STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a nine-game, 10-day homestand against the Guardians (3-0), Rangers (2-1), and White Sox (0-1, two to play) today at Tropicana Field...have won eight of their last 11 games in the wake of a season-high five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...are currently 8-7 on a stretch of 20 games in 20 days to begin the second half (July 17-Aug. 5)...lead the AL with a 64-45 record, fourth in the majors...have won three straight series for the second time this season (also: 8 straight from April 24-May 20) and are 7-2-2 in their last 11 sets (June 19-pres)...have spent 76 days leading the AL East, 32 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 35 consecutive days in first (June 27-pres), matching May 9-June 12 for their longest stay atop the division this season...the 76 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (123), Braves (121), Guardians (95), and Brewers (91)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 75 of those days, already fourth most in team history behind 2023 (109), 2008 (106), and 2021 (95), per Stats Perform...have held a lead between 1.5-3.5 games over the second-place Yankees at the conclusion of each day since the All-Star break (currently 2.5)...entered August in first place for the third time (excl. 2020), joining 2021 (63-42) and 2010 (64-39).
* The Rays yielded 4 HR (or more) for the fourth time this season in last night's 6-1, series-opening setback...it was their seventh loss in which every run they permitted came via the long ball and second at home, joining July 6 vs. NYY (5-1)...they allowed six runs or more, with every run coming on homers, for the first time since Aug. 20, 2025 vs. NYY (6R).
* The Rays finished July with a record of 15-12 (.556), 11th in the majors...it marked the fifth-best winning pct. during the month in franchise history, best since going 16-8 (.667) in 2021...they went 7-9 over their first 16 July games (July 1-19) and 8-3 over their last 11 (July 20-31).
* The pitching staff's .209 (180-for-862) opp. average in July paced the majors and was the lowest mark during the month in franchise history...they also led the majors in opp. OBP (.268), WHIP (1.02), hits allowed per 9.0 IP (6.86), and shutouts (5), while ranking highly in opp. OPS (2nd, .640), walks per 9.0 IP (2nd, 2.33), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (2nd, 3.72).
* The Rays are an MLB-best 40-17 at home (14-5 in last 19G)...the 40 home victories tied for sixth most in AL history before the calendar flips to August...since 1979, the only AL clubs to reach that mark are this year's Rays, the 2022 Yankees (40-13), and the 2008 Rays (40-16).
* Over half (9) of the Rays' 17 hits across the last three games have gone for extra bases (4 2B, 5HR)...they have tallied an extra-base hit in a season-high 21 consecutive games (July 7-pres.), their longest streak since June 14-July 9, 2024 (22G)...their 67 XBH during the streak are tied with the Rangers for the most among AL clubs.
* The extra-base hit streak includes an active stretch of 13 straight games with a double for the first time since July 30-Aug. 18, 2024 (13G), with their last longer single-season streak being a 14-game run to conclude the 2023 season (Sept. 15-Oct. 1).
* The Rays need to win the next two games to avoid their second series loss in their last 16 sets at home (April 24-pres.), which would join June 1-3 vs. DET (0-3)...they are 12-1-2 at home over that span, including a season-high eight consecutive home sets (6-0-2) without a series loss, their longest streak since May 9-June 22, 2025 (7-0-1) at Steinbrenner Field.

LA MAXIMA—Junior Caminero snapped a season-high 12-game drought without a long ball with his 30th home run of the campaign last night, a 453-foot shot off the D-ring catwalk in center field during the 4th inning...he became the fourth player in Rays history with multiple 30-HR seasons, joining **Evan Longoria** (4), **Carlos Peña** (3), and **Brandon Lowe** (2)...he also joined Peña (3 straight, 2007-09) as the only Rays to reach the mark in back-to-back seasons and **Jose Canseco** (31HR, 1999) as the only Rays to tally 30 HR before August...Caminero is 12th player in the modern era with multiple 30-HR campaigns before his age-23 season (age as of June 30), joining LAA **Mike Trout** (2012, 2014), FLA **Giancarlo Stanton** (2011-12), FLA **Miguel Cabrera** (2004-05), STL **Albert Pujols** (2001-02), SEA **Alex Rodriguez** (1996, 1998), OAK **Jose Canseco** (1986-87), ATL **Bob Horner** (1978-80), CIN **Frank Robinson** (1956, 1958), MLN **Eddie Mathews** (1953-54), BOS **Ted Williams** (1939, 1941), and PHA **Jimmie Foxx** (1929-30).
* His home run last night was his MLB-leading 11th on a pitch outside the strike zone, with COL **Hunter Goodman** (7) being the next closest player...Caminero is the ninth player to record 11 such home runs or more in a season during the pitch-tracking era (since 2008), first since WSH **Ryan Zimmerman** and LAA **Justin Upton** both had 12 in 2017...Cabrera holds the record with 13 during 2012 with the Tigers...only six of Caminero's 45 HR last season came on out-of-zone offerings.
* Caminero has launched three home runs that traveled 450 feet or farther, tied with PHI **Kyle Schwarber** for the most in the majors and tied with Avisaíl **García** (2019) for second most by a Ray within a season under Statcast (2015) behind **Mike Zunino** (4) in 2021.
* He now has 75 HR between his age-21 and age-22 seasons (2025-26; age as of June 30), tied with NYY **Joe DiMaggio** for second most in the modern era (since 1900) behind Mathews' (87)...Caminero would need 13 HR over the Rays' final 53 games to tie Mathews' mark.
* He is pacing for 44 HR—if he were to reach that mark, he would become the first player in team history with multiple 40-HR seasons and join Mathews (1953-54) as the only players in the modern era with multiple such seasons before their age-23 campaign.
* Caminero is the only player to appear in all of the Rays' 109 games to this point...he could join **Evan Longoria** (2014), **Delmon Young** (2007), and **Aubrey Huff** (2003) as the only Rays to appear in each of the club's games in a season.

LET HIM COOK—Last night, RHP **Alex Cook** made his MLB debut, working a pair of scoreless frames in the 7th and 8th innings...he became the third player to make his major league debut for the Rays this year, joining RHP **Chase Solesky** (May 18 vs. BAL) and RHP **Trevor Martin** (April 20 vs. CIN), and the 200th in franchise history, according to Baseball-Reference...Cook became the 21st Ray to work multiple scoreless frames in his big-league debut, first since **Paul Gervase** on June 21, 2025 vs. DET at Steinbrenner Field and first at Tropicana Field since **Braden Bristo** (3.0IP) on April 13, 2023 vs. BOS.
* The Rays' three major league debuts are tied with the Braves and Nationals for third fewest in the majors—only the Dodgers and Royals (both 2) have fewer...it would mark the Rays' fewest debuts in a non-shortened campaign since 2012 (2).

TO BE THE BEST—Paired with last series vs. Texas, this marks the Rays' second consecutive matchup against a team that entered the set atop its division, the club's first time facing back-to-back division leaders this season...the Rays have split their six series against first-place teams in 2026 (3-3-0)...they faced four division-leading clubs in April and, prior to last series, had faced only one since (June 15-17 at LAD)...this marks the Rays' season-high third straight set against an opponent with a winning record—dating back to the aforementioned Dodgers series and including the current series, eight of the Rays' last 13 sets have come vs. opponents with a .500 record or better entering the opener.
* The Rays are 35-24 (.593) against clubs that currently hold a .500 record or better, second in the AL to the Astros (31-19/.620) and fifth in the majors...they are 5-0-1 in their last six series against clubs that held a .500 or better record entering the series (June 19-pres.) and 7-4-1 overall.

LIVE BY THE LONG BALL—The Rays are an MLB-best 31-1 when out-homering their opponent, 18-10 when home runs are even, and 15-34 when being out-homered...per Stats Perform, the Rays are the seventh team in the modern era (since 1900) to win 31 of the first 32 games of a season in which they out-homered their opponent, first since the 2022 Yankees (31-1)...only the 2010 Padres (32-0) have won all 32 of those games...the Rays .969 winning pct. when out-homering opponents is on pace to be the second best in the modern era, trailing the undefeated 1903 New York Highlanders (16-0), and the best by any team with at least 30 such games, outpacing the 1994 Montreal Expos (34-2/.947)...the Rays have won 18 consecutive games when out-homering the opposition since their lone loss on May 25 vs. BAL (13 inn.), dropping 22 of the 26 contests they were out-homered during that span, including nine straight losses (July 5-pres)...on the season, they have not lost a nine-inning game in which they tallied more home runs than their opponent (29-0)...after going without a long ball in five of six games from July 22-28, the Rays have plated six of their seven runs over the last three games via 4 HR.
* They are 26-5 in multi-homer games, including five straight wins (July 20-pres.), and 17-1 when recording multiple long balls at Tropicana Field, with the only loss coming on June 1 vs. DET (10-9).
* Over their last 32 games since June 25, the Rays pace the AL in multi-homer efforts (16) and are tied for the league lead in home runs (46, also: DET/HOU), trailing only the Nationals (56HR, 18G) in both categories across all of MLB...they entered that span with the majors' fewest long balls (63) and were tied for the fewest multi-homer games (15, also: BOS & CLE) through their first 77 contests (Opening Day-June 24).

THE BAK3 SHOW—On Thur. vs. TEX, **Bryan Baker** joined **CLE Cade Smith** (30) as the majors' only hurlers to reach the 30-save mark...he tied **Alex Colomé** (2017) and **Fernando Rodney** (2012) for the most saves before the calendar flips to August in franchise history...it marked his 19th consecutive successful save opportunity, tied for the third-longest streak in team history (see table on the right) and the majors' third-longest active streak behind SD **Mason Miller** (28) and TOR **Louis Varland** (24)...Baker has earned saves in each of the Rays' last four victories and five of their last six.

GOOD, BETTER, BEST—The Rays and White Sox continue a six-game season series today after the Rays swept a three-game series on the South Side from April 14-16, which was their second of an MLB-leading 10 sweeps on the year...with a win tonight, the Rays would clinch their first season series over the Sox since 2023 (6-1) and just their second since 2021 (currently 1-3-1)...they lost four of their six matchups with Chicago in 2025...the Rays have won eight of their last nine games against clubs from the AL Central dating back to June 24 vs. KC and are an AL-best 18-8 against the division this season.
* In his last 31 games vs. the White Sox since 2021, **Yandy Díaz** is batting .321/.439/.523 (35-for-109) with 7 2B, 5 HR, 14 RBI, 21 BB, and 23 SO.

TODAY'S START—**Drew Rasmussen** will toe the rubber today for his 21st start of the campaign and 151st career appearance (102nd start)...has made the ninth-most starts in franchise history (101GS), trailing seventh-ranked **Jeremy Hellickson** and **Blake Snell** (108GS)...ranks highly among AL arms (min. 100.0IP) in opp. on-base pct. (2nd, .251), **strikeout-to-walk ratio** (2nd, 5.89), **walks per 9.0 innings** (2nd, 1.54), **WHIP** (2nd, 0.93), **opp. AVG** (3rd, .206), **opp. OPS** (3rd, .580), and **opp. SLG** (5th, .329).

- With a win today, Rasmussen would improve to 3-0 following the All-Star break, tying for the MLB lead in second-half wins (3 pitchers with 3 wins entering play today)...would be the first time in his career he has earned a win in his first three starts after the break.
- His .714 (15-6) winning percentage after the All-Star break as a Ray is the second highest in franchise history (min. 30GS), behind **Blake Snell** (.741/20-7).
- He is limiting right-handed batters to a .175 (28-for-160) clip this season, the second-best mark among MLB arms (min. 100BF), trailing **ATH J.T. Ginn** (.168).
- Since 2021, his 2.85 ERA (556.2IP, 176ER) ranks fourth best among all major league pitchers (min 500.0IP) behind **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (2.68), **ATL Chris Sale** (2.77), and **MIL Brandon Woodruff** (2.79).
- In starts following a team loss, Rasmussen boasts the lowest **WHIP** (0.86) among AL starters (min. 25.0IP) and the ninth-lowest **ERA** (2.57).
- Min. 200.0 innings in day games, Rasmussen's 2.14 ERA (214.2IP, 51ER) as a Ray is the lowest clip in franchise history...under the same parameters, his career 2.33 ERA (223.2IP, 58ER) is the third-lowest mark in the live-ball era (since 1920), trailing **Jacob deGrom** (2.06ERA, 2016-pres.) and **Eddie Watt** (2.11ERA, 1966-75).

LAST TIME OUT—Rasmussen earned his ninth win of the season after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing only one hit, on July 26 vs. CLE (W, 7.0IP, H, OR, BB, 9SO)...despite allowing a leadoff double in the 1st inning, he did not surrender a hit across the rest of the outing, retiring 22 of 24 BF...handed the ball over to the bullpen, which worked a pair of hitless frames to conclude the game.

- Marked his fourth career start of 7.0 innings with one or zero hits allowed (last: June 5, 2026 at MIA)...it was also his seventh career start of 7.0 scoreless innings or more and fourth in 2026 (last: June 10 vs. BOS).
- Was his 14th outing allowing one or zero extra-base hits this season, third most among AL starters behind **LAA José Soriano** (16) and **TOR Dylan Cease** (15).
- It marked the second time in team history the Rays have yielded a leadoff hit as the only hit allowed in a contest (also: May 2, 2003 at DET).
- Fourteen of his 20 starts have been 5.0 innings or more with 2 ER or fewer, tied for the fifth-most such starts among AL pitchers this year.
- Generated 18 whiffs, his second most in a start this year behind 20 whiffs on June 10 vs. BOS.

AND YOU SAY CHI CITY—Across four career appearances (all starts) opposite the White Sox, Rasmussen is 0-1 with a 3.43 ERA (21.0IP, 8ER), 1.05 WHIP, and .260 (20-for-77) opp. average...made his last start against the White Sox on July 22, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field, allowing two runs across 4.0 innings (4.0IP, 3H, 2ER, BB, 5SO).

- He is 8-5 with a 2.86 ERA (113.1IP, 36ER) over 30 career appearances (21 starts) vs. AL Central foes, including 7-5 with a 2.38 ERA (102.0IP, 27ER) in the 21 starts.
- Made his lone start against the club at Tropicana Field on June 4, 2022 (1,519 days ago), posting 7.0 scoreless innings (7.0IP, 3H, OR, BB, 2SO).

NO PLACE LIKE DOME—The right-hander is making his 11th start at home this season...is 6-3 with a 3.07 ERA (55.2IP, 19ER) and more than five times as many SO (58) than BB (11) in 10 starts at the Trop this year...Rasmussen has logged a career 2.76 ERA (185.2IP, 57ER) at Tropicana Field, the second-lowest ERA in the venue's history (min. 150.0IP) behind **Blake Snell** (2.70).

- With a win today, the Rays would become the only team in the majors with three starting pitchers owning seven home wins or more: **Nick Martinez** (7-2), **McClanahan** (7-1), and Rasmussen...no other team has more than one.
- Since 2021, Rasmussen's 18 career home wins with the Rays are second most behind **McClanahan's** 28 wins...boasts a .581 (18-13) winning pct. at home with Tampa Bay.
- Rasmussen's 3.05 ERA (247.2IP, 84ER) at venues with a dome or retractable roof since the start of 2022 is the fourth-lowest clip in the majors (min. 225.0IP), trailing **TB Shane McClanahan** (2.71), **DET Framber Valdez** (2.99), and **SEA Bryan Woo** (3.04).

A CUT ABOVE—Rasmussen's cutter is his most used pitched this season (30.5%), generating a team-high 25.3 pct. whiff rate on the pitch...his 526 cutters this year are the second most among AL pitchers behind **NY Y Cam Schlichtler** (559).

- Min. 300 pitches on the cutter, he owns the fifth-best whiff rate among AL pitchers this year behind **MIN Taj Bradley** (37.7%), **CLE Tanner Bibee** (33.2%), **TEX Nathan Eovaldi** (27.0%), and **DET Kenley Jansen** (26.5%).

LIMIT THE FREE PASSES—Rasmussen's 4.3 pct. walk rate is the eighth-lowest clip among qualified major league pitchers, behind **BOS Garrett Whitlock** (3.9%)...he has yielded two walks or fewer in 22 straight starts dating back to Sept. 19, 2025 vs. BOS.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP GRIFFIN JAX [6-8, 3.74]

LAST TIME OUT—Served as a bulk reliever behind **Casey Legumina**, tossing 4.2 scoreless innings on July 29 vs. TEX (W, 4.2IP, 2H, OR, BB, 4SO)...marked his second-longest shutout performance this season behind 6.2 hitless innings on June 25 vs. KC...has allowed three runs or fewer in six of seven starts this year.

vs. WHITE SOX—In three career appearances (one starts) against the White Sox, he is 0-1 with a 5.63 ERA (8.0IP, 5ER), 1.50 WHIP, and .258 (8-for-31) opp. AVG...is 3-2 with a 2.70 ERA (33.1IP, 10ER) and 38 strikeouts against AL Central competition in his career (10G/3GS).
