**RAY REPORT**—The Rays continue a nine-game, 11-day, season-opening road trip through St. Louis (1-2), Milwaukee (1-1, one to play), and Minnesota (three to play) today at American Family Field...marks the longest road trip to begin a season in club history...are tied for third in the AL East, 2.0 GB the Blue Jays and Yankees (both 4-1)...are opening with back-to-back Interleague series for the second time, joining 2025 (COL, PIT)...are opening with a road trip for the eighth time, first since 2021, and second time in the last 17 seasons (2010-26)...will return to Tropicana Field on April 6 vs. CHC, their first game at the ballpark in 561 days (Sept. 22, 2024 vs. TOR).

- ✦ The Rays hit a pair of solo homers for the second straight game, but went hitless with RISP (0-for-5) and left seven runners on base in last night's 6-2 loss...the Rays rank fourth in the AL with 43 LOB, their most through five games since 2003 (49).
- ✦ Making his first major league start in 972 days, **Shane McClanahan** (4.2IP, 2H, 3R-2ER, 3BB, 4SO) took the loss despite holding the Brewers hitless through four innings.
- ✦ Tampa Bay batters have 12 XBH in their last three games after recording 1 XBH in their first two...they are tied with Houston for the MLB lead in total hits (55), third in franchise history through five games behind the 1998 (68) and 2000 (56) teams.
- ✦ The Rays six errors are third most in the majors behind the Angels and Nationals (both 7)...they have committed an error in each of their first five games for the first time in club history.
- ✦ The Rays are 5-5 on April Fools' Day, including 1-1 on the road...they are 4-1 in their last five April 1 games dating back to 2019 after a 7-0 win last year vs. PIT at Steinbrenner Field.

#### WHAT'S AT STAKE

- ✦ Earn their second road series win over the Brewers, joining their first visit to American Family Field (then Miller Park) from June 20-22, 2011.
- ✦ After taking two of three games from May 9-11, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field, record consecutive series wins over the Brewers for the second time...the Rays won each of the first three sets between the clubs (2014, 2011, 2005).
- ✦ Avoid losing their first two series of a season for the fifth time...they dropped their first two sets of the 2018, 2011, 2003, and 2001 campaigns.
- ✦ Pick up their first rubber-game win on the road since Aug. 13, 2025 at ATH (0-4 in last four).
- ✦ Improve to .500 (or better) through six games for the fifth straight year since 2022 and for the ninth time in 12 seasons under **Kevin Cash** (since 2015).

**PLAYING THE HITS**—The Rays lead the majors in hits (55, T1st with HOU), batting average (.293), singles (42), infield hits (11), and bunt hits (2, T1st with CHC and CLE) while ranking third in contact rate (77.9%) and fifth in on-base pct. (.348)...they are batting an MLB-best .338 (22-for-65) with two outs, with their 22 two-out hits ranking second to the Astros (23), who have played one more game.

- ✦ Among AL clubs, only the Astros (6.5) and Rangers (5.8) are averaging more runs than the Rays (5.6).

**THAT'S HIS FORTE(S)**—**Nick Fortes** is the second catcher in franchise history to reach base safely in each of the Rays first five games (games at catcher only), joining **Toby Hall** (2002) and **John Flaherty** (1999)...no Tampa Bay backstop has reached in each of the club's first six games...Fortes is also the first Rays catcher to tally an RBI in four of the team's first five contests...his 4 RBI are tied for third among AL backstops behind **ATH Shea Langeliers** (7) and **DET Dillon Dingler** (5)...he has hit safely in nine consecutive starts dating back to Sept 17, 2025 (12-for-34/.353), tied for the longest streak of his career (also: June 7-26, 2025).

- ✦ Between Fortes (6-for-16) and **Hunter Feduccia** (1-for-4), Rays catchers lead the majors in on-base pct. (.474) and hits (T1st with BOS).
- ✦ All six of Fortes' hits have come off fastballs (6-for-12)...he has whiffed on only two of his 25 swings against heaters (92.0% contact rate)...his 88.0 pct. contact rate overall leads MLB catchers.
- ✦ He has gone 4-for-6 on ABS challenges from behind the plate, tying **KC Salvador Perez** and **CWS Edgar Quero** for the second-most successful challenges among catchers to **LAD Will Smith** (5).

**CHAN THE MAN**—**Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in each of the Rays first five games, going 8-for-18 (.444)...he joins **Junior Caminero** (5G, 2025), **Randy Arozarena** (10G, 2023), and **Yandy Diaz** (6G, 2019) as the only Rays over the last 12 seasons (2015-26) to accomplish the feat...of his eight hits, seven have come off fastballs (7-for-11/.636, 10.5 pct. whiff rate vs. FB)...his three multi-hit efforts are tied with Diaz for the club lead and are tied for fourth in the majors...in his last 19 games dating back to Sept. 11, 2025, Simpson is batting .382 (29-for-76) with 5 XBH, 4 RBI, 3 BB, 7 SB, and an .866 OPS...min. 75 AB, it marks the best average in the majors over that span, and the only player with more hits is **TOR George Springer** (30).

- ✦ His 2-for-3 performance yesterday improved his career average to .301 through 114 major league games, second in franchise history over such a span (min. 300AB) to **Jorge Cantú** (.304, 2004-05).
- ✦ Min. 250 AB, his career .312 (81-for-260) average on the road is second among active players, trailing **SF Luis Arraez** (.312/515-for-1,651) by percentage points.

**MR. RELIABLE**—**Yandy Diaz**'s 11 hits are the most in the majors and are tied for second in franchise history through the Rays first five games, trailing **Quinton McCracken** (12) in 1998...McCracken also holds the club record through six games (14H)...Diaz has reached base safely 12 times, tied for fifth in the AL and tied for third in Rays history through five team games behind **Akinori Iwamura** in 2007 and **Fred McGriff** in 1998 (both 13 TOB)...the record through six games is 15, achieved by four players, most recently **Evan Longoria** and **Carlos Peña** in 2012.

- ✦ His 172 doubles with Tampa Bay are tied for fifth in franchise history (see table to the right)...with 893 hits as a Ray, he is 17 hits shy of tying **B.J. Upton** (910) for fourth on the club's all-time list.

**JONNY ROCKETS**—**Jonny DeLuca** has hit safely and recorded an RBI in all three of his starts, going 5-for-12 (.417) with 1 2B, 1 HR, and 4 RBI in those games...he is looking to become the fifth Ray to tally an RBI in each of his first four starts...he would join **Jose Siri** (5G, 2023), **Manuel Margot** (4G, 2021), **Evan Longoria** (4G, 2009), and **Jorge Cantú** (4G, 2005)...in five total games, DeLuca has already recorded the three hardest hits of his career (109.0-mph homer, two 108.1-mph singles).

**ALL ARANDA BASES**—**Jonathan Aranda**'s 1st-inning solo homer last night extended his career-best on-base streak to 19 games (July 19, 2025-pres.), the third-longest active streak in the majors (see table to the right)...he is slashing .314/.405/.571 (22-for-70) with 3 2B, 5 HR, 15 RBI, 12 BB, and a .976 OPS since the streak began...Aranda has collected an RBI in nine of his last 11 games...today, he looks to become the first Ray to reach safely in 20 consecutive games since **Brandon Lowe** (23G) from June 9-July 5, 2025.

- ✦ Of Aranda's 16 balls in play, 10 have been hard hit (95 mph EV or higher), tied for third most in the AL (see table to the right).

**CASH CONSIDERATIONS**—**Kevin Cash** has 898 wins in his managerial career, two shy of becoming the fourth active skipper with 900 career victories...he would join **CIN Terry Francona** (2,036), **DET A.J. Hinch** (966), and **LAD Dave Roberts** (947)...Cash would also become the ninth manager in MLB history to reach the mark while managing only one team in his career, joining **LAD Walter Alston**, **LAA Mike Scioscia**, **LAD Tommy Lasorda**, **BAL Earl Weaver**, **MIN Tom Kelly**, **DET Hughie Jennings**, **PIT Danny Murtaugh**, and **STL Red Schoendienst** (Stats Perform).

**ON DECK**—The Rays close their nine-game road trip with a three-game set against the Twins this weekend in Minnesota...they are 4-1-1 in series play vs. the Twins since 2023, but have dropped five of their last seven sets at Target Field after losing two of three games in their last visit from July 4-6, 2025, with both losses coming by one run...overall, 10 of the last 15 meetings between the Rays and Twins have been one-run affairs.

- ✦ The current forecast in Minneapolis calls for a high of 37 degrees with a chance of snow on Saturday...according to Baseball-Reference, the coldest first-pitch temperatures in Rays history are 35 degrees (April 9, 2018 at CWS) and 34 degrees (April 17, 2003 at BOS).

**TODAY'S START**—Drew Rasmussen takes the mound this afternoon against the Brewers for his second start of the 2026 season...marks his 132nd career appearance (83rd start) and 2nd career start opposite his former club...has a four-decision winning streak dating back to June 25, 2025...allowed three runs or fewer in 28 of 31 starts last season and was named an All-Star for the first time in his career...established career highs in 2025 in starts (31), innings pitched (150.0), strikeouts (127), and bWAR (4.5)...ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43).

★ Became the fourth Rays pitcher (5x) to record a sub-3.00 ERA while making 30 starts or more, joining Cy Young winners **Blake Snell** (1.89) in 2018 and **David Price** (2.56) in 2012, **James Shields** (2.82) in 2011 and **Price** (2.72) in 2010.

**LAST TIME OUT**—In his first career Opening Day start on March 26 at STL, he did not receive a decision after allowing 1 ER on 4 H (1HR) with 2 SO over 5.0 IP... allowed two baserunners in the 1st inning after a **Junior Caminero** fielding error and a single by **Alec Burleson**...two more baserunners reached base in the 2nd inning after Caminero's second error and a single before a double-play ball and ground out got him out of the frame...retired nine of his last 10 batters faced after surrendering the long ball to **JJ Wetherholt** in the 3rd inning.

★ Rasmussen has gone 39 straight regular season starts (April 30, 2023–pres.) with four runs or fewer allowed, the longest active streak in the major leagues...it is the second longest in franchise history by a traditional starter behind **Shane Bieber** (44G, April 29, 2021–July 26, 2022)...his 31 starts with four runs or fewer last season tied him for the most in the majors with MIL **Freddy Peralta**, PHI **Cristopher Sánchez**, and PIT **Paul Skenes**.

**HOPTIMIST**—In his lone career start against Milwaukee on May 11, 2025, Rasmussen took the loss after yielding 3 ER on 4 H (2HR) with 1 BB and 3 SO in a 4-2 defeat at Steinbrenner Field.

★ He is 2-2 with a 4.11 ERA (50.1IP, 23ER) in 22 career outings (7GS) vs. NL Central opponents in his career, going 1-1 with a 3.60 ERA (15.0IP, 6ER) with 12 SO across three starts in 2025.

★ In 46 career appearances (20 starts) against NL opponents, Rasmussen is 7-4 with a 3.31 ERA (130.1IP, 48ER) and 131 SO.

**ROAD RAS**—Rasmussen did not take a loss in 13 road starts last season and has gone 19 starts since his last road defeat as a starter on April 14, 2023 at TOR...he was the only pitcher in the majors to make 10 starts or more away from home in 2025 without taking a loss...min. 50.0 IP, his 2.83 road ERA (60.1IP, 19ER) last season ranked 8th in the AL...Rasmussen has an active seven-decision winning streak on the road as a *starter*, tied with **David Price** (May 15–Aug. 16, 2012) for the second longest on the road by a Rays starting pitcher, trailing **Tyler Glasnow's** nine-decision streak from April 5, 2019–May 3, 2021.

**LEADING THE WAY**—Rasmussen paced the Rays rotation and ranked fourth in the AL (min. 150.0IP) with a 2.76 ERA (150.0IP, 46ER) last season, trailing only DET **Tarik Skubal** (2.21), HOU **Hunter Brown** (2.43), and BOS **Garrett Crochet** (2.59)... under the same parameter, he also ranked among AL leaders in WHIP (4th, 1.02), opp. slugging pct. (5th, .340), ground ball rate (5th, 49.0%), opp. OPS (6th, .611), opp. on-base pct. (6th, .271), fewest pitches per IP (6th, 15.4), opp. average (7th, .221), walks per 9.0 IP (8th, 2.22) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (10th, 3.43).

**GOOSE EGGS**—Rasmussen has made 10 scoreless starts of 5.0 IP or more, the most in a single season in franchise history and tied with LAD **Yoshinobu Yamamoto** for third most in the majors behind DET **Tarik Skubal** (12) and PIT **Paul Skenes** (12)...his 21 such career starts are tied with **Blake Snell**, **Scott Kazmir**, and **James Shields** for second most in Rays history behind **Chris Archer** (24).

**RIGHT ON TIME**—Right-handed batters hit .198 (49-for-247) against him, sixth lowest in the AL and the sixth lowest mark in franchise history (min. 200AB)... under the same qualifier, his .551 opp. OPS vs. right-handed hitters was third in the AL, trailing only TEX **Nathan Eovaldi** (.512) and BAL **Trevor Rogers** (.519), and ranked second in club history to **Tyler Glasnow** (.492) in 2023.

**PLEASE TAKE ONE**—Rasmussen recorded an MLB-leading 13 starts of 5.0 IP or more without allowing an extra-base hit, most in a season in Rays history, ahead of **David Price** in his 2012 Cy Young-winning campaign (9)...it marked the most such starts by an AL pitcher over an entire season since CAL **Nolan Ryan** (13GS) in 1977.

★ Rasmussen yielded five hits or fewer in 17 consecutive starts to end the season, the longest single-season streak in franchise history (excluding openers) and the longest season-ending streak by a traditional starter in AL history...only CIN **Tony Cingrani** (18) in 2013 has recorded a longer season-ending streak.

**FROZE HIM**—Rasmussen's 47 called strikeouts in 2025 ranked sixth in the AL, trailing CLE **Tanner Bibee** (58), NYY **Will Warren** (58), BOS **Garrett Crochet** (56), HOU **Hunter Brown** (54), and DET **Jack Flaherty** (51)...in all of MLB, only CIN **Brady Singer** (49), Warren (49), and PHI **Ranger Suárez** (47) had more called strikeouts on fastballs than Rasmussen (44), who tied Crochet (44).

**HEAT CHECK**—Rasmussen threw fastballs (cutter, sinker, four-seamer) 89.6 pct. of the time last season, the highest rate among major league pitchers (min. 1,000 total pitches)...opponents hit .213 (107-for-503) in at-bats ending with his fastballs, third in the AL (min. 300AB) to SEA **Bryan Woo** (.200), and CWS **Shane Smith** (.203)...this includes a .174 (28-for-161) clip against his cutter, second in the majors (min. 100AB), with only LAA **Kenley Jansen** (.163) turning in a better mark...of his 127 total strikeouts, 117 came on fastballs, fourth most in the AL, with BOS **Garrett Crochet** (158), SEA **Bryan Woo** (129), and MIN **Joe Ryan** (128) tallying more...collected 234 whiffs on fastballs, tied with Ryan for fourth most in the majors to Crochet (231), Woo (250) and SEA **Luis Castillo** (245) and the most by a Rays pitcher since **Jake Odorizzi** (257) in 2016.
