RAY REPORT—The Rays begin the second half with a seven-game road trip against the Red Sox (four to play) and the Blue Jays (three to play) today at Fenway Park...are 13-5 (.722) in their last 18 contests (June 24–pres.), tied for the second-best record in the majors over that span with the Cubs (13-5/.722) behind only the Red Sox (14-3/.824)...had a season-high nine-game winning streak from June 24–July 3 (T4th-longest in TB history), tied for the longest by an AL club this season...prior to the streak, went an MLB-best 22-4 from April 22–May 22 and an MLB-worst 9-18 from May 24–June 23...lead the AL with a 56-38 record, third in the majors and the third-best start in team history behind 2023 (59-35) and 2010 (57-37)...today marks the beginning of a stretch of 11 games in 10 days (July 17-26) and 20 games in 20 days (July 17–Aug. 5)...have spent 61 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 19 consecutive days in first...hold a 3.0-game lead in the division.

- ✦ The Rays closed the first half with an 8-2 loss to the Mariners on Sunday...their 56-38 (.596) record at the break is the third best in franchise history behind 2023 (58-35/.624) and 2010 (54-34/.614).
- ✦ **Jonathan Aranda** launched a two-run home run, his 14th of the campaign, in the defeat...he closed the first half with 64 RBI, the third most in franchise history before the Midsummer Classic behind only **José Canseco** (69) in 1999 and **Evan Longoria** (66) in 2009.
- ✦ Aranda has an extra-base hit in three straight games (July 10–pres.), tying the second-longest streak of his career (4x, last: June 26-28, 2025) and one game shy of his career-best four-game streak between June 24-27, 2026.
- ✦ The Rays are a major league-best 19-7 (.731) against left-handed starters this season...the Red Sox have accounted for six of those games, starting a southpaw in each game against the Rays thus far in 2026...game one starter, **Jake Bennett**, is set to become the first Red Sox lefty to start three games or more against the Rays in a single season since **Rich Hill** made four starts in 2022...it is also set to be the first time a team has started southpaws seven times or more against the Rays in a single season since 2021 (TOR, 10 & BOS, 8).
- ✦ Today's doubleheader is the Rays first since Aug. 19, 2023 at LAA (see more in "Doubleday" note below).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Earlier today, the Rays appointed **RHP Mason Englert** as the 27th man for today's doubleheader...this is his fourth stint on the active roster this season (Opening Day–May 9, June 3-13, July 5-6)...the right-hander has appeared in 13 games (two starts) with an 0-2 record, 3.82 ERA (30.2IP, 13ER), 28 strikeouts, and one save.

DOUBLEDAY—The Rays will play their first doubleheader since Aug. 19, 2023 at LAA today after their scheduled contest on May 9 at BOS was postponed...this marks the 41st doubleheader in Rays history, having gone 8-14-18 in the previous twin bills...they went 454 games without playing a doubleheader (Aug. 20, 2023–July 12, 2026), the longest stretch in franchise history, surpassing a streak of 422 straight games from Oct. 1, 2004–July 20, 2007...according to Stats Perform, the 454-game stretch without a twin bill is the 18th-longest streak in major league history...from 2024-25, the Rays and Astros were the only clubs that did not play a doubleheader...Houston recently snapped a 584-game run without one (July 22, 2022–April 28, 2026)...the Rays played three doubleheaders in 2023, their most since 2019 (5), going 4-2 in those contests...they split with the Red Sox (June 3) and Angels (Aug. 19) and swept the Royals (July 15)...Tampa Bay has won 12 of its last 15 doubleheader contests dating back to the night cap on Aug. 8, 2020 vs. NYY.

- ✦ This marks the Rays 10th doubleheader against the Red Sox, surpassing the Orioles and Yankees (both 9) for their most against any opponent...they have gone 1-3-5 in the previous nine, all of which have taken place at Fenway Park...the lone sweep came on May 1, 2014...the most recent twin bill between the clubs took place on June 3, 2023 (split)...the Rays played their second doubleheader in franchise history on Sept. 21, 1998 at BOS (split).
- ✦ The Rays have not been swept in a doubleheader since July 18, 2019 at Yankee Stadium...they have gone 4-0-5 in their last nine twin bills since the sweep.
- ✦ They are 5-10-11 in split doubleheaders compared to 3-4-7 in traditional twin bills...including today, each of their last six doubleheaders have been split dating back to 2022.

GET OUT BALL—The Rays have homered in 14 of their last 17 games (June 25–pres.), tallying multiple long balls in 10 of those contests...their 31 home runs over that span are tied for the most in the majors (also PIT) and are their most in any 17-game span since April 29–May 17, 2023 (33)...they are 21-4 (.840) when they hit multiple home runs this season, the third-best record in the majors behind the Yankees (35-4/.897) and Dodgers (27-5/.844)...they have won 12 of their last 13 contests (June 14–pres.) when registering two long balls or more.

- ✦ Since the power surge began on June 25, 11 of the 13 position players the Rays have used during that span have have homered, with **Junior Caminero** (12), **Cedric Mullins** (5), **Victor Mesa Jr.** (3), **Jonathan Aranda** (2), **Richie Palacios** (2), and **Ryan Vilade** (2) all recording multiple long balls.

STARSTRUCK—The Rays were represented by a franchise-record-tying five All-Stars (**Bryan Baker**, **Junior Caminero**, **Yandy Diaz**, **Nick Martinez**, **Drew Rasmussen**) at the 2026 All-Star Game on Tuesday in Philadelphia, matching the 2009 Rays (**Jason Bartlett**, **Carl Crawford**, **Evan Longoria**, **Carlos Peña**, **Ben Zobrist**)...it was the first time in franchise history the Rays have had three pitchers named All-Stars after having had two hurlers on four previous occasions (2015, 2010-12)...each of the five All-Stars appeared in the game, surpassing the 2010 Rays, who had four players (Crawford, Longoria, **David Price**, **Rafael Soriano**) appear.

- ✦ Caminero started at third base for the AL, becoming the the first third baseman and 14th player in the modern era (since 1900) to start back-to-back All-Star Games in age-22-or-younger seasons (age as of June 30)...since the All-Star Game's inception in 1933, he is the second primary third baseman to receive multiple All-Star nods in age 22-or-younger seasons, joining BAL **Manny Machado** (two), the 11th infielder, and the 34th player overall.
- ✦ Rays arms combined to pitch 2.0 scoreless frames for the AL, with Martinez setting down all three batters he faced with one strikeout, Rasmussen going 0.2 IP with one walk and one strikeout, and Baker getting the final out of the game after giving up a single.

GREAT GREEN JEWEL OF THE COMMONWEALTH—The Rays and Red Sox continue their 13-game season set today with a doubleheader at Fenway Park...the teams were scheduled to meet for a four-game set between May 7-10 in Boston, before the third contest of that series was postponed due to inclement weather and rescheduled for today's twin bill...the Rays are 5-1 against the Red Sox in 2026 after going 3-10 in 2025...they need to win two of their remaining seven games against the Red Sox to clinch their seventh season series victory over the past eight seasons (2019–pres.).

- ✦ In six games against the Red Sox this season, **Nick Fortes** is slashing .579/.619/.737 (11-for-19) with 3 2B, 1 RBI, 5 R, and a 1.356 OPS...min 15 PA, his 1.356 OPS would be the fifth best by a Ray over a single season against the Red Sox and the best since **Kameron Misner** had a 1.361 in 2025...he has a hit in each of his last 12 games against the Red Sox dating back to his time with the Marlins (July 2, 2024–pres.)...it marks the second-longest active streak against Boston in the majors behind CHC **Alex Bregman** (14G, May 17, 2022–pres.), who has not faced the club since 2024.
- ✦ **Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely in 20 straight games (Sept. 28, 2024–pres.) against the Red Sox, it is the third-longest on-base streak against the team in Rays franchise history behind **Akinori Iwamura** (26G, Sept. 22, 2007–May 3, 2009) and **Carlos Peña** (Sept. 11, 2007–Sept. 17, 2008)...over that span, Diaz is slashing .373/.449/.560 (28-for-75) with 2 2B, 4 HR, 13 RBI, and a 1.009 OPS...11 of 20 games during the streak have come at Fenway Park.

TODAY'S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber today for his 15th start and 26th appearance of the year, including his seventh start and 15th outing on the road...marks his 15th straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 31st start of his major league career...acquired from the Twins for **RHP Taj Bradley** on July 31, 2025.

- ✦ Jax has not allowed an extra-base hit in six of his starts this year, trailing rotation-mate **Shane McClanahan** (8), LAA **José Soriano** (8), and TOR **Dylan Cease** (7) for the most such starts in the AL.
- ✦ Has fashioned a 2.25 ERA (36.0IP, 9ER) across his last seven starts since June 7, the fifth-lowest mark in the AL (min. 35.0IP) during that span...in 21 appearances (14 starts) since April 5, Jax has a 2.91 ERA (68.0IP, 22ER).
- ✦ Boasts a 2.80 ERA (61.0IP, 19ER) with 61 strikeouts in 14 starts compared to an 8.00 ERA (9.0IP, 8ER) with 10 strikeouts in 11 relief appearances this year.
- ✦ Since the start of 2022, Jax has the seventh-lowest ERA (min. 150.0IP) in the majors against opponents with a sub-.500 winning pct., trailing McClanahan (2.07), LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (2.24), SEA **Logan Gilbert** (2.45), LAD **Clayton Kershaw** (2.56), NYY **Max Fried** (2.59), and DET **Justin Verlander** (2.64).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned the win on July 11 vs. SEA after working 5.0 innings of one-run ball (W, 5.0IP, 4H, ER, 3BB, 3SO)...walked a pair of batters and allowed a single to **Dominic Canzone** in the 1st inning, but struck out **Josh Naylor** and **Luke Raley** to escape a bases-loaded jam...after inducing a GIDP to end the 3rd inning, he retired 6 of his last 7 BF before handing the ball off to the bullpen.

- ✦ Has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his last seven starts, pitching to a 2.25 ERA (36.0IP, 9ER) with 39 strikeouts and a .211 (27-for-128) opp. AVG in that span.
- ✦ Has surrendered one or zero earned runs in nine of his 14 starts.
- ✦ Has tossed a career-high seven consecutive outings of 5.0 IP or more.

NORTHERN ATTITUDE—Jax has appeared in 15 games (two starts) opposite the Red Sox in his career...he holds an 0-1 record with a 6.75 ERA (21.1IP, 16ER) and 25 strikeouts in those outings, and his teams are 10-5 in those contests...in the two starts, both of which have come at Fenway Park, he is 0-1 with an 11.42 ERA (8.2IP, 2ER) and seven strikeouts...made his most recent start against the Red Sox earlier this year on May 5 at BOS, taking a no decision after allowing two earned runs on four hits across 4.0 innings (4.0IP, 4H, 3R-2ER, BB, 3SO) in an 8-4 Rays victory.

- ✦ Jax has a 3-8 record with a 4.40 ERA (94.0IP, 46ER) across 66 outings (eight starts) against AL East foes in his career...as a starter, he is 0-4 with a 6.11 ERA (35.1IP, 24ER) and 32 strikeouts...his teams are 39-27 lifetime in his appearances against Boston.
- ✦ Will mark his eighth appearance (sixth start) against an AL East club in 2026, pitching to a 2.82 ERA (22.1IP, 7ER) with 26 strikeouts in those outings.

LET'S PLAY TWO—Today will mark the second time Jax has pitched during the first leg of a doubleheader in his career, joining July 19, 2021 at CWS [G1] (w/ MIN)...in that game, Jax did not factor into the decision after pitching 4.0 innings of one-hit ball, with his lone blemish being a **Tim Anderson** home run in the 3rd inning (4.0IP, H, R, 6SO, HR)...retired 13 of 15 BF.

HIT THE ROAD, JAX—In 15 appearances (six starts) on the road this season, Jax is 2-4 with a 3.24 ERA (33.1IP, 12ER) with 25 strikeouts to 12 walks and a .276 (34-for-123) opp. average...among AL right-handed starters (min. 25.0IP), he 2.00 ERA as a road starter ranks third...the Rays have lost four of his last five starts on the road, but Jax has gone 1-2 with a 1.57 ERA (23.0IP, 4ER) with 18 SO in those outings...has worked a 4.34 ERA (45.2IP, 22ER) over 30 career appearances (five starts) against AL East opponents on the road.

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for **Ian Seymour** on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frame...for his career, he is 7-9 with a 4.49 ERA (132.1IP, 66ER) in 30 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

- ✦ Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

HOW SWEEP IT IS—Jax throws his sweeper 25.8 pct. of the time, the seventh-highest mark among AL pitchers (min. 750 pitches)...despite this, his usage rate has dropped 18.2 pct. on the pitch from 2025 (44.0 pct.)...in 2026, he has limited opponents to a .140 (7-for-50) average on the pitch, fourth lowest in the AL (min. 50AB) behind LAA **Ryan Zeferjahn** (.104), BOS **Sonny Gray** (.114), and SEA **Emerson Hancock** (.137)...under the same parameters, his 42.7 pct. whiff rate on sweepers ranks third in the AL and fifth in the majors.

- ✦ According to Baseball Savant, Red Sox hitters are batting below major league average (.206) on sweepers (.190/39-for-205) this season, the eighth-lowest mark in the majors...Boston has a 33.9 pct. whiff rate on sweepers, sixth highest in MLB.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

- ✦ He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.

GAME 2 STARTER—Mason Englert, who was recalled from Triple-A Durham earlier today as the 27th man for today's doubleheader, is scheduled to take the mound for his third start and 14th appearance of the campaign...marks his fifth career start and 86th career appearance...is in the midst of his fourth stint with the Rays this season, joining Opening Day–May 9, June 3-13, and July 5-6....was acquired from the Detroit Tigers for LHP Drew Sommers on Feb. 12, 2025.

- ✦ He has not allowed a run in 12.0 IP spanning seven career outings vs. BOS, all in relief...has 11 SO in those games, tied for his most against any club in his career (also: CWS, HOU).
- ✦ Is seeking his first career victory after the calendar flips to July...has gone 5-3 over 63 appearances (three starts) in March through June compared to 0-3 in 22 outings (two starts) from July on.....across 12 career appearances (one start) in July, he has logged a 4.91 ERA (22.0IP, 12ER) with 22 strikeouts and a .230 opp. average (20-for-87).

LAST TIME OUT—Englert worked a career-high 5.2 innings, one out shy from recording his first career quality start, in a 2-0 loss on July 5 at HOU (L, 5.2IP, 5H, 2R, BB, 9SO, 2HR)...collected a career-high nine strikeouts, tied for the fourth most by a Rays starter this season...punched out four of his first seven batters faced and did not allow a hit until a **Christian Walker** solo home run to start the 4th inning...allowed just one baserunner through his next seven batters faced before giving up a solo homer to **Isaac Paredes**...handed the ball off to the bullpen with two outs in the 5th inning.

- ✦ Generated a career-high 16 whiffs, including six on his changeup and four on his four-seam fastball...has recorded double-digit whiffs five times in his career, most recently reaching the mark this year on June 3 vs. DET (11).
- ✦ Fired a career-high 101 pitches, the third most by a Rays starter this season, trailing only **Joe Boyle** (April 3 at MIN - 104) and **Drew Rasmussen** (June 16 at LAD - 102).

BACK IN BOSTON—Across seven career appearances against the Red Sox, Englert has not factored into a decision and has not allowed a run through 12.0 innings of work...has issued two walks against 11 strikeouts, limiting the opposition to a .205 clip (9-for-44)...took the mound against Boston in relief earlier this season on May 8 at Fenway Park, tossing 3.1 scoreless innings and giving up just three hits against three strikeouts, marking the longest scoreless appearance of his career at the time.

- ✦ Today marks his first start facing an AL East club, and he is 1-1 with a 5.46 ERA (28.0IP, 17ER) over 20 career appearances against the division...is 4-2 with a 3.27 ERA (99.0IP, 36ER) in 53 career outings against AL opponents.
- ✦ Will mark his fifth career appearance at Fenway Park, which will be one of three ballparks in which he has made five outings or more in (also: Comerica Park - 24 & Steinbrenner Field - 15).
- ✦ Is seeking his first team win against Boston...his clubs are 0-7 in seven career appearances vs. the Red Sox.

AWAY WE GO—Englert is making his 11th road appearance this season...in 44 career appearances on the road, he has gone 4-3 with a 4.83 ERA (76.1IP, 41ER) as opposed to a 1-3 mark with a 4.46 ERA (76.2IP, 38ER) in 41 career home outings...since the beginning of his tenure with the Rays at the start of the 2025 season, the right-hander is 0-1 and has posted a 3.79 ERA (40.1IP, 17ER) with 40 strikeouts across 24 road appearances (one start).

- ✦ Six of his last eight road outings (April 4–pres.) have been scoreless, logging a 1.42 ERA (19.0IP, 3ER) over that span.

ROLE CALL—Despite beginning his minor league career as a starter, Englert has made only four career starts in the majors...in those contests, he has gone 0-2 with a 3.86 ERA (14.0IP, 6ER), four walks, and 14 strikeouts...over 81 career relief appearances, he has posted a 4.73 ERA (139.0IP, 73ER) with 36 walks and 115 strikeouts.

MAJOR LEAGUE RECAP—Englert is in the midst of his fourth major league season...in his first season with the Rays in **2025**, he recorded career bests in ERA (3.83), strikeouts (44), WHIP (1.21), and FIP (3.05), holding opponents to a .251/.299/.345 (43-for-171) clip—all three marks were the lowest of his career...had three stints in the majors after being acquired from the Tigers Feb. 12: Opening Day–May 9, June 10-16, and July 7–season's end...made his final appearance Sept. 3 at SEA and was placed on the 15-day IL Sept. 4 with right shoulder impingement.

- ✦ Finished **2025**, his first season with the Rays, with 11 BB in 44.2 IP, good for a 5.9 pct. walk rate, 10th among AL relievers (min. 30.0IP)...was the only MLB pitcher to throw his changeup 200 times or more without allowing an XBH on the offering.
- ✦ In **2024**, made 12 appearances (1 start) with the Tigers spanning three stints in the big leagues: May 23–June 4, June 5-25, and Aug. 26-29...was on the minor league injured list (right forearm strain) from July 6–Aug. 22...completed a four-game rehab assignment between Rookie-level Lakeland and Class-A West Michigan...designated for assignment Feb. 7, 2025 to accommodate **Jack Flaherty's** addition to the Tigers 40-man roster...traded to the Rays in exchange for **LHP Drew Sommers** Feb. 12.
- ✦ In **2023**, made 31 appearances with Detroit in his first major league season...placed on the 15-day IL on July 23 with left hip tightness...completed a nine-game rehab assignment with Triple-A Toledo from Aug. 13–Sept. 6, but did not return to the majors...allowed one or zero runs in 24 of 31 outings...when he was placed on the injured list on July 24, his 18 multi-inning relief appearances led MLB...on March 30 at TB, made his major league debut, yielding a solo home run before retiring **Isaac Paredes**, **Randy Arozarena**, and **Luke Raley** in succession.
