among pitchers with 10+ GS in May since 2023, he ranks 2nd in both WHIP and SO/BB ratio, trailing Tarik Skubal-DET in both categories (0.729 WHIP, 14.0 SO/BB)...has tossed 6.0+ IP in 10 of those 12 starts in May, including 8 quality starts.

WOOOOO...has tossed 7.0+ innings in 3 starts this season (last: 4/19 vs. TEX)...threw 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just 1 hit on April 3 at Los Angeles-AL, his 3rd career start tossing 7.0+ IP with 1-or-fewer hits...tied for the most such games in MLB since the start of last season (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD).

FEW FEW PASSES...has issued just 6 walks across 41.0 innings and 7 starts this season...his 1.32 walks-per-nine innings this season ranks 3rd-best in MLB, trailing rotationmate Emerson Hancock (1.30) and Tarik Skubal-DET (1.25)...his 3.6 walk percentage this season is tied with Tarik Skubal for the best in the Majors...among qualifying pitchers, he also ranks 2nd in both walks-per-nine (1.66) and walk percentage (4.7%) since 2025.

WATCH ME WHIP.....his 0.989 career WHIP is the lowest in franchise history (min. 400 IP) and is tied for the 3rd-best mark in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, alongside Shota Imanaga-CHC, trailing Tarik Skubal-DET (0.91) and Paul Skenes-PIT (0.93)...has thrown 6.0+ IP with 4-or-fewer hits in 16 games since 2025, tied for 3rd-most such games in MLB across that span.

QUALITY STUFF...has tossed a quality start in 4 of his 7 starts this season (last: 4/19 vs. TEX)...threw a quality start in 21 of his 30 starts last season, tied for 4th-most in the Majors that season, trailing only Logan Webb-SF (22), Cristopher Sánchez-PHI (22) and Garrett Crochet-BOS (22)...his 25 quality starts since 2025 are tied for 5th-most in MLB.

GOING THE DISTANCE...across his career, the Mariners are 28-21 when he tosses 6.0+ IP and 9-4 when he tosses 7.0+ IP compared to 15-13 when he tosses fewer than 6.0 innings...has tossed 6.0+ IP in 32 of his 37 starts since 2025 with the team going 17-15 in those games.

FIRST HALF WARRIOR...is 13-8 with a 3.15 ERA (82 ER, 234.1 IP), 2010 strikeouts and a 0.969 WHIP across 41 career starts pre All-Star Break...his 0.969 WHIP in the first half ranks 3rd-best in MLB since 2023 (min. 200 IP), trailing Tarik Skubal-DET (0.857) and Paul Skenes (0.913)...he threw 6.0+ innings in all 18 starts before last year's All-Star break, while posting a 2.75 ERA (35 ER, 114.2 IP) with 109 strikeouts and 21 walks...his 2.75 ERA last year was the 6th-best by a starting pitcher in the first half (min. 15 GS) in franchise history, while his 0.93 WHIP ranked 3rd-best (1st: Logan Gilbert, 0.87 in 2024).

THROUGH 75...made his 75th career start on April 19 vs. Texas...among Mariners through their first 75 starts with the club, his 330 hits allowed are the fewest, his 3.14 ERA ranks 2nd-best, trailing only Hisashi Iwakuma (2.93), his 86 walks allowed are 2nd-fewest, trailing only George Kirby (52 BB), and his 418 strikeouts are 4th-most...his 39 total quality starts are T-6th in franchise history across a starter's first 75 career starts, alongside Dave Fleming, Félix Hernández, and Hisashi Iwakuma.

400...recorded his 400th career strikeout on March 28 vs. Cleveland, becoming the 2nd-fastest starter to reach 400 strikeouts in franchise history (71 GS), behind only Felix Hernández (70 GS, 405 SO).

2025 TOTALS...went 15-7 with a 2.94 ERA (61 ER, 186.2 IP), 36 walks, 198 strikeouts and a 0.93 WHIP in 30 starts...held opponents to a .200/.243/.353 slashline last season...finished 5th in 2025 BBWAA Cy Young Award voting.
