To clinch a spot in the postseason for the 10th time in team history and the first time since 2023.

RAY REPORT—The Rays start a seven-game, eight-day road trip against the Rangers (four to play) and Braves (three to play) tonight in Arlington...the Rays are set to play 14 of their final 23 games on the road beginning tonight...are 9-10 in their last 19 contests (Aug. 14–pres.) after going 18-4 between July 20–Aug. 12...despite the 9-10 stretch, they are an MLB-best 27-14 since July 20...have the second-toughest remaining schedule with an opp winning pct. of .522, just behind the Orioles (.524)...in their seven remaining series, the Rays will face five opponents that are currently in position to qualify for the postseason...hold a 3.5-game lead over the second-place Yankees in the AL East standings...have spent 108 days leading the division, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...this includes a season-high 68 consecutive days in first place (June 27–pres.)...are seeking their fifth AL East division title, first since winning the division in back-to-back seasons from 2020-21...have held the AL's best record outright for 107 days, the most in franchise history, according to Stats Perform.

- ✦ The Rays dropped their rubber game against the Mets, 10-4, last night...it marked the second time in three series and third time in five sets the Rays have required a rubber match to determine a series victor...entering this stretch, only three of their previous 19 series had been decided in the final game (June 8–Aug. 17).
- ✦ **Chandler Simpson** recorded his 49th multi-hit game of the season (see more in "The Leading Chan" note below).
- ✦ The loss marked the Rays fourth home series loss in their last five sets (July 31–pres.) after winning or splitting each of their last eight home series (6-0-2) and 14 of their last 15 sets (12-1-2).
- ✦ Of the Rays 56 losses on the season, 22 have come with a deficit of five runs or more...those 22 games are the sixth most in the AL and 12th most in the majors...since the 2008 rebrand, only the 2024 Rays (23) and the 2017 Rays (24) lost more such games in a single season.

STREAKING INTO SEPTEMBER—**Junior Caminero** had his 15-game hitting streak snapped last night, it was the longest streak in the majors and the longest by a Ray since **Chander Simpson's** career-best 18-game run from June 25–July 19, 2025...he is slashed .356/.406/.492 (21-for-59) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, and an .898 OPS during the streak...he has homered in two of his last five games on the heels of a career-high-tying 15-game drought without a long ball...with 37 HR, Caminero is tied with **HOU Yordan Alvarez** for the most homers in the AL, trailing only **PHI Kyle Schwarber** (40) and **CHC Pete Crow-Armstrong** (38) across all of MLB...the 37 HR marked the third most by a Ray before the end of August, trailing Caminero last season (39) and **Carlos Peña** (38) in 2009...he is 3 HR shy of becoming the first player in franchise history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (45HR in 2025) and needs 9 HR over the Rays final 24 games to tie Peña's franchise record from 2007 (46HR).

- ✦ He became the youngest hitter (23.058) in franchise history to record a 15-game hitting streak or longer, surpassing **Austin Meadows** who was 24y, 138d when he had a 16-game hitting streak between Sept. 1-18, 2019).

THE LEADING CHAN—**Chandler Simpson** (.312) is five points behind **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (.317) for the AL's best batting average...he is attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only AL batting champions in Rays history...he could also become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title in one of his first two MLB seasons, including the third since 1942 along with **SEA Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season) in 2001 and Rays Hall of Famer **BOS Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season) in 1983...after posting a .295 (122-for-109) average last season, he is attempting to become the fifth player in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to bat .295 or better in each of his first two MLB seasons (min. 400AB in each season), joining **CHC Starlin Castro** (2010-11), **NY Y Robinson Cano** (2005-06), **STL Albert Pujols** (2001-02), and **Suzuki** (2001-02)...Simpson leads the AL in singles (133) and triples (6)—no Ray has ever paced the AL in the former category over a full season, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallix Smith** (2018) have finished atop the Junior Circuit's leaderboard in the latter...since 1983, only two AL hitters have led the league in both singles and triples: **CLE Amed Rosario** in 2022 and **KC Whit Merrifield** in 2019...Simpson needs 12 singles over the Rays final 23 games to match Crawford's club record from 2003 (145).

- ✦ Over his last 62 games (June 19–pres.), Simpson paces the majors in batting average (.369/87-for-236), hits, and stolen bases (24).
- ✦ In August, Simpson (41H, 11SB) became the first player in franchise history to lead the majors in both hits and steals during a calendar month, the first major leaguer to turn the trick since **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (42H/16SB) in September 2024 (Elias)...he became the first player with 40 hits or more and 10 stolen bases or more in any month since **PHI Trea Turner** in August 2025 (41H/10SB) and the second AL hitter since 2015, joining **SEA Julio Rodriguez** in August 2023 (45H, 11SB).
- ✦ With 38 SB, third most in MLB, Simpson is two steals shy of joining **CAL Chad Curtis** (1992-93), **MON Delino DeShields** (1990-91), **STL Vince Coleman** (1985-86), and **NY Y Bert Daniels** (1910-11) as the only players in the modern era (since 1900) to reach 40 stolen bases in each of their first two major league campaigns.

THE RAY WAY—The Rays clinched a winning season before the end of August for the fourth time (excl. 2020), joining 2023 (82-52), 2021 (84-48), and 2008 (84-51)...this marks the 13th winning season across 29 campaigns in franchise history, all of which have come in the last 19 seasons becoming the Rays in 2008 after the Devil Rays had none across the franchise's first decade of existence (1998–2007)...including results thus far from this season, the 13 winning seasons since 2008 are tied with the **Braves** and **Brewers** for fourth most among all major league clubs, trailing the **Dodgers** (18), **Yankees** (17), and **Cardinals** (16)...the **Astros**, **Guardians**, and **Red Sox** (all 11) are the next closest AL teams over that timeframe.

- ✦ This marks the fourth time the Rays entered September atop the AL East, joining 2021 (84-48), 2020 (25-11), and 2008 (84-51)...they went on to win the division crown in each of those seasons, including **World Series** appearances in 2020 and 2008 and a club-record 100 wins in 2021.
- ✦ The Rays are approaching their first postseason berth since 2023 and sixth in the last eight seasons since 2019...as it stands, their five postseason appearances since 2019 are sixth most in the majors, trailing the **Dodgers** (7), **Astros** (6), **Braves** (6), **Brewers** (6), and **Yankees** (6)...they have made the postseason nine times since becoming the Rays in 2008, tied with the **Astros** and **Brewers** for fifth most in MLB behind the **Dodgers** (15), **Yankees** (13), **Braves** (10), and **Cardinals** (10).

PITCHER'S PARADISE—The Rays staff has yielded 3 ER or fewer in nine of the last 11 games (Aug. 22–pres.), turning in a 2.70 ERA (100.0IP, 30ER) while holding opponents to a .195/.242/.301 (72-for-369) line—they lead the AL in opp. AVG, opp. OBP, opp. SLG, hits per 9.0 IP (6.48), walks per 9.0 IP (1.89), and strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.38) over that stretch...they also have MLB's best WHIP in that span (0.93), with the **Phillies** (1.00) being the next closest staff...entering that stretch, Rays pitchers had permitted five runs or more in a season-high six consecutive games (Aug. 16-21)...the starting rotation has a 2.48 ERA during the 11-game span, going 5-2 with 52 SO against 7 BB...seven of their last 10 starts have been quality.

- ✦ Tonight's probable starter, **Shane McClanahan**, has recorded 559 strikeouts in his career, three shy of tying **Chris Archer** (562; 2012-15) for the fourth most by a Rays pitcher in his first four big-league seasons...his 43 wins are tied with **James Shields** (2006-09) for the most across a Rays pitcher's first four major league seasons.

CLOSING TIME—**Bryan Baker** has converted a franchise-record 28 consecutive save opportunities (May 17–pres.), pushing his season-long total to an MLB-leading 39 saves, most by a Ray since **Alex Colomé** paced the majors with 47 in 2017...he has as many or more saves than 21 clubs have as a team this season...Baker's 28-save streak ties **SD Mason Miller** (March 28–July 29) for MLB's longest this season and is the longest single-season streak by an AL pitcher since **CLE Emmanuel Clase** converted 34 straight saves from May 20–Sept. 25, 2024...he is attempting to join Colomé as the only Rays to pace the majors in saves over a full season.

THURSDAY NIGHT LIGHTS—The Rays begin a four-game set today in Texas against the Rangers...the Rays took two of three contests in their home series against the Rangers this season (July 28-30)...they need to win two of the four games to claim their first season series against Texas since 2022 (4-3)...have dropped nine straight games at Globe Life Field dating back to July 17, 2023 and are 6-12 overall in their last 18 contests vs. the club in that span...went 12-7 in their 19 previous contests in Arlington from 2016-22.

- ✦ In 42 career games vs. the Rangers, **Yandy Diaz** has hit .327 (50-for-123) with 7 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, and 13 RBI, and 22 R.

HOME ON THE RANGE—Rays Player Development announced today **INF Xavier Isaac** [TB No. 18] and **RHP Ty Johnson** [TB No. 10] as the Rays Player of the Month and Rays Pitcher of the Month respectively for August.

- ✦ Isaac appeared in 17 games with Double-A Montgomery and four games with Triple-A Durham last month...he slashed .311/.443/.703 (23-for-74) with 5 2B, 8 HR, 24 RBI, 18 BB, 3 SB, and a 1.146 OPS...he ranked highly in the Southern League in R (2nd), OBP (3rd), SLG (3rd), RBI (4th), HR (15th), and BB (16th)...he earned his promotion to Triple-A on Aug. 25 and made his Bulls debut that night.
- ✦ Johnson worked out of the bullpen, making 11 appearances for Durham...he pitched to a 0.79 ERA (11.1IP, 1ER), 19 strikeouts, a 0.35 WHIP, and a .059 (2-for-34) opp. average...the right-hander allowed four baserunners (2H, 2BB) across the month, posting the third lowest WHIP by a Bulls pitcher since at least 2005 in a single month (min. 10.0IP).

TONIGHT'S START—Shane McClanahan will toe the rubber for his 24th start of the season and 12th on the road tonight...marks his 98th career start and 46th on the road...will mark his fourth start since being reinstated from the 15-day IL (left mid-back tightness) on Aug. 17...missed the last two years after his second Tommy John surgery wiped out his 2024 season and nerve-related issues sidelined him for 2025...the Cape Coral High School (Fla.) product was selected by the Rays in the Compensatory Round (31st overall) of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Florida.

- Min. 100.0 IP, he ranks among AL leaders in opp. OPS (4th, .593), opp. SLG (5th, .315), home runs per 9.0 IP (5th, 0.72), and opp. average (6th, .206).
- With a win tonight, he would tie CLE **Parker Messick** for the most wins by an AL southpaw this season.
- His 559 career strikeouts are eighth most in franchise history, 11 shy of tying **Alex Cobb** (570 SO) for seventh most.
- His 43 career wins are the sixth most in franchise history, five shy of tying Cobb (48) for fifth...min. 50 career starts, he owns the second-best winning pct. by any pitcher in Rays history (.662/43-22), 10 points behind **Drew Rasmussen** (.672/43-21).
- Across his last eight starts since July 1, he has logged a 4-1 record with a 2.97 ERA (39.1IP, 13ER), 30 strikeouts, a 0.89 WHIP, and a .176 (25-for-142) opp. average...min 30.0 IP in that time frame, he ranks third among AL pitchers in WHIP and fourth in opp. average.
- When nagivating an opponent's lineup for the first time in a game, he has limited batters to a .186 (36-for-194) clip, seventh lowest among AL southpaws this season (min. 190AB).
- This marks his first start in September since Sept. 25, 2022 vs. TOR.

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his 10th win of the season after yielding four runs (3ER) across 5.2 innings in a 9-4 win over the Padres on Aug. 28 at Tropicana Field (W, 5.2IP, 3H, 4R-3ER, 2BB, 4SO, HR)...retired 12 of his first 13 batters, working around a single in the 2nd...a walk-single-fielding error sequence was followed by a pair of fielder's-choice plays that each plated runs in the 5th inning...set down his next three batters, but surrendered a walk followed by a home run by **Jackson Merrill** to end his day in the 6th, one out shy of his fifth quality start of the year.

- He has allowed five hits or fewer in each of his last eight starts since July 1, the longest streak by a Rays pitcher this season...min. 30 IP, his 5.72 hits allowed per 9.0 IP are the fewest by an AL lefty in that span...min. 130 AB, his .176 (25-for-142) opp. average in that span is the third lowest by an AL pitcher, behind TOR **Dylan Cease** (.139) and NYY **Cam Schlitler** (.169).

DON'T MESS WITH TEXAS—The southpaw has made three career appearances (all starts) opposite the Rangers, going 1-0 with a 3.38 ERA (16.0IP, 6ER) with 14 strikeouts and a .130 (7-for-54) opp. average in those contests...two of those starts were quality...his most recent outing came on July 30 of this season at Tropicana Field, when he allowed just 1 ER in his shortest start of the year (3.0IP, ER, 2BB, HBP, 3SO), departing in the 4th inning due to left mid-back tightness, which preceded a July 31-Aug. 17 stint on the 15-day IL...his last outing in Texas came on July 17, 2023, when he did not receive a decision after tossing 6.0 innings of two-run ball in a 3-2 loss at Globe Life Field (6.0IP, 3H, 2ER, 6SO, HR).

- Owns a career 4-4 record with a 3.94 ERA (89.0IP, 39ER) and .218 (72-for-330) opp. average in 18 appearances (all starts) against AL West competition.
- This season, he has made 16 starts against AL foes, going 8-3 with a 2.60 ERA (79.2IP, 23ER), 71 strikeouts, and a .193 (57-for-295) opp. average...eight of his last nine starts have come against the AL.

TRAVELING MAN—McClanahan is 2-5 with a 3.91 ERA (53.0IP, 23ER) in 11 road starts...his last road start came on Aug. 22 at BAL, when he did not receive a decision after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings in a 3-2 loss to the Orioles (ND, 5.0IP, 4H, OR, BB, 5SO)...the left-hander has produced a 2-2 record, 2.80 ERA (35.1IP, 11ER), and 1.08 WHIP over seven road starts in AL ballparks...this includes a loss in his lone outing at an AL West venue, a 4-3 defeat at Angel Stadium on June 12 (L, 4.0IP, 8H, 4ER, BB, 7SO)...tonight, is seeking his first road victory since July 1 at KC (W, 6.0IP, 3H, OR, 4SO).

SOUTHPAW SUCCESS—Left-handed hitters have gone 13-for-93 (.140) against McClanahan this season...min. 90 AB, the .140 opp. average vs. LHB paces the AL and is fourth in the majors behind MIL **Jacob Misiorowski** (.117), STL **Gordon Graceffo** (.134), and SD **Yuki Matsui** (.135).

- He is allowing left-handed batters to reach base at a .238 clip, T7th among AL arms (min. 100PA) and T13th in the majors.
- Both opp. average and opp. on-base pct. are the lowest marks against left-handers he has posted in a season in his career.

KEEP THE CHANGE—He has held opponents to a .146 (20-for-137) average on his changeup, the lowest mark in the AL and second lowest in the majors (min. 100AB), behind SD **Bradley Rodriguez** (.139/14-for-101)...under the same parameter, he also leads MLB pitchers in opp. SLG (.197), and ranks third in opp. OBP (.188) and on the pitch...he has yielded only 5 XBH on changeups and tallied nearly half (49) of his 103 strikeouts on the offering.

SPLIT IT UP—In each of the first four frames, McClanahan has posted a .250 opp. average or lower...when pitching in the 5th inning this season, he has pitched to a 6.88 ERA (17.0IP, 13ER) and a .316 (24-for-76) opp. average, the highest opp. average in a single frame within any season of his career (min. 15.0IP).

- In the 1st inning this season, the southpaw has turned in a 1.96 ERA with 25 strikeouts and a .169 (14-for-83) opp. average...ranks highly among AL arms in the opening frame (min. 20 starts) in opp. OBP (4th, .216), WHIP (4th, 0.83), opp. average (6th), opp. OPS (7th, .517), ERA (8th), and opp. SLG (9th, .301).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP NICK MARTINEZ (13-4, 2.99)

LAST TIME OUT—Did not receive a decision after yielding 3 ER over 6.0 IP in a 7-6 win on Aug. 29 vs. SD (ND, 6.0IP, 7H, 3ER, HR, 4SO)...marked his 13th quality start of the year and fourth since the All-Star break...has allowed three runs or fewer in 22 of his 26 starts this season.
