RAYS REPORT—The Rays continue their final road trip before the All-Star break today at Comerica Park, going 1-3 so far against the Twins (1-2), Tigers (0-1, two to play) and Red Sox (4-0)...have lost three of four and seven of their last 10 games...are still 28-16 in their last 44 games since May 20, fourth in the majors behind the Blue Jays (31-14), Astros (30-14) and Brewers (28-15), and 40-28 in their last 68 contests since starting 9-14...are 3-4-1 in their last eight series after going 7-1-1 in their previous nine (May 9-June 8)...are fourth in the AL/tied for sixth in MLB in run differential (+65)...are third in the AL East, 4.0 GB the first-place Blue Jays, their largest deficit since entering play on June 15 (4.5 GB)...spent 19 days within 2.5 games from June 16-July 4, including three within a half-game, but never claimed first...have been in second or third for the last 45 days...on the season, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 29 in third, 30 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ★ The Rays dropped last night's series opener, 5-1, with seven of their nine hits allowed going for extra bases...they have allowed 46 extra-base hits (24 2B, 2 3B, 20HR, .534 opp. SLG) in their last 10 games, tying July 27-Aug. 8, 2019 for their most over any 10-game span in the last 16 seasons since 2010.
- ★ Tampa Bay has allowed four runs or more in eight straight games, its longest streak since May 27-June 6, 2017 (9G)...on the year, the club is 16-32 when permitting four runs or more and 33-10 with three runs or fewer.
- ★ Over the last 15 games, the Rays rotation has recorded a 3.29 ERA (79 IP, 29ER) while the bullpen has a 7.52 ERA (52.2IP, 44ER)...the pen has yielded multiple runs in five straight and eight of the last 10 games.
- ★ The Rays have scored first once in their last eight games...they have allowed the opening run in five straight games, their longest streak since May 6-10 (5G)...their longest streak this season is six games, set from April 15-20.
- ★ The Rays have a .477 (114-125) winning pct. in July since **Kevin Cash** took the helm in 2015, their lowest mark in any calendar month.
- ★ The Rays are 21-17 (.553) on the road, second in the majors behind the Tigers (27-20/.574)...having played the most home games (53) and fewest road games (38) to this point, 13 of 19, 25 of 34 and 31 of their next 45 games will come on the road.
- ★ Tampa Bay needs to win tonight in order to avoid dropping four straight series for the first time since June 18-July 4, 2024 (six straight)...paired with a three-game sweep from Sept. 24-26, 2024, it would mark their first time losing consecutive series at Comerica Park since 2015-16.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Earlier today, the Rays recalled LHP **Ian Seymour** from Triple-A Durham and optioned RHP **Paul Gervase** to Durham...this marks Seymour's second stint with the Rays, joining June 8-10...the 26-year-old has gone 4-0 with a 1.80 ERA (25.0IP, 5ER) over four starts since returning to the Bulls.

SIMPLE CHAN—Chandler Simpson tallied his 15th multi-hit game last night to extend his hitting streak to 11 games, matching the longest streak his career high (also: May 11-26)...the 24-year-old is batting .421 (16-for-38) with 1 2B, 1 3B, 3 RBI and 5 SB during the current streak, which is two games shy of the club rookie record held by **Rocco Baldelli** (13G, March 31-April 16, 2003) and is tied with **KC Bobby Witt Jr.** for the third-longest active streak in the majors behind **WSH Daylen Lile** (13G) and **NY Yankees Cody Bellinger** (12G)...Simpson is the fourth Rays rookie to record multiple hitting streaks of 11 games or more, joining **Delmon Young** (5x, 2006-07), **Randy Arozarena** (2x, 2021) and **Randy Winn** (2x, 1998).

- ★ Simpson has not struck out in his last 45 PA, the longest active streak in the majors and second longest by a rookie in Tampa Bay history behind **Randy Winn's** streak of 59 PA from July 16-Aug. 4, 1998.
- ★ His 24 SB are tied for second in the AL behind teammate **José Caballero** (31SB) despite appearing in only 48 of the Rays 91 games...he is 3 SB shy of the Rays rookie record for a full season, set by **Baldelli** in 2003 (27SB).
- ★ Simpson's 3.95 second home-to-first time is the fastest in the majors...min. 10 competitive runs, it marks the fastest time by any player under Statcast (since 2015).

HARD KNOCK LIFE—Over their last nine games (3-6), Rays hitters have an expected batting average of .274, while their opponents are at .231...they have had a higher xBA than the opposition in four of the six losses...they have 46 hard-hit outs in the last 10 games compared to 42 by opposing hitters...**Junior Caminero** and **Jake Mangum** lead the team with seven hard-hit outs apiece in that span...seven Rays have an xBA higher than their actual batting average during the nine-game stretch, highlighted by **Taylor Walls** (.120 AVG/.198 xBA - 78 pts.), **Josh Lowe** (.273 AVG/.345 xBA - 72 pts.), **Danny Jansen** (.263 AVG/.325 xBA - 62 pts.) and **Jake Mangum** (.273 AVG/.322 xBA - 49 pts.).

20-20 VISION—With 19 doubles and 21 homers, **Junior Caminero** needs one double to become the first player in franchise history to record 20 doubles and 20 homers before the All-Star break...only seven players in the majors have accomplished the feat so far this season, including four AL hitters: **NY Yankees Aaron Judge** (21 2B, 33HR), **DET Riley Greene** (21/22), **DET Spencer Torkelson** (20/20) and **LAA Taylor Ward** (20/20)...since 1901, five have turned the trick at age 22 or younger: **ATL Ozzie Albies** in 2018 (29/20), **WSH Bryce Harper** in 2015 (21/26), **LAA Mike Trout** in 2014 (26/22), **STL Albert Pujols** in 2002 (25/21) and **CIN Jonny Bench** in 1970 (23/28).

- ★ **Brandon Lowe** is 1 HR shy of reaching 20 HR, which would mark the first time in team history the Rays have had multiple players hit 20 HR before the All-Star break.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR—On Sunday, **Jonathan Aranda** and **Brandon Lowe** were named the Rays representatives at the 2025 MLB All-Star Game in Atlanta...this marks Aranda's first career selection—he is the fourth Rays first baseman to earn an All-Star nod, joining **Yandy Diaz** (2023), **Carlos Peña** (2009) and **Fred McGriff** (1999)...Lowe is headed to the Midsummer Classic for the second time, joining 2019...he is the only second baseman in franchise history to make the All-Star Game and is the eighth Ray to earn multiple selections, joining **Carl Crawford** (4), **David Price** (4), **Evan Longoria** (3), **Chris Archer** (2), **Scott Kazmir** (2), **Shane Bieber** (2) and **Ben Zobrist** (2)...Crawford, Longoria, Zobrist and Lowe are the only position players in that group...Lowe is one of seven active second basemen (min. 50% of games at 2B) with multiple career All-Star nods, joining **HOU Jose Altuve** (9), **ATL Ozzie Albies** (3), **NY Yankees DJ LeMahieu** (3), **AZ Ketel Marte** (3), **TEX Marcus Semien** (3) and **SD Jake Cronenworth** (2).

PLAYING UP...AND PLAYING DOWN—The Rays are 24-18 against teams that currently have a .500 or better record, tied with the Giants for third in the majors behind the Astros (28-19) and Tigers (23-17)...they are undefeated in their last seven sets against teams that entered at .500 or better, going 6-0-1, and are 9-2-1 in their last 12 since losing each of their first four to open the season...meanwhile, their 25-24 mark against sub-.500 teams is 24th in the majors and they have dropped three straight series against teams that entered below the mark (1-4-1 in last six)...on the season, they are 9-6-1 against teams that were .500 or better at the start of the series and 6-5-1 against those with a losing record.

TIGER TOWN—The Rays and Tigers meet for the second time this season after the Rays took two of three games from June 20-22 at Steinbrenner Field in a series that featured a combined 45 runs (TB - 25, DET - 20), Tampa Bay's second most in any series this year behind June 26-28 at BAL (50)...the clubs will complete their six-game season series over a span of 20 days from June 20-July 9...last season, the Rays dropped five of six matchups, their first season series loss to the Tigers since 2021 (4-3)...they have won five of the last seven season sets between the clubs dating back to 2017, going 29-20 in that span...the Rays are 5-2-0 in their last seven series against the Tigers and 8-3-1 in their last 12...they were swept at Comerica Park last season from Sept. 24-26, 2024, but have won two of their last three series here...the Rays are 9-14-1 in this venue since its gates opened in 2000.

- ★ **Matt Thaiss** is batting .351 (13-for-37) with 2 HR and 12 RBI in 15 games against the Tigers, his highest average (min. 15AB) and most RBI vs. any opponent in his career.
- ★ **Yandy Diaz** is 8-for-18 (.444) in four games against the Tigers this season and is batting .395 (15-for-38) with 2 2B, 3 HR, 5 RBI and a 1.109 OPS over his last nine games vs. Detroit dating back to Aug. 6, 2023.

REHAB UPDATES—LHP **Shane Bieber** (left triceps nerve-related issue) threw a scoreless inning for the FCL Rays in his first rehab appearance earlier today, retiring three of four batters faced with a walk and a strikeout...RHP **Alex Faedo** (right shoulder inflammation) has thrown five scoreless innings over three appearances during his rehab assignment with Triple-A Durham, holding opponents to a 2-for-16 (.125) clip.

TONIGHT'S START—Ryan Pepiot (PEP-ee-oh) gets the ball for his team-leading 19th start of the season and seventh on the road...marks the 55th start (62G) of his career and 23rd away from home (26G)...marks his fifth career appearance/four start opposite the Tigers...has three wins in his last four starts...has a 2.54 ERA (46.0IP, 13ER) and 0.96 WHIP in his last eight outings...the Rays have won three of his last four starts, backing him with 26 runs of support (11.32 RSA)...acquired from the Dodgers along with **OF Jonny DeLuca** for **RHP Tyler Glasnow**, **OF Manuel Margot** and cash considerations, Dec. 16, 2023.

LAST TIME OUT—He bounced back from the shortest start of his career by logging his 18th quality start of the campaign in a 7-5 win over the Athletics on July 2 at Steinbrenner Field (W, 6.0IP, 4H, 2ER, 3BB, 9SO, 2HR)...allowed solo homers in the 1st (**Brent Rooker**) and 2nd (**Max Schuemann**) innings...after a wall following Schuemann's blast, he set down seven straight as part of a stretch of 13 of 15 batters retired to conclude the outing...departed with the Rays trailing, 2-1, but picked up his sixth win following a five-run rally in the bottom half of the 6th.

✦ He held Athletics hitters to 1-for-7 in at-bats ending with his cutter...opponents are 1-for-25 (.048) with 8 SO against the pitch across his last eight starts.

MOTOR CITY MATCHUP—Pepiot has made four career appearances/three starts opposite the Tigers, going 1-1 while allowing only five runs across 22.0 IP (2.05 ERA) and holding Detroit hitters to a .177/.278/.304 (14-for-79) line...he started against them on June 21 at Steinbrenner Field, earning his fifth win after tossing five innings of one-run ball...he has recorded five innings or more with two runs or fewer allowed in each of his four career appearances against the Tigers, tied for the fourth-longest streak in MLB history behind **Matt Shoemaker** (8GS, 2014-21), **Mike Mussina** (6GS, 1991-93) and **Carl Pavano** (5GS, 2009).

✦ Pepiot is 2-2 with a 2.98 ERA (42.1IP, 14ER) over nine career appearances/seven starts against AL Central opponents...his start against the Tigers earlier this season was his first against the division in 2025.

UNFRIENDLY CONFINES—The Rays have lost each of Pepiot's last five road starts after winning his first on April 26 at SD (4-1)...he is 0-3 with a 4.44 ERA (24.1IP, 12ER) during the streak, which ties **Zack Littell** (March 29-April 22) for the longest in a Rays pitcher's starts this season...before receiving six runs of support in a 22-8 loss to the Orioles in his last road outing on June 27, he had received a total of three runs of support in his first five outings away from home (1.88 runs of support per 9.0 IP).

PEP RALLY—Since allowing a career-high-tying six runs on April 15 vs. BOS, Pepiot has permitted four runs or fewer in 14 straight starts, going 5-4 with a 2.91 ERA (80.1IP, 26ER), 1.03 WHIP and .205 (59-for-283) clip...he has allowed three runs or fewer in 13 of those 14 outings and two runs or fewer in nine of them...min. 75.0 IP, he ranks among AL leaders over that span (since April 20) in opp. average (7th), opp. on-base pct. (9th), WHIP (9th), opp. OPS (11th, .649) and ERA (11th).

✦ He has allowed 3 ER or fewer in 30 of his last 32 starts dating back to June 26, 2024...his 3.04 ERA (166.0IP, 56ER) in that span is sixth in the AL (min. 150.0IP).

STRIKEOUT STUFF—He has collected 45 SO (12.53 SO/9.0IP) while generating a 31.3 pct. whiff rate in six starts since the calendar flipped to June...through the end of May, he had 56 SO (7.20 SO/9.0IP) with a 22.4 pct. ...on the season, Pepiot's 209 whiffs lead the Rays staff and rank 15th in the AL.

FEELING THE LOVE—He has been backed with six runs of support (or more) in a career-high four straight starts, recording an 11.32 run support average in that span...the Rays have scored 29 total runs during the streak, good for 7.3 runs per game...entering this stretch, they provided him with more than four runs of support in only two of his first 40 starts with the Rays since joining the club ahead of the 2024 campaign...in his career, the Rays are 13-3 when providing Pepiot with three runs of support or more (6-2 in 2025) compared to 8-20 with two runs or fewer (2-8 in 2025).

THINK FAST—Across his last eight starts, opponents are 13-for-70 (.186) with 26 SO and a 28.7 pct. whiff rate against Pepiot's four-seam fastball...through his first 10 starts, those marks stood at .321 (26-for-81), 22 SO and 21.7 pct. ...since he joined the Rays ahead of the 2024 season, opponents are hitting .208 (76-for-365) in at-bats ending with his four-seam fastball, the seventh-lowest mark on any AL pitcher's four-seamer over that timeframe (min. 300AB).

REVERSE REVERSE—Pepiot has limited left-handed hitters to a .173 (29-for-168) average, the fourth-lowest mark among qualified right-handers behind **PHI Zack Wheeler** (.157), **CLE Gavin Williams** (.157) and **HOU Hunter Brown** (.164)...lefties are 12-for-78 (.154) with 33 SO against him over his last eight starts.

✦ RHH are batting .272 (56-for-206) against Pepiot, but this includes an 18-for-84 (.214) clip across his last eight starts (.321 in first 10GS).

TOP HEAVY—The first three spots in opposing lineups are batting .285/.338/.535 (40-for-144) against Pepiot, but 4-9 hitters have produced a .191/.267/.348 (44-for-230) line...this includes a .125 (5-for-40) average against cleanup hitters, tied with **MIN Joe Ryan** for third lowest among qualified pitchers behind **NYM David Peterson** (.119) and **DET Tarik Skubal** (.120)

QUALITY IN QUANTITY—From May 8-June 5, Pepiot threw six straight quality starts, the longest single-season streak by a Rays pitcher since **Shane McLanahan's** club-record 13-start run from May 11-July 26, 2022...he became the 19th Rays pitcher (28x) to record six consecutive quality starts within a calendar year, and he joined McLanahan as the club's only pitchers to do so over the last six seasons since 2020.

✦ His 11 quality starts are second behind **Zack Littell** (12) for the club lead and are tied for seventh most among AL pitchers.
