REDS WAY ALL-STAR

In pre-game ceremonies tonight, Reds Hall of Fame and Museum team member **Stu Lundsford** will be recognized as the organization's **Reds Way All-Star of the Month for July 2019**.

2ND HALF

Since the All-Star break, the Redlegs are **7-9** and lead the National League in **batting average** (.296), **slugging percentage** (.504) and **on-base percentage** (.357)...rank third in the NL and T9th in the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (90, 5.63 r/g)...Reds pitchers rank 12th in the NL in second-half **ERA** (5.00).

FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (85), **HR** (30), **RBI** (82), **batting average** (.305), **slugging percentage** (.586) and **on-base percentage** (.369)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **85-50**, and are **25-8** when leading after the first inning...**5 times** this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first...**3B Eugenio Suárez** is hitting **.338** in the first frame, leads the Major Leagues with **10 HR** that inning and is tied for the lead with **20 RBI**...in **2018**, Reds batters produced **22 HR** and **77 runs** in the first inning.

Eugenio Suárez leads the team with **28 HR**, tied for seventh-most in the Major Leagues, and joins National Baseball Hall of Famer **Tony Pérez** as the only Reds third basemen ever to produce at **least 25 home runs** in **3 seasons** or more...**Suárez** hit **34 HR** last season and **26 HR** in 2017.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is **Game 1** of a 3-game series vs **Jim Trdinich's Pirates** and **Game 4** (2-1) of a 6-game homestand that included a **2-1 series win** vs the **Rockies**...following this series, the Redlegs will visit **Atl's SunTrust Park** (4g) before returning to **Great American Ball Park** for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the **Angels** (2g) and **Cubs** (4g).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are **47-47** since the bench-clearing incident on **4/7 at PNC Park** that led to the ejections of **David Bell**, **Amir Garrett** and **Yasiel Puig**...from **4/4-4/7** the Pirates swept a **4-game series** from the Reds for the first time since **7/11-7/14, 1991** at **Riverfront Stadium** and did it in **Pittsburgh** for the first time since **8/22-8/24, 1969** at **Forbes Field**...from **3/31-4/5** the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in **3 consecutive games** (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since **7/31-8/2, 1931** (5-0 & 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin)...last season the Reds lost 8 of their last 9 and 10 of their last 12 games vs the Pirates, including a **7-game losing streak** from **7/20-9/28**...was Cin's longest losing skid vs Pit since a **9-game losing streak** from **5/1-7/19, 1991**.

CATCH A BREAK: The Reds have used **5 catchers** this season, including **Tucker Barnhart**, **Curt Casali**, **Kyle Farmer**, **Juan Graterol** and **Ryan Lavarway**...the **3 catchers** on the club's **Opening Day roster** - **Barnhart** (IL), **Casali** (IL) & **Farmer** (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for **8 days** (7/18-7/25) until **Barnhart** came off the injured list prior to Fri night's game...**Barnhart** and **Farmer** have returned to the active roster...**Barnhart** on Fri filled the roster spot vacated by **Graterol**, who went on the **7-day concussion list**...**Farmer** was reinstated from the 7-day concussion list prior to yesterday's game...he replaced **Lavarway**, who was designated for assignment...per @EliasSports, the Reds used **6 catchers** in a season just **7 times** in their history, most recently in **1992** (**Troy Afenir**, **Scott Bradley**, **Joe Oliver**, **Jeff Reed**, **Dan Wilson**, **Rick Wrona**)...also used **6 catchers** in **1963**, **1961**, **1937**, **1925** and **1895**...the **1909 Reds** used a club-record **8 catchers** (**Tommy Clarke**, **Tom Downey**, **Emil Haberer**, **Mike Konnick**, **Larry McLean**, **Si Pauxtis**, **Duck Pearce**, **Frank Roth**).

2-WAY PLAYER: **RHP Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 65 of the Reds' 103 games so far this season, including 44 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once as a **pitcher/LF/RF** (7/22 at Mil), once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), 3 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 7 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi) and once as a **CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season** (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)...is the first Reds player with more than 300 career innings pitched (382.1) to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

BLACK & BLUE: **Derek Dietrich** has been hit by a pitch **22 times**, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013 & Jason LaRue, 24, 2004)...was hit by a pitch **6 times** in the 4-game series at Mil from **6/20-6/23** and was hit by a pitch **4 times** in the 3-game series at Chi from **7/15-7/17**...he is the only player in **modern Major League history** to get hit by a pitch **6 times** in a series of any length...was hit by a pitch twice in that series opener vs the Brewers, a 7-1 Reds win...in the 11-7 win in Game 2 became the first Reds batter in the modern era to be **hit by a pitch** 3 times in a game, tying the **Major League record** accomplished many times, and the first Reds batter ever to be hit at least twice in consecutive apps...in 15 apps this season vs the Brewers, **Dietrich** has been **hit by a pitch 8 times**...he has been hit by a pitch **115 times** in his career...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

Tonight's Pitcher - #54 Sonny Gray, RHP

RED HOTS

Sonny Gray is a **2019 National League All-Star**...tonight is making the fifth start of his career and fourth of the season vs the **Pirates**...has made **5 consecutive quality starts**, the longest streak by a Reds pitcher this season (**2-1, 1.62**)...in his 3-0 win on 7/3 vs Mil, threw 8.0 shutout innings and tied his career high with 12 strikeouts...the **8.0 innings** and **12 strikeouts** are the most by a Reds pitcher in a game this season...was added to the **National League All-Star** roster to replace Wsh's **Max Scherzer**...was **Gray's** second **All-Star** selection...he was an **American League All-Star** in 2015 but did not pitch in the game at Cin's **Great American Ball Park**...he joined **RHP Luis Castillo**, selected by his peers, as the first pair of **Reds starting pitchers** named to the **All-Star** team since **Johnny Cueto** and **Alfredo Simon** in **2014**...**Gray** did not pitch in the NL's 4-3 loss at Cle's **Progressive Field**, but **Castillo** threw a perfect fourth inning...began the season with 9 starts without a win, the longest such streak of his career to begin a season...was bothered in spring training by stiffness in his right elbow and made just 3 exhibition starts, but he started the Reds' second game of the season...hasn't missed a turn since...with the completion of the second inning on **7/17 at Cubs** reached **1,000 career innings pitched**...on 7/12 at Col, his **strikeout of Charlie Blackmon** to end the fifth inning was the **900th strikeout** of his career.

- Made 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- After Eugenio Suárez was ejected by HP umpire Carlos Torres between the first and second innings on 7/19 vs StL, made his first Major League appearance at 3B...made his second appearance at that position on Tue at Mil.
- Because of Scooter Gennett injury, spent most of this season playing primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been the starting SS.

66 YASIEL PUIG, of 2nd Half: 16g, 15gs, 16-62 (.258), 5 2b, 2hr, 8rbi

- Name is pronounced yah-SEE-el PWEEG.
- Ranks T13th in the NL in hitting with RISP (.330, 29-88).
- Leads the team and ranks T10th in the National League with 13 stolen bases, 2 shy of his career high (15sb, 2017, 2018).
- Has hit safely in 9 of 16 apps in the second half.
- With 22 HR and 59 RBI through 103 team games is on pace to produce 34 HR and 92 RBI...his single-season career highs for HR and RBI are 28 and 74, both in 2017.
- Beginning 6/15 has 11 HR in last 36 apps...since then, ranks among all Major League leaders in HR (T14th), slugging percentage (10th, .644), batting average (21st, .318) and RBI (T20th, 26).
- Produced his last HR on 7/15 at Cubs (12g) and his last RBI on 7/20 vs StL (7g).

15 NICK SENZEL, cf 2nd Half: 13g, 10gs, 15-42 (.357), 2 2b, 2 3b, 2rbi, 1sb

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- Before he was ejected in yesterday's 3-2 win vs Col went 0-for-3, snapping his 4-game hitting streak (6-13, .462, .995ops)...hit safely in 8 of his 13 second-half apps.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf 2nd Half: 16g, 15-55 (.273), 8hr, 15rbi

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Since the All-Star break leads the National League in slugging percentage (.764), is tied with StL's Paul Goldschmidt for the lead in HR (8) and ranks among the NL's second-half leaders in RBI (15, T4th) and extra-base hits (10, T6th).
- Hit safely in 11 of his 16 apps in the second half.
- In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 10 HR and is tied for the lead with 20 RBI...also in the first frame ranks 11th in the National League in hitting .338 (27-80).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 10 of his last 23 apps (12hr, 24rbi).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).
- Joins Tony Pérez as the only third basemen in franchise history to hit 25 or more HR in 3 or more seasons...his 11 HR this month are the most by a Reds batter in July since Adam Dunn hit 12 HR in July 2008...no Reds batter has hit more than Dunn's 12 HR in July since Frank Robinson hit 13 HR in July 1961.

17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of 2nd Half: 10g, 6gs, 12-24 (.500), 1 2b, 4hr, 6rbi

- In his last 9 apps beginning 7/19 is hitting .522 (12-23, 1 2b, 4hr, 6rbi, 1.087slg, .577obp)...from Wed-Sat homered in 3 straight apps, a streak snapped in yesterday's 3-2 win vs Col...was the third Reds player to homer in 3 straight games this season (Derek Dietrich, Eugenio Suárez twice).
- On 7/18 was promoted from Louisville as 1 of 7 roster moves...since then has made 10 apps (12-24, .500, 1 2b, 4hr, 6rbi, 1.042slg, .571obp), including 4 starts in LF, 1 start at 2B and 1 start at 3B.
- Is his fourth stint on the Reds' roster...from 5/5-5/16, in his first Major League apps, went 2-for-14 (1rbi) in 8 apps and 2 starts...from 5/21-6/18 made 20 apps, including 5 starts (7-27, .259, 2 2b, 2rbi, .375obp)...in his third stint, from 7/4-7/7 went 1-for-4 with a 2-run double in 2 apps (PH, PH-LF-2B-1B-LF).
- Has made 13 starts for the Reds (9gs in LF, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at 2B, 1gs at DH).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacin on 7/24 at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit .358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b 2nd Half: 16g, 14-66 (.212), 4 2b, 1hr, 8rbi

- For the fifth straight season, was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
- Has at least 1 RBI in 4 of his last 6 apps (5rbi) and in 6 of his last 10 apps (7rbi).
- In his last 51 apps beginning 5/24 is hitting .299, raising his season BA from .208 (59-197, 14 2b, 5hr, 22rbi, .368obp).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 61 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 63 HR on the first pitch.

33 JESSE WINKER, of 2nd Half: 16g, 12-42 (.286), 3 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 7rbi

- Among National League leaders since the All-Star break ranks 10th in on-base percentage (.412) and 17th in batting average (.286).
- In his last 10 apps is hitting .310 (9-29, 3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, .517slg, .429obp).
- Hit safely in 8 of his 11 starts and in 9 of his 16 apps in the second half.
- In the 4-3 win on 6/18 vs Hou hit his second career leadoff HR (off Justin Verlander).
- Has 14 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 76 starts, including a team-high 52 starts in LF (14gs in CF, 9gs in RF).
