MAGIC NUMBER: 2

Combination of Rays wins and Yankees losses needed to win the AL East title for the fifth time in franchise history and the first since earning back-to-back division crowns from 2020-21.

RAY REPORT—The Rays begin their final road trip of the regular season against the Yankees (four to play) and Phillies (three to play) today in a doubleheader at Yankee Stadium...have won eight of nine, 12 of 15, and 19 of their last 26 games since Aug. 23...are an MLB-best 39-18 (.684) over their last 57 games (July 20–pres.), tied for their eighth-best record over any 57-game span in a single season in team history (12x, last: April 1–May 31, 2023)...have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in 29 seasons and sixth time in the last eight years (2019–pres.)...are attempting to finish a season with the AL's best record for the fifth time, joining their division titles in 2021, 2020, 2010, and 2008...lead the second-place Yankees by 6.0 games in the AL East standings, holding an advantage of 3.0 games or more each day since Aug. 3...have led the division for 87 consecutive days (June 27–pres.) and spent a total of 127 days at the helm overall as well as 126 days with the AL's best winning pct., both of which are franchise records.

- ★ The Rays took Sunday's rubber match, 5-1, over the Red Sox to claim the season series over them for the seventh time in eight seasons (2019–pres.)...they also improved to a season-high 35 games above .500, their first time reaching the mark since the conclusion of the 2023 season (.99-63)...with a sweep of today's doubleheader, the Rays would move 37 games above .500 for the third time in team history (also: Sept. 7, 2021 & Sept. 25–Oct. 3, 2021).
- ★ They closed their home slate with the third-best home winning pct. in franchise history (2020: .690/.20-9 & 2008: .704/.57-24)...because the 2008 Rays played three home games (3-0) at Champion Stadium at the ESPN Wide World of Sports, the 2026 Rays 55 wins at Tropicana Field marked their most in a single season at the ballpark.
- ★ The Rays earned their 13th win in September, securing their sixth straight month with a .500 record or better...it marks the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month, and they have tied the team record for consecutive such months (also: July 2019–Sept./Oct. 2020).
- ★ Entering play today, the Rays hold a 6.0-game lead over the second-place Yankees...in the pre-divisional era (1876-1968), each of the 97 AL/NL clubs to have a 6.0-game lead (or more) after games on Sept. 21 went on to win the league...in the divisional era (since 1969; not including 2026), each of the 186 AL/NL clubs to have a 6.0-game lead or more through games on Sept. 21 went on to win their division.
- ★ Today's doubleheader includes a make-up game from May 23 and is the Rays second doubleheader this season (see more in "Doubleday" note below).
- ★ The Rays have won each of tonight's game two starter, **Drew Rasmussen's**, last 11 starts since the All-Star break...the 11-game team winning streak in his starts is the longest single-season streak in club history and tied for the longest overall streak with **Matt Moore** (from Sept. 22, 2012–May 19, 2013...it marks MLB's longest streak out of the All-Star break since **MIL Quinn Priester** (11GS) in 2025 and is the longest by an AL pitcher since **MIN Johan Santana** (12GS) in 2006.

"JUST WIN, BABY"—The Rays can claim their fifth AL title in franchise history and first since winning back-to-back in 2020-21 with a single win in their four-game set in New York...with the win, they would secure the No. 1 seed in the AL for the fourth time in team history (also: 2021, 2020, 2010)...with a win today, the Rays would clinch the division on the earliest date in a season in team history (see table on the right)...it would mark the fourth season in a row (2023–pres.) the AL East winner won the division and the No. 1 seed in the AL one year after missing the playoffs and finishing fourth or lower in the division...the AL East is the only division in the majors to have been won by all five teams since 2018 and has been won by each of its five members multiple times since 2014.

SEE THE VALUE—Through 155 games this season, **Junior Caminero** ranks highly in the AL in home runs (1st, 41), XBH (2nd, 68), total bases (2nd, 313), SLG (2nd, .529), RBI (3rd, 97), OPS (3rd, .892), hits (4th, 164), multi-hit games (6th, 43), runs (6th, 96), multi-RBI games (7th, 23), OBP (11th, .363), and AVG (12th, .277)...Caminero has registered a hit in 115 of 155 games, the most games with a hit in the majors...it also is tied for the fifth most in Rays history and marks the most since **Akinori Iwamura** had a hit in 115 games in 2008...the last Rays player to have 116 games or more with a hit was **Delmon Young** (118) in 2007.

- ★ In his age-22 season, he is on pace to become the fourth Ray in team history to play 162 games in a season, joining **Longoria** (2014), **Delmon Young** (2007), and **Aubrey Huff** (2003)...in reaching 162 games, he would become the first player in the modern era (since 1900) to hit 40 home runs or more and play in 162 games in an age-24-or-younger season...he would also become one of 12 players in the modern era to appear in 162 games in an age-22-or-younger season, and the seventh player to do so without appearing as a DH, PH, or PR...the last player to play 162 games without being a DH, PH, PR in an age-22-or-younger season was **BAL Manny Machado** (162G) in 2015.
- ★ There have been only seven players in the modern era to start 162 games or more at third base in a single season: **COL Vinny Castilla** (1998), **BAL Cal Ripken Jr.** (1997), **OAK Sal Bando** (1969), **CHC Ron Santo** (1968, 1965, 1963), **STL Ken Boyer** (1964), **PHI Dick Allen** (1964), and **BAL Brooks Robinson** (1964, 1961-62).
- ★ Additionally, he is on pace for 101 RBI this season...he would become the 23rd player (27x) in the modern era to produce 40 homers or more and 100 RBI or more while playing 162 games...only eight of the previous 22 players did so without appearing at DH, PH, or PR (ATL **Matt Olson**, 2023; MIL **Prince Fielder**, 2009; MIL **Richie Sexson**, 2003; TOR **Carlos Delgado**, 2000; CHC **Sammy Sosa**, 1999; Castilla, 1998; MIN **Harmon Killebrew**, 1969 & 1967; BOS **Carl Yastrzemski**, 1969).
- ★ He paces the AL with 1,352.2 innings played in the field...he is 29.0 innings behind **Longoria's** franchise record with 1,381.2 innings played in 2014...at third base, he has produced four defensive runs saved (DRS), more than 10 clubs have produced at all positions as a team thus far in 2026.

MILESTONE DAY—Entering play today, **Yandy Diaz** (965) is one game shy of tying **B.J. Upton** (966G) for fourth most in franchise history and can surpass him by playing in both games today...game two probable starter, **Drew Rasmussen** is nine strikeouts shy of 600 in his career...**Chandler Simpson** is six hits shy of his 300th career hit...Simpson would become the 61st player in AL history to have 300 hits or more within his first two major league seasons and one of 16 to turn the trick since 1997.

SEVEN IN SIX—Several Rays are within reach of notable accomplishments:

- ★ **Chandler Simpson** (309) trails AL Triple Crown candidate **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (313) by four points for the AL batting title, attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only Rays to pace the AL in average...he could become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942 alongside SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer BOS **Wade Boggs** (361, 2nd season - 1983).
- ★ **Simpson** leads the AL in singles (150), stolen bases (46) and is 12nd in triples (6)—only four players (5x) in the modern era (since 1900) have paced the AL or NL in all three categories over a full season: LAD **Maury Wills** in 1962, NYY **Snuffy Stirnweiss** in 1944, SLB **George Sisler** in 1922, and DET **Ty Cobb** in both 1917 and 1911 (Elias)...no Ray has ever paced the AL in singles, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have had the most three-baggers...Crawford (4x, last: 2007) and **Jose Caballero** (2024) are the only Rays to lead the league in steals.
- ★ **Bryan Baker** (40SV) is attempting to join **Alex Colome** (2017, 47SV) as the only Rays to pace the majors in saves over a full season...he has converted 29 straight save opportunities and could become the 12th AL pitcher (13x) since saves became an official statistic in 1969 to record a streak of 30 consecutive saves or more within a single season and the second since 2017 along with CLE **Emmanuel Clase** (34) in 2024).
- ★ Between **Junior Caminero** (HR), **Simpson** (SB), and **Baker** (SV), the Rays could become the third club since 1969 to have the league leaders (AL or NL) in homers, stolen bases, and saves on the same team, joining Cleveland in 1995 (HR - **Albert Belle**; SB - **Kenny Lofton**; SV - **Jose Mesa**) and Cincinnati in 1970 (HR - **Johnny Bench**; SB - **Bobby Tolan**; SV - **Wayne Granger**), according to Elias.
- ★ The pitching staff leads the majors with a 1.13 WHIP, which would surpass the club record established in 2022 (1.15) and signal the lowest mark since the 2024 Mariners (1.08)...the Rays are attempting to post the majors' best WHIP for the third time, joining 2023 (1.18) and 2012 (1.17).
- ★ **Caminero** leads the AL with 41 HR, one ahead of second-ranked **HOU Yordan Alvarez** and **BAL Pete Alonso** (both 40HR)...Caminero is attempting to join **Carlos Peña** (2009, 39HR) as the only Rays to earn at least a share of the AL home run crown...Peña's 39 bombs that season matched NYY **Mark Teixeira** for the Junior Circuit lead.

DOUBLEDAY—The Rays will play their second doubleheader of the season (also: July 17 at BOS) after not having played in a doubleheader since Aug. 19, 2023 at LAA...this marks the 42nd doubleheader in Rays history, having gone 8-15-18 in the previous twin bills...they previously went 454 games without playing a doubleheader (Aug. 20, 2023–July 12, 2026), the longest stretch in franchise history, surpassing a streak of 422 straight games from Oct. 1, 2004–July 20, 2007...from 2024-25, the Rays and Astros were the only clubs that did not play a doubleheader...Tampa Bay has won 12 of its last 17 doubleheader contests dating back to the night cap on Aug. 8, 2020 vs. NYY.

- ★ This marks the Rays 10th doubleheader against the Yankees, tying the Red Sox for their most against any opponent...they have gone 0-6-3 in the previous nine, all of which have taken place at Fenway Park...the lone sweep came on May 1, 2014...the most recent twin bill between the clubs took place on Aug. 8, 2020 (split).
- ★ The Rays were swept in a doubleheader since July 17, 2026 at Fenway Park and have gone 4-1-5 in their last 10 twin bills...they are 5-11-11 in split doubleheaders compared to 3-4-7 in traditional twin bills...including today, each of their last seven doubleheaders have been split dating back to 2022.

TODAY'S START—Nick Martinez will make his 30th start of the season and 15th on the road today...marks his 159th career start (310th appearance)...leads qualified AL arms in winning pct. (.789/15-4), is tied for second in wins (career-high 15) with teammate **Drew Rasmussen**, and owns the sixth-best ERA (2.94)...the Rays are 22-7 in his starts, including 11-3 on the road...has yielded three runs or fewer in 25 of 29 starts and two runs or fewer in 20 of 29...signed as a free agent on Feb. 10, 2026.

- His club-leading 15 starts with one or zero runs allowed are tied for fifth in MLB and tied for third in the AL with three others behind NYY **Cam Schlichter** (21GS) and LAA **Walbert Ureña** (16GS).
- Marks his third career start (fifth outing) in a doubleheader, with his two previous such starts coming on Aug. 30, 2024 [G1] vs. MIL (w/CIN) and June 11, 2022 [G1] vs. COL (w/SD)...in those two starts, he compiled a 4.09 ERA (11.0IP, 5ER) with 12 strikeouts...his clubs are 2-0 in such starts, winning both games in extra innings.
- Will be his fourth career start on the autumnal equinox, turning a 1-1 record with a 1.80 ERA (15.0IP, 3ER) in such starts, pitching on the day in 2023, 2017, and 2014...would be the oldest pitcher in franchise history (36.047) to win a game on the autumnal equinox.

LAST TIME OUT—Picked up his career-high 15th win of the season on Sept. 16 vs. ATH after tossing 5.0 innings or more with three runs or fewer for the fifth straight start since Aug. 23 (W, 5.0IP, 5H, 2ER, 3SO, 2HR)...retired his first six batters before allowing a solo homer to St. petersburg, Fla. native **Tommy White** to begin the 3rd inning...set down his next two hitters before allowing another solo home run to **Henrv Bolte**...gave up hits to three of his final nine batters faced before handing the ball over to the bullpen with a 4-2 lead.

- Marked the 21st time in 29 starts he has yielded two extra-base hits or fewer.
- Has turned in a 3-0 record with a 2.43 ERA (29.2IP, 8ER), a 0.74 WHIP, a .189 (20-for-106) opp. batting average, and 18 strikeouts across his last five starts since Aug. 23.

YANKEE DOODLE KEEP IT UP—The Fordham University (N.Y.) product is set for his 13th career appearance (eighth start) against the Yankees...owns a lifetime 2-2 record with a 3.72 ERA (46.0IP, 19ER) and 22 strikeouts against the Pinstripes...today marks his third start against the Yankees this season, posting a 1.69 ERA (10.2IP, 2ER) in the previous two, with both earned runs coming off of solo home runs...against AL East clubs this year, he has logged a 5-1 record, a 2.86 ERA (44.0IP, 14ER), and 23 strikeouts in eight starts...the Rays are 7-1 when he pitches against the AL East this year...across 46 career outings (29 starts) opposite AL East foes, he owns an 11-11 mark with a 4.78 ERA (184.2IP, 98ER), 102 strikeouts, and nine quality starts...his teams are 13-12 in his career outings against the division.

- When facing AL opponents this year, Martinez has gone 12-3, pitching to a 3.08 ERA (111.0IP, 38ER) with 60 strikeouts.

THE ROAD GOES ON FOREVER—In 14 road starts this season, Martinez has produced a 7-1 record with a 1.99 ERA (86.0IP, 19ER), 47 strikeouts, a 0.94 WHIP, and a .221 (70-for-317) opp. average...his road ERA ranks third in the AL (min. 75.0IP) behind Cy young frontrunners NYY **Cam Schlichter** (1.16) and TOR **Dylan Cease** (1.94) and is fifth best in the majors...he is on pace to surpass **Blake Snell**'s franchise-record 2.45 road ERA (95.2IP, 26ER) from 2018...Martinez has yielded three runs or fewer in 13 of his 14 road starts and two runs or fewer in 11 of them.

- His seven road wins lead the Rays staff and the club is 11-3 in his road starts, going 6-2 in his last eight such starts since Aug. 5.

FIRST THINGS FIRST—Today marks Martinez's 12th career appearance (eighth start) in the first game of a four-game series...has logged a 5-1 record with a 2.67 ERA (54.0IP, 16ER), 1.09 WHIP, and 29 strikeouts in such outings...his teams are 5-3 lifetime in those starts, including 1-0 in 2026 (July 20 at TOR).

- When pitching in the 1st inning this season, Martinez has posted a 1.55 ERA (29.0IP, 5ER) with 21 strikeouts and a .190 (20-for-105) opp. average...has not allowed a run in the opening frame across 25 of his 29 starts, last allowing a run in the 1st inning on Aug. 18 vs. TOR (2ER)...ranks highly among AL arms (min. 25G) in the 1st frame in ERA (5th), opp. OBP (6th, .241), WHIP (6th, 0.86), and opp. AVG (8th).

UNC'S STILL GOT IT—With today's start, Martinez will make his 30th start of the season and will have a chance to become the fifth AL pitcher (6x) in the Wild Card era (since 1995) to make 30 starts or more and record a sub-3.00 ERA in an age-35-or-older campaign (age as of June 30)...he would join TEX **Jacob deGrom** (30GS/2.97 ERA, 2025), HOU **Justin Verlander** (2018-19), OAK **Bartolo Colon** (30/2.65, 2013), and TOR **Roger Clemens** (33/2.65, 1998)...the right-hander's 15 wins are second most in franchise history during such a season behind **Corey Kluber** (16) in 2022 (age 35), and his 171.1 IP are fourth most, trailing **Charlie Morton** (2019, 194.2IP), **Bobby Witt** (180.1IP, 1999), and Kluber (180.1IP, 2022).

- This season, Martinez became the fifth player in Rays history to earn an All-Star selection in an age-35-or-older season, joining Morton (2019, 35), **RHP Fernando Rodney** (2012, 35), **OF Greg Vaughn** (2001, 35), and **INF Fred McGriff** (2000, 36)...since 2020, the only AL pitchers to turn the trick are Martinez, Verlander (2026, 2022), and deGrom (2025).

I CAN GO THE DISTANCE—On Aug. 11 at ATH, Martinez recorded his first career 9.0-inning complete game, the third by a Ray since the start of 2017 along with **Zack Littell** on May 31, 2025 at HOU and **Ryan Yarbrough** on June 3, 2021 at NYY...he became oldest pitcher in franchise history (36.006) to record a 9.0-inning complete game and one of five pitchers since the start of 2020 to do so after turning 36 (9x), joining AZ **Merrill Kelly** (May 15, 2026 at COL - 37.213), STL **Adam Wainwright** (5x, last: Aug. 13, 2022 vs. MIL - 40.348), HOU **Zack Greinke** (June 4, 2021 at TOR - 37.226), and WSH **Max Scherzer** (May 2, 2021 vs. MIA - 36.279)...he became the eighth pitcher in franchise history (15x) to toss a 9.0-inning complete game on 101 pitches or fewer and the first since **Chris Archer** on Aug. 20, 2015 at HOU (98 pitches).

- He was the first pitcher in the majors to toss a 9.0-inning complete game while allowing four earned runs or more since KC **Jordan Lyles** on May 9, 2023 vs. CWS and the first to turn the trick and earn the win since MIN **Bartolo Colon** on Aug. 4, 2017 vs. TEX...Martinez is the 10th pitcher in the modern era (since 1900) to earn the win in a 9.0-inning complete game while throwing 101 pitches or fewer and allowing four earned runs or more.
- It marked his second career complete game overall, joining an 8.0-inning effort in a 1-0 loss on Sept. 27, 2024 at CHC as a member of the Reds.

CROSSING GUARD—Martinez currently leads the majors with a 3.5 pct. walk rate, outpacing rotation-mate **Drew Rasmussen** (4.5%)...he is attempting to become the third Ray to pace MLB in the category alongside **Corey Kluber** (3.0%) in 2022 and **David Price** (3.6%) in 2013...**Zack Littell** (4.2%) finished as the MLB leader last season, but he was dealt to the Reds ahead of the 2025 trade deadline...the 3.8 pct. walk rate would rank fifth in club history to Kluber in 2022, Price (3.3%) in 2014, **Zach Eflin** (3.4%) in 2023, and Price in 2013.

- He also owns the lowest strikeout rate among MLB qualifiers (14.8%)...27.5 pct. of his total pitches have been put in play, the highest rate in the majors (min. 1,000 pitches thrown)...much of that contact has been soft, as his 32.9 pct. hard-hit rate ranks third in the AL (min. 2,000 pitches thrown) to TOR **Dylan Cease** (31.7%) and ATH **Jacob Lopez** (31.9%).
- Martinez has produced a 4.6 pct. walk rate across the last three seasons (2024-26), the best clip in MLB during that span, ahead of SEA **Bryan Woo** (4.8%).

TONIGHTS START—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber tonight for his 30th start of the campaign and his 160th career appearance (111th start)...leads the AL in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.62) and ranks second in WHIP (0.93), walk rate (4.5%), and opp. on-base pct. (.248)...is also third in opp. AVG (.205), opp. SLG (.305), and opp. OPS (.553)...ranks fourth in ERA (2.81) and fifth in quality starts (17)...has thrown 8.0 straight scoreless frames and allowed 2 ER in his last 22.0 IP.

- Rasmussen's active eight-decision winning streak is tied for the fifth longest in TB history, two wins shy of the club record (**Jalen Beeks** - 10W).
- The Rays have won each of his last 11 starts since the All-Star break and 20 of 29 this year...the 11-game team winning streak in his starts is the longest single-season streak in club history and tied for the longest overall streak with **Matt Moore's** 11-start streak from Sept. 22, 2012-May 19, 2013. ...it marks MLB's longest streak out of the All-Star break since **MIL Quinn Priester (11GS) in 2025** and is the longest by an AL pitcher since **MIN Johan Santana (12GS) in 2006**.
- Is nine strikeouts shy of reaching 600 for his career.
- He and today's game one starter, **Nick Martinez** (15-4), are the fourth pair of Rays teammates to both record 15 wins in a season, first since **Blake Snell** (21) and **Ryan Yarbrough** (16) in 2018.
- Since 2021, his 2.77 ERA (610.2IP, 188ER) ranks thirđ MLB pitchers (min 500.0IP) behind LAD **Shohei Ohtani** (2.68) and ATL **Chris Sale** (2.75).

LAST TIME OUT—Spun 5.0 scoreless innings en route to his 15th victory of the season in a 10-1 win on Sept. 17 vs. ATH (W, 5.0IP, 4H, 2BB, 3SO)...tied **Nick Martinez** (also 15) for the team high...faced the minimum until a single-walk sequence in the 3rd...after surrendering a single in the 4th, allowed baserunners on just a fielder's choice, walk, and single to get through the 5th...was his seventh start of 5.0 innings or more with zero extra-base hits allowed, tied for fifth most among AL pitchers.

- Earned his 44th career win with the Rays, surpassing **Shane McClanahan** (43) for the sixth most in franchise history.
- After retiring **Tommy White** in the 4th inning, he surpassed **Matt Garza** (592.1IP) for eighth-most innings pitched in franchise history (593.2IP).
- After a four-start span in which he tossed 6.0 innings or more (Aug. 24–Sept. 11), this marked his shortest outing since Aug. 19 vs. TOR (5.0IP).
- The outing went down as his 110th start in a Rays uniform, seventh most in franchise history and five shy of sixth-place **Alex Cobb** (115GS).
- Across his last five starts (Aug. 24–pres.), opposing hitters are 22-for-111 (.198) and have been limited to three extra-base hits (2 2B, HR)...allowed two runs or fewer in each of those outings.

THAT'S LIFE—Across 10 career appearances (nine starts) against the Yankees, Rasmussen has pitched to a 4-2 record with a 1.87 ERA (53.0IP, 11ER), a 0.89 WHIP, and 59 strikeouts...min. 50.0 IP, his ERA and WHIP both pace active MLB pitchers when facing New York-AL...is 3-0 with a 0.72 ERA (25.0IP, 2ER), a 0.80 WHIP, and 28 strikeouts in four career starts at Yankee Stadium...his ERA in The Bronx leads active MLB pitchers (min. 20.0IP), while his WHIP at the venue ranks second to SEA **Bryan Woo** (0.63).

- Rasmussen has made 46 career appearances (36 starts) against AL East clubs, pitching to an 13-8 record with a 2.76 ERA (198.2IP, 61ER), 179 strikeouts, and a 1.07 WHIP in those contests...min. 190.0 IP, his ERA vs. the division leads active AL hurlers...min. 700 AB, his .221 (161-for-729) opp. average ranks eighth among active AL pitchers against the division.

ROAD WORK—The right-hander is making his 15th road start of the season...is 6-2 with a 2.57 ERA (80.2IP, 23ER) and 77 strikeouts to 11 walks in the previous 14 starts...he has gone 5.0 IP or more with two runs or fewer in five straight road starts (July 21–pres.), the longest streak of his career and tied for the seventh longest in Rays history...the last longer streak was Nick Martinez's six-start run across his first six road outings earlier this season March 30–May 22...the Rays have won each of Rasmussen's five road starts during the streak on the heels of a 3-6 start to begin the year.

- He has won each of his last four decisions on the road (July 21–pres.), tied for the second-longest streak of his career behind May 17–Aug. 13, 2025 (5).
- Min. 150.0 IP, Rasmussen's 2.74 road ERA (289.1IP, 88ER) as a Ray is the lowest in franchise history, ahead of **Tyler Glasnow** (3.26).
- Since 2021, Rasmussen's 23 road wins pace Rays arms...boasts a lifetime .742 (23-9) winning pct. on the road with Tampa Bay, the highest clip in franchise history (min. 25GS), ahead of **David Price** (.701/47-20).

STARDOM—Since the All-Star break, Rasmussen has gone 8-0 with a 1.91 ERA (66.0IP, 14ER) across 11 starts...from July 21–Aug. 24, he became the first Rays pitcher to win his first seven starts following the break and the first MLB hurler since NYY **Ivan Nova** (7) in 2011...his eight second-half wins are tied with WSH **Cade Cavalli** for the most in the majors, while his 1.91 ERA paces the AL and his 0.89 WHIP ranks second in the AL to NYY **Cam Schittler** (0.85).

- The eight wins are tied for the fourth most by a Rays pitcher in the second half of any season in franchise history and are the most since **Tyler Glasnow** (8) in 2023...it falls one win shy of the club record (9) shared by **Blake Snell** (2018), **David Price** (2012), and **Edwin Jackson** (2008).
- His .778 (21-6) winning percentage after the All-Star break as a Ray is the highest in franchise history (min. 30GS) and the third-highest mark since the inaugural All-Star Game in 1933, trailing **Julio Urias** (.844) and **Johnny Beazley** (.826).
- Rasmussen boasts a career 2.27 ERA (277.0IP, 70ER) across 66 games (49 starts) following the Midsummer Classic...it is the second-lowest clip by a starting pitcher (min. 200.0IP) since 1933 behind **Blake Snell** (2.25) and is the third-lowest mark by any pitcher, also trailing **Billy Wagner** (2.07).

IN AWE OF AUGUST—Across five starts during August, Rasmussen went 5-0 with a 2.57 ERA (35.0IP, 10ER) and a 0.91 WHIP, with the Rays winning all six of his starts...the five wins matched a franchise record for a calendar month, and he became the second Rays pitcher to reach the mark without recording a loss during August (also: 5W, **Shane McClanahan** - 2021)...Rasmussen also joined McClanahan (5W - April/March 2023), **Tyler Glasnow** (5W - April/March 2019), **Blake Snell** (5W - Sept./Oct. 2018), and **Matt Moore** (5W - April/March 2013) as the only Rays to turn the trick in any single calendar month...Rasmussen's WHIP was his fourth lowest in a month during his career, with three of those months coming in 2026 (also: June - 0.61 and April/March - 0.85); Rasmussen logged a 0.67 WHIP during Aug. 2022.

- It was the ninth time in franchise history the Rays have gone 6-0 or better in a pitcher's starts during a month, including the second occurrence in August (also: **Alex Cobb** - 2012).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: LHP IAN SEYMOUR [9-7, 4.38]

LAST TIME OUT—Suffered his seventh loss on Aug. 18 vs. BOS after yielding four runs, including 2 HR, over 5.0 IP of work in a 4-2 setback (L, 5.0IP, 7H, 4ER, 2BB, 5 SO, 2HR, HBP)...marked his most earned runs allowed since July 12 vs. SEA (5).

vs. YANKEES—Seymour is 2-0 despite a 6.59 ERA (13.2IP, 10ER) in six career appearances vs. New York-AL, five of which came in relief...the lone start was earlier this season on July 7 at Tropicana Field, when he fanned a career-high 12 batters and worked into the 6th inning to earn the win (W, 5.1IP, 5H, 3ER, 12SO, HR).
