**FIRST RESPONDERS WEEKEND:** The New York Mets are celebrating First Responders all weekend long...The first 2,000 fans to purchase a First Responders Weekend ticket for Friday, Saturday or Sunday will receive a limited edition Mets First Responders Hat provided by Ford...On Friday, a member of the NYPD Ceremonial Unit performed the National Anthem, the Smithtown Fire Department presented the Last night, the Oceanside Fire Department presented the color guard and today, NYPD Ceremonial Unit members will perform the anthem and present the color guard.

36 DAYS OF NO. 36: There are 34 days until the Mets retire Jerry Koosman's number 36 in a pregame ceremony on August 28...In honor of the event, the team is on a 36day countdown noting the most memorable moments of his historic career...On this day in 1976, Koosman tossed a complete game, but took the loss as the Expos scored a run in the bottom of the ninth to earn a 2-1 victory over the Mets in Montreal...Kooz allowed both runs on six hits with three walks and struck out six in 8.1 innings...He moved to 11-7 with a 3.42 ERA on the year...He finished 1-4 at the plate, hitting his second double of the season...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY:** Former Mets closer Billy Wagner celebrates his 50th birthday today...Wagner spent four seasons with the Mets from 2006-2009, where he went 5-5 with 101 saves and a 2.37 ERA (50 earned runs/189.2 innings) with 54 walks and 230 strikeouts...He ranks fifth in franchise history with 101 saves...During his 16-year career, he recorded 422 saves and posted a 2.31 ERA.

METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Blue Jays, 10-3, last night...The team has won four of its last six games...The Mets are looking for their 16th series victory of the season and their 10th at home...The Mets continue a 10-day, 11-game homestand (1-1) against the Blue Jays (1-1), Braves (five games) and Reds (three games).

OVER THE HILL AND VERY CLOSE: Rich Hill is set to make his first start as a Met today...On Friday, the team acquired the left-handed pitcher from the Tampa Bay Rays in exchange for right-handed pitcher Tommy Hunter and minor league catcher Matt Dyer...Hill, 41, has made 19 starts for the Rays this year and is 6-4 with a 3.87 ERA (41 earned runs/95.1 innings) with 36 walks and 91 strikeouts...The Boston, MA native owns a lifetime 73-48 record with a 3.80 ERA (452 earned runs/1,071.1 innings) with 426 walks and 1.126 strikeouts across 17 major league seasons...He is set to make his third start at Citi Field where he is 0-0 with a 6.30 ERA (seven earned runs/10.0 innings) with two walks and 13 strikeouts.

**AGE US JUST A NUMBER:** Hill, at 41 years and 136 days, will be the second-oldest pitcher ever to make their Mets pitching debut...He trails only Warren Spahn (43 years, 356 days) when he made his Mets debut against the Houston Astros on April 14, 1965...Courtesy of Sports Radar...He will be the ninth player to start a game for the Mets over the age of 40...He joins Bartolo Colón, Tom Glavine, Orlando Hernandez, Orel Hershiser, Warren Spahn, Frank Tanana, Miguel Batista and David Cone.

HOMER BOUND: The Mets have homered in 10 of their last 12 games, hitting 26 home runs in that span...The team's 26 home runs since July 9 are the second-most in the majors...Only the Dodgers (27) have hit more.

**REPLACE-METS:** Entering today, the Mets have used 54 players through 95 games this season...The franchise record for most players used in a season is 56 by the 2018 Mets...The Mets have had 15 different pitchers start a game this season...That is the most in the majors...The Mets used 10 starters in 2020...The Mets have used 16 or more starters in a season only four times previously in franchise history...The team used 16 starters in 1964-66 and used a franchise-record 20 in 1967...The Mets enter the day tied with the Marlins for the most starters used this season at 15.

ACT II: The Mets are batting .280/.364/.512 with 46 runs, 13 doubles and 18 home runs since the break...The team's 18 home runs after the All-Star break are the secondmost in the major leagues and most in the NL, while their .876 OPS ranks third in the majors and second in the National League...The team's .280 batting average is third in MLB in that span, while their .364 OBP is fourth...The Mets hit .231/.310/.373 in the

JULY! JULY! JULY!: As a team, New York is batting .267/.351/.460 with an .810 OPS in 19 games this month...This is their highest batting average, OBP and SLG in any month this season...The team ranks second in the majors OBP and OPS and fourth in the majors in average and SLG...The Mets hit .222/.297/.379 in 30 games in June... The team has hit 32 home runs this month, tied for the second-most in the majors and their second-highest total of any month this year...The team hit a season-high 33 blasts in June...New York is 10-9 this month.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets are 6-8 in Interleague play this year and went 9-11 against the American League last year...The team's .511 winning percentage (223-213) is the third-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is batting .382 (13-34) with seven runs, a double, four home runs, eight RBI, five walks, a .462 OBP and a .765 SLG in eight games after the AII-Star break...He is batting .282/.347/.552 with 23 runs, five doubles, 14 home runs, 34 RBI, 15 walks and an .899 OPS in 44 games since the start of June.

GIMME GUILLORME: Luis Guillorme is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .471 (8-17) with two runs, a double, a home run, three RBI and a walk in that span...Over his last 22 games, Guillorme is batting .356 (21-59) with seven runs, three doubles, a home run, four RBI, seven walks with a .424 OBP and a .458 SLG.

PONY EXPRESS: Alonso has 90 home runs through 303 career games...Despite Alonso's second year in the majors being last year's 60-game season, he currently ranks tied for 15th all-time in home runs through career season No. 3...His next homer will tie him for 12th-most through three big league seasons with Jose Abreu, Bob Horner and Ted Williams...Only seven players have hit 100+ homers through their first

MOVIN' ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 124 home runs and is now tied with Todd Hundley for eighth on the team's all-time home run list...Lucas Duda is seventh with 125...Pete Alonso is now 20th on the Mets all-time home run list with 90 blasts...Cleon Jones is next with 93 home runs.

**HOME, SWEET HOME:** The Mets are in a stretch of 11 home games in 10 days...The team owns a 29-15 record with a 2.55 ERA (107 earned runs/377.0 innings) with 132 walks and 411 strikeouts at home...The Mets have lost back-to-back games at home only twice this year (April 27-28 and June 21-22)...The team's 2.55 ERA at home is the best in the majors and their .659 winning percentage is the third-best...This compares to 22-29 with a 4.39 ERA (207 earned runs/424.1 innings) with 146 walks and 453 strikeouts on the road this year.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .305 (40-127) with 22 runs, 10 doubles, two home runs, 15 RBI, 27 walks, a .431 OBP and a .427 SLG in 40 games this year...His .431 OBP leads the major leagues (min. 150 PA).

QUALITY EATS: The Mets have made 36 quality starts this season...The Mets rotation owns a 3.08 ERA (158 earned runs/462.1 innings) this season, the second-best mark in the major leagues...de Grom leads the major leagues with a 1.08 ERA, while Marcus Stroman is eighth in the majors with a 2.59 mark.

**THIS ONE GOES TO 11:** Jeff McNeil is on an 11-game hitting streak, batting .333 (14-42) with seven runs, a double, a home run, seven RBI, four walks and an .833 OPS in that span...His 11-game hitting streak matches his career-high, which he accomplished from August 16-26, 2018...He has safely reached base in each of his last 12 games, putting up a .417 OBP in that span...He is batting .316 (18-57) with 10 runs, a double, a home run, seven RBI and seven walks with a .786 OPS in 17 games this month.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since Saturday, May 8, a streak of 78 days...This is their longest run atop the East in the last 14 seasons...The 2007 Mets (135 days in a row) were the last iteration of the club to be in first longer than 78 days in a row, per Elias...The team has been in first place for 94 days overall this season, the most of any team in 2021.

FOUR SCORE AND 41 WINS AGO: The Mets are 41-8 when scoring four or more runs this season...The team is 10-35 when scoring three or fewer runs...The Mets are 39-13 when scoring first this season...The team's .750 winning percentage is the fourth-best record in the major leagues when scoring first this season.

IN A PINCH: The Mets pinch-hitters are batting .261/.338/.470 with 10 doubles, six home runs, 30 RBI and 13 walks...Their .261 batting average is the fifth-best in the majors and is the best in the NL...Their .808 pinch-hit OPS is also the best in the NL...The team's six pinch-hit home runs is tied for the third most in the majors.

C IS FOR COOKIE: Carlos Carrasco is currently on a rehab assignment with the Syracuse Mets...He is set to make his third start today...He made the start on Tuesday night and allowed five earned runs on three hits (all home runs) with three walks and a strikeout...He threw 41 pitches, 23 for strikes...He tossed 2.0 scoreless innings and allowed only a hit, while striking out two in his first start...Carrasco is on the 60-Day IL with a right hamstring injury.

WELCOME TO THE METS: Rich Hill, a 41-year-old lefthander from Boston, was acquired by the Mets on July 23 from Tampa Bay in exchange for RHP Tommy Hunter and minor league  ${\it catcher Matt Dyer...} The \ {\it Mets will be the 11th major league franchise for which he's played.}$ 

LAST TIME OUT: Hill last started on July 18 at Atlanta in his final outing for the Rays...He pitched 4.0 innings and allowed three runs on six hits with two walks and eight strikeouts in a 7-5 Tampa Bay win.

WITH TAMPA BAY: Was 6-4 with a 3.87 ERA in 19 starts with the Rays before being traded...Is 5-4 with a 2.85 ERA (22 earned runs/75.0 innings) in his last 15 starts since April 26, yielding two runs or fewer 10 times over that stretch and one run or fewer in eight of those 15 starts. Among starting pitchers over that stretch, he ranks 15th in the majors and fourth in the AL in ERA, and ranks eighth in the majors and second the AL with a .199 opponent average (55-276)...Has posted scoreless innings streaks of 20.2 IP and 16.0 IP this year.

TOP OF THE HILL: At the time of his trade to New York, he ranked among AL leaders in BABIP (fifth, .255), pitches per inning (ninth, 15.2) and in opponent average (13th, .220)...All stats min. 75.0 innings pitched.

**SLOW JAMS:** His average four-seam fastball velocity this season is 88.3 mph, 12th-slowest among the 339 pitchers in the majors with at least 500 fastballs thrown...However, his 33 strikeouts on fastballs 90 mph (or slower) are the second-most in the majors behind Brent Suter (36)...has 58 swings-and-misses on fastballs 90 mph (or slower), which leads the majors.

**HILL'S HOOK:** Has used his curveball on 38.1 percent of his pitches thrown this season, the second-highest rate in the majors (min. 1,000 pitches) behind Drew Smyly (39.8)...His 22.0 percent whiff rate on the curveball is his highest since 2017 (25.1, with LAD)...Has 33 punchouts on curveballs thrown 75 mph (or slower) this season, most in the majors ahead of Adam Wainwright (32)...his 56 swings-and-misses on curveballs of that speed are second to Wainwright's 61.

**REJUVENATED RICH:** Since returning to the majors after pitching in independent ball in 2015, Hill has been one of the majors' top starting pitchers by ERA, winning percentage and opponent average...His 3.07 ERA in the last seven seasons ranks sixth (min. 600 IP) in the big leagues behind Clayton Kershaw (2.47), Jacob deGrom (2.47), Max Scherzer (2.80), Justin Verlander (2.94) and Corey Kluber (3.06)...Only Scherzer (.201) and Verlander (.204) have held their foes to a lower average than Hill (.207)...Hill's .653 win percentage (49-26) ranks seventh since 2015 (min. 100 starts).

QUACK QUACK, RICH HILL IS BACK: Hill is calling Long Island home for the second time in his pro career...He pitched for the Long Island Ducks in 2015 after he was released by the Nationals in June of that season...He said of his stint in independent ball in 2015: "I'm not 100 percent sure when I'll retire...I'll probably be pitching until I'm 70, like Bill Lee." ...He ditched his sidearm delivery and asked a Red Sox executive to watch him throw at his former high school in Massachusetts...He warmed up with his nephew's American Legion team and impressed the Red Sox, who ended up signing him to a minor league deal after two dominant starts for the independent Long Island Ducks...The bobbleheads from his short stint in the independent league sell for between \$50-60 on eBay

CAREER AT CITI FIELD: Has started here in Queens twice in his career, once in 2017 and once in 2018, both with the Dodgers...LA won both games, with Hill staying out of the decision each time...He tossed 5.0 innings in both outings and allowed a total of seven runs on 11 hits in those 10.0 IP with two walks and 13 strikeouts.

METS WHO PLAYED FOR THE YANKEES: Hill is set to become the 147th player to suit up for both the Mets and Yankees...He will be the eighth player to join that list in 2021...Brandon Drury, Cameron Maybin, Billy McKinney, Stephen Tarpley and Mason Williams all played for the Mets this year after previously appearing in a Yankees uniform...Jay Bruce and Darren O'Day made their Yankees debuts in 2021 after previous stints with the Mets.

AWARD SZN: Named AL Pitcher of the Month for May after going 3-1 with a 0.78 ERA (three earned runs/34.2 innings) and 36 strikeouts in six starts...It marked his third career monthly honor, joining July 2017 (with LAD) and May 2016 (with OAK)...According to YES Network and Stats LLC, was the fourth pitcher (fifth time) since 1947 to lead his league in ERA in a month at age 41 or older (min. 25 IP)...He joined Roger Clemens (Houston) in May 2005, Nolan Ryan (Texas) in September 1992 and June 1991, Hoyt Wilhelm (Chicago-AL) in August 1965 and Satchel Paige (Cleveland) in August 1948
