**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Phillies, 6-2, on Sunday night...The Mets have lost back-to-back games after winning two straight...New York is in a stretch of 12 straight games (0-2) and 24 games in 25 days (0-2) to finish on the first-half of the season... The Mets are 12-10 over their last 22 games and 24-22 over their last 46 games...The Mets return to Citi Field for a seven-game homestand against the Cubs (four games) and Phillies (four games).

**JUAN OF A KIND:** Juan Soto has 261 career home runs...That is the 11th-most in MLB history prior to turning 28 (next: Frank Robinson, 262)...His 261 homers are 24th among active players...It is 21st all-time amongst players born in the Dominican Republic... George Bell is next with 265.

**MAKE IT A BAKER'S DOZEN:** Soto has reached base safely in 13 straight games, batting .386 (17-44) with eight runs, three doubles, four homers, nine RBI, 12 walks, a .518 OBP, a .727 SLG and a 1.245 OPS.

**HIGH FIVE:** The Mets have scored five or more runs in each of their last 11 wins dating back to May 29 vs. Miami...The team scored a total of 79 runs in their last 11 wins...The Mets are batting .284/.354/.469 when they win, compared to a .187/.246/.288 in losses.

**IN A PINCH:** The Mets as a team have recorded 14 RBI from their pinch-hitters...That is the third-most in the majors and the second-most in the National League.

**BO KNOWS BALL:** Over the last 32 games since May 17, Bo Bichette is batting .300 (39-130) with 20 runs, six doubles, one triple, six homers, 24 RBI, six walks, a .331 OBP, a .500 SLG and an .831 OPS...Over his last 16 games, he is batting .373 (25-67) with 11 runs, five doubles, one triple, three homers, 14 RBI with a .983 OPS.

**CUBS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have lost three straight and four of their last five to the Cubs...The Cubs are 25-29 all-time at Citi Field, but have won three of their last four at the ballpark.

**DREAM WEAVER:** Luke Weaver has not allowed a run over his last 18 appearances...He has tossed 20.0 scoreless innings, allowing 10 hits, four walks and has struck out 25 in that span...He is now 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA (8 ER/32.0 IP) this season with eight walks and 33 strikeouts in 29 appearances...He has recorded six appearances of at least four outs this season and each of those appearances have been scoreless.

**THE HUSASCAR GOES TO:** As a relief pitcher, Huascar Brazobán has pitched to a 1.17 ERA (4 ER/30.2 IP) across 26 appearances... He ranks sixth in majors and fourth the NL in relief pitcher ERA (min. 20.0 IP).

**POWER OF THE PEN:** The Mets bullpen has posted a 3.37 ERA as a group...That ranks fourth in the majors and fifth in the National League...They have struck out 335 this season, the most in The Show.

**MINTY FRESH:** Dating back to April 4 of 2025, A.J. Minter has not allowed a run over his last 21 appearances...He is 0-1 with a 0.00 ERA (18.1 IP), allowing eight hits, one unearned run, five walks and 19 strikeouts in that span...His 21-game streak without allowing an earned run is tied for the fifth-longest streak in team history.

**THIS DAY IN 1986:** The Mets defeated the Reds, 3-2, at Riverfront Stadium...Ron Darling started and earned his 10th win of the season and allowed two runs over 8.0 innings...Tim Teufel went 3-4 with an RBI double...Kevin Mitchell went 2-4 and gave the Mets the lead with a go-ahead, two-run homer in the seventh...Roger McDowell threw a 1-2-3 inning and earned his ninth save of the season...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions..The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 title on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration is available at Mets.com/1986.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw 4.0 innings and allowed four earned runs while striking out five on June 16 at Cincinnati in his return from the Injured List (4.0 IP, 2 H, 4 ER, 4 BB, 5 K, 2 HR)...Allowed all four of his runs in the first inning on two home runs...His next 3.0 innings were scoreless...Marked his first start since April 26 vs. Colorado...In his first two starts of the season, he threw at least 5.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs while striking out at least seven batters...In his last four starts, he has allowed 20 earned runs over 12.1 innings and has only completed 4.0 innings once.

**VS. CHICAGO-NL/NL CENTRAL:** Is set to make his fourth career start against Chicago-NL and his second this season...In his three career starts against the Cubs he is 1-2 with a 6.91 ERA (11 ER/14.1 IP) and 15 strikeouts...He faced the Cubs on April 17 of this season and allowed six earned runs over 3.1 innings...In his career, he has made 13 starts against NL Central opponents, and he is 4-7 with a 3.82 ERA (30 ER/70.2 IP) and has recorded 76 strikeouts lifetime against the division.

**REHAB STINT:** He made four rehab appearances between St. Lucie, Syracuse and Binghamton from May 22-June 11...Over those starts, he went 0-1 with a 4.00 ERA (8 ER/18.0 IP) with 17 strikeouts...His last rehab appearance came on June 11 with Binghamton and he allowed one earned run over 6.0 innings while striking out five...He threw 75 pitches...He threw a rehab stint-high 91 pitches on June 3 while pitching for Syracuse...He recorded at least five strikeouts in each of his last three rehab starts from May 28-June 11.

**CRUISING AT CITI:** In 31 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 12-7 with a 3.27 ERA (59 ER/162.1 IP) with 201 strikeouts...He is one of 18 pitchers to record at least 200 punchies at Citi Field...His 11.14 K/9.0IP is the third highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin Díaz's 15.10 K/9.0IP and Jacob deGrom's 11.52 K/9.0IP (min. 400 BF).

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** Through five starts this season, Senga had thrown his "ghost" forkball 21.8% of the time and generated a 39.5% whiff rate on the pitch...12 of his 28 strikeouts have come via the ghost fork this season...Last season, Senga picked up 71 of his 109 strikeouts on the ghost fork...Held batters to a .130 average with his ghost fork last season, which was the second-lowest opponents' batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing a split-finger pitch and the seventh-lowest opponent batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing any pitch...His 41.8% whiff rate was the fourth highest on a qualified split finger pitch...In his rookie year (2023), Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats, ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

**2025 SEASON RECAP:** Senga finished last season going 7-6 with a 3.02 ERA (38 ER/60.2 IP), 55 walks and 109 strikeouts in 22 starts...Started the season going 7-3 through June 12, with a 1.47 ERA (12 ER/73.2 IP) over 13 starts...He had thrown at least 5.0 innings in all 13 starts and allowed three earned runs or fewer in all of those starts...Following his return from the IL, posted a 5.90 ERA (26 ER/39.0 IP) in nine starts...Allowed three or more earned runs in three consecutive games before being sent to Triple-A.

**GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES:** Has allowed three or fewer runs in 47 of his first 58 career starts...His 47 such starts are the fourth-most in franchise history through a starter's first 58 career games...He trails Jacob DeGrom's 51 games, Dwight Gooden/Matt Harvey's 49 games and Noah Syndergaard's 48 games...He had allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts from June 23, 2023 to July 11, 2025, which tied with deGrom (from 4/16/18-4/3/19) for the second-longest such streak in franchise history...At the time, it was the longest active such streak in the majors...He trailed only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22).

**SENGA GENESIS:** Through Senga's first 58 career starts he has posted 348 strikeouts...His 348 strikeouts through his first 58 Major League games are the fifth-most in Mets history behind Dwight Gooden (484), Noah Syndergaard (403), Matt Harvey (396) and Jacob deGrom (372)...His 348 strikeouts are also tied for the fifth-most among Japanese-born pitchers through their first 58 starts, trailing only Yu Darvish (477), Hideo Nomo (452), Shohei Ohtani (403) and Yoshinobu Yamamoto (365)...He is tied for fifth with Masashiro Tanaka.

**2024 REWIND:** He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

**REMARKABLE ROOKIE:** During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55

ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967)...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

**HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

- Earned his fourth win of the season after tossing a scoreless inning in relief on June 18 at Philadelphia (1.0 IP, K, BB)...As a relief pitcher, has pitched to a 1.17 ERA (4 ER/30.2 IP) across 26 appearances...Ranks sixth in the majors and fourth in the NL in relief pitcher ERA (min. 20.0 IP)...Overall, he has pitched to a 1.91 ERA (8 ER/37.2 IP) this season.
- Retired all five batters he faced, four via strikeout on June 12 vs. Atlanta (1.2 IP, 4 K)...His four strikeouts on the night were his most in an outing since May 21, 2025 at Boston.
- Since joining the Mets in 2024, he has made 47 appearances (four starts) at Citi Field...In those contests, he is 3-1 with 10 holds, a 2.83 ERA (18 ER/57.1 IP) and 53 strikeouts.
