**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets enjoyed a few days off after they punched their ticket to the NLCS by defeating the Phillies, three-games-to-one in the NLDS...The Mets defeated the Brewers, two-games-to-one in the National League Wild Card Series.

**NEXT UP:** The Mets are headed to the NLCS for the ninth time in franchise history and the first time since 2015...The Mets are 26-17 (.605) all-time in the National League Championship Series.

**EIGHT IS GREAT:** According to Elias, the Mets are the eighth team to reach the League Championship Series after being 11+ games under .500, joining: 2019 Nationals, 2013 Dodgers, 2005 Astros, 1989 Blue Jays, 1984 Royals, 1974 Pirates and the 1973 Mets.

**LA LA LAND:** The Mets are facing the Dodgers for the fourth time in Postseason history...They faced off in the 2015 NLDS (3-2), the 2006 NLDS (3-2) and the 1988 ALDS (3-4)...Overall, the Mets are 9-6 against the Dodgers in the Postseason.

**TROLLEY DODGERS:** J.D. Martinez has hit 25 home runs in 73 career games (Postseason + regular season) at Dodger Stadium...Pete Alonso is a .312 (24-77) hitter with 12 runs, three doubles, one triple, seven homers, 18 RBI with a .338 OBP and a .649 SLG at Dodger Stadium...In 21 career games at the ballpark, Brandon Nimmo has hit .369 (24-65) with 13 runs, six extra-base hits, eight walks and a .468 OBP.

**ONE, SINGULAR SENSATION:** The Mets are 10-11 in the first game of a Postseason Series...The Mets earned an 8-4 win in Game 1 of the 2024 NL Wild Card Series...The defeated the Phillies, 6-2, in Game 1 of the NLDS.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Kodai Senga is set to take the bump for the third time this season...He started Game 1 of the NLDS, allowing one earned run over 2.0 innings, surrendering a solo home run, one walk and struck out three...In the regular season, he made one start on July 26 vs. Atlanta and allowed two earned runs on two hits with one walk and struck out nine over 5.1 innings...At the end of the start, he strained his left calf and has been on the 60-Day IL since then...He has made 30 career MLB starts, going 13-7 with a 2.99 ERA (57 ER/171.2 IP) with 78 walks and 211 strikeouts.

**LINSANITY:** Francisco Lindor connected for his second career Postseason grand slam...He also cleared the bases on October 6, 2017 with Cleveland vs. New York-AL...His two Postseason grand slams are tied with Shane Victorino and Jim Thome for the most in MLB history.

**TO THE POST:** The Mets are 57-42 all-time in Postseason play...The club's .576 winning percentage is the third-best in major league history...Only the Marlins (24-16, .600) and the Yankees (247-179, .570) have a better winning percentage...The Mets own the third-best ERA in Postseason history with 3.20 ERA...Only the Orioles/Browns (2.80) and Athletics (3.14) have a lower ERA.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets are 3-2 on the road during the 2024 Postseason...All-time, they are 24-23 on the road in the Postseason...New York finished the season going 43-38 away from Citi Field in 2024...The Mets surpassed their road win total of 2023 (32-49)...The Mets hit .254/.316/.416 on the road this year...They ranked seventh in the majors in AVG and SLG and were 10th in OBP.

**IN THE CITI:** The Mets are 7-6 during the Postseason at Citi Field...Overall, the Mets are 33-19 at home in the Postseason...Their .635 winning percentage at home is the best in the majors.

**DODGERS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 5-3 all-time in the Postseason at Dodger Stadium.

**THE YOUNG AND THE RESTLESS:** Mark Vientos is the third-youngest player (24 years, 300 days) with 10+ total bases in a playoff game, doing so in Game 2 of the NLDS...He was only older than Carlos Correa (21y, 20d) in Game 4 of the 2015 ALDS and Manny Ramirez (23y, 134d) in Game 2 of the 1995 ALCS...Vientos is now the third Mets player with three extra-base hits in a playoff game, joining Lucas Duda in Game 4 of the 2015 NLCS and Gary Carter in Game 4 of the 1986 World Series.

**ADDICTED TO THE PLAYOFFS:** J.D. Martinez has appeared in 39 Postseason games, batting .293 (39-133) with 16 runs, five doubles, 10 home runs, 34 RBI, 20 walks, a .385 OBP and a .556 SLG.

**SAVE THE CHEERLEADER, SAVE THE WORLD:** There have been 13 players in franchise history to record a save in the Postseason...Jeurys Familia owns the franchise record with five Postseason saves...Armando Benitez, Tug McGraw and Billy Wagner are tied for second with three saves each.

**BACK-TO-BACK:** The Mets have hit back-to-back home runs twice in the Postseason...On October 21, 2015 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Lucas Duda and Travis d'Arnaud hit back-to-back home runs in the first inning...On October 9, 1988 in Game 4 of the NLCS, Darryl Strawberry and Kevin McReynolds went back-to-back in the fourth inning.

**HAPPY TRAILS:** According to Sarah Langs, the Mets entered this year 6-27 when trailing entering the eighth inning in franchise history in the postseason...After the Game 1 win in the NLDS, they are now 2-0 in such games this Postseason...The only teams with more such wins in a single Postseason are the 1996 Yankees (5 wins), the 1980 Phillies (4 wins), the 2015 Royals (3 wins) and the 1986 Mets (3 wins).

**BACK-TO-BACK:** The Mets won Game 3 of the NLWCS and Game 1 of the NLDS after trailing entering the eighth inning...According to Elias, the Mets are the eighth team to win back-to-back Postseason games when trailing in the eighth inning or later in each, joining: the 2015 Royals, 2004 Red Sox, 2001 Yankees, 1999 Mets, 1996 Yankees, 1992 Blue Jays and the 1980 Phillies.

**HIGH FIVE:** The Mets have scored five or more runs in an inning twice this Postseason (In Game 1 of the NLDS and in Game 1 of the Wild Card Series)...It's the first time they've done so multiple times in a single Postseason in franchise history...Courtesy of Brent Maguire at MLB.com

**NOTHING EXTRA:** The Mets scored six runs without recording an extra-base hit in their NLDS Game 1 win against the Phillies...It marks the second time in franchise history that the team scored six runs without an extra-base hit in a Postseason game...The only other coinsurance was Game 6 of the 1986 World Series...Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** In game three of the NL Wild Card Series, Pete Alonso hit the 10th go-ahead homer in the ninth inning or later in a winner-take-all game in Postseason history...It was the first ever with a team trailing.

**FIRST IS THE BEST:** The Mets are the first team in MLB history to clinch a postseason spot in a win and win a playoff series BOTH via games in which they faced a deficit in the ninth inning or later...Courtesy of Sarah Langs and Elias.

**TO RYNE OWNSELF BE TRUE:** Ryne Stanek has appeared in 27 Postseason games...He is 3-0 with a 2.59 ERA (7 ER/24.1 IP) with seven walks and 24 strikeouts in the playoffs.

**WILD OUT:** The Mets previously made the Postseason as the Wild Card team in 1999, 2000, 2016 and in 2022...In 1999, New York defeated the Diamondbacks, 3-1, in National League Division Series and fell to the Atlanta Braves 4-2, in the League Championship Series...The 2000 Mets defeated the Giants, 3-1 in the NLDS and the Cardinals, 4-1 in the NLCS... The team fell to the Yankees 4-1 in the World Series...The 2016 Mets fell to the Giants, 1-0, in the one-game Wild Card Game...The Mets lost a best-of-three-game series to the San Diego Padres, dropping two games to one in 2022 at Citi Field.

**POSTSEASON BOUND:** The Mets are in the Postseason for the first time since 2022 and for the 11th time in franchise history...This marks the fifth Wild Card berth in team history...Also in 1999, 2000, 2016 and 2022.

**POSTING UP:** Pete Alonso appeared in all 162 Mets games this year... Outside of 2020, he became the second Mets player to appear in every single game, joining Félix Millán (1975)...John Olerud appeared in 162 of 163 games during the 1999...This year marked the third time in his career he has appeared in 160 or more games (also, 2019 & 2022).

**ON THE RECORD:** New York won 20 of their last 29 on the regular season...The Mets finished the year going 89-73...In 2023, the team finished at 75-87...The Mets were a season-low 11 games under .500 on June 2 (24-35)...Since then, the Mets went 65-38...Following a loss on May 29, the Mets played 107 games, going 67-40 in that span...Their .626 winning percentage was the best in the majors in that span...They outscored their opponents 541-433 during those 107 games.

**DIVISION BELL:** The Mets appeared in the Division Series for the first time since 2015...They defeated the Phillies, three-games-to-one...Overall, it was their ninth appearance in the series...The Mets are 15-5 all-time in the series...Their .750 winning percentage in the series is the best in the National League...That is tied with the Blue Jays (.750) for the best mark in the majors...This includes a 9-1 record at home in the Division Series.

**IN A CLINCH:** The Mets are 13-9 in clinching games, including 2-0 this year...New York has clinched a spot in the NLCS for the first time since 2015...The Mets clinched their first Postseason series at Citi Field after defeating the Phillies, 4-1, in Game 4 of the NLDS.

### SENGA NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Kodai Senga made his first Postseason start after making just one start in the regular season on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies... He threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning and recorded one walk and three strikeouts.

**2024 REGULAR SEASON RECAP:** Senga missed nearly the first four months of the season with a right shoulder capsule strain...After his one start on July 26, against Atlanta, Senga missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...The right-hander made five rehab starts, one with High-A Brooklyn and four with Triple-A Syracuse...In his five rehab starts, Senga allowed six runs over 14.0 innings and recorded 15 strikeouts.

**REMARKABLE ROOKIE:** In his rookie campaign, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 SO/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers last season.

**SENGA GENESIS:** In his last 18 starts of the 2023 season dating back to June 10, Senga pitched to a 2.57 ERA (31 ER/108.2 IP), struck out 129 batters and recorded 12 quality starts...During that span, his ERA was the fifth-best in the majors and his 10.68 SO/9 rate was the 12th-best (Min. 75.0 IP).

**I LOVE MY NEW HOME:** In 2023, Senga's 2.42 ERA (25 ER/93.0 IP) at Citi Field was the second-best home mark in the majors among qualifiers...Senga held opposing batters to a .179 average at home, the third lowest-mark in the majors among qualifiers...His 12.00 K/9 rate at home was the fifth-highest in the majors among qualifiers.

**PUTTING THE K IN FORK:** Last season, Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts during his rookie campaign...The pitch had a 59.5 percent whiff rate and a 28.2 percent putaway rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

**SPOOKY GOOD:** Last season, Senga led all rookie pitchers in bWAR (4.5) and fWAR (3.4)...He was the only rookie to qualify for the ERA title...Finished the season ranked fifth in the majors and second in the NL with a 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP), the fifth-lowest mark by a Mets rookie in franchise history.

**HARD TO HIT:** In his rookie season, Senga had three starts of 7.0 or more innings with two or fewer hits allowed, which tied for the second-most such starts in the majors this season...Additionally it tied with Dwight Gooden for the most such starts by a Mets rookie in a single season...Only Nolan Ryan (Four, 1970) and Jacob deGrom (Five, 2015) have had more such starts in a single season in franchise history.

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** Last season, Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.
