PITTSBURGH PIRATES (1-1) AT MIAMI MARLINS (1-1)

March 29, 2025 - loanDepot park - Miami, FL - 4:10 EDT - Game #3/Road #3

LHP Bailey Falter (8-9, 4.43 ERA in 2024) vs. RHP Valente Bellozo (3-4, 3.67 ERA in 2024)

THE PIRATES: earned their first win of 2025 with a 4-3 victory Friday night over Miami at loanDepot park...Mitch Keller pitched 6.0 innings, the longest outing of his career in a season debut, striking out four Marlins while allowing five hits and one walk...Oneil Cruz had two hits, two runs and a walk, including what proved to be the game-winning hit, a two-run, line-drive home run (registered exit velocity of 115.0 miles per hour) to right field off Connor Gillispie in the fifth inning.

FISH FRY: With Friday's win over the Marlins, Pittsburgh picked up its ninth win in its last 10 tries against Miami...The Pirates' Opening Day loss snapped an eight-game winning streak against the Marlins that dated back to 10/1/23 (Pittsburgh won each of the seven head-to-head meetings in 2024)...Since the beginning of 2021, the Pirates are 18-12 against Miami (10-7 in Miami).

MARCH MADNESS: With their win over Miami on Friday, Pittsburgh moved to 11-2 (.846) all-time in March games, the best mark in all of Major League Baseball...The Pirates' only two March losses came on Thursday here in Miami (5-4), and in the 2019 opener on 3/28 at Great American Ball Park in Cincinnati (5-3).

CUTCH: With his fourth-inning, RBI double in Friday's win over Miami, Andrew McCutchen collected the 799th extra-base hit of his Major League career...His 610 XBH with Pittsburgh rank fifth in Pirates history, while his 799 XBH are third-most among active Major League players (LAD's Freddie Freeman has 883 and NYY's Paul Goldschmidt has 831)...McCutchen is also just four RBI shy of 1100 for his Major League career, and he ranks fifth among active players on that list (Freeman leads the group with 1234, while NYY's Giancarlo Stanton ranks fourth with 1103).

THE RENEGADE: David Bednar earned his first save of the season on Friday...The save was also the 85th of his career (all with Pittsburgh)...Bednar ranks sixth on the Pirates all-time saves list...His next save will move him into a tie with Felipe Vazquez for fifth-most in Pittsburgh history.

GUIDING THE SHIP: On Friday, sixth-year skipper Derek Shelton earned his 295th win as the Pirates' manager, moving him into a tie with Gene Lamont for 12th on Pittsburgh's all-time managerial wins list...Billy Meyer ranks 11th on the list with 317 managerial wins with the Pirates.

BUCS ON THE BASES: With steals from Oneil Cruz and Tommy Pham on Friday, Pittsburgh now has eight steals through its first two games of 2025...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, those are the Pirates' most through the first two games of a season since at least 1900, surpassing the previous mark of seven (originally set in 1907 and matched in 1983)...The eight stolen bases are also tied for fourth-most by any Major League team through its first two games of a season in the Live-Ball Era (since 1920)...Only the 2023 Orioles (10), 1983 Dodgers (9) and 1976 Reds (9) had more.

SPEED DEMONS: Oneil Cruz and Tommy Pham have both stolen a base in each of Pittsburgh's first two games...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, they are only the second pair of Pirates teammates to each steal at least one base in the first two games of a season since at least 1900...The other instance came in 1983, when Lee Lacy stole a base in each of the first five games (seven steals total) and Dave Parker stole a base in each of the first two games (two steals total)...Per Elias, Tommy Pham became just the third Pirate since at least 1900 to steal at least one base in each of his first two games with the club, joining Kirk Gibson in 1992 and Cozy J. Dolan in 1913.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Triple-A Indianapolis opened its 2025 season Friday night, falling on the road to St. Paul...Braxton Ashcraft, one of Pittsburgh's top prospects (No. 4, per Baseball America / No. 6, per MLB Pipeline) got the start and struck out five batters over 3.1 innings...Billy Cook doubled for one of the Indians' four hits...Mike Burrows, who made his MLB debut in 2024 and is also considered a top prospect, is expected to pitch for Indianapolis today...Pittsburgh's other full-season affiliates will begin their seasons Friday, 4/4.

THE ROAD AHEAD: The Bucs are opening the season on the road for the ninth straight year and the 10th time in 11 years...Prior to the last nine years, the last time the Pirates opened on the road more than nine straight years was from 1894 to 1953 (60 consecutive years).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

March 29, 2024: Ryder Ryan earned the first win of his big-league career as the Pirates beat the Marlins, 7-2, at loanDepot park to improve to 2-0 on the season. Oneil Cruz, Ke'Bryan Hayes and Connor Joe each had two hits in the win, with Hayes scoring twice and driving in two runs. Josh Fleming worked the final 3.0 innings, striking out three and earning the second save of his career.

HOW ACQUIRED: From Philadelphia in deal for INF Rodolfo Castro on 8/1/23.

STARTING OFF: The 27-year-old lefty is in his third season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline on 8/1/23, in exchange for infielder Rodolfo Castro...Falter is in his fifth Major League season after debuting in April 2021... He was selected by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.

AGAINST MIAMI: Falter will be making his first ninth career appearance (sixth start) against the Marlins...He allowed six runs in 4.0 innings, including five in the first inning, in a no-decision against the Marlins last year on 3/31 at loanDepot park...He also allowed just two hits over 7.1 shutout innings (five strikeouts) while winning a 3-1 decision against Miami last year on 9/11 at PNC Park...In that start, he took a no-hitter into the seventh inning before Jonah Bride broke it up with a one-out single to left field...Since making his last relief appearance against Miami on 4/16/22, he has gone 3-0 with a 3.57 ERA (22.2ip/9er) in four starts against the Marlins...Has pitched 16.1 innings across his five career appearances (three starts) here in Miami.

HITTING HIS SPOTS: Falter comes into today with the longest-active streak in MLB without hitting a batter (1096 plate appearances from 8/20/22 to 9/29/24)... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last pitcher with as long of a streak without hitting a batter was Yusmeiro Petit (1205 plate appearances) from 4/21/17 to 6/6/21... Philadelphia's Cristopher Sánchez entered 2025 with the second-longest active streak without hitting a batter, according to the Elias Sports Bureau (967 plate appearances).

2024 IN REVIEW: Falter spent his first full season in the big leagues while going 8-9 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 starts with the Pirates...He was on an Opening Day roster for the third straight season after also doing so with the Phillies in both 2022 and 2023.

MARVELOUS MAY: In the month of May last season, Falter pitched a career-best 19.2 consecutive innings without allowing a run from 5/12 to 5/24...Overall, he posted a 2.23 ERA (32.1ip/8er) across his five starts that month...Among National League pitchers in the month of May, Falter ranked ninth in innings pitched and 12th in ERA.

STAYING IN THE PARK: Falter surrendered 11 home runs in 68.1 innings (1.45 per 9.0 innings) in his first 12 starts of the 2024 season...In his last 16 starts (6/12 onward), he surrendered six home runs across 74.0 innings, averaging just 0.73 per 9.0 innings.

JUST LIKE SANDY: Growing up in Chino Hills, California, Falter's father, Darwin, taught him to idolize fellow left-handed pitcher Sandy Koufax...Bailey would do reports on Koufax at school and even had a framed picture of the Dodgers southpaw hanging above his childhood bed...To this day, his delivery on the mound mimics that of Koufax...In 2024, he ranked in the 98th percentile in extension (per Baseball Savant).

BACK HOME IN CALIFORNIA: Attended Chino Hills High School, where he was classmates with NBA players Lonzo and LaMelo Ball...Falter had committed to play collegiately at the University of California, Santa Barbara prior to being drafted by and signing with Philadelphia in 2015.

The Pirates will be the sixth different team he's pitched for (also: Miami, Los Angeles-AL, New York-AL, Los Angeles-NL and Texas)...Is one of just four Major League lefties with 150-plus strikeouts in each of the last two seasons (also: Yusei Kikuchi, Framber Valdez, MacKenzie Gore)...His 2.65 walks per 9.0 innings from 2014-24 were the eighth-fewest among Major League lefties in that span (min. 1000.0ip)...Was drafted by Miami in the first round (ninth overall) of the 2012 First-Year Player Draft...Made his MLB debut with the Marlins in 2014...Has been scoreless in 11.2 career innings across two starts against Miami (8h, 2bb, 11k)...Has a 2.14 ERA (21.0ip/5er) with 16 strikeouts and just one walk in Miami...When he pitched 6.0 shutout innings (4h, 7k) with the Rangers here on 6/2/24, was his first game back here since 9/21/14.
