### **INSIDE THE NUMBERS**

The Mariners are the <u>only team in MLB</u> this season with multiple 5-run comebacks (April 9 vs. HOU and May 7 at ATH)...the Mariners have 2 of 8 total 5-run comebacks across MLB this season.

The Mariners have 6 position players with at least 1.0 WAR (Baseball-Reference) this season, the most in the AL...Cal Raleigh (1.9, 5th in AL), J.P. Crawford (1.5), Julio Rodríguez (1.4), Randy Arozarena (1.3), Jorge Polanco (1.3) and Dylan Moore (1.0) make up the 6 Mariners players.

Over his last 9 games, **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .342 (13x38) with 7 runs, 1 double, 2 HR, 4 RBI, 2 walks and 2 strikeouts with a .917 OPS...he's gone 7 consecutive games (5/2-c) without a K.

Randy Arozarena has reached base safely via hit, walk, or hit-by-pitch in 31 consecutive games, the longest onbase streak by a Mariners player since Robinson Canó (34 G) in 2016.

The Mariners have had 41 players appear in a game for them this season, tied for the most in the Majors (also:

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-game homestand tonight with the 2nd of 3 games against the Toronto Blue Jays (0-1)...Seattle will also welcome the New York Yankees (3 G, 5/12-5/14) to T-Mobile Park...Seattle is coming off a 6-game road trip (4-2) with series wins against the Texas Rangers (2-1) and Athletics (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Angie Mentink on the call, with Jen Mueller serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) and Mariners.com with Rick Rizzs, Ryan Rowland-Smith and Gary Hill Jr. on the call. **ODDS AND ENDS...** the Mariners dropped last night's series opener to the Blue Jays by a 6-3 final... despite the loss, Seattle is 8-3 over its last 11 games, 10-4 over its last 14 games, 12-5 over its last 17 games, 14-6 over its last 20 games, 18-7 over its last 25 games and 19-8 over its last 27 games...the

- Mariners 19-8 (.704) record is the best in the Majors since April 7. Best In The West - The Mariners lead the American League West Division by 3.0 games over the Astros and Athletics.
- That's Gonna Leave A Mark Seattle batters have the 2nd-most hit-by-pitches (22) in the Majors trailing only Minnesota (23)...Seattle has led MLB in most hit-by-pitches in both 2023 (111) and 2024 (MLB record 116).
- Deep Thoughts The Mariners own a 12-2 record (.857) when their starters go at least 6.0 innings and a 20-9 (.690) when they go at least 5.0.
- **Ground Hogs -** Mariners relievers have a 50.1% ground ball rate this season, highest in the Majors... **Andrés Muñoz** ranks 2nd among MLB pitchers with a 73.5% ground ball rate.
- **Roster Moves -** The Mariners yesterday recalled RHP **Troy Taylor** from Triple-A Tacoma...RHP **Trent Thornton** was placed on the 15-day Injured List (appendicitis, retroactive to May 6).

GOING FOR 10 CONSECUTIVE SERIES WINS...the Mariners have won 9 consecutive series since April 7: vs. Houston (2-1), vs. Texas (3-0), at Cincinnati (2-1), at Toronto (2-1), at Boston (2-1), vs. Miami (2-1), vs. Los Angeles-AL (2-0), at Texas (2-1) and at the Athletics (2-1)...the 9 consecutive series victories marks their longest string of consecutive series wins since they won a franchise-record 14 (or 15) consecutive series from July 27-Sept. 20, 2001...one of those 15 series was a win in 1 game at Anaheim on Sept. 10, 2001...during the current series winning streak, the Mariners have lost the first game of the series 5 times (at Reds, at Blue Jays, at Red Sox, vs. Marlins and at Athletics).

HAPPY HOMERS...the Mariners are 21-8 (.724) in games when hitting at least one home run, and 1-7 (.125) when they do not homer...their lone win without homering came on April 24 at Boston (W 4-3)... Seattle's 21-8 record in games that they have homered in ranks 4th-best in MLB behind the Mets (.800/20-5), Cubs (.750/18-6) and Phillies (.727/16-6).

MATILDA'S DAD IS GOOD...Andrés Muñoz leads the American League with 13 saves...in 18 appearances this season, the reigning American League Reliever of the Month is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 18.0 IP) with 7 hits allowed, 1 run allowed (unearned), 8 walks (2 intentional) and 25 strikeouts, sporting a 0.833 WHIP and 12.5 strikeouts-per-9 innings rate...he leads relievers and ranks T-3rd among all pitchers with 1.9 WAR (Baseball-Reference) this season, trailing only Jesús Luzardo-PHI (2.1) and Hunter Brown-HOU (2.0).

**A TOP RANKED OFFENSE...** Seattle batters rank 1st in the AL in walks (158), trailing only the Diamondbacks (159) in MLB...they also rank 2nd in on-base percentage (.338), 3rd in OPS+ (124), 7th in OPS (.750), 6th in runs-per-game (5.08), T-5th in home runs (51), 6th in stolen bases (43) and 2nd in hit-by-pitches (22) this

HITTING ALL THE WAY AROUND...the Mariners have 10 players with at least 50 plate appearances and an OPS+ of 100-or-better (above league average), tied for the most such players with Detroit...Seattle has Jorge Polanco (212 OPS+), Cal Raleigh (174), Leo Rivas (155), Dylan Moore (151), Randy Arozarena (142), J.P. Crawford (137), Julio Rodríguez (119), Luke Raley (102), Rowdy Tellez (101) and Mitch Garver (101)...Ben Williamson has an 86 OPS+ in 82 plate appearances across 20 games.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...the Mariners are at T-Mobile Park for a 6-game homestand against the Toronto Blue Jays (3 G, 5/8-5/11) and New York Yankees (3 G, 5/12-5/14)...remaining promotions on the homestand include, **Maple Grove Night** tonight, **Mother's Day** tomorrow, **Star Wars Night** on May 12 and **Asian American, Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander Heritage Night** on May 13.

SWEET SIXTEEN FOR J.P. ...shortstop J.P. Crawford has an active career-high 16-game hitting streak (4/19-c)...J.P.'s streak is the <u>longest active streak in the Majors</u>, ranking ahead of a 14-game streak by Freddie Freeman-LAD...if J.P. gets a hit in tonight, he will have the longest hitting streak by a Mariners player since Teoscar Hernández (17 G, Aug. 21-Sept. 8, 2023)...during the streak, J.P. is batting .348 (23x66) with 10 runs, 1 double, 3 home runs, 13 RBI, 9 walks and 1 stolen base with a .427 OBP and slugging .500 (.927 OPS) during the streak.

SPEAKING OF STREAKS...outfielder Randy Arozarena has an active career-high 31-game on-base streak (3/31-c)...the longest on-base streak by a Mariners player since Robinson Canó's 34-game on-base streak from April 30-June 5, 2016...Arozarena's streak is the 2nd-longest active streak in the Majors, trailing only Kyle Schwarber-PHI (44 G)...during the streak, Arozarena has gotten on-base at a .400 clip with an .829 OPS, hitting .250 (28x112) with 15 runs, 8 doubles, 4 homers, 18 RBI, 23 walks, 5 hit-bypitches and is 8-for-8 in stolen bases.

CAL AGAINST THE JAYS...catcher Cal Raleigh is tied for the Major League lead in home runs (12)...in 23 career regular season + Postseason games against Toronto, Cal is batting .307 (27x88) with 20 runs, 3 doubles, 11 home runs, 23 RBI and 10 walks, slugging .716 with a 1.090 OPS...Cal's .716 slugging percentage leads active MLB players against Toronto, with his OPS ranking 2nd to Corey Seager-TEX (1.174 OPS)...Cal has homered in 9 games against Toronto, including 2 multi-homer games.

THE POLO GROUNDS...Jorge Polanco is batting .377 (20x53) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 7 home runs and 21 RBI with a .404 OBP and slugging .811 (1.215 OPS) in 15 games at T-Mobile Park this season...his 1.215 OPS at T-Mobile Park is the highest in a single season in ballpark history (min. 50 PA)...his 1.215 OPS at home this year is 4th in the Majors, trailing Aaron Judge-NYY (1.335), Zach McKinstry-DET (1.231) and Freddie Freeman-LAD (1.228).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...James Paxton is set to throw out the ceremonial first pitch tonight, and...<u>YOU</u> MAY ALSO KNOW...that The Big Maple, who retired after lest season, had an 11-year Major League career, including 7 seasons with Seattle where he went 41-26 with a 3.42 ERA (222 ER, 583.2 IP), 169 walks and 619 strikeouts, but...DID YOU KNOW?...Paxton is tied for the franchise record in ERA?...his 3.42 mark matches Félix Hernández, Randy Johnson and Hisashi lwakuma...active Mariners pitchers George Kirby (3.43) and Logan Gilbert (3.55) also rank in the Mariners all-time top 10...Paxton also threw the 6th no-hitter in Mariners history on May 8, 2018 at Toronto, the only Canadian-born pitcher to throw a no-hitter in Canada

#### ABOUT LOGAN EVANS ...

- The 23-year old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 3rd career Major League start in tonight's game against Toronto, and his 1st career start against the Blue Jays.
- Evans was selected by the Mariners in the 12th round of the 2023 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Pittsburgh.
- Spent 2 seasons at Penn State University, 2020-21, before transferring to the University of Pittsburgh, 2022-23.
- Was born in Ann Arbor, Michigan and attended Saline High School (MI).

LAST TIME OUT...L#1 on 5/4 vs. Texas, he threw 5.0 innings pitched, giving up 6 runs on 11 hits (0 HR), with 5 strikeouts against 2 walks...despite allowing 6 runs in the 3rd inning alone, Evans still managed to get through 5 innings on 92 pitches.

'The way he bounced back from that inning was really good," Manager Dan Wilson said after the game. "That's a big learning moment for him, and a confidence booster.'

"Probably deserved a better fate today, cause I thought he threw the ball well, mixed up his pitches, which is what he does, but just a tough day," Wilson said. "Sometimes that's the way the game goes. Again, threw the ball well, made some good pitches, but just luck wasn't on his side that inning.

EFFICIENT STUFF...has tossed 5+ strikeouts in 3 of his 7 starts this season between Everrett and Seattle...Evans only threw 5+ SO in 9 of his 22 starts in the minor leagues last season (all with Arkansas)...he also did so twice in 2023, tossing 6 SO in back-to-back starts with Modesto (9/01 and 9/07/23).

MAKING A STATEMENT...became the 9th pitcher in Mariners history to allow 2 or fewer hits with 5.0+ innings of work in his Major League debut, also joining fellow teammates Emerson Hancock (8/9/23 vs. SD) and Bryce Miller

SIMILAR FOOTSTEPS...also became the 7th pitcher in Mariners history drafted in the 10th round or later to start their MLB debut (does not include non-drafted players), joining: Bob Stoddard (10th round), Joel Piñeiro (12th), Jim Converse (16th), Anthony Vasquez (18th), Brandon Maurer (23rd), and George Glinatsis (32nd).

**DEBUTANTS**...was the 3rd Mariners player to make his Major League debut this season, joining **Ben Williamson** (April 15 at Cincinnati) and **Sauryn Lao** 

(April 21 at Boston). Since then, Rhylan Thomas also made his MLB debut on May 2 vs. TEX...Evans was also the 48th pitcher in franchise history to start his MLB debut and first since Emerson Hancock (August 9, 2023 vs. San Diego)...he was also the youngest starting pitcher to make his MLB debut at home for the Mariners (23 years, 325 days), since Andrew Moore (23 years, 10 days) on June 22, 2017 vs. DET.

PROSPECT WATCH...was the Mariners top pitching prospect entering the season, and 8th overall in the Mariners system by Baseball America...he is also ranked as the No. 10 Mariners prospect (MLB Pipeline).

CAREER STATS...has appeared in 3 minor league seasons going 11-6 with a 3.05 ERA (50 ER, 147.2 IP), 48 walks, 136 strikeouts and a 1.15 WHIP in 42 games (32 starts)...he has made 5 starts for Triple-A Tacoma this season, going 1-1 with a 3.05 ERA (11 ER, 25.2 IP), 4 walks, 23 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH...the 6-foot-4 right-hander earned Pacific Coast League Player of the Week honors on April 14 after tossing 6.0 innings allowing just 1 run on 2 hits and no walks with a season-high 7 strikeouts on April 9 against Sacramento.

MAYNIFICENT PERFORMANCE...in 5 starts during May for Arkansas last season, Evans threw 5.0+ innings pitched in all of his starts, compiling a 4-1 record, a 0.63 ERA (2 ER, 28.2 IP), .163 AVG against, 0.70 WHIP, with 33 strikeouts against 4 walks...was named both Mariners Minor League Co-Pitcher of the Month and Texas League Pitcher of the Month for his efforts.

TIME WITH THE TRAVS...was 9-5 with a 3.20 ERA (38 ER, 107.0 IP), 42 walks and 98 strikeouts in 32 games (22 starts) with Double-A Arkansas last season...in 10 starts before his transition to a reliever, he was 5-2 with a 1.23 ERA (7 ER, 51.1 IP), 15 walks and 47 strikeouts...he made 10 appearances as a reliever from June 4-30 before transitioning back to a starter.

PANTHERS IN THE MLB...became the only University of Pittsburgh Panther to appear in the Majors this season...he was also the 19th pitcher in program history to play in MLB, and only the 2nd pitcher to make a start since the 2000 season.

AWARDED... was named Texas League Pitcher of the Week on Aug. 11, 2024 after tossing 6.0 perfect innings with 7 strikeouts on Aug. 9 vs.

HIGHS...during his minor league career, struck out a career-high 9 batters twice (5/4/24 vs. San Antonio and 9/25/24 vs. Midland, both w/ Double-A Arkansas)...has tossed a career-high 6.0 innings 8 times (last: 4/9/25 vs. Sacramento w/ Triple-A Tacoma).
